RULES OF THE SUPREME COURT.

Notice is hereby given that the following draft Rules are published, pursuant to the Rules Publication Act, 1893:—

Draft Rules under the Trade Union Act, 1913, Section 2 (4).

1. All appeals to the High Court under Section 2 (4) of the Trade Union Act, 1913, shall be brought by petition in the Chancery Division of the High Court of Justice presented within three months of the decision of the Registrar, or within such further time as the Court may under special circumstances allow. Each such petition shall state the nature of the decision appealed against, and shall also state concisely the grounds of the appeal and no grounds, other than those so stated, shall, except with the leave of the Court to be given on such terms and conditions as may seem just, be allowed to be taken by the appellant at the hearing.

2. Every such appeal shall, subject to any direction of the Court to the contrary, be set down in the same manner as if it were a witness action, and be heard and disposed of in due course.

3. In all proceedings on such appeal the evi-

dence shall be the same as that presented to the Registrar, if any, and no further evidence shall be given, except by the leave of the Court on application to be made to the Court at or before the hearing.

4. In all proceedings on such appeal, the Court shall have all the powers by the Act vested in the Registrar, and may make any order which might, or ought to have been made by the Registrar.

5. In all proceedings on such appeal, the costs of and incident thereto, including the cost of any proceedings before the Registrar, shall be in the discretion of the Court.

#### Whitehall, August 22, 1913.

The KING was pleased, at Buckingham Palace, on Tuesday, the 12th instant, to present to Mr. George Edward Bennett and to Mr. George Frederick Irish Albert Medals of the Second Class for gallantry in saving life, as detailed below:

On the 28th December last while an exhibition was being given at the Empire Cinema Palace, Slough, some cinematograph films, which a boy, aged 13 years, was rewinding, caught fire. In response to the boy's shouts an operator from the adjoining operating chamber tried to put out the fire with a wet blanket, but the flames were too fierce for his efforts to prove successful. Mr. Bennett, the proprietor, was in the hall, and on learning that the boy was in the rewinding room, he at once climbed the vertical iron ladder leading to the trap-door of the room, from which volumes of flame and smoke were issuing. On entering the room he found the boy lying on the floor, and succeeded in dragging him to the trap-door and down the ladder into the hall, and thus saved the boy's life. Some 5,000 feet of film were destroyed. Mr. Bennett was badly burned, and ran very serious risk to his own life.

On the 27th April, 1913, while young children were playing at Redditch, Worcestershire, on a piece of ground through which a sewer was being carried, a boy, one of their number, fell into the sewer and disappeared. Attracted by the children's cries Irish ran to the spot, where the sewer was open for some 30 or 40 yards. The boy was not to be seen, but the place where he had fallen in having been pointed out, Irish jumped into the sewer, which

was 2½ feet wide and 14 feet deep with perpendicular sides, and with some difficulty succeeded in finding the child in the water at. the bottom. He lifted him out and found him to be insensible. The water was level with the rescuer's head, and owing to the narrowness of the sewer and the steepness of the sides he was unable to climb out, so he had to support the boy until assistance arrived. child was apparently dead, but by the aid of. artificial respiration he was brought round and recovered.

A full description of the explosion and of the gallantry of various officers and others to whom Albert Medals were awarded in 1911 will be found in the London Gazette of September 26th, 1911.

Captain Ross discovered the fire, and with a detachment of his regiment entered the magazine compound with a small hand engine fed from tanks in the magazine, and attempted to put out the fire. He also worked at getting

the steam engine into position.

Major Young, as General Anderson's Brigade-Major, was constantly with the General in positions of great danger. In particular he joined General Anderson at a critical moment by the door of No. 8 cell, from which the gunpowder was being removed, and remained with the General throughout the rest of the period of danger.

Captain Battye assisted in the removal of the unpowder from No. 8 cell. He also, with Staff Serjeant Fitzpatrick, directed the operations for piercing two holes through the masonry of the roof of Cell No. 9, where the small arms ammunition was burning, and succeeded in getting the hose through these holes so as to play on the burning ammunition. By this means a check on the fire in No. 9 was effected. Both men were conspicuous throughout the day in the magazine enclosure.

The National Health Insurance (Further Payments to Approved Societies) (Wales) Order (No. 5), 1913, dated 22nd August, 1913, made by the Welsh Insurance Commissioners under sections 78 and 82 of the National Insurance Act, 1911 (1 & 2 Geo. V, c. 55).

Whereas by section 78 of the National Insurance Act, 1911 (in this Order called "the Act"), it is amongst other things provided that if any difficulty arises in bringing Part I of the Act into operation the Insurance Commissioners, with the consent of the Treasury, may by Order make any appointment and do anything which appears to them necessary or expedient for bringing Part I of the Act into operation, and any such Order may modify the provisions of the Act so far as may appear necessary or expedient for carrying the Order into effect:

And whereas by section 82 of the Act like powers are conferred upon the Welsh Insurance Commissioners (in this Order called "the Commissioners"):

And whereas by section 82 of the Act it is amongst other things provided that the sums required to meet expenditure properly incurred by Approved Societies (in this Order called "Societies") for the purposes of benefits under Part I of the Act to insured persons resident in Wales and the administration of those benefits shall be paid out of the Welsh National Health Insurance Fund (in this Order referred to as "the Fund"):

And whereas it is necessary in order to bring Part I of the Act into operation that payment should be made out of the Fund to meet expenditure properly incurred by Societies for the purposes of the benefits administered by them and the administration of those benefits:

And whereas up to the date of this Order it has not been possible, and will not for some time to come be possible, to carry to the credit of the various Societies all the sums which ought to be carried to the credit of the Societies in respect of contributions paid by or in respect of the members of those Societies before the date of this Order and the sums which ought to be credited to the Societies under section 55 of the Act read with section 82 of the Act in respect of reserve values:

And whereas the Regulations to be made under section 56 of the Act read with section 82 of the Act providing for the crediting of sums to Societies are not yet in force:

And whereas it is apprehended that by reason of the premises payments cannot lawfully be made out of the Fund for the purposes aforesaid unless this Order is made, and a difficulty has thereby arisen within the meaning of the said section 78.

Now therefore, the Commissioners in pursuance of the powers conferred on them by the Act and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, with the consent of the Treasury, hereby order as follows:—

1.—(1) Subject to such conditions as the Commissioners may impose, there may be paid out of the Fund at any time after the date of this Order to any Society which has given security to the Commissioners pursuant to the


provisions of section 26 of the Act read with section 82 of the Act such sums as are shown to the satisfaction of the Commissioners to be necessary for the purpose of meeting expenditure to be incurred by the Society for the purposes of the benefits administered by them and the administration of those benefits during the prescribed period:

prescribed period:

(2) For the purposes of this Order the expression "the prescribed period" means such period as the Commissioners may think fit in each case, not exceeding in any case three

months from the date of payment.

- 2. Subject as aforesaid there may be paid out of the Fund to any Society which has not given security to the Commissioners pursuant to section 26 of the Act read with section 82 of the Act such sums not exceeding the actual amount expended in respect of the period ending the twelfth day of October, 1913, by that Society as certified by the proper officers of the Society, as the Commissioners may think fit.
- 3. The total amount paid to a Society under this Order together with all sums paid out of the Fund to the Society prior to the date of this Order for the purpose of meeting expenditure incurred or to be incurred by the Society for the purposes of benefits and the administration of benefits or either of such purposes, and all sums credited to any Insurance Committee and debited to the Society, and an amount which in the opinion of the Commissioners is not less than the amount of all the sums which ought to be paid by or credited at the expense of the Society to any Insurance Committee under any provision of the Act, and which have not been so paid or credited shall not exceed the sum of the amounts standing to the credit of, or due to be credited to, the Society in the Approved Societies Current Account, the Investment Account and the Reserve Values Account, and of moneys invested on behalf of the Society at the date of such payment, together with such sum as may be estimated to become payable out of moneys provided by Parliament in respect of the expenditure to be incurred by the Society during the period for which the payment is made.
- 4. Any payments made to a Society in pursuance of this Order shall, so far as they are payments which could properly have been made out of the Fund under section 82 of the Act if made in the prescribed manner, and if money had been credited in the Fund to that Society, be deemed to have been duly made in pursuance of the provisions of section 82 of the Act.
- 5. This Order may be cited as the National Health Insurance (Further Payments to Approved Societies) (Wales) Order (No. 5), 1913.
