## ANIMALS (LANDING FROM IRELAND) AMENDMENT ORDER OF 1913.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1911, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

## Landing of Swine from Ireland.

1. Part II. of the Animals (Landing from Ireland) Consolidation and Amendment Order of 1912 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order ") shall be read and have effect as if the words "until the expiration of twelve hours from the time of the landing of the swine" were substituted for the words "until the expiration of fourteen days from the date of departure from Ireland of the vessel in which the swine were conveyed."

# Commencement.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the third day of January, nineteen hundred and thirteen.

## Short Title.

3. This Order may be cited as the Animals (Landing from Ireland) Amendment Order or 1913, and shall be read with the principal Order.
