At the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 12th day of August, 1915.

By the Lords of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

WHEREAS it is provided by Section 2 of the Customs (Exportation Prohibition) Act, 1914, that any Proclamation or Order in Council made under Section 8 of the Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1879, as amended by the Act now in recital, may, whilst a state of war exists, be varied or added to by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of the Board of Trade:

And whereas it is provided by Section 2 of the Customs (Exportation Restriction) Act, 1914, that any Proclamation made under Section one of the Exportation of Arms Act, 1900, may, whether the Proclamation was made before or after the passing of the Act now in recital, be varied or added to, whilst a state of war exists, by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of the Board of Trade:

And whereas by a Proclamation dated the 28th day of July, 1915, and made under Section 8 of the Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1879, and Section one of the Exportation of Arms Act, 1900, and Section one of the

Customs (Exportation Prohibition) Act, 1914, the exportation from the United Kingdom of certain articles to certain or all destinations was prohibited:

And whereas by Orders of Council, dated respectively the 30th day of July, 1915, and the 3rd day of August, 1915, the said Proclamation was amended and added to in certain particulars:

And whereas there was this day read at the Board a recommendation from the Board of Trade to the following effect:—

That the Proclamation dated the 28th day of July, 1915, as amended and added to by the Orders of Council dated respectively the 30th day of July, 1915, and the 3rd day of August, 1915, should be further amended by making the following amendments in and additions to the same:—

- (1) That the heading "Hosiery Needles" in the list of goods the exportation of which is prohibited to all destinations should be deleted, and that the exportation of "Hosiery-Needles" should be prohibited to all destinations abroad other than British Possessions and Protectorates.
- (2) That the heading "Mercury" in the list of goods the exportation of which is prohibited to all destinations abroad other than British Possessions and Protectorates should be deleted, and that the exportation of

"Mercury" should be prohibited to all destinations.

- (3) That the heading "Mercury, salts and preparations of (other than nitrate of mercury)" in the list of goods the exportation of which is prohibited to all destinations abroad other than British Possessions and Protectorates should be deleted, and there be substituted therefor the heading "Mercury, compounds and preparations of (other than nitrate of mercury)."
- (4) That the exportation of the following goods should be prohibited to all destinations abroad other than British Possessions and Protectorates:—

Caustic Soda: Sodium.

(5) That the exportation of the following goods should be prohibited to all foreign countries in Europe and on the Mediterranean and Black Seas, other than France, Russia (except through Baltic ports), Italy, Spain and Portugal:—

Acetic Acid;

Antimony, compounds of, except sulphides and oxides of antimony (the exportation of which is prohibited to all destinations abroad other than British Possessions and Protectorates);

Copper, compounds of, except copper nitrate (the exportation of which is prohibited to all destinations), and copper iodide, copper sulphate, and suboxide of copper (the exportation of which is prohibited to all destinations abroad other than British Possessions and Protectorates);

Sodium cyanide; Sodium sulphide.

Now, therefore, Their Lordships, having taken the said recommendation into consideration, are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the same be approved.

Whereof the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs and Excise, the Director of the War Trade Department, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 28th day of July, 1915, in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and

provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

- "And whereas we consider it desirable to make Special Regulations in respect of Seamen and Marines injured in the present War:
- "We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the award of pension to any Seaman or Marine discharged from further service on account of injury received or disease contracted directly on account of Service during the War in accordance with the following Scheme.
- "Any man who loses two limbs, or the sight of both eyes, or is otherwise so severely incapacitated as to be totally disabled from earning his living, shall be granted a pension of 25s. a week.
- "Any man who is injured in a less degree, and is not totally disabled from earning his living, shall be granted such a pension as will, with the wages he may be deemed capable of earning, amount to 25s. a week, and shall receive in any case not less than 10s. 6d. a week if he has lost a limb, or the sight of an eye.
- "Men in possession of Good Conduct Badges or Medal shall receive the same addition to their pension in respect thereof as under existing Regulations. Chief Petty Officers, Petty Officers, and Leading Rates of the Royal Navy shall also receive the same additions in respect of petty time as under existing Regulations. Non-Commissioned Officers of the Royal Marines shall receive the additions laid down in the existing Regulations for Long Service Pensions in respect of Service above the rank of Private.

"Additions shall be made to the pensions awarded under the present Scheme in respect of each child born before the date of discharge. These additions shall be at the rate of 2s. 6d. a week for each child until the age of 16 years in the case of men receiving total disablement pensions, and at a rate not exceeding 2s. 6d. a week in the case of men partially disabled.

"The additions for children may be continued beyond the age of 16 on the recommendation of the Local Education Authority in the case of apprentices receiving not more than nominal wages, or of children being educated at Secondary Schools, Technical Schools, or Universities.

"The new rates of pension, including the allowances in respect of children, shall be granted as from 1st March, 1915, or from the date of discharge if later, in all cases of Seamen and Marines invalided as shown above throughout the present War from its commencement.

"If more favourable to the Seaman or Marine than the above Scheme the pension allowable under existing Regulations shall be granted.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf by the Foreign Jurisdiction Acts, 1890 and 1913, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Colonial Prisoners Removal Act, 1869, shall, from the date of this Order, apply to the Gambia Protectorate, the East Africa Protectorate, the Nyasaland Protectorate, Somaliland, Southern Rhodesia, and Weihaiwei, as though each of the said Protectorates were, within the meaning of the said Act, a Colony not having a Legislative Body.

And the Right Honourable Andrew Bonar Law, His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Colonies, is to give the necessary

directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, chapter 39, and the Act of the 3lst and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, chapter 114, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 15th day of July, in the year 1915, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, chapter 114, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowsons or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called 'the said Benefice') of Peasemore, the Church and Cure (hereinafter called 'the said Benefice') of Uffington with Woolstone, and the Church and Cure (hereinafter called 'the said Benefice') of Baulking, all in the County of Berks, and in the Diocese of Oxford:

"Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to each of the said Benefices of Peasemore, Catmere, Uffington with Woolstone, and Baulking, is vested for an estate in fee simple, in possession, in Henry Lindsay Archer Houblon, of Welford Park, in the County of Berks, a Captain in Your Majesty's Army:

"And whereas the said Henry Lindsay Archer Houblon is desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to each of the said Benefices of Peasemore, Catmere, Uffington with Woolstone, and Baulking, now vested in him as aforesaid should be transferred to and be vested in the Right Reverend Charles, now Bishop of Oxford, and his Successors in the same

Bishopric:

"And whereas the said Charles, Bishop of Oxford, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness, and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited, or by some or one of them, is made necessary, he, the said Charles, Bishop of Oxford, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefices of Peasemore, Catmere, Uffington with Woolstone, and Baulking, which is hereinbefore mentioned, and hereinafter recommended and proposed, will, in our opinion, tend to make better provision for the Cure of Souls in the Parishes or Districts in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowsons, so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid, respectively arise or exist, that is to say, in the Parishes of Peasemore, Catmere, Uffington with Woolstone, and Baulking:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Henry Lindsay Archer Houblon (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Charles, Bishop of Oxford, (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme, and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to each of the said Benefices of Peasemore, Catmere, Uffington with Woolstone, and Baulking, now vested in him the said Henry Lindsay Archer Houblon as aforesaid, shall be transferred to the said Charles, Bishop of Oxford, and his Successors in the same Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in, and shall and may from time to time be exercised by, the said Charles, Bishop of Oxford, and his Successors in the same Bishopric for

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar

of the said Diocese of Oxford.

HEREAS the Local Government Board, after giving to the Incumbent and the Churchwardens of the Parish of Falstone, in the Civil Parish of Plashet and Tynehead, in the County of Northumberland, of the Parish of Thorpe St. Andrew, in the Civil Parish of Thorpe (next Norwich), in the County of Norfolk, and of the Parish of Heptonstall, in the Civil Parish of Heptonstall, in the West Riding of the County of York, ten days' previous notice of their intention in that behalf, have, under the provisions of the Burial Act, 1853, as amended by the Burial Act, 1900, made Representations to His Majesty in Council, to the effect that, for the protection of the public health, the opening of any new burial grounds in the Civil Parishes of Plashet and Tynehead, Thorpe (next Norwich), and Heptonstall, aforesaid, save with the previous approval of the Local Government Board, should be prohibited, and that burials should be discontinued therein, as follows, viz.:

PLASHET AND TYNEHEAD.—Forthwith and entirely in the Parish Church of St. Peter, Falstone, in the Civil Parish of Plashet and Tynehead, in the County of Northumberland; and in the Churchyard attached thereto, with the following exceptions, that is to say:—

In the said Churchyard, in any grave space in which no interment has heretofore taken place, the burial may be allowed of the body of any person for whom, or of any member of a family for which, such grave space has been reserved and appropriated as a burial place, with the exclusive right of burial therein, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than 3 feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave

THORPE (NEXT NORWICH).—Forthwith and entirely in the Church of St. Andrew, Thorpe St. Andrew, in the Civil Parish of Thorpe (next Norwich), in the County of Norfolk; and in the Churchyard attached thereto, with the follow-

ing exceptions, that is to say:—

In the vault now existing in the said Churchyard, and belonging or reputed to belong to Lieutenant-Colonel John Robert Harvey, burial may be allowed subject to the condition that every coffin buried in such vault be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

HEPTONSTALL.—Forthwith and entirely in the old Church of St. Thomas a' Becket, Heptonstall, in the Civil Parish of Heptonstall, in the West Riding of the County of York; and in the Churchyard attached thereto, with the following exceptions, that is to say:—

(a) In any vault or walled grave now existing in the said Church or Churchyard, burial may be allowed subject to the condition that every coffin buried in such vault or grave be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork

properly cemented.

 (\hat{b}) In any earthen grave now existing in the said Churchyard, the burial may be allowed of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such grave, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than 3 feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give notice of such Representations, and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council, on the 23rd day of September next.

And His Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith published in the London Gazette, and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the Churches or Chapels of, or on some conspicuous places within, the Parishes affected by such Representations one month before the said 23rd day of September.

The KING has been pleased, by Letters Patent under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, bearing date the 28th June, 1915, to confer the dignity of a Baron of the said United Kingdom upon the Right Honourable Sir Francis Leveson Bertie, G.C.B., G.C.M.G., G.C.V.O., His Majesty's Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary to the French Republic, and the heirs male of his body lawfully begotten, by the name, style, and title of Baron Bertie of Thame, in the county of Oxford.

His Majesty the KING has been pleased to award the Edward Medal of the Second Class to James Wagenaar for bravery in saving life in the City Deep Gold Mine, Witwatersrand, South Africa, on the 29th October, 1913.

Wagenaar was working in the mine when he was informed by a native that five other natives down a winze, or steep incline, had been overcome by the fumes from explosives used in blasting (the debris brought down had interfered with the ventilation and prevented the dispersion of the gas). Wagenaar, tying a wet cloth round his mouth, immediately descended the winze to the place where the natives were lying in various stages of collapse, and, without assistance, brought out four of them in succession. He proceeded down the winze for the fifth time to bring out the last native, but was unable to carry him up more than a few yards, as he was fast being overcome by the fumes, and had himself to be helped out of the winze. Three men, who subsequently brought out the fifth native, also collapsed from the effects of the gas. It is probable that but for Wagenaar's brave action all the natives would have succumbed to the effects of the Wagenaar and the five natives were all in hospital for some days.


