## PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS by section 26 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, after reciting that, "Whereas in some instances tithings, hamlets, chapelries and other places or districts may be separated from the parishes or mother churches to which they belong, with great advantage, and places altogether extraparochial may, in some instances, with advantage be annexed to parishes or districts to which they are contiguous, or be constituted separate parishes for ecclesiastical purposes," it is, amongst other things, enacted, "that when with respect to his own diocese it shall appear to the Archbishop of the province, or when the Bishop of any diocese shall represent to the said Archbishop that any such tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place or district within the diocese of such Archbishop, or the diocese of such Bishop, as the case may be, may be advantageously separated from any parish or mother church, and either be constituted a separate benefice by itself or be united to any other parish to which it may be more conveniently annexed, or to any other adjoining tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place or district, parochial or extra-

parochial, so as to form a separate parish or benefice, or that any extra-parochial place may with advantage be annexed to any parish to which it is contiguous, or be constituted a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes: And the said Archbishop or Bishop shall draw up a scheme in writing (the scheme of such Bishop to be transmitted to the said Archbishop for his consideration) describing the mode in which it appears to him that the alteration may best be effected, and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes, rent charges, and other ecclesiastical dues, rates, and payments, and in respect to patronage and rights to pews, may be made with justice to all parties interested; and if the patron or patrons of the benefice or benefices to be affected by such alteration shall consent in writing under his or their hands to such scheme, or to such modification thereof as the said Archbishop may approve, and the said Archbishop shall, on full consideration and inquiry, be satisfied with any such scheme, or modifica-tion thereof, and shall certify the same and such consent as aforesaid, by his report to His Majesty in Council, it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council to make an Order for carrying such scheme, or modification thereof, as the case may be, into effect."

And whereas by the Pluralities Act, 1887, it

is amongst other things, enacted that a scheme under section 26 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, in relation to any part of a parish or extraparochial place, may provide for the transfer thereof to a different diocese, and further that where after the passing of the Act now in recital it is proposed by a scheme under section 26 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, that a part of a parish or an extra-parochial place in any diocese should be transferred to another diocese, such scheme may be consented to in writing by the Bishop of the other diocese, and (if the two dioceses are not in the same province may be approved by the Archbishop of the province in which the said other diocese is situate; and upon such consent, or such consent and approval being given, the scheme may be dealt with and brought into effect by Order in Council in manner provided by the said section, and such Order shall be registered in the registry of both dioceses.

And whereas the Right Reverend Huyshe, Lord Bishop of Worcester, hath made a representation in writing to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, as follows:—

- "I, Huyshe, by Divine permission Bishop of Worcester, do, in pursuance of the twenty-sixth section of an Act of Parliament of the first and second years of the reign of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter 106, hereby represent to your Grace as follows:—
- "1. There is in the county and my diocese of Worcester the rectory of Bredon with Norton and Cutsdean, the parish whereof contains, according to the census of one thousand nine hundred and one, a population of nine hundred and sixty.
- "2. The net annual value of the said benefice arising from tithe rentcharge and glebe is eight, hundred and sixty-seven pounds or thereabouts.
- "3. There is in the county and diocese of Gloucester the vicarage of Temple Guyting, the parish whereof contains, according to the census of one thousand nine hundred and one a population of four hundred and thirty-seven.
- "4. The net annual value of the said benefice arising from glebe, Queen Anne's Bounty, Ecclesiastical Commission and fees is one hundred and sixteen pounds or thereabouts.
- "5. A certain detached portion of the said parish of Bredon with Norton and Cutsdean, namely, the hamlet or chapelry of Cutsdean, lies to the north of the parish of Temple Guyting and adjacent thereto, and is upwards of eleven miles distant from the parish church of Bredon. There is a consecrated Chapel of Ease at Cutsdean, the services whereof have for many years past been conducted by the Incumbent of Temple Guyting. The population of the said hamlet is about one hundred and twenty-six persons.
- "6. It appears to me that the said hamlet or chapelry of Cutsdean may under the provisions of the said Act 1 and 2 Vic., cap. 106, and of the Acts of the second and third years of the same reign, cap. 49, and of the fiftieth and fifty-first years of the same reign, cap. 68, be advantageously separated from the said parish of Bredon with Norton and Cutsdean

and united to the said parish of Temple Guyting.

- "7. The Most Noble William John Arthur Charles James Duke of Portland, K.G., is the patron of the said benefice of Bredon with Norton and Cutsdean, and the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Christ in Oxford are the patrons of the said benefice of Temple Guyting.
- "8. The Reverend Henry George Cavendish-Browne is the present Incumbent of the benefice of Bredon with Norton and Cutsdean, and the Reverend Odiarne William Decimus Lane is the present Incumbent of the benefice of Temple Guyting.
- "9. Pursuant to the directions contained in the twenty-sixth section of the first mentioned Act of Parliament, I, the said Bishop, have drawn up a scheme in writing appended to this representation describing the said hamlet or chapelry of Cutsdean so as aforesaid proposed to be annexed to the ecclesiastical parish of Temple Guyting, and the mode in which it appears to me the alterations may be best effected, and how the changes consequent thereon in respect of ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes, dues, rates and payments, and in respect to patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested. And I do hereby submit the same to your Grace, together with the consents in writing of the said patrons and Incumbents, and also with the consent in writing of the Lord Bishop of the said diocese of Gloucester, as provided by the said Act of the fiftieth and fifty-first years of Her late Majesty's reign, cap. 68, and in case you shall, on full consideration and enquiry, be satisfied therewith, I request that your Grace will be pleased to certify the same and such consents to His Majesty in Council."

And whereas the said scheme drawn up by the said Bishop is as follows:—

### "SCHEME.

- "It is proposed to separate the hamlet or chapelry of Cutsdean from the ecclesiastical parish of Bredon with Norton and Cutsdean, in the county and diocese of Worcester, and unite the same for ecclesiastical purposes to the adjoining parish of Temple Guyting, in the county and diocese of Gloucester. The said hamlet or chapelry is bounded on the north and west sides thereof by the parish of Stanway, on the east partly by the parish of Sourton-on-the-Hill, and partly by the parish of Seizincote, and on the south partly by the parish of Condicote, and partly by the said parish of Temple Guyting. The said hamlet or chapelry is a detached portion of the said county of Gloucester, situate within the said county of Gloucester.
- "The inhabitants of the said hamlet or chapelry shall not after this scheme takes effect be entitled to any accommodation in the parish church of Bredon (except nevertheless any person or persons possessing a legal right by faculty or otherwise to any pew or sitting within the said church and who may not be willing to relinquish the same) and shall be exonerated from all liability to repair the said

parish church of Bredon, but shall be entitled to accommodation in the parish church of Temple Guyting, and shall be liable subject to the provisions of the Compulsory Rates Abolition Act, 1868, to the repairs of the said church.

"The Incumbent of the parish church of Temple Guyting shall when this scheme takes effect have the exclusive cure of souls within the said hamlet or chapelry.

"The fees for marriages and churchings and all other ecclesiastical dues arising from the said hamlet or chapelry and due to the Incumbent thereof shall when this scheme takes effect belong to the Incumbent of the benefice of Temple Guyting aforesaid.

"No alteration shall be made in the patronage of either of the said benefices.

"The yearly rentcharge of eighty pounds payable by the Right Honourable Francis Earl of Wemyss and March and charged upon what was formerly the glebe farm containing three hundred and fifteen acres or thereabouts and known as Scarborough Farm, situate in the hamlet or chapelry of Cutsdean, and also charged upon other hereditaments belonging to the said Earl of Wemyss and March and known as Cutsdean Lodge and Cutsdean Hill Farm and containing two hundred and sixteen acres or thereabouts which forms part of the endowment of the said rectory of Bredon with Norton and Cutsdean shall for ever after this scheme takes effect belong to and be vested in the vicar of the said vicarage of Temple Guyting and his successors as part of the endowment of the said vicarage.

"The tithe rentcharge of three pounds payable in respect of those lands within the said hamlet or chapelry of Cutsdean which have not been exonerated from the render of tithes under the provisions of an Inclosure Act and belonging to the rectory of Bredon with Norton and Cutsdean shall be assigned to and attached to the parish and vicarage of Temple Guyting the said sum of three pounds being charged upon the lands comprised in the Schedule hereunder written which is an extract from the tithe apportionment.

And whereas the Lord Bishop of Gloucester, and the patrons and Incumbents of the respective benefices have consented in writing to the said scheme;

And whereas the said scheme hath been transmitted by the said Bishop of Worcester to the said Archbishop for his consideration;

And whereas the said Archbishop, being satisfied with the said scheme, hath certified the same, and the consents aforesaid to His Majesty in Council by his report dated the 12th day of July, 1911, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We the undersigned Randall Thomas Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury do hereby represent to Your Majesty in Council

"That the Right Reverend Huyshe Bishop of Worcester has represented unto Us (amongst other things)

"That there is in the county of Worcester and his diocese of Worcester the rectory of Bredon with Norton and Cutsdean the parish

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whereof contains according to the census of one thousand nine hundred and one a population of 960.

"That there is also in the county and diocese of Gloucester the vicarage of Temple Guyting the parish whereof contains according to the census of one thousand nine hundred and one a population of 437.

"That a certain detached portion of the said parish of Bredon with Norton and Cutsdean, namely, the hamlet or chapelry of Cutsdean lies to the north of Temple Guyting and adjacent thereto and is upwards of eleven miles distant from the parish church of Cutsdean.

"That it appears to the said Lord Bishop that the said hamlet or chapelry of Cutsdean may under the provisions of the Pluralities Acts 1838 and 1887 be advantageously separated from the said parish of Bredon with Norton and Cutsdean and united to the said parish of Temple Guyting.

"That pursuant to the directions contained in the said Acts the said Lord Bishop has drawn up a scheme in writing describing the mode in which it appears to him that the proposed alterations may best be effected and how the changes consequent upon such alterations in respect of ecclesiastical jurisdiction glebe lands tithe rentcharges and other ecclesiastical dues rates and payments and in respect to patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested which scheme together with the consents thereto in writing of William John Arthur Charles James Duke of Portland, K.G., the patron or person entitled to present to the benefice of Bredon with Norton and Cutsdean in case the same were now vacant the Reverend Henry George Cavendish-Browne the Incumbent of the same benefice, the Right Reverend Edgar Charles Sumner Bishop of Gloucester as bishop of the diocese in which the benefice of Temple Guyting is situate the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Christ in Oxford the patrons or persons entitled to present to the said benefice of Temple Guyting in case the same were now vacant and the Reverend Odiarne William Decimus Lane the Incumbent of the same benefice has been transmitted to Us by the said Lord Bishop for Our consideration.

"The representation and scheme of the said Lord Bishop of Worcester and the consents above referred to are hereunto annexed.

"And We the said Archbishop being on full consideration and enquiry satisfied with the said scheme do hereby pursuant to the said Pluralities Acts 1838 and 1887 certify the same and such consents as aforesaid to Your Majesty in Council to the intent that Your Majesty in Council may in case Your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do make and issue an Order for carrying the said scheme into effect.

And whereas Edgar Charles Sumner, Lord Bishop of Gloucester hath, pursuant to the enactment aforesaid, made a representation to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

- "I Edgar Charles Sumner by Divine permission Bishop of Gloucester do in pursuance of the 26th section of the Pluralities Act 1838 hereby represent to Your Grace as follows:—
- "1. There is in the county of Gloucester and my diocese of Gloucester the perpetual curacy of Holy Trinity (Forest of Dean) the parish whereof contains an estimated present population of about 5,000. The net annual value of this benefice arising from income payable by the Ecclesiastical Commissioners Queen Anne's Bounty and fees and other sources is £270 or thereabouts.
- "2. There is also in the same county and diocese the rectory of Abenhall the parish whereof contains an estimated present population of about 218. The net annual value of this benefice arising from tithe rent-charge glebe land and fees and other sources is £110 or thereabouts.
- "3. A certain district of the said parish of Holy Trinity known as the Plump Hill Edgehills and Shapridge District lies at a distance of about two miles from the parish church of Holy Trinity but at distances varying from half a mile to a mile and a half from the parish church of Abenhall.

- "4. It appears to me that under the provisions of the said Pluralities Act the district referred to in the last preceding paragraph may advantageously be separated from the said parish of Holy Trinity and annexed to the said parish of Abenhall to which it is contiguous.
- "5. The benefice of Holy Trinity is in the patronage of the Crown. The benefice of Abenhall is in the patronage of the Lord Chancellor.
- "6. The Reverend James Lawton is the present Incumbent of the benefice of Holy Trinity. The Reverend Charles Richard Pollock is the present Incumbent of the benefice of Abenhall.
- "7. Pursuant to the directions contained in the 26th section of the said Pluralities Act I the said Bishop have drawn up a scheme in writing annexed to this representation describing the district so as aforesaid proposed to be annexed to the said parish of Abenhall and the mode in which it appears to me the alteration may best be effected and how the changes consequent thereon in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction glebe lands tithes rent-charges and other ecclesiastical dues rates and payments and in respect to patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested And I do hereby submit the same to your Grace together with the consents in writing of the said Patrons and Incumbents to the intent that if your Grace shall on full consideration and enquiry be satisfied with such scheme you may certify the same and such consents by your report to His Majesty in Council."

And whereas the said scheme drawn up by the said Bishop of Gloucester and the consents referred to in the said representation are as follows:—

## "SCHEME.

"That a district shall be separated from the said parish of Holy Trinity and annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the contiguous parish of Abenhall That the said district is delineated and described in the plan hereunto annexed and is thereon verged red and consists of the district known as the Plump Hill Edgehills and Shapridge District.

"That the Incumbent of the said parish of Abenhall to which such district shall be annexed shall have the sole and exclusive cure of souls within the said district.

"That the parishioners of the said district shall be entitled to accommodation in the church of the said parish of Abenhall but shall cease to be entitled to accommodation in the church of thesaid parish of Holy Trinity excepting nevertheless any person or persons possessing a legal right by faculty or otherwise to any pew or sitting in the said parish church of Holy Trinity and who may not be willing to relinquish and give up the same.

"That marriages baptisms churchings and burials shall be solemnised and performed for the inhabitants of the said district in the said parish church of Abenhall.

'That all fees dues ecclesiastical offerings and emoluments arising from the said district

shall belong to the Incumbent of the said parish of Abenhall to which such district shall be annexed.

"That no alteration shall be made in the patronage or endowment (except as aforesaid) of the said benefices or either of them."

### "CONSENTS.

"We the Right Honourable Herbert Henry Asquith, K.C., M.P., First Lord Commissioner of His Majesty's Treasury being the patron or person entitled to present to the benefice of Holy Trinity (Forest of Dean) in the county and diocese of Gloucester (in case the same were now vacant) the Reverend James Lawton being the Incumbent of the same benefice the Right Honourable Robert Threshie Earl Loreburn Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain being the patron or person entitled to present to the benefice of Abenhall in the county and diocese of Gloucester (in case the same were now vacant) and the Reverend Charles Richard Pollock the Incumbent of the same benefice do hereby respectively signify to your Grace our several consents to the scheme above proposed and set forth and to every matter and thing therein contained.

"That there is in the county of Gloucester and his diocese of Gloucester the perpetual curacy of Holy Trinity (Forest of Dean) the parish whereof contains an estimated population of 5,000.

"That there is also in the same county and diocese the rectory of Abenhall the parish whereof contains an estimated population of 218.

"That a certain district of the said parish of Holy Trinity known as the Plump Hill Edgehills and Shapridge district lies at a distance of about two miles from the parish church of Holy Trinity but at distances varying from half a mile to a mile and a half from the parish church of Abenhall.

"That it appears to the said Lord Bishop that under the Pluralities Act 1838 the said

district known as the Plump Hill Edgehills and Shapridge district (more particularly delineated and described and verged red in the plan annexed to the scheme appended hereto) may be advantageously separated from the said parish of Holy Trinity and annexed to the said parish of Abenhall to which it is contiguous.

"That pursuant to the directions contained in the said Act the said Lord Bishop has drawn up a scheme in writing describing the mode in which it appears to him that the proposed alteration may best be effected and how the changes consequent upon such alterations in respect of ecclesiastical jurisdiction glebe lands tithe rent-charges and other ecclesiastical dues rates and payments and in respect to patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested which scheme together with the consents thereto in writing of the Right Honourable Herbert Henry Asquith K.C. M.P. First Lord Commissioner of Your Majesty's Treasury on behalf of the Crown, the patron or person entitled to present to the benefice of Holy Trinity (Forest of Dean) (in case the same were now vacant) the Reverend James Lawton the Incumbent of the same benefice, the Right Honourable Robert benefice, Threshie Earl Loreburn Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain the patron or person entitled to present to the benefice of Abenhall (in case the same were now vacant) and the Reverend Charles Richard Pollock the Incumbent of the same benefice, has been transmitted to Us for Our consideration.

"The representation and scheme of the said Lord Bishop of Gloucester and the consents above referred to are hereunto annexed.

"And We the said Archbishop being on full consideration and enquiry satisfied with the said scheme do hereby pursuant to the said Pluralities Act 1838 certify the same and such consents as aforesaid to Your Majesty in Council to the intent that Your Majesty in Council may in case Your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do make and issue an Order for carrying the said scheme into effect."

And whereas Frederic Henry, Lord Bishop of Ely, hath, pursuant to the enactment aforesaid, made a representation to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"I, Frederic Henry, Bishop of Ely, in pursuance of the 26th section of the Pluralities Act, 1838, do hereby represent to your Grace as follows:—

"There is in the county of Bedford and diocese of Ely the benefice or vicarage of Shillington, the parish whereof (including the district of Lower Stondon hereinafter mentioned) contains a population of one thousand five hundred and eighty-eight or thereabouts, with accommodation in the parish church for four hundred and fifty persons.

"The Master, Fellows and Scholars of the College of the Holy and Undivided Trinity within the town and University of Cambridge of King Henry the Eighth's Foundation are the patrons of the benefice of Shillington, and the Reverend Langdale Horwood Postgate is the present Incumbent thereof.

"John Hilary Edward Hull, of 18, Allenby Road, Forest Hill, in the county of Kent, Esquire, is the patron of the benefice of Upper Stondon, and the Reverend George Stevenson Ellis Hingston is the present Incumbent thereof.

"That, pursuant to the directions contained in the 26th section of the Pluralities Act, 1838, I, the said Lord Bishop, have drawn up a scheme in writing annexed to this representation describing the mode in which it appears to me that the alteration above proposed may best be effected, and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes, rentcharges, and other ecclesiastical dues, rates and payments, and in respect to patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested, and I do hereby submit the same to your Grace, together with the consents in writing of the said patrons and Incumbents respectively of both the said benefices to the intent that if your Grace shall on full consideration and enquiry be satisfied with such scheme you may certify the same and such consents as aforesaid to His Majesty in Council."

And whereas the said scheme drawn up by the said Bishop of Ely and the consents referred to in the said representation are as follows:—

### "SCHEME.

"It is proposed to separate from the parish of Shillington all that portion of the district known as Lower Stondon, which is more particularly delineated and described in the plan attached hereto and thereon verged pink, and to annex the same to the contiguous parish of Upper Stondon,

"That the Incumbent of the benefice of Upper Stondon shall have sole and exclusive cure of souls within such portion so to be separated from Shillington.

"That the inhabitants of such-portion shall be entitled to accommodation in the parish church of Upper Stondon, but shall cease to be entitled to any right or accommodation in the parish church of Shillington except, nevertheless, any person or persons (if any) possessing a legal right by faculty or otherwise to any pew or sitting in the said parish church of Shillington and who may not be willing to relinquish and give up the same.

"That the inhabitants of the aforesaid portion shall have such and the same right to have marriages, baptisms, churchings and burials solemnized and performed in the parish church of Upper Stondon as they might have had in the parish church of Shillington.

"That all fees, ecclesiastical offerings and emoluments arising from the said portion so to be separated from Shillington shall henceforth belong to the Incumbent of the benefice of Upper Stondon.

"That no alteration shall be made in the endowments of the said benefices or either of them.

"That no alteration shall be made in the patronage of the said benefices or either of them."

And whereas by the Local Government Act, 1888, the powers and business of the Justices, in respect of the matters aforesaid in each county, were transferred to the Council of such county:

And whereas a petition has been presented to His Majesty by the County Council of Middlesex, praying that on the occurrence of the next vacancy in the office of Coroner for the existing Western Coroner's District of the said county that district should be altered by the transfer from the said Western District to the existing Central Coroner's District of the said county of the following parishes: -Edgware, Great Stanmore, Harrow-on-the-Hill, Harrow Weald, Kingsbury, Little Stanmore, Pinner, Wealdstone, Wembley; and that on the occurrence of the next vacancy in the office of Coroner for the existing Eastern Coroner's District or the existing Central Coroner's District of the said county, whichever shall first happen, the existing Eastern Coroner's District and the existing Central Coroner's District, or the existing Central Coroner's District as extended by the addition of certain parishes transferred from the Western Coroner's District as hereinbefore mentioned, should be constituted as one district, and that such district might be named or known as the Eastern Coroner's District of the said county:

And whereas the said petition, with the reasons upon which it is founded, has been duly certified to His Majesty:

And whereas all the provisions in that behalf of the hereinbefore first recited Act have been duly complied with:

And whereas the Coroners for the said county have not presented any petition to His Majesty concerning the said proposed alteration:

And whereas His Majesty has, with the advice of His Privy Council, taken into consideration the said petition and is minded to make such alteration and division as is hereinafter provided:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, direct, and declare, and it is hereby ordered, directed, and declared, that:—

- (1) On the occurrence of the next vacancy in the office of Coroner for the existing Western Coroner's District of the county of Middlesex that district shall be altered by the transfer from the said Western District to the existing Central Coroner's District of the said county of the following parishes:—Edgware, Great Stanmore, Harrow-on-the-Hill, Harrow Weald, Kingsbury, Little Stanmore, Pinner, Wealdstone, Wembley;
- (2) On the occurrence of the next vacancy in the office of Coroner for the existing Eastern Coroner's District or the existing Central Coroner's District of of Middlesex, county whichever shall first happen, the existing Eastern Coroner's District, and the existing Central Coroner's District, or the existing Central Coroner's District as extended by the addition of certain parishes transferred from the Western Coroner's District as hereinbefore mentioned, shall be constituted as one district, and that such district shall be named or known as the Eastern Coroner's District of the county of Middlesex;
- (3) After such alterations shall have taken effect the said county (excluding the Liberty of the Duchy of Lancaster) shall be divided into two districts for Coroners' purposes and for the purposes of the said firstly recited Act;
- (4) The said two districts shall be named respectively "The Eastern Coroner's District" and "The Western Coroner's District," and the said districts shall respectively comprise the several parishes and places and have the boundaries prescribed and mentioned in that behalf in the schedule hereto;
- (5) This Order shall be published in the London Gazette.

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## Whitehall, May 23, 1912.

The following Address was presented to the King on Tuesday, the 21st instant, when His Majesty, accompanied by the Queen, opened the new building of the Royal Society of Medicine in Wimpole Street:—

To the King's and the Queen's Most Excellent Majesties.

· May it please Your Majesties,

We, the President, Council, and Fellows of the Royal Society of Medicine, desire to convey to Your Majesties, with our loyal duty, our attachment and devotion to Your Persons and to the Throne.

We take this opportunity to express our grateful appreciation of the deep interest which Your Majesties invariably evince in all that concerns the well-being of Your Subjects, and in the progress of our profession, whose duty it is not only to preserve the individual by curing disear but to improve the health of

the Nation by promoting Hygiene, and pre-

venting illness.

Our Society was founded in 1805, but greater stability and effect were given to its designs by the Charter granted in 1834 by the special grace of His Majesty King William IV, who thereby declared himself, "and his successors if they shall think fit," the Patron of the Society.

It is our pride and privilege to record that each of the illustrious Successors of King William IV have so thought fit, and that our greatly beloved and never-to-be-forgotten late Sovereigns, Her Majesty Queen Victoria and His Majesty King Edward VII, have been, and now Your own most excellent Majesty is our Patron.

By a Supplementary Charter graciously granted in 1907 by Your Majesty's august Father, the Society was empowered to enrol as Fellows the Members of several younger Societies having allied objects; the powers of the Society were enlarged, its name was

changed from "The Royal Medical and Chirurgical Society of London" to "The Royal Society of Medicine"; and it was specifically ordained that female as well as male persons might be elected Fellows and appointed to offices of the Society.

To have been distinguished by the gracious favour of Your Majesties on this auspicious occasion has given inexpressible pleasure to all concerned, and is a recognition that reflects the brightest lustre upon the History of the Society.

It is with these feelings of appreciation and gratitude that we very earnestly thank Your Majesties for the great honour You have conferred upon us, and upon the profession at large, by Your Presence here to-day.

To which Address His Majesty was pleased to return the following gracious Answer:

I thank you on behalf of the Queen and Myself for the loyal and dutiful Address of the Royal Society of Medicine.

It gives Me great pleasure to open the fine building which will henceforth be the home of the Society, and which will provide adequately for the increase in your membership and for the extension of your duties since a new and enlarged Charter was granted to you by My Father, King Edward. The importance of the Society's work is now universally appreciated, and it is a matter of satisfaction that the needs of the Society have been generously provided for, and that its varied functions can now be carried on unhampered by lack of space.

The health and well-being of the community are safeguarded by the energies of the medical profession. We look to you to fight sickness and disease: and we claim from you an untiring vigilance in this contest and unceasing efforts to find, by the investigation of the laws of Nature, new means of combating these enemies.
