30. To the Mayor, Aldermen, and Commons of the city of London, in Common Council assembled;—

To the councils of the several metropolitan boroughs, municipal boroughs, and other urban districts in England and Wales;—

To the councils of the several rural districts in England and Wales;—

To all medical practitioners;—
To all certified midwives;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS We, the Local Government Board, are empowered by section 130 of the Public Health Act, 1875, as amended by the Public Health Act, 1896, from time to time, to make, alter, and revoke Regulations with a view to the treatment of persons affected with any endemic or infectious disease and for preventing the spread of the disease; and to provide for the enforcement and execution of the Regulations;

And whereas Ophthalmia Neonatorum as hereinafter defined is an endemic and an infectious disease:

NOW THEREFORE, We, by this Our Order and in the exercise of the powers conferred upon Us by the Public Health Act, 1875, the Public Health (London) Act, 1891, and the Public Health Act, 1896, and of every other power enabling Us in that behalf, do hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

Definitions.

ARTICLE I.—In these Regulations, unless the contrary intention appears:—

- (a) Words importing the masculine gender include females;
- (b) Words in the singular include the plural, and words in the plural include the singular;
- (c) Expressions referring to writing include references to printing, and to other modes of representing or reproducing words in a visible form, and references to printing include references to other mechanical modes of so representing or reproducing words;

of so representing or reproducing words;
(d) The expression "Local Authority"
means, as the case may be, the Mayor, Aldermen, and Commons of the City of London
in Common Council assembled, the Council
of a Metropolitan Borough, the Council of
a Municipal Borough or other Urban District, or the Council of a Rural District;

(e) The expression "District" means the District subject to the jurisdiction of the Local Authority for the purposes of the Public Health (London) Act, 1891, or of the Public Health Act, 1875, as the case may be:

(f) The expression "Medical Officer of Health" means Medical Officer of Health of a Local Authority;

(g) The expression "Medical Practitioner" means any person for the time being registered under the Medical Acts;
(h) The expression "Certified Midwife"

(h) The expression "Certified Midwife" means a woman certified under the Midwives Act, 1902;

(i) The expression "Ophthalmia Neonatorum" means a purulent discharge from the eyes of an infant commencing within twentyone days from the date of its birth.

Commencement of Regulations.

ARTICLE II.—These Regulations shall come into operation on the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and fourteen, and shall then and thereafter apply and have effect throughout England and Wales, and shall be enforced and executed by every Local Authority.

Supply of Forms of Notification.

ARTICLE III.—For the purposes of these Regulations every Local Authority shall provide and maintain a sufficient supply of printed copies of the Form set out in the Schedule to these Regulations, and shall as soon as practicable after these Regulations come into operation, and afterwards from time to time when application is made to them, furnish printed copies of the said Form to every certified midwife resident or practising within the District of the Local Authority.

Notice of Provisions of Regulations.

ARTICLE IV.—The Local Authority shall forthwith cause notice to be given to all Medical Practitioners and to all Certified Midwives resident or practising within the District of the Local Authority of the duties imposed upon them by these Regulations.

Notification by Medical Practitioners.

ARTICLE V.—(1) Subject to the provisions of these Regulations every Medical Practitioner, on first becoming aware that a child upon whom he is in professional attendance is suffering from Ophthalmia Neonatorum, shall forthwith make and sign a notification of the case in the Form prescribed for the purpose of certificates under Section 3 of the Infectious Disease (Notification) Act, 1889, at the same time stating in writing, either on the form or on a separate sheet attached to the form, the date of birth of the child, the name and address of the parent or other person, if any, having charge of the child, and the date of the onset of the disease, and shall transmit the notification and statement aforesaid to the Medical Officer of Health for the District within which the place of residence of the parent or other person, if any, having charge of the child is situate at the date of notification:

Provided that a Medical Practitioner shall not be required to notify a case of Ophthalmia Neonatorum under these Regulations in any of the following cases; that is to say,—

- (a) If the case is notifiable or has been notified under the Infectious Disease (Notification) Act, 1889, Section 55 of the Public Health (London) Act, 1891, or under the provisions of any Local Act or Order made thereunder; or
- (b) If the case has been notified by a Certified Midwife as hereinafter provided.
- (2) Every Medical Practitioner who transmits to a Medical Officer of Health a notification of a case of Ophthalmia Neonatorum under the Infectious Disease (Notification) Act, 1889, section 55 of the Public Health (London) Act,

1891, or under the provisions of any Local Act or Order made thereunder, shall at the same time state in writing, either on the form or on a separate sheet attached to the form, the date of birth of the child, the name and address of the parent or other person, if any, having charge of the child, and the date of the onset of the disease.

Notification by Certified Midwives.

ARTICLE VI.—Subject to the provisions of Article X of these Regulations every Certified Midwife who has reasonable grounds for supposing that a child upon whom she is in attendance or whom she is called in to visit in the course of her practice is suffering from Ophthalmia Neonatorum, shall, unless the case has been already notified by a Medical Practitioner, forthwith make and sign a notification of the case in the Form set out in the Schedule to these Regulations, and shall transmit the notification to the Medical Officer of Health for the District within which the place of residence of the parent or other person, if any, having charge of the child is situate at the date of notification.

Transmission of Notifications.

ARTICLE VII.—A notification to be transmitted to a Medical Officer of Health in pursuance of these Regulations shall be enclosed in a sealed envelope addressed to that Officer and may be transmitted by being delivered to him or by being delivered at his office or residence, or may be sent by prepaid letter post addressed to him at his office or at his residence.

Fees for Notification.

ARTICLE VIII.—(1) The Local Authority shall pay to every Medical Practitioner a fee of two shillings and sixpence for each notification duly made, signed and transmitted by him under these Regulations if the case occurs in his private practice, and of one shilling if the case occurs in his practice as medical officer of any public body or institution.

- (2) The Local Authority shall pay to every Certified Midwife a fee of one shilling for each notification duly made, signed and transmitted by her under these Regulations.
- (3) Every fee shall be paid as soon as practicable after the end of the quarter during which the notification was sent, and the Local Authority shall not require before payment an account of fees claimed under these Regulations
- (4) The said fees shall in each case be deemed to cover all expenses, including the cost of transmission.

Duties of Medical Officers of Health.

ARTICLE IX.—The duties assigned to the Medical Officer of Health by the Sanitary Officers (London) Order, 1891, or the Sanitary Officers (Outside London) Order, 1910, as the case may be, shall be deemed to extend to and to include all action by the Medical Officer of Health in the execution of these Regulations.

Notification not required in certain cases.

ARTICLE X.—Nothing in these Regulations shall be deemed to require a notification to be transmitted to a Medical Officer of Health in

respect of the child of an inmate of any building, ship, vessel, boat, tent, van, shed or similar structure belonging to His Majesty the King.

Short Title.

ARTICLE XI.—These Regulations may be cited as "The Public Health (Ophthalmia Neonatorum) Regulations, 1914."

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(Dated 2nd February, 1914.)

THE WART DISEASE OF POTATOES ORDER OF 1914.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in

them under the Destructive Insects and Pests Acts, 1877 and 1907, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Application of the Order.

1. This Order shall apply to England and Wales.

Definitions.

- 2. In this Order-
- "The Board" means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries:
- "The Local Authority" means as regards any District the Local Authority for the District under the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894:
- "Disease" means the disease affecting potatoes which is known as Synchytrium endobioticum, or Wart Disease of potatoes, Black Scab, Cauliflower disease, or Potato canker; and "diseased" means visibly affected with disease:
- "Tubers" means tubers of the potato plant.

Notification of Disease.

3. The occupier of any premises on which disease exists, or appears to exist, shall forthwith notify the fact by post or otherwise to the Board, or to an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of the Local Authority authorised to receive such notification, and where practicable a specimen showing the disease shall accompany the notice.

Precaution to be adopted in case of an Outbreak or Supposed Outbreak of Disease.

4. No tubers shall be removed from any premises on which disease exists or appears to exist until after the investigation required by the next Article.

Investigation by Local Authority.

- 5.—(1.) The Local Authority on receiving in any manner notice of the existence or apparent existence of disease shall forthwith take such steps as may be necessary to determine on what premises the disease exists in the crops or soil, and shall cause notice of such determination to be served on the occupier of each of such premises, which, within the limits specified in the notice, shall thereupon become "infected premises" and continue to be infected premises until the notice is withdrawn in accordance with Article 9, but the limits of the infected premises may be extended by a notice served by the Local Authority on the occupier of the infected premises.
- (2.) The notice shall as far as practicable include in the infected premises only those lands in which there are or have been diseased tubers.

Action to be taken after Preliminary Investigation.

6.—(1.) The Local Authority may at any time and from time to time by a notice served on an occupier of infected premises require him to adopt such measures for prevention of the spread of the disease as are authorised by this Article and specified in the notice.

- (2.) A notice under this Article may require the occupier of the premises to adopt any one or more of the following measures:—
 - (a) to destroy any part of the crop, except the tubers, by fire or such other suitable method as may be specified in the notice;
 - (b) to boil thoroughly all diseased tubers;(c) to take such other steps as the Local
 - (c) to take such other steps as the Local Authority may consider necessary to prevent the disease being conveyed to other premises.
- (3.) Nothing in this Order shall prevent the destruction by the owner thereof, by fire or other effective method, of any diseased tubers.
- (4.) A notice under this Article may prescribe the time within which the adoption of any measure thereby prescribed shall be completed.

Power to Prohibit the Planting of Potatoes on Infected and other Premises.

7. The Local Authority may by a notice served on the occupier of any infected premises or any adjoining premises to which the disease is likely to spread prohibit the planting of potatoes in the infected or other premises except under such conditions as may be prescribed in the notice.

Provisions to prevent Spread of Disease by Planting Diseased Potatoes.

- 8.—(1.) Diseased tubers shall not be used for planting or sold or offered for sale for any purpose.
- (2.) No person shall use, except by licence of an Inspector of the Board or the Local Authority, or sell or offer for sale for planting tubers which to his knowledge have been grown on infected premises, whether the premises have been declared to be infected before or after the tubers were lifted.
- (3.) An Inspector of the Local Authority, acting under their directions, may by a notice served on any person having in his possession or under his charge tubers which are diseased, or in a pit, bag or other receptacle with diseased tubers, or which the Inspector has reason to believe to have been in a pit, bag or other receptacle with diseased tubers, or otherwise exposed to infection with disease, prohibit the removal of the tubers from the premises on which they are when the notice is served, except under such conditions as the Inspector, acting under such directions, may consider necessary to prevent the spread of disease and prescribe by the notice.

Withdrawal of Notices of Infected Premises.

9. A notice constituting any premises infected premises may be withdrawn by a notice signed by an Inspector or other officer of the Board. Unless there are special circumstances, a notice of withdrawal shall not be issued as regards any premises until the expiration of three years from the date of the notice declaring the premises infected.

Copies of Notices and Returns of Proceedings to be sent to the Board.

10.—(1.) A copy of every notice served under this Order shall be sent to the Board by

the Inspector or officer by whom the notice is signed.

(2.) The Local Authority shall, in a form to be provided by the Board, notify the Board of any outbreak of disease.

Information to be given as to Diseased Potatoes.

11. Every person who has or has had in his possession or under his charge any diseased tubers, and every person who as auctioneer, salesman or otherwise has sold or offered for sale any such tubers shall, if so required in writing by the Board, or the Local Authority, or an Inspector of the Board or of the Local Authority, give the Board, or the Local Authority, or the Inspector, as the case may be, all such information as he possesses as to the persons in whose possession or under whose charge they are or have been; Provided that any information given under this Article shall not be available as evidence against the person giving the same in any prosecution under this Order, except in respect of an alleged failure to comply with this Article.

Powers of Entry.

12. Any Inspector or other officer appointed in that behalf by the Local Authority, upon production if so required of his appointment or authority, may for the purpose of enforcing this Order enter any premises and examine any plant or tubers thereon.

Notification of Order.

13. This Order shall be published by the Local Authority in accordance with any direction given by the Board.

Powers of the Board and their Inspectors.

14. The powers conferred by this Order on a Local Authority or an Inspector of a Local Authority may be exercised by the Board or an Inspector of the Board respectively, and any notice served by a Local Authority or an Inspector of a Local Authority may be altered or revoked by a notice under this Order served by the Board or an Inspector of the Board.

Offences.

- 15. Every person shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds, who—
 - (1.) fails to give notification of disease as required by Article 3; or
 - (2.) fails to adopt such measures for prevention of the spread of the disease as are specified in a notice served on him under Article 6; or
 - removes any tubers in contravention of this Order or any notice served thereunder; or
 - (4.) plants potatoes in infected premises in contravention of a notice served under this Order: or
 - (5.) uses tubers or sells or offers for sale tubers in contravention of this Order; or
 - (6.) refuses or fails to give any information required under Article 11, or gives false information; or
 - (7.) wilfully obstructs or impedes any Inspector or other officer in the course of his duties under this Order.

Execution of the Order.

- 16.—(1.) Each Local Authority shall carry into effect this Order within their District, and shall appoint such Inspectors or other officers for that purpose as may be necessary.
- (2.) Any duty or power imposed or conferred on a Local Authority by this Order may be performed or exercised by an Inspector of the Local Authority acting under and in accordance with any directions in that behalf given by the Local Authority.
- 3.) For the purposes of this Order a notice shall be deemed to be served on a person if it is delivered to him personally or left for him at his last known place of abode or business or sent through the post in a letter addressed to him there, and a notice or other document purporting to be signed by the clerk or an Inspector of a Local Authority or an Inspector of the Board shall be prima facie evidence that it was signed by him and duly authorised by the Local Authority or the Board.

Revocation of Order.

- 17.—(1.) The Wart Disease of Potatoes Order of 1912 is hereby revoked; provided that such revocation shall not-
 - (i.) affect the previous operation of that Order or anything duly done or suffered under that Order; or
 - (ii.) affect any right, privilege, obligation, or liability acquired, accrued, or incurred under that Order; or
 - (iii.) affect any penalty incurred in respect of any offence committed against that Order; or
 - (iv.) affect any investigation, legal proceeding, or remedy in respect of any such right, privilege, obligation, liability, or penalty as aforesaid;

and any such investigation, legal proceeding, or remedy may be instituted, continued, or enforced, and any such penalty may be imposed, as if this Order had not been made.

(2.) Every notice served under the Order hereby revoked shall have effect as if it were a notice under this Order.

Commencement.

18. This Order shall come into operation on the third day of February, nineteen hundred and fourteen.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 2ND FEBRUARY, 1914.)

THE WART DISEASE OF POTATOES (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1914.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Destructive Insects and Pests Acts, 1877 and 1907, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Application of Order.

1. This Order shall apply to any Area declared by Order of the Board to be infected with Wart Disease, and any such Area shall be an Infected Area for the purposes of this Order.

Restriction on Planting in Infected Area.

2. No potatoes shall be planted or caused or permitted to be planted in an Infected Area except with the authority of a licence granted by an Inspector of the Board or otherwise than in accordance with the conditions imposed by the licence. The licence may prescribe the variety of potatoes authorized to be planted, and the source from which the potatoes shall be obtained.

Restriction of Removal of Potatoes grown in Infected Area.

3. Potatoes grown in an Infected Area, whether before or after the declaration of the Area to be infected, shall not be removed or caused or permitted to be removed from the Infected Area except with the authority of a licence granted by an Inspector of the Board; provided that this restriction shall not apply to the removal of potatoes not visibly diseased for the purpose of being consumed upon premises in the occupation of the person by whom they were grown.

Notification of Disease.

4. The occupier of any premises in an infected Area on which Wart Disease exists, or appears to exist, shall forthwith notify the fact by post or otherwise to the Board, or to the person authorized by the Board to receive such reports, who will forthwith forward the report to the Board. Where this Article applies Article 3 (Notification of Disease) of the Wart Disease of Potatoes Order of 1914 shall not apply.

Precautions against Spread of Disease.

- 5. The following measures for prevention of the spread of Wart Disease shall be adopted by each occupier of premises in an Infected Area.
 - (a) The haulm, leaves and roots of each diseased plant shall be destroyed either by fire, or by some other method authorized by an Inspector of the Board, within 14 days

from the date of lifting, either within the Infected Area or with the written authority of an Inspector of the Board at a place outside the Infected Area.

(b) Potatoes which are visibly diseased, if not forthwith destroyed by fire within the Infected Area, shall be thoroughly boiled as soon as possible, either within the Infected Area, or with the licence of an Inspector of the Board at a place outside the Infected Area.

(c) Litter or manure from any live stock which have been fed with potatoes grown on land within the Infected Area shall not be used or permitted to be used as manure on any land outside the Infected Area.

Power to require Crop to be lifted.

6. An Inspector of the Board may by notice served upon the occupier of any premises within an Infected Area require him to lift any potatoes which the Inspector may suspect to be affected with Wart Disease by a date specified in such notice.

Partial exemption from General Order.

7. No part of an Infected Area shall be declared to be "infected premises" under the Wart Disease of Potatoes Order of 1914, and any premises included in an Infected Area shall cease to be "infected premises."

Definitions.

8. In this Order—
"The Board" means the Board of Agri-

culture and Fisheries:

"Wart Disease" means the disease affecting potatoes which is known as Synchytrium

Wart endobioticum, or Disease of potatoes, Black Scab, Cauliflower disease, or Potato canker; and "diseased" affected with Wart Disease.

Offences.

9. Every person shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds, who-

(1) plants or removes or causes or permits to be planted or removed any potatoes in contravention of this Order; or

(2) fails to give notification of Wart Disease as required by Article 4; or

(3) fails to adopt any measure required by Article 5 to be adopted by him; or

(4) fails to lift any potatoes as required to be lifted by him under Article 6.

Short Title.

10. This Order may be cited as the WART DISEASE OF POTATOES (INFECTED AREAS) Order of 1914.

LEIGHTON BUZZARD URBAN DISTRICT COUNCIL.

(Authorizing the Ccuncil to Supply Gas within the Urban Districts of Leighton Buzzard and Linslade and adjoining Parishes in the Counties of Bedford and Buckingham, and to Acquire the Undertaking of the Leighton Buzzard Gas Company; Terms of Purchase; 'Agreements; Maintenance of Gasworks; Charges and Rates; Purchase of Lands; Power to Sell or Hire Stoves and Fittings; Contracts for Supply of Gas; Testing for Calorific Power and Pressure; Borrowing and Financial Powers and other usual Powers Conferred on Local Authorities Supplying Gas; Incorporation, Amendment and Repeal of Acts and other General Provisions.)

OTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament for leave to bring in a Bill in the present Session of Parliament by the Urban District Council of Leighton Buzzard (in this notice referred to as "the Council") for an Act for all or some of the following purposes (that is to say):—

1. To authorize the Council to manufacture, store, supply and sell gas for all public and private purposes within the urban district of Leighton Buzzard and the parishes of Billington, Eggington, Heath and Reach and Stanbridge, in the county of Bedford, and the urban district of Linslade and the parishes of Grove,

Mentmore, Slapton and Wing, in the county of Buckingham (in this notice referred to as "the area of supply"), and to exercise the powers usually conferred upon local authorities for supplying gas and the manufacture and dealing in residual products.

- 2. To empower the Council in pursuance of the provisions contained in the Leighton Buzzard Gas Act, 1891, or otherwise, to purchase the undertaking of the Leighton Buzzard Gas Company (in this notice referred to as "the Company") upon such terms and conditions as shall be agreed on between the Council and the Company, or as failing agreement shall be settled by arbitration, and to vest the undertaking in the Council, and to confer upon the Council and the Company such further powers as may be necessary in connection therewith.
- 3. To confirm any agreement which may be entered into between the Council and the Company for or in connection with the acquisition of the undertaking of the Company, and to provide for the dissolution and winding-up of the Company.
- 4. To authorize the Council to maintain, repair, renew and continue the existing gasworks of the Company upon the lands described in the First Part of the Schedule to the Leighton Buzzard Gas Act, 1891, and to store gas upon those lands and upon the lands described in the Second Part of the said Schedule, and from time to time to construct, alter, improve, enlarge, extend or remove buildings, apparatus and works for or incidental to the manufacture and storage of gas, and of coke, culm, tar, pitch, asphaltum, ammoniacal liquor, sulphate of ammonia, oil and other residual products therefrom, and to manufacture or convert, sell, dispose of and deal in coke and other products arising or resulting or obtained from the manufacture of gas.
- 5. To enable the Council to charge for gas supplied, and to fix a maximum price, and to provide that the same charges shall be made throughout the area of supply.
- 6. To make provision for the testing of the calorific value of the gas supplied, and to prescribe the manner and conditions under which such test shall be made, and to fix the penalties for deficient calorific value.
- 7. To provide also for the testing of the pressure of the gas supplied, and to relieve the Council from penalties where any insufficiency, defect or excess was caused by any circumstance beyond the control of the Council. To make provision with regard to the construction and placing of pipes and fittings between mains and meters, and to require the Council to pay interest on moneys deposited with them.
- 8. To authorize the Council to purchase or hire, provide, sell, let for hire, use and otherwise deal in and to fix, fit up, alter, repair, remove and refix stoves, ranges, ovens, prepayment and other meters, fittings, engines, machinery, pipes, lamps, burners, apparatus, appliances and things used in the supply or consumption of gas for lighting, motive power, heating, cooking or any other purpose whatsoever, and to provide materials and labour, and do works necessary therefor or in connection therewith for such remuneration and upon such terms and conditions as they may think fit or as may be prescribed by the Bill including security (both as regards the consumers and other parties) for the safety and return of such

articles and things, and to exempt all such articles and things from liability to distress or being taken in execution under process of law or in proceedings in bankruptcy.

- 9. To authorize the Council to levy and recover rents and charges for or in respect of the supply of gas and for the sale and hire of meters, fittings, stoves, engines, machinery, apparatus, appliances, pipes, lamps, burners and things, and to confer, vary and extinguish exemptions from the payment of rents and charges.
- 10. To make special provisions with reference to the following matters:

Notice of discontinuance of a supply of gas, power to refuse a supply to persons in debt for other premises, form of notice for discontinuance of supply, prescribing the period of error in the case of defective meters, provisions with regard to the supply of gas to users of gas suction plant, bye-laws as to fittings and the enforcing of same, power to require antifluctuators for gas engines, and to make a minimum charge for gas laid on to premises having a separate supply of gas or electricity.

- 11. To authorize the Council to purchase by agreement and to hold or take on lease and to acquire rights or easements over any lands or other hereditaments which may be required for the general purposes of the gas undertaking of the Council, and to sell, let or otherwise dispose of any lands for the time being belonging to them and not required for the purposes of their undertaking, and to purchase, erect, or take on lease dwelling houses for persons in their employ, and offices, showrooms, and other buildings for the purposes of their undertaking.
- 12. To authorize the Council to break open and interfere with public and private streets, roads, passages and places, railways, tramways and bridges, and to lay down, maintain, repair and renew gas mains, pipes and works in, upon and under the same within the area of supply.
- 13. To authorize the Council to enter into and carry into effect contracts and agreements with any company, corporation, body or person for the supply of gas in bulk to the Council, or for the supply by the Council of gas within and beyond the area of supply.
- 14. To enlarge the financial and rating powers of the Council and to enable them to borrow moneys for any of the purposes of the intended Act, to provide that moneys so borrowed shall not be subject to the limitation of the Public Health Act, 1875, to prescribe the mode of raising money, the form of mortgages, the protection of lenders and mode of repayment of loans and sinking fund, to authorize the Council to use their sinking funds instead of borrowing and adopt one uniform form of mortgage, to provide for the application of the revenue of the undertaking and the payment of any deficiency, and other provisions with regard to the borrowing powers of the Council.
- 15. To confer general powers on the Council with regard to the evidence of appointments, the authentication and service of notices, the liability of persons acting in exercising the powers of the Bill, and the informations which may be laid, and other clauses usually inserted

- in Bills relating to the supply of gas by a Local Authority.
- 16. To repeal, alter or vary all or any of the provisions of the Leighton Buzzard Gas Act, 1891, and any other Act or Order relating to the Company.
