The KING has been pleased, by Letters Patent under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, bearing date the 21st instant, to appoint the Reverend Ernest Harold Pearce, M.A., Vicar of Christ Church, Newgate Street, with St. Leonard Foster Lane, in the city of London, to the Canonry in the Collegiate Church of St. Peter, Westminster, void by the promotion of Doctor Henry Charles Beeching to the Deanery of Norwich.

The KING has been pleased to grant unto Harold Colin Webster, of The Red House, in the parish of Hawarden and county of Flint, Gentleman, His Royal Licence and Authority that he and his issue may, in compliance with a clause contained in the last Will and Testament of William Peer King, late of Wanward House, in the parish of Alston and county of Cumberland, Gentleman, deceased, take and henceforth use the surname of King in addition to and before that of Webster, and that he and they may bear the Arms of King quarterly with his and their own family Arms, the said Arms being first duly exemplified according to the Laws of Arms, and recorded in His Majesty's College of Arms, otherwise the said Royal Licence and Permission to be void and of none effect. And to command that the said Royal Concession and Declaration be recorded in His Majesty's said College of Arms.

#### WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of Cornwall) Order, 1911.

Dated 21st December, 1911.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1908, and upon application by the Council of

the Administrative County of Cornwall, I hereby make the following Order:—

#### Title.

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of Cornwall) Order, 1911."

#### BIRDS.

##### *Close Time Extended.*

II. The period during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited by the Act of 1880, shall be extended throughout the Administrative County of Cornwall so far as concerns the undermentioned birds, so as to be between the 31st day of January and the 1st day of September in each year:—Bittern, Curlew or Whaup, Dotterel, Dunlin (Ploverspage, Purre or Sealark), Grebe, Hobby, Lark, Merlin, Nightingale, Nightjar (Fern Owl, Goat-sucker or Night Hawk), Nutcracker, Nuthatch, Oriole, Richard's Pipit, Water Pipit, Puffin (Coulterneb or Sea Parrot), Razorbill, Sanderling, Sandpiper, Summer Snipe or Otterling, Stone Curlew or Thick Knee, Tern or Sea Swallow, Whimbrel.

##### *Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.*

III. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the Administrative County of Cornwall to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the Schedule to the said Act:—Snow Bunting, Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Hobby, Kestrel, Merlin, Nutcracker, Nuthatch, Osprey, Richard's Pipit, Water Pipit, Lesser Redpole, Mealey Redpole, Bearded Titmouse.

##### *Certain Birds Protected during the whole of the Year.*

IV. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Act of 1880 does not extend, the killing or taking of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of Cornwall:—Cirl Bunting, Reed Bunting, Snow Bunting, Honey Buzzard, Cornish Chough, Goldcrest (Golden-crested Wren), Goldfinch, Hawfinch, Hoopoe, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Kittiwake or Tarrock, Osprey, Owl (all species), Oyster Catcher, Lesser Redpole, Reeve or Ruff, Bearded Titmouse, Woodpecker, Wren.

##### *The Shag and Cormorant deprived of protection.*

V. The whole of the Administrative County of Cornwall is hereby exempted from the operation of the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, so far as the Shag and the Cormorant are concerned.

#### EGGS.

##### *Certain Eggs protected throughout the Administrative County.*

VI. The taking or destroying of the eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of Cornwall:—Cirl Bunting, Corn Bunting, Reed Bunting, Honey Buzzard, Bittern, Little Bittern, Cornish Chough, Dipper or Water Ouzel, Dunlin (Ploverspage, Purre or Sealark), Peregrine Falcon, Firecrest, Goldcrest (Golden-crested Wren), Pied Flycatcher, Spotted Flycatcher, Gannet or Solan Goose, Goldfinch, Hen
