year of the reign of King Henry the Eighth, chapter 14.

July, in the year one thousand nine hundred and eleven, in the words and figures following; that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-seven, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for authorizing the sale and disposal of certain property situate in the parishes of Upton Snodsbury and North Piddle, in the county of Worcester.

"Whereas under and by virtue of an indenture bearing date the seventeenth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, and made or expressed to be made between Charles Walker and the Reverend Thomas Walker of the first part, the said Charles Walker and George Thomas Woodrooffe of the second part, Benjamin Bomford of the third part, and us the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England of the fourth part, the messuages, lands and hereditaments commonly known as the Cowsden Hall Estate situate in the parishes of Upton Snodsbury and North Piddle in the county of Worcester containing two hundred and sixty acres one rood and eighteen perches or thereabouts more particularly described in the first and second schedules to the said indenture and delineated and coloured pink on the plan drawn thereon became with their appurtenances and are now vested in us.

"And whereas under and by virtue of a certain other indenture bearing date the thirty-first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, and made or expressed to be made between Benjamin Bomford of the one part and us the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England of the other part the messuages, lands and hereditaments situate in the said parishes and county containing together two hundred and ninety-six acres one rood and twelve perches or thereabouts more particularly described in the schedule to the said indenture and delineated and verged pink on the plan drawn thereon became with their appurtenances and are now vested in us.

"And whereas the messuages, lands and hereditaments aforesaid are not subject to any outstanding beneficial lease or grant, but are now in our possession, but some portions thereof on account of their character or situation are unsuitable or inconvenient to be held or applied for the purposes for which estates vested in us are applicable under the Acts by which our proceedings are governed.

"Now therefore, we humbly recommend and propose that we may be authorised and empowered by instrument or instruments, in writing duly executed according to law, from time to time to sell or dispose of and duly to convey according to the provisions of the said Acts all or any of the said messuages, lands and hereditaments so vested in us as aforesaid, with their appurtenances and all our estate, right, title and interest therein or in any part or parts thereof unto and to the use of any person or persons desirous or willing to purchase the same, and his or their heirs, executors, administrators or assigns or otherwise as he or they shall direct or appoint, and for such consideration as shall upon due calculation and inquiry appear to us to be just and reasonable, it being our intention to invest the proceeds of such sale from time to time as occasion may arise in the purchase of other lands, tithes, rentcharges, tenements or hereditaments, or of some estate or interest therein convenient to be held by us for the purposes of the Acts by which our proceedings are governed as aforesaid, and in the meantime to invest the said proceeds in some Government or Parliamentary Stock or other public securities in England.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Act or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act. HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter seventy; of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-seven; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the fifteenth day of June, in the year one thousand nine hundred and eleven, in the words and figures following, that is to say:-

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter seventy of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-seven, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fiftyfive, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following representation as to the assignment of a consolidated chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Andrew, Starbeck, situate within the district parish of Bilton with Harrogate, commonly called Christ Church, High Harrogate, in the county of York and in the diocese of Ripon.

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said district parish of Bilton with Harrogate and of the parish of Knaresborough which extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such

"A'nd whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said district parish of Bilton with Harrogate and of the said parish of Knaresborough should be formed into a consolidated chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said church of Saint Andrew, Starbeck, situate as aforesaid.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend William Boyd, Bishop of Ripon, as such Bishop, and as patron, in right of his See, of the said district parish of Bilton with Harrogate and of the said parish of Knaresborough, (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said district parish of Bilton with Harrogate and of the said parish of Knaresborough which are described in the schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one consolidated chapelry for the said church of Saint Andrew, Starbeck situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Andrew, Starbeck.'

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto as to Your Majesty in Your Royal Wisdom shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Andrew, Starbeck, comprising:

"T. All that portion of the district parish of Bilton with Harrogate, commonly called Christ Church, High Harrogate, in the county of York and in the diocese of Ripon, which is bounded upon the north by the new parish of Bilton, upon the east by the parish of Knaresborough, both in the said county and diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south and upon the west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Knaresborough from the said district parish of Bilton with Harrogate at the point where such boundary which follows the western side of Forest Lane crosses the middle of the eastern end of Hookstone Road, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Hookstone Road for a distance of sixty chains or thereabouts to its junction with Stonefall Avenue and Wetherby Lane, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of Wetherby Lane for a distance of three chains precisely, and extending thence first northward and then north-eastward in a line parallel to and at a distance of three chains from the middle of Stonefall Avenue for a distance of nineteen chains and a half or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the stream called Rud Beck, and extending thence first westward and then north-westward along the middle of Rud Beck for a distance of ten chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the southern end of the fence forming the western boundary of the close numbered 1 upon the map or plan annexed to this representation, and extending thence north-westward to and along the said fence and along the fences forming the western boundaries of the closes numbered 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6 upon the said map or plan (thereby passing to the west of the house called Forest Lodge) for a distance in all of twenty-six chains or thereabouts to the point where the fence forming the western boundary of the said close numbered 6 meets the southern side of Knaresborough Road, and extending thence first north-westward to and then north-eastward along the middle of Knaresborough Road for a distance of three chains and a half or thereabouts to a point opposite to the southern end of the fence forming the south-western boundary of the close numbered 7 upon the said map or plan, and extending thence north-westward to and along the last mentioned fence and along the fences forming the south-western boundaries of the closes numbered 8 and 9 upon the said map or plan for a distance of twenty-three chains or thereabouts to the western corner of the said close numbered 9, and extending thence north-eastward along the fence forming the north-western boundary of such close for a distance of four chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the fence forming the south-western boundary of the close numbered 10 upon the said map or plan, and extending thence north-westward first in a straight line to the last mentioned fence and then along such fence for a distance in all of twelve chains and a half or thereabouts to the point where such fence meets the southern side of the footpath leading from Granby Terrace and The Stray past the northern side of Bogs Farm into Bogs Lane, and extending thence first northwestward to the middle of the said footpath and then first north-eastward, and then southward along the middle of the said footpath for a distance of twenty-two chains or thereabouts to its junction with Bogs Lane, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of Bogs Lane for a distance of fourteen chains or thereabouts to its junction with the roadway running past the western side of the house called Longlands to Bilton Road, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the said roadway for a distance of fifteen chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with the footpath leading past the northern side of the said house called Longlands to Bilton Hall Lane upon the boundary which divides the said district parish of Bilton with Harrogate from the said new parish of Bilton.

fence forming the eastern boundary of the close numbered 12 upon the said map or plan for a distance of fourteen chains or thereabouts to the boundary of the parish of Spofforth in the said county and diocese which here coincides with the boundary of the civil parish in Knaresborough Outer and extending thence first south-westward and then in various directions along the boundary of the said civil parish (thereby following in one part the said boundary of the parish of Spofforth and in another part the southern side of Forest Moor Road) for a distance of fifty-three chains or thereabouts to the point where such civil parish boundary meets the eastern side of Forest Lane, and continuing thence south-westward in a straight line across Forest Lane to a point upon its western side upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Knaresborough from the said district parish of Bilton with Harrogate."

The following Statute, made by the Goveruing Body of All Souls College, Oxford, on the fifth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and eleven, and sealed on the twenty-first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and eleven, altering and amending Statute III, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions contained in "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877":—

To the KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

THE HUMBLE PETITION of the Warden and College of the Souls of All Faithful People deceased of Oxford, commonly called All Souls College.

Whereas the University of Oxford Commissioners under and by virtue of all and every the powers in that behalf enabling them contained in the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, did by an Instrument under their seal, dated the 16th day of June, 1881, make certain Statutes thereunto annexed for your Petitioners who are therein described as "the College of All Souls of the Faithful Departed, commonly called All Souls College, in the University of Oxford."

And whereas such Statutes were approved

by Her late Majesty in Council on the 3rd day of May, 1882.

And whereas at a general meeting of the Governing Body of our said College specially summoned for that purpose and held on the 5th day of June, 1911, it was unanimously resolved as follows, namely:—

- 1. That Clause 6 and the subsequent clauses of Statute III should be re-numbered respectively and be henceforth known by the next higher numbers to the existing ones; thus Clause 6 should henceforth be known as Clause 7 and the same course be adopted with regard to the subsequent clauses of this Statute.
- 2. That a new Clause 6 should be inserted in Statute III immediately after Clause 5 of such Statute and to be in the following words, namely:—
  - 6. Every Fellow elected under the foregoing clauses shall undertake to pursue
    during the tenure of his Fellowship some
    course of study or investigation to be
    specified by him to the Warden and
    Fellows and approved by them. The
    Warden and Fellows may from time to
    time make regulations by by-law for giving
    effect to this requirement. This clause
    shall operate without prejudice to the interest of any Fellow elected before the
    31st of March, 1911.
- 3. That Clause 7 (late Clause 6) of Statute III should be repealed, and in place thereof there should be substituted a new clause in the following words, namely:—
  - 7. If a Fellow elected under the foregoing clauses of this Statute shall receive in any year, apart from the emoluments of his Fellowship, any income not derived from an academical office in the University or in any College, University, or University College in the United Kingdom, he shall not receive in that year any greater sum as the emoluments of his Fellowship than will amount, together with such income, to the aggregate sum following, that is to say:—
    - (a) if such income or any part thereof is not earned income for the purpose of income tax, and amounts to £200 or more, then the sum of £400;
    - (b) in any other case the sum of £500.

For the purposes of this clause the amount of income which, apart from the emoluments of his Fellowship, is returnable by a Fellow in any year for the purposes of income tax, or is otherwise subject to income tax, or which, being received by him outside the United Kingdom, would be so returnable or subject if it were received by him in the United Kingdom, shall be deemed to be the amount of income received by him.

This clause shall operate without prejudice to the interest enjoyed by any Fellow elected before the 31st of March, 1911.

- 4. That Clause 9 (late Clause 8) of Statute III should be amended by the insertion of the words "subject to the provisions of Clause 7" between the words "and" and "there" in such clause.
- · 5. That Clause 10 (late Clause 9) of Statute III should be repealed, and in place

thereof a new clause should be substituted in the following words, namely:—

- 10. The Warden and Fellows may elect without examination to a Fellowship with the aforesaid emolument:—
  - (1.) Any one person whose services they may require as Estates Bursar.
  - (2.) Any one person whose services they may require as Domestic Bursar.
  - (3.) Any one person whose services they may require as Chaplain.
  - (4.) Any one person whose services they may require as Librarian.
  - (5.) Any person holding the office of a Professor or Public Reader in the University or of Assistant Librarian in Bodley's Library.

The number of Fellows elected under this sub-clause shall at no time exceed two.

Every person elected under this clause must be at least a Master of Arts or Bachelor of Civil Law of the University. He shall hold his Fellowship during his tenure of the office or employment in respect of which he is elected and no longer, but he may, on ceasing to hold such office or employment, be re-elected under this clause in respect of any other of the said offices or employments.

A Professor elected under this clause whose emoluments (exclusive of fees) exceed £700 per annum shall not receive a greater sum as the emolument of his Fellowship than will amount, with the emoluments of his Professorship, to £900 per annum.

Now, we, the said Warden and College, in pursuance of the provisions of the said Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, do hereby submit the aforesaid alterations so made by us in the Statutes governing our said College to the King's Most Excellent Majesty in Council, and humbly pray that the same may be approved and confirmed.

It shall be lawful for the Quarantine Medical Officer to apply any of the provisions of Articles 1 and 2 to any of the goods mentioned in Article 1 or to any other merchandise arriving from any place other than an infected place, in any case in which, in the opinion of such Quarantine Medical Officer, it is desirable to enforce the provisions of either of the Articles above referred to with respect to any

such goods or other merchandise with a view to preventing the introduction of disease, and on his certifying to that effect."

#### PRESTWICH UNION.

WHEREAS by a General Order dated the 14th day of December, 1852, addressed to the Guardians of the Poor of certain Unions and Parishes, including the Prestwich Union, the Poor Law Board prescribed Regulations with regard to the administration of out-door relief to poor persons in the said Union;

And whereas it is expedient that further provision should be made temporarily with regard to the administration of relief to certain classes of poor persons in the said Union:

- (3.) Any such able-bodied male person who is absent from the Workhouse without any contravention of subdivision (2) of this Article may be relieved by the Guardians during his absence from the Workhouse, without being set to work during the time or any part of the time of his absence.
