HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth,

chapter seventy-seven, of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and thirteen, and of the Act of the thirty-seventh and thirty-eighth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter sixty-three, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the ninth day of May, in the year one thousand nine hundred and twelve, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, chapter seventy-seven, of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and thirteen, and of the Act of the thirty-seventh and thirty-eighth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter sixty-three, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for constituting a new archdeacoury within the Diocese of Southwell, and for endowing such new archdeacoury.

"Whereas the said Diocese of Southwell now comprises three archdeaconries and no more, namely the Archdeaconry of Chesterfield, the Archdeaconry of Derby, and the Archdeaconry of Nottingham.

"And whereas the Right Reverend Edwyn, Bishop of Southwell, has represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that a new archdeaconry should be constituted within the said Diocese of Southwell and should comprise the Rural Deaneries of Bawtry, Mansfield, Newark, Norwell, Retford, Tuxford, and Worksop, which are at present within the said Archdeaconry of Nottingham and within the said Diocese of Southwell, and that such new archdeaconry should be endowed in the same manner which is hereinafter recommended and proposed.

"And whereas it appears to us to be undesirable that procurations, synodals, visitation fees and induction fees should be received by the Archdeacon of the said proposed new archdeaconry.

"And whereas it has been made to appear to us that by reason of the discontinuance of the collection of the said fees there will be no annual income available for the said proposed archdeaconry from fees dues and emoluments, and that the grant hereinafter recommended and proposed will not be such as to raise the annual income of the said proposed archdeaconry to an amount exceeding two hundred pounds.

"Now therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Edwyn, Bishop of Southwell, (testified by his having signed and sealed this scheme), humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day upon which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme shall be published in the London Gazette and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order one new archdeaconry shall be created within the said Diocese of Southwell and that such archdeaconry shall be named 'the Archdeaconry of Newark' and shall comprise and consist of the said Rural Deaneries of Bawtry, Mansfield, Newark, Norwell, Retford, Tuxford, and Worksop.

"And we further recommend and propose that the rural deans and other the clergy and the inhabitants generally of the said proposed Archdeaconry of Newark shall be under and subject to the archidiaconal jurisdiction authority and control of the archdeacon of such proposed archdeaconry for the time being and that such archdeacon shall have and exercise all the rights, powers and duties of an archdeacon within the limits of his archdeaconry.

"And we further recommend and propose that we be authorized to pay by half-yearly instalments on the first day of January and the first day of July in every year out of the common fund created by the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act to the Archdeacon of the said proposed Archdeaconry of Newark and to his successors in the same archdeaconry the yearly sum of two hundred pounds, the instalment so first becoming due being an apportioned part only of the said sum of two hundred pounds in respect of the period between the date of the collation of the first archdeacon of the said proposed Archdeaconry of Newark and the first half-yearly day of payment next ensuing; provided always, that every payment in respect of the said yearly sum of two hundred pounds shall be made by us only after we shall have been satisfied that the archdeacon who applies for the same has during the previous twelve calendar months complied with the conditions as to residence which for the time being are required by law and that he has

not collected procurations, synodals, visitation fees, or induction fees during the same period.

"And we further recommend and propose that whenever any archdeacon who may be entitled to receive the said yearly sum of two hundred pounds shall resign or otherwise avoid his archdeaconry such yearly sum shall be apportionable between such archdeacon or his representatives (as the case may be) and the archdeacon who shall next be collated to the same archdeaconry.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending or proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas a draft of the said scheme has, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the archdeacon affected by the scheme, that is to say, the Archdeacon of Nottingham, and the said archdeacon has signified his consent to such scheme.

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts. And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Southwell.

HEREAS by section 16 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, as amended by the Pluralities Act, 1850, it is, amongst other things, enacted, "That whenever it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, with respect to his own diocese, and whenever it shall be represented to him by the Bishop of any diocese, or by the Bishops of any two dioceses, that two or more benefices, or that one or more benefice or benefices, and one or more Spiritual Sinecure rectory or rectories, vicarage or vicarages, in his or their diocese or dioceses, being either in the same parish or contiguous to each other, and of which the aggregate population shall not exceed one thousand five hundred persons, may, with advantage to the interests of religion, be united into one benefice, the said Archbishop of the Province shall inquire into the circumstances of the case; and if on such inquiry it shall appear to him that such union may be usefully made, and will not be of inconvenient extent, and that the patron or patrons of the said benefices, Sinecure rectory or rectories, vicarage or vicar-

ages respectively, is or are consenting thereto, such consent being signified in writing under the hands of such patron or patrons, the said Archbishop shall, six weeks before certifying such inquiry and consent to His Majesty as hereinafter directed, cause, with respect to his own diocese, a statement in writing of the facts, and in other cases a copy in writing of the aforesaid Representation to be affixed on or near the principal outer door of the church, or in some public and conspicuous place in each of such benefices, Sinecure rectories, or vicarages, with notice to any person or persons interested, that he, she, or they, may, within such six weeks, show cause in writing under his, her, or their hand or hands, to the said Archbishop, against such union; and if no sufficient cause be shewn within such time, the said Archbishop shall certify the inquiry and consent aforesaid to His Majesty in Council, and thereupon it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council to make and issue an Order or Orders for uniting such benefices, Sinecure rectory or rectories, vicarage or vicarages, into one benefice, with cure of souls, for ecclesias-tical purposes only; and it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council to give directions for regulating the course and succession in which the patrons, if there be more than one patron, shall present or nominate to such united benefice, from time to time, as the same shall become vacant; and for determining, if such united benefice shall be in two dioceses, to which of such dioceses such benefice shall belong, and such Order or Orders shall be registered in the Registry or Registries of the diocese or respective dioceses, to which such united benefice shall be determined to belong, and to which either or any of the united benefices, Sinecure rectories, or vicarages shall have belonged when separate, which Order or Orders the Registrar, or Registrars, of such diocese or respective dioceses, immediately on the receipt thereof, are hereby required to register accordingly: and such Order, or Orders, shall thenceforth be binding on all parties whatsoever."

And whereas the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, pursuant to the provisions of the said Act, hath duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a certificate in writing, bearing date the 14th day of February, 1912, in the words and figures following:—

"We the undersigned Randall Thomas Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury Primate of all England and Metropolitan do hereby certify to Your Majesty in Council:—

"That the Right Reverend Edward Lord Bishop of Winchester as Bishop of the diocese within which is situate the vicarage of Combe in the county of Hants and the Right Reverend Frederic Edward Lord Bishop of Salisbury as Bishop of the diocese within which is situate the rectory of Buttermere in the county of Wilts, having jointly represented unto Us that the said benefices being contiguous to each other and of which the aggregate population does not exceed 1500 persons might with advantage to the interests of religion be united into one benefice, We inquired into the circumstances of the case.

"That on such inquiry it appeared to Us that such union might be usefully made and would not be of inconvenient extent, and that the Dean and Canons of the King's Free Chapel of St. George within the Castle of

Windsor being the patrons or persons entitled to present or nominate to the vicarage of Combe and also to the rectory of Buttermere (if the same or either of them were now vacant) have consented to the proposed union.

"That six weeks and upwards before certifying such inquiry and consent to Your Majesty in Council we caused a copy in writing of the aforesaid Joint Representation of the said Lord Bishops to be affixed to the principal outer door of the parish church of each of the said benefices with notice to any person or persons interested that he she or they might within such six weeks show cause in writing under his her or their hand or hands to Us the said Archbishop against such union but no sufficient cause has been shown.

"The Joint Representation of the said Lord Bishops of Winchester and Salisbury, Our inquiry into the circumstances of the case the statement of circumstances in reply thereto, the consent in writing of the said patrons and the copies of the Joint Representation and notices before mentioned are hereunto annexed.

"And We do hereby certify the inquiry and consent aforesaid to Your Majesty in Council to the intent that Your Majesty in Council may in case Your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do make and issue an Order for uniting the said benefices into one benefice with cure of souls for ecclesiastical purposes and we further hereby declare that the said benefices when they shall be united into one benefice shall be included in and belong to the diocese of Salisbury and be under the full authority and jurisdiction of the bishop of such diocese of Salisbury.

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the vicarage of Combe, situate in the county of Hants and diocese of Winchester, and the rectory of Buttermere, situate in the county of Wilts and diocese of Salisbury, shall be united into one benefice with cure of souls for ecclesiastical purposes only.

And His Majesty in Council, by and with the advice aforesaid, is further pleased to order and determine that such united benefice shall belong to the diocese of Salisbury.

WHEREAS by Section 26 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, after reciting that "Whereas in some instances Tithings, Hamlets, Chapelries, and other Places or Districts may be separated from the Parishes or Mother Churches to which they belong, with great advantage, and Places altogether extraparochial may in some instances with advantage be annexed to Parishes or Districts to which they are contiguous, or be constituted

separate Parishes for Ecclesiastical purposes," it is, amongst other things, enacted "That when with respect to his own Diocese it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, or when the Bishop of any Diocese shall represent to the said Archbishop that any such Tithing, Hamlet, Chapelry, Place, or District within the Diocese of such Archbishop, or the Diocese of such Bishop, as the case may be, may be advantageously separated from any Parish or Mother Church, and either be constituted a separate Benefice by itself or be united any other Parish to which it may bе more conveniently annexed, or any other adjoining Tithing, Hamlet,-Chapelry, Place, or District, Parochial or Extra-Parochial, so as to form a separate Parish or Benefice, or that any Extra-Parochial Place may with advantage be annexed to any Parish to which it is contiguous, or be constituted a separate Parish for Ecclesiastical purposes; and the said Archbishop or Bishop shall draw up a Scheme in Writing (the Scheme of such Bishop to be transmitted to the said Archbishop for his consideration) describing the mode in which it appears to him that the alteration may best be effected, and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to Ecclesiastical Jurisdiction, Glebe Lands, Tithes, Rent Charges, and other Ecclesiastical Dues, Rates, and Payments, and in respect to Patronage and Rights to Pews, may be made with justice to all Parties interested; and if the Patron or Patrons of the Benefice or Benefices to be affected by such alteration shall consent in Writing under his or their Hands to such Scheme, or to such modification thereof as the said Archbishop may approve, and the said Archbishop shall, on full consideration and inquiry, be satisfied with any such Scheme, or modification thereof, and shall certify the same and such consent as aforesaid. by his Report to His Majesty in Council, it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council to make an Order for carrying such Scheme, or modification thereof, as the case may be, into effect.'

And whereas Edward, Lord Bishop of Winchester, hath, pursuant to the enactment aforesaid, made a Representation to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

- "I Edward Lord Bishop of Winchester in pursuance of the Pluralities Act 1838 do hereby represent to your Grace as follows:—
- "There is in the County of Surrey and my Diocese of Winchester the Benefice of Farnham the Parish whereof contains a population of 5306 or thereabouts with accommodation in the Parish Church for 1400 persons and in the Church or Chapel of St. James for 400 persons.
- "The nett annual value of the said Benefice of Farnham from all sources is Five hundred and fifty pounds or thereabouts.
- "There is in the same County and Diocese the Benefice of Hale the Parish whereof contains a population of 4731 or thereabouts with accommodation in the Parish Church for 450 persons.
- "The nett annual value of the said Benefice of Hale from all sources is Two hundred and sixty-nine pounds or thereabouts.
 - "A certain portion of the said Parish of |

Hale with a population of 550 or thereabouts is distant One mile from the Parish Church of Hale and about half a mile from the Church or Chapel of St. James within the said Parish of Farnham.

"That it appears to me and I do hereby represent to your Grace that under the provisions of the said Pluralities Act 1838 a portion of the said Parish of Hale the boundaries of which are more particularly described in the Scheme appended to this Representation and are delineated on the Ordnance Sheet annexed to such Scheme and thereon verged pink may be advantageously separated therefrom and be annexed to the said Parish of Farnham to which it is contiguous.

"By virtue of my Bishopric I am the Patron of both the said Benefices of Farnham and Hale.

"The Reverend Ernest Neville Lovett is the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Farnham and the Reverend Allan Macnab Watson is the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Hale.

"That pursuant to the directions contained in the 26th Section of the said Pluralities Act 1838 I the said Lord Bishop have drawn up a Scheme in writing annexed to this Representation describing the mode in which it appears to me that the alteration above proposed may best be effected and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to Ecclesiastical jurisdiction Glebe lands Tithes rentcharges and other Ecclesiastical dues rates and payments and in respect to patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested and I do hereby submit the same to your Grace together with my Consent in writing as Patron of the said Benefices and the Consents of the Incumbents of the said Benefices to the intent that if Your Grace shall on full consideration and enquiry be satisfied with such Scheme you may certify the same and such Consents as aforesaid to His Majesty in Council."

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop of Winchester and the Consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows:—

"SCHEME.

"It is proposed to separate All that part of the Ecclesiastical Parish of Hale which adjoins the Ecclesiastical Parish of Farnham and which lies to the west of and within an imaginary line which commences on the South East side of Farnham Park at the point where the two Parishes are contiguous and runs thence North Eastward along the boundary of the said Park to the South East corner of the same (following the Civil Parish Boundary to the point where it reaches the road from Farnham to Hale) thence across the said road and down the footpath to the west of Bourne Mill across the Guildford Road thence eastward along the same road to the point where the road leading to the River Wey joins such road thence along the said road leading to the Railway at the point marked 'North Branch' on the said Ordnance Sheet and thence westward along the River Wey to the ford, which portion of the Parish of Hale is verged pink on the said Ordnance Map hereto annexed.

"That the Incumbent of the Benefice of Farnham shall have sole and exclusive Cure of Souls within such portion so to be separated from Hale and annexed to Farnham.

- "That the inhabitants of such portion shall be entitled to accommodation in the Parish Church of Farnham and in the Church of St. James or one of them but shall cease to be entitled to any right or accommodation in the Parish Church of Hale except nevertheless any person or persons (if any) possessing a legal right by Faculty or otherwise to any pew or sitting in the said Parish Church of Hale and who may not be willing to relinquish and give up the same.
- "That the inhabitants of the aforesaid portion shall have such and the same right to have Marriages Baptisms Churchings and Burials solemnized and performed in the Parish Church of Farnham or in the Church of St. James as they might have had in the Parish Church of Hale.
- "That all fees Ecclesiastical offerings and emoluments arising from the said portion so to be separated from the Parish of Hale shall henceforth belong to the Incumbent of the Benefice of Farnham.
- "That no alteration shall be made in the Endowments of the said Benefices or either of them.
- "That no alteration shall be made in the Patronage of the said Benefices or either of them."

"CONSENTS.

- "We Edward Lord Bishop of Winchester by virtue of my Bishopric the Patron or person entitled to present to the Benefices of Farnham and Hale in the County of Surrey and my Diocese of Winchester (if the same or either of them were now vacant) the Reverend Ernest Neville Lovett Incumbent of the said Benefice of Farnham and the Reverend Allan Macnab Watson Incumbent of the said Benefice of Hale do hereby respectively signify to Your Grace our several Consents to the Scheme above proposed and set forth and to every matter and thing therein contained.
- "In testimony whereof we have hereunto set our hands this nineteenth day of December One thousand nine hundred and eleven.

- "We the undersigned Randall Thomas Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury do hereby report to Your Majesty in Council
- "That the Right Reverend Edward Lord Bishop of Winchester has represented unto Us amongst other things

- "That there is in the County of Surrey and Diocese of Winchester the Benefice of Farnham the Parish whereof contains a population of 5306 or thereabouts with accommodation in the Parish Church for 1400 persons and in the Church or Chapel of Saint James for 400 persons.
- "The nett annual value of the said Benefice of Farnham is Five hundred and fifty pounds or thereabouts.
- "That there is in the same County and Diocese the Benefice of Hale the Parish whereof contains a population of 4731 or thereabouts with accommodation in the Parish Church for 450 persons.
- "The nett annual value of the said Benefice of Hale is Two hundred and sixty-nine pounds or thereabouts.
- "That it appears to the said Lord Bishop that under the provisions of the Pluralities Act 1838 a portion of the said Parish of Hale (more particularly described in the Scheme of the said Lord Bishop and also delineated in the plan annexed to such Scheme and thereon verged with a pink line) may be advantageously separated therefrom and annexed to the said Parish of Farnham to which it is contiguous.
- "That pursuant to the directions contained in the 26th Section of the said Act of Parliament the said Lord Bishop has drawn up a Scheme in writing describing the mode in which it appears to him that the proposed alterations may best be effected and how the changes consequent on such alterations in respect to Ecclesiastical jurisdiction Glebe lands Tithes rent charges and other Ecclesiastical dues rates and payments and in respect to patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested which Scheme together with the Consents thereto in writing of the said Lord Bishop by virtue of his Bishopric the Patron or person entitled to present to the said Benefices of Farnham and Hale (if the same or either of them were now vacant) the Reverend Ernest Neville Lovett the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Farnham and the Reverend Allan Macnab Watson the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Hale has been transmitted to Us by the said Lord Bishop for Our consideration.
- "The Representation and Scheme of the said Lord Bishop and the Consents above referred to are hereunto annexed.
- "And We the said Archbishop being on full consideration and enquiry satisfied with the said Scheme do hereby pursuant to the said Pluralities Act 1838 certify the same and such Consents as aforesaid to Your Majesty in Council to the intent that Your Majesty in Council may in case Your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do make and issue an Order for carrying the said Scheme into effect.

HEREAS by section 26 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, after reciting that "Whereas in some instances tithings, hamlets, chapelries, and other places or districts may be separated from the parishes or mother churches to which they belong, with great advantage, and places altogether extra-parochial may, in some instances, with advantage be annexed to parishes or districts to which they are contiguous, or be constituted separate parishes for ecclesiastical purposes," it is, amongst other things, enacted, "That when with respect to his own diocese it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, or when the Bishop of any diocese shall represent to the said Archbishop, that any such tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place or district within the diocese of such Archbishop, or the diocese of such Bishop, as the case may be, may be advantageously separated from any parish or mother church, and either be constituted a separate benefice by itself or be united to any other parish to which it may be more conveniently annexed, or to any other adjoining tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place, or district, parochial or extra-parochial, so as to form a separate parish or benefice, or that any extra-parochial place may with advantage be annexed to any parish to which it is contiguous, or be constituted a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes; and the said Archbishop, or Bishop, shall draw up a scheme in writing (the scheme of such Bishop to be transmitted to the said Archbishop for his consideration) describing the mode in which it appears to him that the alteration may best be effected, and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes, rent charges, and other ecclesiastical dues, rates and payments, and in respect to patronage and rights to pews, may be made with justice to all parties interested; and, if the patron or patrons of the benefice or benefices to be affected by such alteration shall consent in writing under his or their hands to such scheme, or to such modification thereof, as the said Archbishop may approve, and the said Archbishop shall, on full consideration and inquiry, be satisfied with any such scheme, or modification thereof, and shall certify the same and such consent as aforesaid, by his report to His Majesty in Council, it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council to make an Order for carrying such scheme or modification thereof, as the case may be, into effect."

And whereas the Right Reverend John, Lord Bishop of Hereford, hath, pursuant to the enactment aforesaid, made a representation to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"I the Right Reverend John Lord Bishop of Hereford do hereby represent to Your Grace that there is in the county of Hereford and my diocese of Hereford a district known as Haywood Forest containing one thousand six hundred and fifty-four acres which district is extra parochial the boundaries whereof are well defined.

"That there is no church for the said extra parochial district of Haywood Forest and the inhabitants thereof have been in the habit of worshipping in the churches of the adjoining parishes of Clehonger and Callow.

"That the said extra parochial district is bounded on the north-west by the parish of Clehonger and the Vicar of Clehonger has from time to time exercised the office of spiritual minister over such portion of the said district as lies to the north of the line of the Great Western Railway which portion is coloured pink on the plan hereunto annexed.

"That the population of that portion of the said extra parochial district of Haywood Forest which lies to the north of the said Great Western Railway is 114 and the population of the said parish of Clehonger is 400.

"That the parish church of Clehonger aforesaid contains accommodation for 300 persons.

STATUTE to amend Statute V Scholars and Exhibitioners) framed by the Commissioners appointed under the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877 (40 and 41 Victoria, c. 48), in relation to the College of the Great Hall of the University commonly called University College, in the University of Oxford, duly enacted at an Extraordinary General Meeting of the Master and Fellows, being the Governing Body of the said College, specially summoned for this purpose, and holden on the twenty-seventh day of April, one thousand nine hundred and twelve, and passed by the unanimous vote of those present and voting, and submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council.

Whereas, in the year 1891, the Master and Fellows of the College of the Great Hall of the University commonly called University College, in the University of Oxford, did, with the consent of Her Majesty in Council, amend the Statutes of the said College so as to convert the emoluments of one Scholarship out of the Linton Fund to the establishment of two Exhibitions of £40 per annum, to be awarded for special proficiency in Modern History.

RAG FLOCK ACT, 1911. Regulations under Section 1 (1). GENERAL.

To the Mayor, Aldermen, and Commons of the city of London in Common Council assembled;

To the councils of the several Metropolitan boroughs;-

To the councils of the several municipal boroughs and other urban districts in England and Wales;

To the councils of the several rural districts in England and Wales;-And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of section 1 of the Rag Flock Act, 1911 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), it is enacted as follows:

"(1.) It shall not be lawful for any person to sell or have in his possession for sale flock manufactured from rags or to use for the purpose of making any article of upholstery, cushions, or bedding flock manufactured from rags or to have in his possession flock manufactured from rags intended to be used for any such purpose, unless the flock conforms to such standard of cleanliness as may be prescribed by regulations to be made by the Local Government Board, and, if any person sells or uses or has in his possession flock in contravention of this Act, he shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding, in the case of a first offence, ten pounds, or in the case of a second or subsequent offence, fifty pounds.'

And whereas it is expedient that the regulations hereinafter set forth be made in relation

to flock manufactured from rags: NOW THEREFORE, We,

THEREFORE, We, the Local Government Board, by this Our Order, and in the exercise of the powers conferred upon Us by the Act, and of every other power enabling Us in that behalf, do make the following regulations, that is to say:-

ARTICLE I.—Flock shall be deemed to conform to the standard of cleanliness for the purposes of sub-section (1) of section I of the Act when the amount of soluble chlorine, in the form of chlorides, removed by thorough washing with distilled water at a temperature not exceeding 25 degrees centigrade from not less than 40 grammes of a well-mixed sample of flock, does not exceed 30 parts of chlorine in 100,000 parts of the flock.

ARTICLE II.—These regulations may be cited as "The Rag Flock Regulations, 1912," and shall come into operation on the

first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and twelve.
