WHEREAS by Section 26 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, after reciting that "Whereas in some instances Tithings, Hamlets, Chapelries, and other Places, or Districts, may be separated from the Parishes or Mother Churches to which they belong, with great advantage, and Places altogether extra-parochial may, in some instances, with advantage be annexed to Parishes or Districts to which they are contiguous, or be constituted separate Parishes for ecclesiastical purposes," it is, amongst other things, enacted, "That when with respect to his own Diocese it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, or when the Bishop of any Diocese shall represent to the said Archbishop, that any such Tithing, Hamlet, Chapelry, Place, or District, within the Diocese of such Archbishop, or the Diocese of such Bishop, as the case may be, may be advantageously separated from any Parish or Mother Church, and either be constituted a separate Benefice by itself or be united to

any other Parish to which it may be more conveniently annexed, or to any other adjoining Tithing, Hamlet, Chapelry, Place, or District, parochial or extra-parochial, so as to form a separate Parish or Benefice, or that any Extra-Parochial Place may with advantage be annexed to any Parish to which it is contiguous, or be constituted a separate Parish for ecclesiastical purposes; and the said Archbishop, or Bishop, shall draw up a Scheme in writing (the Scheme of such Bishop to be transmitted to the said Archbishop for his consideration) describing the mode in which it appears to him that the alteration may best be effected, and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to Ecclesiastical Jurisdiction, Glebe Lands, Tithes, Rent-Charges, and other Ecclesiastical Dues, Rates, and Payments, and in respect to Patronage and Rights to Pews, may be made with justice to all Parties interested; and if the Patron or Patrons of the Benefice or Benefices to be affected by such alteration shall consent in writing under his or their hands to such Scheme, or to such modification thereof as the said Archbishop may approve, and the said Archbishop shall, on full consideration and inquiry, be satisfied with any such Scheme, or

modification thereof, and shall certify the same and such Consent as aforesaid, by his Report to His Majesty in Council, it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council to make an Order for carrying such Scheme, or modification thereof, as the case may be, into effect:—

And whereas the Right Reverend Charles John, Lord Bishop of Chichester, hath made a Representation in writing, dated the 13th day of February, 1915, to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, as follows:—

“I, the Right Reverend Charles John, Lord Bishop of Chichester, in pursuance of the 26th Section of the Pluralities Act, 1838, do hereby represent to Your Grace as follows:—

“That there are in the County of Sussex, and my Diocese of Chichester, the Vicarage of the Parish Church of South Bersted, and the Vicarage of the Parish Church of St. John, Bognor, the limits and boundaries of the said Parishes respectively being well known and defined, the latter Benefice having by Order in Council dated the 5th day of February, 1873, been separated and detached from the original Parish of South Bersted, of which it then formed part, and constituted a separate Benefice, with Cure of Souls, comprising the original Tithing of Bognor, in the said Parish of South Bersted, with certain exceptions in the said Order in Council mentioned:

“That it is desirable that further portions of the said Parish of South Bersted, which, in consequence of the increase in population of the Town of Bognor, have been largely built over, and lie contiguous to the Boundaries of the Vicarage of St. John, Bognor, aforesaid, should, by a further Order in Council, be separated from the said Vicarage and Parish of South Bersted, and attached to the said Vicarage of St. John, Bognor, aforesaid:

“That the said Parish of St. John, Bognor, and the said contiguous portions of the said Parish of South Bersted, are delineated upon the Plan which accompanies this Representation, and that on such Plan the said Parish of St. John, Bognor, is coloured *blue*, and the said contiguous Parts of the Parish of South Bersted, proposed to be added thereto, are coloured *pink*:

“That according to the last Census the population of the said Parish of South Bersted, as now constituted, numbers 4,774 persons, and the population of the said Parish of St. John, Bognor, numbers 3,894 persons:

“That the population of the said Portions of the said Parish of South Bersted, which are contiguous as aforesaid to the said Parish of St. John, Bognor, numbers some 1,200 persons:

“That the said Parish Church of St. John, Bognor, is conveniently situated for, and adapted to, the accommodation of the Inhabitants of the said contiguous Portions of the said Parish of South Bersted, the most distant Portion being *three-quarters* of a mile and upwards from the said Parish of St. John, Bognor:

“That good roads lead from all parts of the said contiguous Places to the said Parish Church of St. John, Bognor:

“That it does not appear that any of the Inhabitants or Landowners of the said con-

tiguous Places possess any legal right, by Faculty or otherwise, to the exclusive right of any Pews or Sittings in the said Parish Churches of South Bersted, and St. John, Bognor, respectively:

“That the Patronage of both the said Vicarages belongs to your Grace by virtue of your Archbishopric:

“That the Vicar of the said Vicarage of the Parish Church of South Bersted is The Reverend Frederick Trevor Philips Evershed, Clerk in Holy Orders, and the Vicar of the said Vicarage of the Parish Church of St. John, Bognor, is The Reverend John Joseph Priestley, Clerk in Holy Orders:

“That it appears to me that the said contiguous Parts of the said Parish of South Bersted may, under the provisions of the Pluralities Act, 1838, be advantageously separated from the said Parish of South Bersted, and be annexed to the Vicarage of the Parish Church of St. John, Bognor, for ecclesiastical purposes:

“That, pursuant to the directions contained in the said 26th Section of the Pluralities Act, 1838, I have drawn up a Scheme in writing, appended to this Representation, describing the mode in which it appears to me that the alteration above proposed may best be effected, and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to Ecclesiastical Jurisdiction, Glebe Lands, Tithes, Rent-Charges, and other Ecclesiastical Dues, Rates, and Payments, and in respect to Patronage and Rights to Pews, may be made with justice to all Parties interested; and I do submit the same to your Grace, together with the Consents in Writing of your Grace, the Patron of both the said Vicarages, and of the said Frederick Trevor Philips Evershed, as the Vicar of the Vicarage of the Parish Church of South Bersted, and of the said John Joseph Priestley, as Vicar of the said Vicarage of the Parish Church of St. John, Bognor, to the intent that your Grace may, if after full inquiry and consideration you should be satisfied with the said Scheme, certify the same and such Consents by your Report to His Majesty in Council.”

And whereas the said Scheme, drawn up by the said Bishop, and the Consents referred to in the said Representation, are as follows:—

“SCHEME.

“That there shall be separated from the said Vicarage of the Parish Church of South Bersted, and be annexed to the said Vicarage and Parish Church of St. John, Bognor, for ecclesiastical purposes, all those contiguous Parts of the said Parish of South Bersted which are comprised within the Plan hereto annexed, and thereon coloured *pink*.

“That the said contiguous Parts shall be subject to the same Ecclesiastical Jurisdiction as the said Vicarage of the Parish Church of St. John, Bognor, and the Incumbent of the said Vicarage of the Parish Church of St. John, Bognor, shall have exclusive Cure of Souls within the limits of the same.

“That all Fees, and other Ecclesiastical Dues, and Payments, for Marriages, Churchings, Burials, and other Ecclesiastical Offices, solemnized and performed within the Parish or

Parish Church of St. John, Bognor, in respect of the said contiguous Parts of the said Parish of South Bersted, shall from henceforth belong to the Incumbent of the said Vicarage of the Parish Church of St. John, Bognor.

"That the Inhabitants of the said contiguous Parts of the said Parish of South Bersted shall not in future be entitled to any accommodation in the said Parish Church of South Bersted, and shall be exonerated from all liability to repair the said Parish Church, but shall be entitled in common with the Parishioners of the said Parish of St. John, Bognor, and shall be liable, subject to the provisions of 'The Compulsory Church Rate Abolition Act, 1868,' to the repair of the said Parish Church of St. John, Bognor.

"That this Scheme shall in no wise affect the Endowment or Income of the said two Benefices of South Bersted, and St. John, Bognor, but the present Endowment of the said contiguous Parts of the said Parish of South Bersted shall be retained by the said Benefice of South Bersted.

"CONSENTS.

"We, The Right Honourable and Most Reverend Father in God, Randall Thomas, Lord Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury, the Patron or person entitled by virtue of our Archbishopric to present to the Vicarage of the Parish Church of South Bersted, and also to the Vicarage of the Parish Church of St. John, Bognor, if the same or either of them were now vacant, The Reverend Frederick Trevor Philips Evershed, the Vicar of the said Vicarage of the Parish Church of South Bersted, and the Reverend John Joseph Priestley, the Vicar of the said Vicarage of the Parish Church of St. John, Bognor, do hereby respectively signify our Consent to the Scheme above proposed and set forth, and to every matter and thing therein contained.

"The Representation and Scheme of the said Lord Bishop, and the Consents above referred to, are hereunto annexed:

"And we, the said Archbishop, being on full consideration and inquiry satisfied with the said Scheme, do hereby, pursuant to the said Pluralities Act, 1838, certify the same and such Consents as aforesaid to Your Majesty in Council, to the intent that Your Majesty in Council may, in case Your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do, make and issue an Order for carrying the said Scheme into effect.

"There is also in the same County and Diocese the Benefice or Vicarage and Rectory of Abingdon, the Parish whereof contains a population of 6,846, or thereabouts, with accommodation in its 3 Churches or Chapels for 1,500 persons:

"The net annual value from all sources of the said Benefice of Abingdon is £370 2s. 4d., or thereabouts:

"There is also in the same County and Diocese the Benefice or Vicarage of Drayton, the Parish whereof contains a population of 513, or thereabouts, with accommodation in the Parish Church for 200 persons:

"The net annual value from all sources of the said Benefice of Drayton is £200 0s. 0d., or thereabouts:

"The Civil Parish or District, in the said Parish of Sutton Courtenay with Appleford and Sutton Wick, known as Sutton Wick (the boundaries of which are well known and defined) with a population of 218, or thereabouts, is in great part distant from 2 to 4 miles from the Church of Sutton Courtenay, and is, as to a certain portion of it, distant *half* a mile from the Church of St. Helen, Abingdon, and is, as to certain further portions of it, distant *one quarter* of a mile from the Church of Drayton:

"The Dean and Canons of the King's Free Chapel of St. George within the Castle of Windsor are the Patrons of the Benefice of Sutton Courtenay with Appleford and Sutton Wick, and The Reverend Edward Bruce MacKay is the Incumbent thereof:

"By virtue of my Bishopric I am the Patron of the Benefice of Abingdon, and The Reverend Henry Alexander Kennedy is the Incumbent thereof:

"The Right Honourable Harriet Sarah, Lady Wantage, is the Patron of the Benefice of Drayton, and The Reverend Frederic John Chapman is the Incumbent thereof:

"That pursuant to the directions contained in the said 26th Section of the Pluralities Act, 1838, I, the said Lord Bishop, have drawn up a Scheme in writing, annexed to this Representation, describing the mode in which it appears to me that the alteration above proposed may best be effected, and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to Ecclesiastical Jurisdiction, Glebe Lands, Tithes, Rent-Charges, and other Ecclesiastical Dues, Rates, and Payments, and in respect to Patronage and Rights to Pews,

may be made with justice to all Parties interested, and I do hereby submit the same to your Grace, together with the Consents in Writing of the said Patrons and Incumbents of the said several Benefices, to the intent that, if your Grace shall on full consideration and inquiry be satisfied with such Scheme, you may certify the same and such Consents as aforesaid to His Majesty in Council."

And whereas the said Scheme, drawn up by the said Bishop, and the Consents referred to in the said Representation, are as follows:—

"SCHEME.

"It is proposed to separate from the Parish of Sutton Courtenay with Appleford and Sutton Wick, and annex to the Parish of Abingdon, all that part of the Civil Parish or District known as Sutton Wick which lies north of an imaginary boundary line drawn from the point where the Civil Parish Boundary of Sutton Wick meets the Wilts and Berks Canal, and thence runs due east to the eastern Boundary of the said Civil Parish, being also the County Boundary, and the west bank of the River Thames, which part is more particularly shown on the Map or Plan attached hereto, and verged *pink*.

"It is also proposed to separate from the said Parish of Sutton Courtenay with Appleford and Sutton Wick, and annex to the Parish of Drayton, all the remaining part of the said Civil Parish or District of Sutton Wick which lies to the south of the said imaginary boundary line, which part is more particularly shown on the said Plan, and is thereon verged *blue*.

"That the Incumbents of the Benefices of Abingdon and Drayton shall respectively have the sole and exclusive Cure of Souls within those portions so to be separated from Sutton Courtenay with Appleford and Sutton Wick, and annexed to their respective Parishes.

"That the Inhabitants of such respective portions shall be entitled to accommodation in the Parish Churches of Abingdon and Drayton respectively, but shall cease to be entitled to any right or accommodation in either of the Churches at Sutton Courtenay or Appleford, except nevertheless any person or persons (if any) possessing a legal right by Faculty or otherwise to any Pew or Sitting in either of the Churches at Sutton Courtenay or Appleford, and who may not be willing to relinquish and give up the same.

"That the Inhabitants of the aforesaid portions, so to be separated, shall have such and the same right to have Marriages, Baptisms, Churchings, and Burials, solemnized and performed in the Churches of the Parishes to which they shall be respectively annexed as they might have had in the Churches of the Parishes to which the said District of Sutton Wick was formerly annexed.

"That all Fees, Ecclesiastical Offerings, and Emoluments, arising from the said portions, so to be separated from Sutton Courtenay with Appleford and Sutton Wick, shall henceforth respectively belong to the Incumbents of Abingdon and Drayton.

"That no alteration shall be made in the Endowments of the said Benefices, or any of them.

"That no alteration shall be made in the Patronage of the said Benefices, or any of them."

ENGLISH CHANNEL, NORTH SEA, AND RIVERS THAMES AND MEDWAY.

Pilotage and Traffic Regulations.

Former Notice.—No. 1173 of 1915; hereby cancelled.

Mariners are hereby warned that, under the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, the following Regulations have been made by the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty and are now in force:—

I. All ships (other than British ships of less than 3,500 tons gross tonnage, when trading coastwise or to or from the Channel islands and not carrying passengers) whilst bound from, and whilst navigating in the waters from, the Downs Pilot Station to Gravesend or *vice versa*, must be conducted by Pilots licensed by the London Trinity House.

2. All ships (other than British ships of less than 3,500 tons gross tonnage, when trading coastwise or to or from the Channel islands and not carrying passengers) whilst bound from, and whilst navigating in the waters from, Gravesend to Great Yarmouth or *vice versa*, must be conducted by Pilots licensed by the London Trinity House.

3. All ships (other than British ships of less than 3,500 tons gross tonnage, when trading coastwise or to or from the Channel islands and not carrying passengers) whilst navigating in the waters from Gravesend to London Bridge or *vice versa*, must be conducted by Pilots licensed by the London Trinity House.

4. The Trinity House Pilot Station at Dungeness having been discontinued, pilotage is therefore not compulsory between the Downs Pilot Station and Dungeness, except for ships bound into or out of the Harbours of Dover and Folkestone.

II. Trinity House Pilot Stations have been established at the undermentioned places, and merchant vessels not under compulsion of pilotage are very strongly advised to take Pilots:—

(a) THE DOWNS, where ships proceeding north can obtain Pilots capable of piloting as far as Great Yarmouth, and also pilots for the River Thames, and for Folkestone and Dover harbours. The Pilot Steamers attached to the Downs Station will cruise in the vicinity of a position two miles south-east of Deal Pier.

(b) GREAT YARMOUTH, where ships from the North Sea bound for the River Thames or the English Channel can obtain Pilots capable of piloting as far as the Downs.

The Pilot Steamer attached to the Great Yarmouth Station will cruise between the Corton Light-Vessel and the South Scroby Buoy.

(c) THE SUNK LIGHT-VESSEL, where ships crossing the North Sea between the parallels of 51° 40' and 51° 54' North Latitude, but *no others*, can obtain Pilots for the River Thames and the Downs.

(d) Pilots can also be obtained at LONDON and HARWICH for the Downs and Great Yarmouth (including the River Thames and approaches).

Note.—The Pilots referred to in this Notice are the Pilots licensed by the London Trinity House and no others.

III. RIVERS THAMES AND MEDWAY.—All traffic into and out of the River Thames must pass through the Edinburgh Channels, or through the Black Deep south of the Knock John and Knob Light-Buoys, and through the Oaze Deep, until further notice.

No vessels are to remain under way in the above-mentioned Channels between a line drawn from London Stone to No. 3 Reach Light-Buoy and thence to Canvey Point on the west, and the Sunk Head Light-Buoy or a line joining the positions of the South Long Sand and East Shingles Buoys, on the east, between the hours of 6.30 p.m. and 5.30 a.m.

Vessels at anchor within these limits must not exhibit any lights between the hours of 6.30 p.m. and 5.30 a.m.

All other Channels are closed to navigation.

2. Coasting vessels are not to be under way nor exhibit any lights in the East Swin or Wulpet between sunset and sunrise.

3. Cruising of Yachts and Pleasure craft is prohibited in the estuaries of the Thames, Medway, Colne, Blackwater, Crouch and Roach, and adjacent Rivers and Creeks.
