ance. On the 21st October the Board decided to suppress the medical visit which has been in force on arrivals from the ports of Zougouldak,

Kilimli, Cozlou, and Erigli (Black Sea).
On the 23rd October the Board decided to suppress the medical visit imposed on arrivals

from Fatza (Black Sea).

THE MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903. Regulations under Section 9 (1).

COUNTY OF HERTFORD.

Urban District of Bishop's Stortford. To the County Council of Hertford;—And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), it is enacted that, within any limits or place referred to in regulations made by Us, the Local Government Board, with a view to the safety of the public on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a

person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour;

And whereas We have received and duly considered an application from the County Council of Hertford for the issue of a Regulation in pursuance of the said sub-section putting the above-mentioned provisions of that sub-section in force within the limits comprising certain roads or parts of roads situate within the urban district of Bishop's Stortford:

NOW THEREFORE, in pursuance of the powers given to Us in that behalf, We do, by this Our Order, make the following Regulations.

ARTICLE I.—The provisions of sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Act with respect to the

driving of a motor car at a speed not exceeding ten miles per hour shall apply and have effect within the limits comprising the roads or parts of roads within the said urban district which are specified in the Schedule hereto.

ARTICLE II.—These Regulations shall come into operation on the sixth day of November, one thousand nine hundred and eleven.

# SCHEDULE.

So much of the main road from London to Cambridge as extends from the south-western corner of the Railway Bridge, through Hockerill, to a point in the road 100 yards north of its junction with Dunmow Road;

So much of the road comprising South Street and North Street as extends in a northerly direction from a point 50 yards south of the southern corner of Holy Trinity Churchyard to the Wheatsheaf Public House at Northgate End;


So much of the road leading from Dunmow through the town of Bishop's Stortford as extends from its junction with Manor Road to the west side of Hockerill Bridge;

So much of the said road from Dunmow as extends from the bridge over the River Stort to the north-west corner of St. Michael's Churchyard on Wind Hill;

So much of Hadham Road as extends from its junction with North Street to its junction with Chantry Road; and

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 31ST OCTOBER 1911.)

SOMERSET (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1911 (No. 7).

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1911, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

# Withdrawal of Restrictions from Zone III.

1. The provisions of the Somerset (Footand-Mouth Disease) Orders Nos. 1-6 which relate to Zone III shall cease to operate, and the Scheduled District for the purposes of those Orders shall comprise only Zones I and II, as described in the Schedule to the Somerset (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1911 (No. 5).

#### Movement into or Within Zone II.

2. The existing restrictions on the movement of animals into Zone II, or from any premises situate in Zone II to any other premises in the said Zone, shall cease to operate, but this provision shall not affect the existing restrictions on the movement of animals out of Zone I or Zone II, or the prohibition of markets, fairs, sales and exhibitions of animals in such Zones.

Withdrawal of Restrictions on Movement of Poultry in Zone I.

3. Paragraph (2) of Article 1 of the Somerset (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1911 (No. 4), as to the confinement of poultry in Zone I, shall cease to operate.

#### Commencement.

4. This Order shall come into operation on the second day of November, nineteen hundred and eleven. Short Title and Construction.

5. This Order may be cited as the SOMERSET (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1911 (No. 7), and shall be read with the Somerset (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1911 (No. 3).

THE PUBLIC HEALTH ACTS AMEND-MENT ACT, 1907.

THE BROMSGROVE URBAN DISTRICT COUNCIL.

HEREAS the Urban District of Bromsgrove have applied to the Local Government Board to declare certain parts and sections of the above-named Act to be in force in the urban district of Bromsgrove.
