His Majesty the King has been graciously pleased to award the Edward Medal of the Second Class to John Cairns ...nder the following circumstances:-

On the 13th of March an inrush of water from old workings occurred at the Townhead Iron Ore Mine, Egremont, Cumberland, shortly after a number of men had descended the pit shaft to their work. As soon as the alarm was raised all men made for the shaft bottom, with the exception of James Ward, who had gone alone to his usual working place some distance from the others. Cairns was rushing to the shaft to escape, when he recollected that Ward, who was working alone, would be unaware of the danger till too late. He promptly turned back to find Ward and hurry him out of the working. By the time he had reached him the water had risen and the two men found it impossible to get back to the shaft. Luckily, they reached a stone drift above the water level, which happened to be connected with the surface by a six-inch bore-Through this bore-hole communications were made to them from above and food was sent down. They remained imprisoned for 5½ days until they were rescued after the mine had been cleared of water.

There is no doubt that Cairns imperilled his own life by his plucky action in going back into the mine to give warning to Ward.

Also to Thomas Wagstaff and Allan Holli-

day under the following circumstances:

On 20th February, 1913, at the Burton Brewery Company's Work, Burton-on-Trent, a number of men were lime-washing the ceiling of a hop-press room. On the wall, about two or three feet above the scaffolding on which the men were standing, a shaft was running, driving two cog-wheels. One of the men, named Arbon, was leaning over the shaft when he was suddenly caught and dragged into the machinery. Holliday, who was Holliday, who was standing near, at once seized hold of him and became entangled in the gear-wheels himself. The clothes of both men were torn from them, and they were in imminent peril. With great presence of mind Wagstaff seized hold of Holliday and succeeded in keeping clear of the cogwheels. Holliday escaped with very serious injuries, but Arbon unfortunately lost his life. There can be no doubt that by their plucky action both Holliday and Wagstaff incurred the gravest risk to their own lives.

NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE.

The National Health Insurance (Transfer of Deposit Contributors) (Wales) Order, 1913 (No. 2), dated July 24th, 1913, made by the Welsh Insurance Commissioners under sections 78 and 82 of the National Insurance Act, 1911 (1 & 2 Geo. 5, c. 55).

Whereas by section 78 read with section 82 of the National Insurance Act, 1911 (in this Order called "the Act"), it is amongst other things provided that if any difficulty arises in bringing Part I of the Act into operation in Wales, the Welsh Insurance Commissioners, with the consent of the Treasury, may by Order make any appointment and do anything which appears to them necessary or expedient for bringing Part I. of the Act into operation in Wales, and any such Order may modify the provisions of the Act so far as may appear necessary or expedient for carrying the Order into effect:

And whereas by section 42 of the Act, and by the Regulations made thereunder, it is amongst other things provided that insured persons who have not joined an approved society within the time prescribed, shall become deposit contributors within the meaning of that section, and by section 43 of the Act, provision is made for the transfer of deposit contributors to approved societies and for the necessary consequential adjustments between the Post Office Fund and the funds of the approved societies:


And whereas in many cases persons have under the provisions of the Act and the said Regulations become deposit contributors, but have, by reason of the fact that contributions payable by or in respect of them have not been paid, or for other reasons, failed to take such steps as were necessary for the purpose of enabling accounts to be opened in their name in the Post Office Fund:

And whereas many of such persons have since become members of approved societies for the purposes of Part I. of the Act, and delay has arisen and will arise in ascertaining the position in insurance of such persons and in the administration of their benefits by their approved societies by reason of the fact that it is necessary that contributions, or arrears of contributions, payable by or in respect of them

before the time of their joining an approved society, should be paid into the Post Office Fund, and the necessary transfers and adjustments should be subsequently made between the Post Office Fund and the approved society, and doubts have arisen, in the case of approved societies, whether they are in order in administering the benefits of such persons until the proper amount, if any, has been transferred to the societies from the Post Office Fund and the adjustments aforesaid have been made, and a difficulty has thereby arisen within the meaning of the said section 78:

Now, therefore, the Welsh Insurance Commissioners, in pursuance of the powers conferred on them by the said section read with section 82 of the Act and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, with the consent of the Treasury, hereby order as follows:—

- 1. Where no account has been opened in the Post Office Fund in the name of any person who, by reason of any provisions of the Act or of any Regulations made thereunder, has become or is deemed to have become a deposit contributor, that person may, if he shall have joined an approved society for the purposes of Part I of the Act before the 15th day of July, 1913, notwithstanding anything contained in the Act or the Regulations made thereunder, be treated in all respects and for all purposes as a member of the society as from the date on which, under any provisions of the Act or of the said Regulations, he would, but for this Order, have become or be deemed to have become a deposit contributor.
- 2. This Order may be cited as the National Health Insurance (Transfer of Deposit Contributors) (Wales) Order, 1913 (No. 2).

LISKEARD UNION.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Liskeard Union;

WHEREAS by an Order dated the 24th day of July, 1847, addressed to the Guardians of the Poor of the Liskeard Union (amongst

others), and by the Workhouse Regulation (Dietaries and Accounts) Order, 1900, the Poor Law Commissioners and We, the Local Government Board, respectively, made Rules and Regulations with regard to the government of the Workhouse of the Liskeard Union, and the diet of the inmates of the Workhouse:

MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.

Regulations under Section 9 (1).

COUNTY OF HERTFORD.

To the County Council of Hertford; And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by Sub-section (1) of Section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), it is enacted that, within any limits or place referred to in Regulations made by Us, the Local Government Board, with a view to the safety of the public, on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour;

And whereas the County Council of Hertford, having made application to Us to make a Regulation in pursuance of the said Sub-section putting the above-mentioned provisions of that Sub-section in force within the limits comprising certain roads or parts of roads at Letchworth, in the County of Hertford, We directed a Local Inquiry to be held into the

matter by one of our Inspectors, and the Inquiry was held accordingly, and report has been made to Us thereon:

NOW THEREFORE, in pursuance of the powers given to Us in that behalf, We do, by this our Order, make the following Regulations:—

ARTICLE I.—The provisions of Sub-section (1) of Section 9 of the Act with respect to the driving of a motor car at a speed not exceeding ten miles per hour shall apply and have effect within the limits comprising the parts of roads at Letchworth which are specified in the Schedule hereto.

ARTICLE II.—These Regulations shall come into operation on the twenty-eighth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and thirteen.

SCHEDULE.

So much of Norton Road as extends from a point in the road 100 yards south-west of the "Three Horse Shoes" Inn to the south-western corner of the garden of "Hillcrest" at the eastern end of Norton Village; and

So much of the main road from Hitchin to Baldock as extends from a point in the road 50 yards west of its junction with Letchworth Lane to a point 50 yards east of its junction with Norton Way South.
