WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the sixteenth and seventeenth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter fifty, and of the Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and twenty-four, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the nineteenth day of October, in the year one thousand nine hundred and eleven, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the sixteenth and seventeenth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter fifty, and of the Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and twenty-four, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for effecting an exchange of the patronage of the benefice (being a rectory) of Smallburgh, situate in the county of Norfolk and in the diocese of Norwich, for the patronage of the benefice of the Fourth Part of the rectory of Felmingham, situate in the said county of Norfolk and in the said

diocese of Norwich, and the alternate patronage of the benefice (being a rectory) of Catfield, also situate in the said county of Norfolk and in the said diocese of Norwich.

"Whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Smallburgh is vested in the Right Reverend Bertram, Bishop of Norwich, in right of his Bishoprick.

of his Bishoprick.

"And whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the benefice (being a vicarage) of the remaining three parts of Felmingham aforesaid is vested in the said Bertram, Bishop of Norwich, in right of his said Bishoprick.

"And whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benetice of the Fourth Part of the rectory of Felmingham and one undivided moiety of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Catfield are vested for an estate in fee simple, free from incumbrances in Charles Maurice Jickling, of Smallburgh, in the said county of Norfolk, a Captain in Your Maiesty's Army.

"And whereas the remaining moiety of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Catfield is vested in the said Bertram, Bishop of Norwich, in right of his said Bishoprick.

"And whereas the said Bertram, Bishop of Norwich, and the said Charles Maurice Jickling

have respectively signified to us their desire that the patronage of the three said benefices of Smallburgh, Catfield, and the Fourth Part of the rectory of Felmingham may be rearranged by way of exchange in the manner which is hereinafter recommended and proposed.

"And whereas we have made due inquiry and calculation as to the circumstances and relative value of the said three benefices and of the patronage thereof respectively and we do hereby certify to Your Majesty in Council that the circumstances and present values of the said three benefices are as set forth in the schedule hereunto annexed.

"Now therefore, with the consent of the said Bertram, Bishop of Norwich, acting as such Bishop (in testimony whereof the said Bishop has affixed to this scheme his hand and episcopal seal) and with the consent of the said Charles Maurice Jickling (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of

Smallburgh and the church thereof shall be assigned and transferred from the said Ber-tram, Bishop of Norwich, and from his successors in the same Bishoprick, and shall become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time and at all times be exercised by the said Charles Maurice Jickling, his heirs and assigns for ever, and that in exchange for the same the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of the Fourth Part of the rectory of Felmingham and the church thereof and the said moiety of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Catfield and the church thereof, which is now vested in the said Charles Maurice Jickling as aforesaid, shall in like manner and upon and from the same date be assigned and transferred from the said Charles Maurice Jickling and shall become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time and at; all times be exercised by the said Bertram, Bishop of Norwich, and his successors in the same Bishoprick for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them or of any

other Act of Parliament.

"Whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Buckland is vested in the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Lincoln, and their successors.

"And whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Saint Margaret, Somerby, is vested in Your Majesty, Your heirs and successors in right of the Crown, and such right of patronage and presentation is exercised on behalf of Your Majesty by the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain for the time being.

"And whereas the said Dean and Chapter of Lincoln and the Right Honourable Robert Threshie, Earl Loreburn, now Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, acting on behalf of Your Majesty as aforesaid, have respectively signified to us their desire that the patronage of the said two benefices of Buckland and Saint Margaret, Somerby, may be rearranged by way of exchange in the manner which is hereinafter recommended and proposed.

"And whereas we have made due inquiry and calculation as to the circumstances and relative value of the said two benefices and of the patronage thereof respectively, and we do hereby certify to Your Majesty in Council that the circumstances and present values of the said two benefices are as set forth in the schedule hereunto annexed.

said benefice of Saint Margaret, Somerby, in Your Majesty's Books amounts to seven pounds seven shillings and sixpence.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Dean and Chapter of Lincoln (in testimony whereof they have caused their common or capitular seal to be affixed to this scheme) and with the consent of the said Robert Threshie, Earl Loreburn, acting as Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme, and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Buckland, and the church thereof, shall be assigned and trans-ferred from the said Dean and Chapter of Lincoln, and from their successors, and shallbecome and be absolutely vested in Your Majesty, Your heirs and successors, and shall and may from time to time and at all times be exercised on behalf of Your Majesty by the said Robert Threshie, Earl Loreburn, as Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain or other the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, for the time being, and that in exchange for the same the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Saint Margaret, Somerby, and the church thereof, shall in like manner and upon and from the same date be assigned and transferred from Your Majesty, Your heirs and successors, and shall become and beabsolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time and at all times be exercised by the said Dean and Chapter of Lincoln and their successors for ever.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His late Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter forty-nine; of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter sixty; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following representation as to the assignment of a district chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint John, Fishponds, situate in the new parish (sometime district chapelry) of Fishponds, in the diocese of Bristol.

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church of Saint John, Fishponds, situate as aforesaid.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend George Forrest, Bishop of Bristol (testified by his having signed and sealed this representation) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said new parish of Fishponds, which is described in the schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed,

should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church of Saint John, Fishponds, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint John, Fishponds.'

"And with the like consent of the said George Forrest, Bishop of Bristol (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent, that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said church of Saint John, Fishponds, situate as aforesaid, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being: Provided always, that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us the said Commissioners to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism or for the registration thereof.

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration and to make such Order with respect thereto as to Your Majesty, in Your Royal Wisdom, shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Saint John, Fishponds, being:—All that part of the new parish. (sometime district chapelry) of Fishponds, in the diocese of Bristol, which is bounded upon the east partly by the parish of Downend and partly by the district parish of Trinity, Kingswood, upon the south by the new parish of Two Mile Hill, upon the south-west by the parish of Saint George, upon the north-west partly by the consolidated chapelry of Saint Thomas the Apostle, Eastville, and partly by the consolidated chapelry of All Saints, Fishponds, all in the said diocese, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the north, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said consolidated chapelry of All Saints, Fishponds, from the said new parish of Fishponds at the centre of the bridge which carries Hockeys-lane across the Bristol and Birmingham Line of the Midland Railway, and extending thence eastward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of sixty-six chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said new parish of Fishponds from the said parish of Downend.'

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter seventy, of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-seven, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have pre-pared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following representation as to the assignment of a consolidated chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint James, Cross Roads cum Lees, situate within the new parish (sometime consolidated chapelry district) of Ingrow with Hainworth, in the county of York and in the diocese of Ripon.

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said new parish of Ingrow with Hainworth, of the new parish (sometime district chapelry) of Saint Michael, Haworth, and of the parish of Bingley, both in the said county and diocese, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such new parishes and

parish.

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain configuous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said new parish of Ingrow with Hainworth, of the said new parish of Saint Michael, Haworth, and of the said parish of Bingley, should be formed into a consolidated chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said church of Saint James, Cross Roads cum Lees, situate

as aforesaid.
"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend William Boyd, Bishop of Ripon, as such Bishop, and also as the patron in right of his See as well of the vicarage of the said new parish of Ingrow with Hainworth as of the vicarage of the said parish of Bingley, and with the consent of the Reverend Herbert Gresford Jones, Clerk in Holy Orders, vicar or incumbent of the vicarage of the parish of Saint Peter, Bradford, in the said county and diocese, as the patron of the rectory of the said new parish of Saint Michael, Haworth (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said new parish of Ingrow with Hainworth, of the said new

parish of Saint Michael, Haworth, and of the said parish of Bingley, which are described hereunder written, schedule which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one consolidated chapelry for the said church of Saint James, Cross Roads cum Lees, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint James, Cross Roads cum Lees.

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto as to Your Majesty in Your Royal Wisdom shall

seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The consolidated chapelry of Saint James, Cross Roads cum Lees, comprising:—All those contiguous portions of the new parish (sometime consolidated chapelry district), of Ingrow with Hainworth, of the new parish (sometime district chapelry) of Saint Michael, Haworth, and of the parish of Bingley, all in the county of York, and in the diocese of Ripon, which are comprised within and are bounded by an imaginary line commencing at or near the point where the River Worth is joined by the stream called Bridgehouse Beck, where the boundaries of the new parish of Oakworth, in the said county and diocese, the said new parish of Saint Michael, Haworth, and the said new parish of Ingrow with Hainextending worth all meet, and generally southward along the middle of Bridgehouse Beck (thereby following in part the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Michael, Haworth, from the said new parish of Ingrow with Hainworth) for a distance of thirty-nine chains and a half or thereabouts to a point opposite to the middle of the street which leads into the road called Mill Hey at its junction with Victoria Road, and extending thence south-eastward to and along the middle of such street for a distance of two chains and a quarter or thereabouts to its junction with Mill Hey and Victoria Road, and extending thence south-east-ward along the middle of Victoria Road for a distance of five chains and a quarter or there-abouts to its junction with Cliff Street, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Cliff Street for a distance of nine chains and a quarter or thereabouts to its junction with Hebden Road, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Hebden Road for a distance of six chains or thereabouts to its junction with Dean Street and with the footpath leading into the road running from Haworth to Flappit Spring, and extending thence first south-eastward, then north-eastward and then southward along the middle of the said footpath for a distance of seven chains and three-quarters or thereabouts to its junction with the last-mentioned road, and extending thence first north-eastward and then south-eastward along the middle of such road (thereby following in part the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Michael, Haworth, from an isolated portion of the said parish of Bingley) for a distance of sixty-seven chains or thereabouts to its junction at Flappit Spring with Halifax Road

upon the boundary which divides the said: isolated portion of the parish of Bingley from the new parish of Cullingworth, in the said county and diocese, and extending thence first north-eastward and then in various directions along the last-mentioned boundary (thereby following in part the middle of Halifax Road and in part the middle of Staples Lane) for a distance of fifty-eight chains and a half or thereabouts to the point where such boundary meets the boundary which divides the said new parish of Cullingworth from the said new parish of Ingrow with Hainworth, and extending thence generally eastward along the lastmentioned boundary and along the boundary which divides the said new parish of Cullingworth from the said parish of Bingley for a distance in all of fifty-seven chains or thereabouts to the point near the house called Eller the last-mentioned boundary Carr where crosses the middle of Keighley Road, and extending thence northward along the middle of Keighley Road for a distance of fifty-two chains and a half or thereabouts to the point where such road is crossed by the boundary which divides the said parish of Bingley from the said new parish of Ingrow with Hainworth, and extending thence northward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of eight chains and a half or thereabouts to the point where it crosses the middle of the road leading from Ryecroft to Hainworth, and exthence north-westward along the middle of the last-mentioned road for a distance of forty-five chains and a quarter or thereabouts to its junction at Hainworth with the road leading to Hill Top and Hainworth Crag, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the last-mentioned road for a distance of twelve chains or thereabouts to its junction near Hill Top with the road leading past the eastern side of the house and premises known as The Whins towards Cross Roads, and extending thence first north-west-ward and then south-westward along the middle of the last-mentioned road for a distance of twenty-one chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the south-eastern end of the fence forming the north-eastern boundary of the close numbered 1473 upon the ordnance map of the civil parish of Keighley published in the year one thousand nine hundred and eight upon the scale of twenty-five inches to a mile and also upon the map or plan which is annexed to this representation, and extending thence first northwestward to and along the said fence and then in various directions along the fences forming the northern boundaries of the closes numbered 1471 and 1470 upon the said maps for a distance in all of six chains and a quarter or thereabouts to the north-western end of the fence forming the northern boundary of the said close numbered 1470, and extending thence westward in a straight line for a distance of one chain and three-quarters or thereabouts to the point where the fence forming the southern boundary of the close numbered 1467 upon the said maps meets the western side of Hainworth Crag Road, and extending thence north-westward along the last-mentioned fence and along the wall or fence forming the southern boundary of the house and premises known as number 223, Halifax Road, for a distance of one chain and a half or thereabouts to the point where such wall or fence meets the eastern side of Halifax Road,

WHEREAS by Section 2 of the Poisons and Pharmacy Act, 1908, it is, amongst other things, enacted that "so much of the Pharmacy Act, 1868, as makes it an offence for any person to sell or keep open shop for the sale of poisons, unless he is a duly registered pharmaceutical chemist or chemist and druggist, and conforms to Regulations made under Section 1 of that Act, shall not apply in the case of poisonous substances to be used exclusively in agriculture or horticulture for the destruction of insects, fungi or bacteria, or as sheep dips or weed killers, which are poisonous by reason of their containing arsenic, tobacco or the alkaloids of tobacco, if the person so selling or keeping open shop is duly licensed for the purpose under this section by a local authority, and conforms to any Regulations as to the keeping, transporting and selling of poisons made under this section, but nothing in this section shall exempt any person so licensed from the requirements of any other provision of the Pharmacy Act, 1868, or of the Arsenic Act, 1851, relating to poisons;" and that "His Majesty may by Order in Council make Regulations as to-

"(a) the granting of licences under this

section; and
"(b) the duration, renewal, revocation, suspension, extent and production of such licences; and

"(c) the keeping, inspection and copying

of registers of licences; and

"(d) the fees to be charged for licences and for inspection and copying of registers;

"(e) the keeping, transporting and selling of the poisonous substances to which this section applies;

" and generally for the purposes of carrying

this section into effect.'

1. 2.—(1) Where the applicant for a licence under Section 2 of the Poisons and Pharmacy Act, 1908, is a person in the employment of a person who has obtained a licence under that section, the application shall be made in the second form set out in Schedule A to these Regulations, and the forms of licences, applications for the renewal of licences, and renewals of licences, shall be those set out in Schedules B, C, and D to these Regulations, and the maximum fee charged for the grant of a licence shall be 5s. instead of the maximum fee specified in the principal Regulations, and so much of the principal Regulations as requires an applicant to publish notice of his intention to apply for a licence in two newspapers shall not apply.

(2) A licence granted to such an applicant as aforesaid shall not continue in force after the licence of the person in whose employment he is is revoked or whilst it is suspended.

(3.) The following Regulation shall be substituted in place of No. 14 of the principal Regulations:-

A poisonous substance shall not be sold except in an enclosed vessel or receptacle as received from the manufacturer, distinctly labelled with the name of the substance and the word "Poison," and with the name and address of the seller, as provided by Section 17 of the Pharmacy Act, 1868, and also with a notice of the special purpose for which it has been prepared. For the purposes of this Regulation the person on whose behalf any sale is made shall be deemed to be the seller.

Sections I, II, III and IV of the Arsenic Act,

I. Every Person who shall sell any Arsenic shall forthwith, and before the Delivery of such Arsenic to the Purchaser, enter or cause to be entered in a fair and regular Manner, in a Book or Books to be kept by such Person for that Purpose, in the Form set forth in the Schedule to this Act, or to the like Effect, a Statement of such Sale, with the Quantity of Arsenic so sold, and the Purpose for which such Arsenic is required or stated to be required, and the Day of the Month and Year of the Sale, and the Name, Place of Abode, and Condition or Occupation of the Purchaser, into all which Circumstances the Person selling such Arsenic is hereby required and authorized to inquire of the Purchaser before the Delivery to such Purchaser of the Arsenic sold, and such Entries shall in every Case be signed by the Person making the same, and shall also be signed by the Purchaser, unless such Purchaser profess to be unable to write (in which Case the Person making the Entries hereby required shall add to the Particulars to be entered in relation to such Sale the Words "cannot write", and, where a Witness is hereby required to the Sale, shall also be signed by such Witness, together with his Place of Abode.

II. No Person shall sell Arsenic to any Person who is unknown to the Person selling such Arsenic, unless the Sale be made in the Presence of a Witness who is known to the Person selling the Arsenic, and to whom the Purchaser is known, and who signs his Name, together with his Place of Abode, to such Entries, before the Delivery of the Arsenic to the Purchaser, and no Person shall sell Arsenic to any Person other than a Person of full Age.

III. No Person shall sell any Arsenic unless the same be before the Sale thereof mixed with Soot or Indigo in the Proportion of One Ounce of Soot or Half an Ounce of Indigo at the least to One Pound of the Arsenic, and so in proportion for any greater or less Quantity: Provided always, that where such Arsenic is stated by the Purchaser to be required, not for Use in Agriculture, but for some other Purpose for which such Admixture would, according to the Representation of the Purchaser, render it unfit, such Arsenic may be sold without such

Admixture in a Quantity of not less than Ten

Pounds at any One Time.

TV. If any Person shall sell any Arsenic, save as authorized by this Act, or on any Sale of Arsenic shall deliver the same without having made and signed the Entries hereby required on such Sale, or without having obtained such Signature or Signatures to such Entries as required by this Act, or if any Person purchasing any Arsenic shall give false Information to the Person selling the same in relation to the Particulars which such lastmentioned Person is hereby authorized to inquire into of such Purchaser, or if any Person shall sign his Name as aforesaid as a Witness to a Sale of Arsenic to a Person unknown to the Person so signing as Witness, every Person so offending shall for every such Offence, upon a summary Conviction for the same before Two Justices of the Peace in England or Ireland, or before Two Justices of the Peace or the Sheriff in Scotland, be liable to a Penalty not exceeding Twenty Pounds.

Section 17 of the Pharmacy Act, 1868.

It shall be unlawful to sell any Poison, either by Wholesale or by Retail, unless the Box, Bottle, Vessel, Wrapper, or Cover in which such Poison is contained be distinctly labelled with the name of the Article and the Word Poison, and with the Name and Address of the Seller of the Poison; and it shall be unlawful to sell any Poison of those which are in the First Part of Schedule (A.) to this Act, or may hereafter be added thereto under Section Two of this Act, to any Person unknown to the Seller, unless introduced by some Person known to the Seller; and on every Sale of any such Article the Seller shall, before Delivery, make or cause to be made an Entry in a Book to be kept for that Purpose stating, in the Form set forth in Schedule (F.) to this Act, the Date of the Sale, the Name and Address of the Purchaser, the Name and Quantity of the Article sold, and the Purpose for which it is stated by the Purchaser to be required, to which Entry the Signature of the Purchaser and of the Person, if any, who introduced him shall be affixed; and any Person selling Poison otherwise than is herein provided shall, upon a summary Conviction before Two Justices of the Peace in England or the Sheriff in Scotland, be liable to a Penalty not exceeding Five Pounds for the First Offence, and to a Penalty not exceeding Ten Pounds for the Second or any subsequent Offence, and for the Purposes of this Section the Person on whose Behalf any Sale is made by any Apprentice or Servant shall be deemed to be the Seller; but the Provisions of this Section, which are solely applicable to Poisons in the First Part of the Schedule (A.) to this Act, or which require that the Label shall contain the Name and Address of the Seller, shall not apply to Articles to be exported from Great Britain by Wholesale Dealers, nor to Sales by wholesale to retail Dealers in the ordinary Course of wholesale Dealing, nor shall any of the Provisions of this Section apply to any Medicine supplied by a legally qualified Apothecary to his Patient, nor apply to any Article when forming Part of the Ingredients of any Medicine dispensed by a Person registered under this Act; provided such Medicine be labelled, in the Manner aforesaid, with the Name and Address of the Seller, and the Ingredients thereof be entered, with the Name of the Person to whom it is sold or delivered, in a Book to be kept by the Seller for that Purpose; and nothing in this Act contained shall repeal or affect any of the Provisions of an Act of the Session holden in the Fourteenth and Fifteenth Years of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled An Act to regulate the Sale of Arsenic.

His Majesty The KING has been pleased to award the Edward Medal of the Second Class to Thomas Barker under the following circumstances:—

On the 3rd July last a bobbin carrier named Whitehead, employed at the Hawk Cotton

Spinning Factory, Shaw, Lancashire, slipped-while entering the hoist cage on the third floor and, clutching the starting chain, set the hoist in motion. Whitehead fell forward, and, the doors of the hoist having closed automatically, he became tightly wedged between the top of the doorway and the cage floor. Barker, a spinner, seeing what had happened, rushed to Whitehead's assistance, but found he could neither open nor shut the hoist doors. Squeezing through the small opening between the doors, Barker stood on a very narrow ledge where he ran a grave risk of falling down the open hoist-well, a depth at this landing of 60 feet. He managed to get hold of the chains, and by exercise of all his strength to lower the hoist cage until, with the aid of other helpers, Whitehead could be lifted away, though he afterwards succumbed to the serious injuries he had sustained.

His Majesty The KING has also been pleased to award the Edward Medal of the Second Class to George Jones and Hugh Roberts.

On the 5th August, 1910, a serious explosion, causing the loss of two lives, occurred at the Main Coal Colliery, Northop, near Flint, owing to the ignition of fire damp by a shot fired to bring down coal. Jones, the fireman in charge at the time of the explosion, was severely injured; but, although a fire was known to be burning in the mine, he returned twice to the workings in search of one of the men under his charge who was believed to be missing. On the second occasion Jones was accompanied by Roberts, a timberman, who subsequently went again into the mine in order to extinguish the fire.

The Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of Dorset) Order, 1911.

Dated 14th November, 1911.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1908, and upon application by the Council of the Administrative County of Dorset, I hereby make the following Order:—

Title.

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of Dorset) Order, 1911."

BIRDS.

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

II. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the administrative county of Dorset to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the Schedule to the Act:—Cirl Bunting, Common Bunting, Reed Bunting, Common Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Chiffchaff,

III.—(a) The period during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall be extended throughout the administrative county of Dorset, so far as regards the Birds added to the Schedule of the Act by Clause II of this Order, and all the Birds mentioned in the said Schedule, except the Golden Plover, Snipe, Wild Duck (all species), and Wood-cock, so as to be between the 31st day of January and the 1st day of September in any

(b) So far as regards the Golden Plover, Snipe, Wild Duck (all species), and Woodcock, the close time shall be altered so as to be between the last day of February and the 1st

day of September in any year.

Hoopoe, Kingfisher, Wood Lark, Nightjar (Goatsucker, Night Hawk, Fern Owl), Golden Oriole, Osprey, Barn Owl, Long-eared Owl, Wood Owl, Raven, Spoonbill, Bearded Tit, Dartford Warbler, Green Woodpecker, Great Spotted Woodpecker, Lesser Spotted Woodpecker.

Certain Eggs protected throughout the County.

VI. The taking or destroying of the eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the administrative county of Dorset:—Cirl Bunting, Corn Bunting, Reed Bunting, Chough, Coot, Curlew, Stone Curlew (Thick-knee), Dipper, Wild Duck, Peregrine Falcon, Spotted Flycatcher, Guillemot, Hen Harrier, Montagu's Harrier, Hoopoe, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Sky Lark, Wood Lark, Nightingale, Nightjar (Goatsucker, Night Hawk, Fern Owl), Nuthatch, Long-eared Owl, Barn Owl, Tawny Owl, Oyster Catcher, Pochard, Raven, Razorbill, Puffin, Ringed Plover, Sheldrake, Red-backed Shrike, Snipe, Dartford Warbler, Grasshopper Warbler, Reed Warbler, Willow Warbler, Wood Warbler, Whinchat, Woodcock, Great Spotted Woodpecker, Lesser Spotted Woodpecker, Green Woodpecker, and (after April 15th in each year) Lapwing (Peewit or Green Plover).

All Eggs protected in Certain Areas.

VII. The taking or destroying of the eggs of any species of Wild Bird is prohibited within the undermentioned areas for a period of five years from the date of this Order:

(a) The districts or areas known as the Chesil Bank, together with East and West The coast or cliffs from the Chesil Bank around the Island of Portland to Portland Roads. The coast of Portland Roads from Portland Castle to Bincleave Rocks, thence around the Weymouth Backwater and Lodmoor to Preston Beach and the coast and cliffs to Redcliff Point.

From thence the coast and cliffs to St. Albans Head, Durlston Head, Swanage, and Studland Bays, to Little Sea.

And in every case a distance of 2 furlongs inland from the nearest point of high water mark or edge of marsh land.

(b) The district or area within a line drawn from the coast at the south end of Little Sea to Claywell, thence to a point in the road opposite the south end of Wytch Fir Pound, thence along the road to Corfe Castle through Wareham to Stroud Bridge on to the Bere and Wareham main road (including Green Pond, situate on the Rempstone Estate, Corfe Castle), theuce to Wych, along the road to Corfe Castle through Wareham to Stroud Bridge, on the Bere and Wareham main road, thence to a point on the Poole and Dorchester main road about 3 furlongs westward from Morden Mill, thence along the said Poole and Dorchester main road to Morden Mill, Park Corner, Slepe, North Holton Farm, Lytchett Minster through Upton to Fleets Corner, Longfleet and Poole, thence along the main road from Poole to the county boundary at Bournemouth, and along such boundary to the coast; which said districts and areas are outlined in red on five Ordnance Sheets, numbered 328, 329, 341, 342, and 343 respectively, deposited with the Clerk of the County Council, each sheet being sealed with

N.B.—These Regulations are liable to alteration at any time.

- 1. Competitive examinations of candidates for situations in the different public Departments will be held at such times and at such places as may be deemed expedient. Before every such examination Special Regulations will be issued, in which the particular conditions of the competition will be specified.
- 2. These examinations will have reference either to the vacancies existing at the time of the examination, or to the number which may be estimated as likely to occur within any period not exceeding six months after the commencement of the examination, or to vacancies occurring within any period not exceeding six months from the date of the announcement of the result of the examination.
- 3. These examinations are open to all natural-born or naturalized British subjects, being of the requisite age, health and character, subject to such restrictions as are herein contained, and to Special Regulations affecting the particular situations.
 - (i.) The following persons are ineligible:—

Members of the Royal Irish Constabulary of less than five years' service.

- (ii.) The following classes of persons are eligible under certain conditions only, that is to say:—
 - (a) Persons actually serving in the Army.
 - (b) Persons actually serving in the Navy.
- (c) Persons holding situations in the Civil Service.

- (d) Members of the Royal Irish Constabulary of more than five years' service.
- (e) Probationary Engineer Cadets in the Navy and apprentices in His Majesty's Dockyards.
- (f) Persons who have entered upon or completed a course of education or training for the occupation of teacher, on account of which grants are payable from the Exchequer.

So much of the road from Petworth to Midhurst as extends from its junction with Pound Street to a point opposite Cricketers' Lodge; and

Lombard Street, Market Place, New Street, Damers Bridge, Saddlers Row and East Street.

ORDER OF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT BOARD: Notification and Treatment of Pulmonary Tuberculosis.

GENERAL ORDER.

To the Councils of the several administrative counties in England and Wales;— To the Mayor, Aldermen and Commons of

the City of London, in Common Council assembled;—

To the Councils of the several Metropolitan Boroughs;—

To the Councils of the several Municipal Boroughs and other Urban Districts in England and Wales;—

To the Councils of the several Rural Districts in England and Wales;—
To all Medical Practitioners;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS We, the Local Government | Board, are empowered by section 130 of the

Public Health Act, 1875, as amended by the Public Health Act, 1896, from time to time, to make, alter and revoke Regulations with a view to the treatment of persons affected with any endemic or infectious disease and for preventing the spread of the disease; and to provide for the enforcement and execution of the Regulations;

And whereas Tuberculosis is an endemic disease and that form of the disease which is known as Pulmonary Tuberculosis is an infec-

tious disease;

And whereas by the Public Health (Tuberculosis) Regulations, 1908, and by the Public Health (Tuberculosis in Hospitals) Regulations, 1911, We made certain Regulations for preventing the spread of Pulmonary Tuberculosis;

And whereas it appears to Us to be expedient that such further Regulations as are hereinafter set forth should be made in relation to Pulmonary Tuberculosis:

NOW THEREFORE, We, by this Our Order and in the exercise of the powers conferred upon Us by the Public Health Act, 1875, the Public Health (London) Act, 1891, and the Public Health Act, 1896, and of every other power enabling Us in that behalf, do make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

Definitions.

ARTICLE I.—In these Regulations, unless the contrary intention appears:—

(a) Words importing the masculine gender include females;

(b) Words in the singular include the plural, and words in the plural include the singular;

(c) Expressions referring to writing include references to printing, and to other modes of representing or reproducing words in a visible form, and references to printing include references to other mechanical modes of so representing or reproducing words;

of so representing or reproducing words;
(d) The expression "Council" means, as the case may be, the Mayor, Aldermen and Commons of the city of London in Common Council assembled, the Council of a Metropolitan Borough, the Council of a Municipal Borough or other Urban District, or the Council of a Rural District;

Council of a Rural District;

(e) The expression "area" means the area subject to the jurisdiction of the Council for the purposes of the Public Health (London) Act, 1891, or of the Public Health Act,

1875, as the case may be;
(f) The expression "Medical Practitioner" means registered Medical Practitioner;

(g) The expression "Medical Officer of Health" means Medical Officer of Health of a Council:

(h) The expression "School Medical Inspector" means any medical practitioner appointed under section 13 of the Education (Administrative Provisions) Act, 1907, to undertake the medical inspection of children attending a Public Elementary School;

(i) The expression "the Poor Law Regu-

(i) The expression "the Poor Law Regulations" means the Public Health (Tuberculosis) Regulations, 1908, and the expression "the Hospital Regulations" means the Public Health (Tuberculosis in Hospitals) Regulations, 1911;

(j) The expressions "Poor Law Institution" and "Hospital" have the same meaning respectively as in the Poor Law Regulations and the Hospital Regulations;

(k) The expression "place of residence," where used in relation to a person notified, means the place of residence as described in the notification unless and until it has been proved to have been incorrectly described.

Commencement of Regulations.

ARTICLE II.—These Regulations shall come into operation on the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and twelve, and, subject to the provisions of Article XIV., shall then and thereafter apply and have effect throughout England and Wales, and shall be enforced and executed by every Council and their officers.

Supply of Forms of Notification. ARTICLE III.—For the purposes of these Regulations-

i.) Every Council shall provide and maintain a sufficient supply of printed copies of the forms set forth in the Schedules A

and B to these Regulations;

(ii.) Every Council shall as soon as practicable after these Regulations come into operation, and afterwards from time to time when application is made to them, supply printed copies of the form set forth in the Schedule A to these Regulations to every Medical Practitioner resident within the area of the Council, and printed copies of the form set forth in the Schedule B to these Regulations to the School Medical Inspector or Inspectors of every Public Elementary School situate within the area of the Council.

Notification by Medical Practitioners (including School Medical Inspectors).

ARTICLE IV.—(1) Subject as provided in Articles X., XI., and XII. of these Regulations every Medical Practitioner attending on or called in to visit any person shall, within forty-eight hours after first becoming aware that such person is suffering from Pulmonary Tuberculosis, complete, sign and transmit a notification of the case in the form shown in the Schedule A to these Regulations to the Medical Officer of Health for the area within which the place of residence of the person is

Provided that a Medical Practitioner shall not be required under these Regulations to notify any case of Pulmonary Tuberculosis which has already, to his knowledge, under these Regulations or under the Poor Law Regulations or under the Hospital Regulations, been notified to the Medical Officer of Health for the area within which the place of

residence of the patient is situate.

(2) Every Medical Practitioner who is a School Medical Inspector shall, within the period of forty-eight hours after he has inspected any children attending a Public Elementary School, complete and sign a notification in the form shown in the Schedule B to these Regulations of all cases of Pulmonary Tuberculosis of which he became aware during the course of the inspection, and shall transmit the notification to the Medical Officer of Health for the area within which the Public Elementary School is situate.

ARTICLE V.—A notification to be transmitted to a Medical Officer of Health in pursuance of these Regulations may be transmitted by being delivered to that Officer, or by being delivered at his office or residence, or may be sent by prepaid letter post addressed to him at his office or at his residence.

Remuneration of Medical Practitioners.

ARTICLE VI.—The Council of the area within which the place of residence of the patient is situate shall pay to the Medical Practitioner the sum of two shillings and sixpence in respect of each notification sent by him in pursuance of these Regulations, and the said sum shall in every case be deemed to cover all expenses, including the cost of transmission:

Provided that no fee shall be payable under this Article to a School Medical Inspector.

Duties of Medical Officers of Health.

ARTICLE VII.—(1) A Medical Officer of Health who receives from a Medical Practitioner a notification relating to a patient whose place of residence is not within the area for which he is Medical Officer of Health, shall forthwith transmit the notification to the Medical Officer of Health for the area in which the place of residence of the patient is situate, and shall at the same time inform the Medical Practitioner that he has done so, and shall give to him the name and address of the Medical Officer of Health to whom the notification has been sent. Any expenses incurred by a Medical Officer of Health in carrying out the duties imposed upon him by this sub-division shall be defrayed by the Council of the area for

which he is Medical Officer of Health.

(2) Every Medical Officer of Health shall enter in a register, to be kept by him for that purpose, the full particulars contained in every notification received by him under these regulations or under the Poor Law Regulations or under the Hospital Regulations and relating to a patient whose place of residence is situate within the area for which he is Medical Officer of Health. The said Register shall be kept in the custody of the Medical Officer of Health, and shall not be open to inspection by any person other than a person specially authorized by resolution of the Council, the Medical Officer Health for the Administrative County within which the area is situate, any School Medical Inspector acting within the area, or an Officer of the Local Government Board or of the Board of Education.

(3) The Medical Officer of Health for every area within the Administrative County of London shall, as soon as practicable after the end of each week, send to the Medical Officer of Health for the Administrative County of London a statement of every notification received by him during the week in pursuance of these Regulations and relating to a patient whose place of residence is situate within the area for which he is Medical Officer of Health. Such statement shall contain the address, age and sex of the patient and the date of the notification.

ARTICLE VIII .-- Upon the receipt of a notification under these Regulations or under the Poor Law Regulations or under the Hospital Regulations the Medical Officer of Health, or an Officer acting under the instructions of the Medical Officer of Health, shall make such inquiries and take such steps as may appear to him to be necessary or desirable for preventing the spread of infection and for removing conditions favourable to infection;

Provided that nothing in this Article shall

be deemed to authorize a Medical Officer of Health or other Officer to take any of the steps herein mentioned at any Poor Law Institution or any Hospital.

Special Powers of Councils.

ARTICLE IX .-- (1) For the purposes of these Regulations and of the Poor Law Regulations and of the Hospital Regulations a Council, on the advice of their Medical Officer of Health, may supply all such medical or other assistance, and all such facilities and articles as may reasonably be required for the detection of Pulmonary Tuberculosis, and for preventing the spread of infection and for removing conditions favourable to infection, and for that purpose may appoint such officers, do such acts and make such arrangements as may be necessary:

Provided that nothing in this sub-division shall be deemed to authorize a Council to take any of the measures herein mentioned at any Poor Law Institution or any Hospital.

(2) A Council, on the advice of their Medical Officer of Health, may provide and publish or distribute in the form of placards, handbills, or leaflets, suitable summaries of information and instruction respecting Pulmonary Tuberculosis, and the precautions to be taken against the spread of infection from that disease.

Limitation of Scope of Regulations.

ARTICLE X .- Nothing in these Regulations shall apply to or impose any duty or obligation upon any Medical Practitioner acting in his capacity as-

(a) Medical Officer of a Poor Law Institution or District Medical Officer;

(b) Medical Officer of a Hospital;

c) Medical Officer of one of His Majesty's Prisons or of a Certified Reformatory School;

(d) Medical Officer of an Institution for

Lunatics;

(e) Medical Examiner of candidates for

some office or appointment;
(f) Medical Examiner on behalf of an Insurance Company of a person proposing to insure his life at the risk of that Company;

(g) Medical Examiner of the passengers and crew of an emigrant ship.

ARTICLE XI.—Nothing in these Regulations or in the Hospital Regulations shall have effect so as to require a notification to be transmitted to a Medical Officer of Health in respect of any person whose place of residence is not situated in England or Wales.

ARTICLE XII.—Nothing in these Regulations shall have effect so as to require a notification to be transmitted to a Medical Officer of Health in respect of any inmate of any building, ship, vessel, boat, tent, van, shed or similar structure belonging to His Majesty the King.

Exception and Application of Enactments.

ARTICLE XIII.—Nothing in these Regulations shall have effect so as to apply, or so as to authorize or require a Medical Officer of Health or a Council, or any other person or authority, directly or indirectly, to put in force with respect to any patient in relation to whom a notification in pursuance of these Regulations has been transmitted to a Medical Officer of Health, any enactment which renders \

the patient, or a person in charge of the patient, or any other person, liable to a penalty, cr subjects the patient to any restriction, prohibition, or disability affecting himself, or his employment, occupation or means of livelihood, on the ground of his suffering from Pulmonary Tuberculosis.

Modifications Consequent upon Local Acts.

ARTICLE XIV.—Nothing in these Regulations shall have effect in derogation of any power conferred, or of any obligation imposed with respect to Pulmonary Tuberculosis by a Local Act.

Subject as aforesaid and subject to the condition set forth in Article XIII., these Regulations shall apply and have effect in relation to every area in which a Local Act containing provisions with respect to Pulmonary Tuberculosis is in force:

Provided that, on the application of the Council for the area We may, by Order, direct that, after the date fixed by the Order, these Regulations, or so much thereof as is specified in the Order, shall cease to apply to the area, or shall apply to the area with such modifications as are specified in the Order.

Short Title.

ARTICLE XV.—These Regulations may be cited as "the Public Health (Tuberculosis) Regulations, 1911."

(Purchase of the Water and Markets Undertakings and other Properties of the Duke of Bedford at Tavistock, and vesting same in the Tavistock Urban District Council; Supply of Water; Limits of Supply; Maintenance and Improvement of Existing Works; Provisions for Protection of Waterworks and Water; Rates and Charges; Supply of Fittings; Provisions for Management and Regulation of Markets and Fairs; Tolls, Rates and Charges; Power to Acquire further Lands; Provisions as to Maintenance and User of Public Lands and Properties, Town Hall, Letting of Public Buildings, Bands and Concerts Baths; Recreation Grounds; Borrowing of Money, Sinking Funds and other Financial Provisions; General Provisions for the better Administration of the District; Bye-laws and Penalties; Incorporation, Amendment and Repeal of Acts, &c.)

OTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the ensuing Session by the urban district council of the urban district of Tavistock, in the county of Devon (in this notice referred to as "the Council"), for leave to bring in a Bill for all or some of the following purposes,

namely: -

1. To empower the Council to purchase and acquire and to provide for the transfer to and vesting in the Council of the water undertaking works, mains, lands, pipes, easements, property (both real and personal), rights, powers and authorities of the Duke of Bedford and his trustees (in this notice referred to as "the Duke"), for such price or consideration, and upon and subject to such terms, conditions and stipulations as may be prescribed by the Bill, or as may be agreed upon between the Council and the Duke, or as may be settled by arbitration or otherwise, and to provide that the Duke shall sell and transfer the same accordingly, and to define what is to be comprised in the expression "the water undertaking of the Duke."

2. To make further provision with regard to the transfer of the water undertaking of the Duke, and other undertakings and properties proposed to be acquired by the Council from the Duke, and to provide for the payment of the purchase money, the discharge of all debts and liabilities, the payment of outgoings up to the completion of the purchase the continuance of contracts, and generally to provide for the maintenance of the under-

takings until the transfer.

3. To provide for the apportionment of the rent and water charges in respect of houses let by the Duke at an inclusive rent, and to enable the Council to collect and recover from any householder the proportion of water charges so apportioned with all necessary pro-

visions in connection therewith.

4. To make special provision for the protection of the Duke and the owner and occupier of Kilworthy House and other persons having rights in the waters of the Kilworthy Leat, and to restrict the power of any person to interfere with or abstract water from the said leat or the Wallabrook River, and to pro-

vide for the fencing of lands to be acquired by the Council.

5. To provide that no person shall, without the consent of the Council, sink or make any well, shaft, bore or other excavation, or work in any lands adjoining the waterworks whereby any springs of water may be tapped or interfered with, and to impose penalties in respect

of any breach thereof.

6. To authorize the Council to take from the Tavistock Canal near the point at which the water of the canal enters the existing culvert such quantity of water as the Council may reasonably require, in order to pump a supply of water to the Whitchurch Down Estate and other parts of the limits of supply of the Council, and to require the Duke to keep the said canal maintained and repaired and to indemnify the Council against any failure, and to empower the Council to enter, to cleanse, repair and renew the works connected with the existing pumping apparatus.

7. To authorize the Council to supply water for all purposes within the urban district of Tavistock and the parishes of Tavistock Hamlets and Whitchurch in the county of Devon.

8. To authorize the Council to maintain, renew, extend, enlarge, alter and repair the waterworks comprised in the water undertaking of the Duke, and to construct such subsidiary works as may be necessary or convenient in connection therewith, and with certain limitations as prescribed by the Bill to use the same for the purpose of taking, intercepting and impounding any water that can be taken, intercepted or impounded by

means of any of such works.

9. To authorize the Council to purchase and take on lease lands and easements for any of the purposes of the intended Act, and to enter into and carry into effect agreements with respect to the drainage of any lands within the drainage area of the reservoirs and other waterworks authorized to be acquired or provided by them under this Act, and to hold, let, sell or dispose of any lands, houses, buildings or works for the time being belonging to them, and not required for the purposes of their undertaking, and on such sale or disposal to reserve water and other rights.

10. To empower the Council to make byelaws for the prevention of pollution of the sources of supply and to enable them to discharge water from their water works into any

stream or watercourse.

11. To make general provisions in regard to the supply of water by the Council, and particularly with respect to the following matters:—

Limiting the powers of the Council to abstract water; the pressure at which water is to be supplied; the provision of cisterns for high level supplies; the detection of waste; the power to make bye-laws for preventing waste of water; the terms on which water may be supplied by meter and the supply to houses partly used for trade; the connecting and disconnecting of meters; the laying of mains and pipes in private streets; the purchase, sale, supply, letting, fixing, altering and repair by the Council of meters, baths, cisterns, pipes, sanitary and other fittings; the provision of separate communication pipes for each house; agreements for supply in bulk; requiring notice to be given by consumers of discontinuance of supply; imposing penalties for the injuring of meters; making provision

as to owners paying water charges on small houses; and with regard to the proper registration of meters; empowering Council to enter houses to remove meters and fittings; and to require that houses shall not be occupied without a proper water supply.

- 12. To authorize the Council to levy and recover rates, rents and charges for the supply of water for domestic or other purposes by a charge fixed according to the rateable or annual value of the house supplied, or by a charge per thousand gallons for the water consumed or taken by a supply by meter; to prescribe an additional charge for water supplied for washing horses, carriages or motor cars or for other purposes in stables or premises where horses, carriages or motor cars are kept, or for garden purposes, or if a hose pipe or similar apparatus is used; to levy increased charges for water supplied to houses on Whitchurch Down Estate; to levy and recover charges for the supply of meters and fittings, to increase, reduce or alter such rates, rents or charges, and to allow discounts and to compound for the payment of rates on small houses.
- 13. To empower the Council to purchase and acquire and to provide for the transfer to and vesting in the Council of the Cattle Market, the New Market, the Corn Market and the Slaughter-houses and other property of the Duke held in connection therewith, and all other the market franchises, lands, buildings, fixtures, apparatus and effects, together with all easements, rights and and privileges appertaining thereto (in this Notice referred to as "the market undertaking of the Duke ") vested in or belonging to or held or enjoyed by the Duke at the appointed day for or in connection with markets and fairs in the district or in the manors of Tavistock and Hurdwick for such price or consideration and upon and subject to such terms, conditions and stipulations as may be expressed in or provided by or under the provisions of the Bill or as may be agreed upon by the Council and the Duke or as may be settled by arbitration or otherwise, and to provide that the Duke shall sell and transfer the same accordingly, with all such stipulations and provisions as are applicable in the case of the transfer of the water undertaking of the Duke or in connection therewith, and particularly in regard to the maintenance of the market undertaking of the Duke until the transfer.
- 14. To authorize the Council to carry on the market undertaking of the Duke and to exercise all the rights, powers, and privileges of the Duke with regard to markets within the district, and to provide for the management and regulation of the said markets and any additional markets which may be established by the Council.
- 15. To enable the Council to demand and levy tolls or charges from any person selling or offering for sale in any highway or public place any cattle, sheep, pigs or marketable articles, and to make provision for the recovery of such tolls or charges.
- 16. To prohibit the holding of markets and fairs other than those of the Council in the district or within the area of three miles from the parish church at Tavistock, and to enable the Council to grant licences for the holding of markets and fairs and for selling

horses, cattle and other marketable commodities.

- 17. To confer upon the Council further powers with regard to their markets, and particularly to enable the Council to let the markets or market buildings or any stall, standing, site or other convenience connected therewith, or the tolls, rents and charges receivable in respect thereof; to require that tolls shall be payable by successive sellers; to prescribe penalties for the evasion of payment of tolls; to empower the Council to take possession of stalls for non-payment of rent; to provide for the forfeiture of commodities left in the market; to prevent the disturbance of markets or fairs; to enable the Council to exclude old and diseased animals from the markets and fairs, and to authorize the Council to make bye-laws relating to markets and fairs and sales by auction therein.
- 18. To empower the Council to purchase and acquire and to provide for the transfer to and vesting in the Council of the following lands and hereditaments and premises (in this Notice referred to as "the public lands and properties"), that is to say:—

(1) The Council offices situate in Drake-

road.

(2) The Town Hall and offices connected therewith situate in Bedford-square.

(3) The following houses and premises adjoining the Town Hall and Market:—No. 3, Bedford-square, Nos. 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17 and 18, Duke-street, and the butchers' shops Nos. 1-21, Market Colonnade.

- (4) The refreshment room adjoining the market.
- (5) The yard and buildings south of the canal known as the Wharf in Canal-road, together with a right of way (in common with others) over the bridge across the canal so long as the Council shall keep such bridge in repair.

(6) The land and premises known as Frog Meadow containing four acres and one rood on the north side of the canal and lying between the canal and the Plymouth-road.

- (7) The land and premises known as "Jessop's Hay" or "the Meadows," containing ten acres one rood and twenty-seven perches and situate on the south side of the canal.
- (8) The swimming bath and buildings connected therewith adjoining the Union Workhouse, together with the right of obtaining water for the said bath from the same sources in the same manner and to the same extent from in and to which the water supply for the said bath is at present obtained, and together also with a right of way for all purposes to and from the said bath over the roadway leading from Trelawny-road to the said bath.

To enable the Council to maintain and carry on the gasworks and undertaking of the Company so transferred to them, and to alter, improve, enlarge, extend and renew or discontinue the existing gasworks and erect additional gasworks, and do all such acts as they may think proper for making and storing gas

To authorize the Corporation to provide erect, lay down and maintain in connection with and for the purposes of such vehicles all necessary and proper posts, standards, brackets, wires, conductors, mains, apparatus, buildings, works and conveniences and to provide and maintain all other necessary proper electrical and other equipment in, over, under, along and across any public street or road, and for the purposes aforesaid to open and break up the surface of any of the streets or roads along or adjoining those along which they may be authorized to run such vehicles;

to supply electrical energy therefor, and to confer on the Corporation the exclusive right of using any apparatus provided, erected or used by the Corporation for the purpose of working such vehicles.

To empower the Corporation to attach brackets, wires and apparatus to any buildings and to prescribe the conditions upon which the same may be so attached.

- 17. To authorize the purchase by the Company of a part only of any house, building, manufactory or property as may be required for the purposes of the Bill notwithstanding anything contained in the ninety-second section of the Lands Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845.
- 18.
