"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of the Ascension, Stirchley, comprising: -All those contiguous portions of the parish of King's Norton and of the new parish (sometime district chapelry) of Moseley, both in the county of Worcester and in the diocese of Birmingham, which, taken together, are bounded upon the north-west by the new parish of Saint Stephen, Selly Hill, in the said county and diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south-west, upon the south-east, and upon the north, by an imaginary line commencing at the centre of the culvert which carries the Worcester and Birmingham Canal across the stream called the Bourn where the boundaries of the said new parish of Saint Stephen, Selly Hill, of the new parish of Saint Mary, Selly Oak, in the said county and diocese, and of the said parish of King's Norton all meet, and extending thence first southward and then south-eastward along the middle of the said canal for a distance of sixty-four chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries the Bristol and Birmingham line of the Midland Railway across such canal, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the said line of railway (thereby following in part the boundary which divides the new parish of All Saints, King's Heath, in the said county and diocese, from the said parish of King's Norton and from the said new parish of Moseley) for a distance of one mile and twenty-four chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries such line of railway across Dad's Lane, and extending thence first north-westward, then westward, and then again north-westward along the middle of Dad's Lane for a distance of thirtyfive chains or thereabouts to its junction with Dogpool Lane, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Dogpool Lane for a distance of three chains and a half or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries such lane across the River Rea, upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Moseley from the said new parish of Saint Stephen, Selly Hill."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts. And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Birmingham.
