The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth,

chapter seventy-seven, of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and thirteen, and of the Act of the thirty-seventh and thirty-eighth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter sixty-three, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the ninth day of May, in the year one thousand nine hundred and twelve, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, chapter seventy-seven, of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and thirteen, and of the Act of the thirty-seventh and thirty-eighth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter sixty-three, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for constituting a new archdeaconry within the Diocese of Southwell, and for endowing such new archdeaconry.

“ Whereas the said Diocese of Southwell now comprises three archdeaconries and no more, namely the Archdeaconry of Chesterfield, the Archdeaconry of Derby, and the Archdeaconry of Nottingham.

“ And whereas the Right Reverend Edwyn, Bishop of Southwell, has represented to us and
