WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of East Suffolk) Order, 1912.

Dated 22nd February, 1912.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1908, and upon application by the Council of the Administrative County of East Suffolk, I hereby make the following Order:-

Title.

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of East Suffolk) Order, 1912."

BIRDS.

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

II. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the Administrative County of East Suffolk to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the Schedule to the Act:

Hedge Accentor (Hedge Sparrow), Brambling, Black-headed Bunting, Cirl Bunting,
Corn Bunting, Reed Bunting (Reed Sparrow),
Yellow Bunting (Yellow Hammer), Snow
Bunting, Great Bustard, Little Bustard, Buzzard, Chiffichaff, Crake, Tree Creeper, Crossbill, Turtle Dove, Eagle, Peregrine Falcon,
Pied Flycatcher, Spotted Flycatcher, Goldenscreated Wren), Harrier, Comcrest (Golden-crested Wren), Harrier, Common Heron, Hobby, Kestrel, Kite, Magpie, House Martin, Sand Martin, Merlin, Nuthatch, Osprey, Alpine Pipit (Water Pipit), Meadow Pipit (Titlark), Richard's Pipit, Rock Pipit, Tawny Pipit, Tree Pipit, Rail, Raven, Lesser Redpoll Redstart, Robin Stone-Lesser Redpoll, Redstart, Robin, Stone-chat, Swallow, Swift, Bearded Tit (Reed-ling or Reed Pheasant), Long-tailed Tit, Grey Wagtail, Pied Wagtail, Yellow Wagtail, Warbler, Blackcap Dartford Warbler, Grasshopper Warbler, Garden Warbler, Marsh Warbler, Reed Warbler, Sedge Warbler, Willow Warbler, Wood Warbler, Waxwing, Wheatear, Whinchat, White-throat, Lesser Whitethroat, Wren, Wryneck (Cuckoo's Mate or Snake Bird).

Close Time extended.

III. The time during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds (other than Mallard, Wild Duck, Snipe, Teal (other than the Garganey), Widgeon, and Woodcock) is prohibited within the Administrative County of East Suffolk, shall be extended so as to be between the last day of February and the 1st day of September in any year; the close time for Mallard, Wild Duck, Snipe, Teal (other than the Garganey), and Widgeon remaining as fixed by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, namely, between the 1st day of March and the 1st day of August in any year, while the close time for Woodcock shall be extended so as to be between the 1st day of February and the 13th day of August in any year.

Certain Birds protected during the whole of the Year.

IV. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, as extended by Clause III of this Order, does not apply, the killing or taking of the following kinds of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of East Suffolk:

Hedge Accentor (Hedge Sparrow), Avocet, Bittern, Brambling, Black-headed Bunting, Cirl Bunting, Corn Bunting, Reed Bunting (Reed Sparrow), Snow Bunting, Great Bustard, Little Bustard, Buzzard, Chiffchaff, Tree Crossbill, Cuckoo, Stone Curlew (Norfolk Plover, Thick-knee), Eagle, Peregrine Falcon, Pied Flycatcher, Spotted Flycatcher, Goldcrest (Golden-crested Wren), Goldfinch, Great Crested Grebe, Little Grebe or Dabchick, Harrier, Hobby, Hoopoe, Kes-trel, Kingfisher, Kite, Wood Lark, House Martin, Sand Martin, Merlin, Nightjar (Goat-Martin, Sand Martin, Merlin, Nightjar (Goatsucker, Night Hawk, Fern Owl), Nightingale, Nuthatch, Oriole, Osprey, Owl, Kentish Plover, Raven, Redstart, Robin, Spoonbill, Stonechat, Swallow, Swift, Tern (Sea Swallow), Bearded Tit (Reedling or Reed Pheasant), Long-tailed Tit, Grey Wagtail, Pied Wagtail, Yellow Wagtail, Blackcap Warbler, Dartford Warbler, Garden Warbler, Grassbayper Warbler, Marsh Warbler, Reed Warbler, Grassbayper Warbler, Marsh Warbler, Reed Warbler, Control of the State of the S hopper Warbler, Marsh Warbler, Reed Warbler, Sedge Warbler, Willow Warbler, Wood Warbler, Waxwing, Wheatear, Whinchat, Whitethroat, Lesser Whitethroat, Woodpecker, Wren, Wryneck (Cuckoo's Mate or Snake Bird).

All Birds Protected on Sundays within a certain Area.

V. During those periods of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, as extended by Clause III of this Order, does not apply, the killing or taking of Wild Birds on Sundays is pro-hibited in the portion of the Administrative County of East Suffolk which is situated to the east of the London to Great Yarmouth main line of the Great Eastern Railway in the said Administrative County, and in the following parishes or such parts thereof as are not situated to the east of the said main line in the

said Administrative County, namely:—
Akenham, Barham, Barking, Barsham,
Baylham, Bealings Magna, Bealings Parva,

Beccles, Belstead, Belton, Benhall, Bentley, Blakenham Great, Blakenham Little, Blaxhall, Bradwell, Bramfield, Bramford, Brampton, Brantham, Bromeswell, Burgh Campsey Ash, Claydon, Coddenham, Darsham, Eyke, Farnham, Fritton, Glenham Little, Halesworth, Herringfleet, Holton (near Halesworth), Kelsale-cum-Carlton, Martlesham, Melton, Middleton, Needham Market, Pettistree, Playford, Redisham, Ringsfield, Rushmere St. Andrew (near Ipswich), Saxmund-ham, Shadingfield, Spexhall, Sproughton, Tattingstone, Tuddenham St. Martin, Ufford, Wenhaston - with - Mells Hamlet, Westerfield, Westhall, Weston, Wherstead, Whitton, Wickham Market, Wissett, Woodbridge, Yoxford; also so much of the following estuaries and tidal waters as are within the body of the County of Suffolk, and lie above or to the landward side of the following lines respectively, namely:-

STOUR AND ORWELL.

A line drawn straight from the Tower, in Walton-on-the-Naze, in the county of Essex, to the seaward extremity of Landguard Point, in the county of Suffolk.

Provided that nothing in the said Order shall apply to any wild duck decoy, for the time being used as such, or any pond used in connection therewith, in the said portion of the said Administrative County or in any of the foregoing parishes.

Eggs.

Certain Eggs protected throughout the Administrative County.

VI. The taking or destroying of the eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of East Suffolk:—

Hedge Accentor (Hedge Sparrow), Avocet, Bittern, Cirl Bunting, Great Bustard, Buzzard, Chiffchaff, Crake, Tree Creeper, Crossbill, Dotterel (Stone-runner), Sheld Duck, Dunbird, Dunlin (Ox Bird, Plover's Page, Purre, Sea Lark), Peregrine Falcon, Pied, Flycatcher, Spotted Flycatcher, Garganey (Summer Teal), Goldcrest (Golden-crested Wren), Goldfinch, Great Crested Grebe, Little Grebe or Dabchick, Harrier, Hobby, Hoopoe, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Wood Lark, Magpie, House Martin, Sand Martin, Nightjar (Goat Sucker, Night Hawk, Fern Owl), Nightingale, Nuthatch, Oriole, Owl, Oyster Catcher, Meadow Pipit (Titlark), Rock Pipit, Tree Pipit, Kentish Plover, Pochard, Rail, Raven, Lesser Redpoll, Redshark Redstart Reeve Robin, Sandpiper shank, Redstart, Reeve, Robin, Sandpiper (Summer Snipe), Shoveller, Snipe, Stint, Stonechat, Stone Curlew (Norfolk Plover, Thick-knee), Stonehatch (Ringed Plover), Swallow, Swift, Teal, Tern (Sea Swallow), Bearded Tit (Reedling or Reed Pheasant), Long-tailed Tit, Woodpecker, Grey Wagtail, Pied Wagtail, Yellow Wagtail, Blackcap Warbler, Dartford Warbler, Garden Warbler, Grasshopper Warbler, Marsh Warbler, Reed Warbler, Sedge Warbler, Willow Warbler, Wood Warbler, Wheatear, Whinchat, Whitethroat, Lesser Whitethroat, Woodcock, Wren, Wryneck (Cuckoo's Mate or Snake Bird), and (after April 20th in each year) Lapwing (Peewit or Green Plover), and Redshank.

Repeal of former Order.

VII. The Order of the 20th October, 1909, is hereby repealed.

TRADE BOARDS ACT, 1909.

Order of the Board of Trade under Section 5 (2).

WHEREAS by Section 4 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, it is amongst other things provided as follows:—

(1) Trade Boards shall, subject to the provisions of this section, fix minimum rates of wages for time-work for their trades (in this Act referred to as minimum time-rates), and may also fix general minimum rates of wages for piecework for their trades (in this Act referred to as general minimum piece-rates), and those rates of wages (whether time or piece rates) may be fixed so as to apply universally to the trade, or so as to apply to any special process in the work of the trade, or to any special class of workers in the trade, or to any special area.

(2) Before fixing any minimum time-rate or general minimum piece-rate, the Trade Board shall give notice of the rate which they propose to fix, and consider any objections to the rate which may be lodged with

them within three months.

(3) The Trade Board shall give notice of any minimum time-rate or general minimum piece-rate fixed by them.

AND WHEREAS by Section 5 of the said Act it is amongst other things provided:—

(1) Until a minimum time-rate or general minimum piece-rate fixed by a Trade Board has been made obligatory by order of the Board of Trade under this section, the operation of the rate shall be limited as in this

Act provided.

(2) Upon the expiration of six months from the date on which a Trade Board have given notice of any minimum time-rate or general minimum piece-rate fixed by them, the Board of Trade shall make an order (in this Act referred to as an obligatory order) making that minimum rate obligatory in cases in which it is applicable on all persons employing labour and on all persons employed, unless they are of opinion that the circumstances are such as to make it premature or otherwise undesirable to make an obligatory order, and in that case they shall make an order suspending the obligatory operation of the rate (in this Act referred to as an order of suspension).

AND WHEREAS, on the 18th day of August, 1911, the Trade Board established under the said Act for that branch of the Lace Trade which is engaged in Machine-made Lace and Net Finishing, other than the finishing of the product of Plain Net machines, gave notice that they had fixed general minimum piece-rates for the trade of Machine-made Lace and Net Finishing, other than the finishing of the product of Plain Net machines, for the processes more specifically set forth in the processes more specifically set forth in the processes in the trade of Machine-made Lace and Net Finishing, other than the finishing of the product of Plain Net machines, and the rates fixed are set out in the Schedule hereto:

AND WHEREAS the said rates have been in limited operation since the 18th day of August, 1911:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Board of Trade, in pursuance of the powers in them vested as

before recited DO, by this order, make the said general minimum piece-rates and minimum time-rates fixed by the said Trade Board, and set out in the said Schedule hereto, obligatory in cases in which they are applicable on all persons employing labour and on all persons employed in the said trade.
