It is hereby notified that His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs has received a telegraphic despatch from Vice-Admiral Burney, commanding His Majesty's Naval forces in Montenegrin waters, addressed to the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, and dated April 23rd, stating that the blockade announced in the London Gazette of April 11th has been extended to Durazzo by the officers in command of the British, Austro-Hungarian, French, German and Italian Naval forces. The blockade was put in force from 6 a.m. on April 23rd.
