HEREAS in pursuance of the Bishops Resignation Act, 1869, a representation has been made to His Majesty by the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, by Divine providence Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, Primate of all England and Metropolitan, at the instance of the Right Reverend George Forrest, by Divine permission Lord Bishop of Bristol, and, as such, a Bishop of a Diocese within and of the province of of a Diocese within and of the province of Canterbury, that the said Bishop is desirous of resigning his Bishopric, by reason that he is incapacitated by age from the due performance of his duties as Bishop.
