PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by Section 26 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, after reciting that "Whereas in some instances Tithings, Hamlets, Chapelries, and other Places, or Districts, may be separated from the Parishes or Mother Churches to which they belong, with great advantage, and Places altogether extra-parochial may, in some instances, with advantage be annexed to Parishes or Districts to which they are contiguous, or be constituted separate Parishes for ecclesiastical purposes," it is, amongst other things, enacted, "That when with respect to his own Diocese it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, or when the Bishop of any Diocese shall represent to the said Archbishop, that any such Tithing, Hamlet, Chapelry, Place, or District, within the Diocese of such Archbishop, or the Diocese of such Bishop, as the case may be, may be advantageously separated from any Parish or Mother Church, and either be constituted a separate Benefice by itself or be united to any other Parish to which it may be more conveniently annexed, or to any other adjoining Tithing, Hamlet, Chapelry, Place, or District, parochial or extra-parochial, so as to form a

separate Parish or Benefice, or that any Extra-Parochial Place may with advantage be annexed to any Parish to which it is contiguous, or be constituted a separate Parish for ecclesiastical purposes, and the said Archbishop, or Bishop, shall draw up a Scheme in writing (the Scheme of such Bishop to be transmitted to the said Archbishop for his consideration) describing the mode in which it appears to him that the alteration may best be effected, and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to Ecclesiastical Jurisdiction, Glebe Lands, Tithes, Rent-Charges, and other Ecclesiastical Dues, Rates, and Payments, and in respect to Patronage and Rights to Pews, may be made with justice to all Parties interested, and if the Patron or Patrons of the Benefice or Benefices to be affected by such alteration shall consent in writing under his or their hands to such Scheme, or to such modification thereof as the said Archbishop may approve, and the said Archbishop shall, on full consideration and inquiry, be satisfied with any such Scheme, or modification thereof, and shall certify the same and such Consent as aforesaid, by his Report to His Majesty in Council, it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council to make an Order for carrying such Scheme, or modification thereof, as the case may be, into effect."

And whereas the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Cosmo Gordon, Lord Archbishop of York, hath certified to His Majesty

in Council by his Report dated the 20th day of July, 1915, as follows:—

"The undersigned, Cosmo Gordon, Lord Archbishop of York, Primate of England and Metropolitan, in pursuance of the 26th Section of an Act passed in the Session of Parliament holden in the 1st and 2nd years of the reign of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 106, hereby reports to Your Majesty in Council as follows:—

"That there is, in the County of York, and within our Diocese of York, the Vicarage and Parish of Aislaby, particularly delineated on the Map or Plan hereto annexed, and thereon coloured *yellow*:

"That the population of the said Parish of Aislaby is, according to the last Census, 273 persons, and that the net annual value thereof is £118 12s. 2d.:

"That the Patronage of the said Vicarage of Aislaby is vested in us, and our successors, Archbishops of York, for ever, and that the Incumbent of the said Vicarage is The Reverend Arthur Llewelyn Meyricke, Clerk, M.A.:

"That there is also, in the same County and Diocese, the Rectory and Parish of Whitby, the boundaries whereof are well known and defined:

"That the population of the said Parish of Whitby (including that portion of the Township of Newholm-cum-Dunsley hereinafter referred to, and coloured *grey* on the said Map or Plan) is, according to the last Census, 10,947 persons, and that the net annual value thereof is £437 17s. 2d.:

"That the Patronage of the said Rectory of Whitby is vested in us, and our successors, Archbishops of York, for ever, and that the Incumbent thereof is The Reverend Chancellor George Austen, Clerk, M.A.:

"That there is also, in the said County and Diocese, the Vicarage and Parish of Ugthorpe, the boundaries whereof are well known and defined:

"That the population of the said Parish of Ugthorpe (including that portion of the Township of Hutton Mulgrave hereinafter referred to, and coloured *pink* on the said Map or Plan) is, according to the last Census, 533 persons, and that the net annual value thereof is £210 0s. 0d.:

"That the Patronage of the said Vicarage of Ugthorpe is vested in us, and our successors, Archbishops of York, for ever, and the present Incumbent thereof is The Reverend John William Edward Walker, Clerk, M.A.:

"That there is also, in the same County and Diocese, the Vicarage and Parish of Ruswarp, the boundaries whereof are well known and defined:

"That the population of the said Parish of Ruswarp (including that portion hereinafter referred to, and coloured *green* on the said Map or Plan) is, according to the last Census, 650 persons, and that the net annual value thereof is £300 0s. 0d.:

"That the Patronage of the said Vicarage of Ruswarp is vested in us, and our successors, Archbishops of York, for ever, and that the Incumbent thereof is The Reverend John Groves, Clerk:

"That the portion of the Township of Newholm-cum-Dunsley, hereinbefore referred to, is at a distance of 3 miles, or thereabouts, from the Parish Church of Whitby, and at a distance of 2 miles, or thereabouts, from the

Parish Church of Aislaby, and contains a population estimated at 250 persons:

"That that portion of the Township of Hutton Mulgrave, in the Parish of Ugthorpe, hereinbefore referred to, is at a distance of 4 miles, or thereabouts, from the Parish Church of Ugthorpe, and at a distance of 2 miles, or thereabouts, from the Parish Church of Aislaby, and contains a population estimated at 30 persons:

"That that portion of the Parish of Ruswarp, hereinbefore referred to, and coloured *green* on the said Map or Plan, is at a distance of $1\frac{3}{4}$ miles, or thereabouts, from the Parish Church of Ruswarp, and at a distance of 1 mile from the Consecrated Chapel of Ease or Church of Saint Hilda, in the Parish of Whitby, and contains a population estimated at 150 persons:

"That there is no Church or Chapel within either of the said portions of the Parishes of Whitby, Ugthorpe, and Ruswarp, coloured *grey*, *pink*, and *green* on the said Map or Plan, and it would be more convenient for the Inhabitants thereof to attend Divine Service at the Parish Church of Aislaby, as regards the portions coloured *grey* and *pink*, and at the Church of Saint Hilda, Whitby, as regards the portion coloured *green*, than at the respective Parish Churches to which they now belong, and the Incumbents of Aislaby and Whitby could more easily work the said portions than can the Rector of Whitby, as regards the portion coloured *grey*, and the Vicars of Ugthorpe and Ruswarp respectively, as to the portions coloured *pink* and *green*:

"That it appears to us that the said portion of the Parish of Whitby, (being part of the said Township of Newholm-cum-Dunsley), and coloured *grey* on the said Map or Plan, the said portion of the Parish of Ugthorpe, (being part of the Township of Hutton Mulgrave), and coloured *pink* on the said Map or Plan, and the said portion of the Parish of Ruswarp, coloured *green* on the said Map or Plan, may, under the provisions of the Acts of Parliament passed in the 1st and 2nd years of the reign of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 106, and of the 2nd and 3rd years of the reign of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 49, be advantageously separated from the respective Parishes to which they now belong, and be annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of Aislaby, as regards the said portions coloured *grey* and *pink*, and to the Parish of Whitby, as regards the said portion coloured *green*, on the said Map or Plan:

"That pursuant to the directions contained in the said first-mentioned Act of Parliament the said Archbishop has prepared a Scheme in writing, appended to this Report, describing the mode in which it appears to him the alteration above proposed may be made with justice to all Parties concerned, and we do certify the same to Your Majesty in Council, with the Consents in writing to the said Scheme of the said Archbishop, as Patron of Aislaby, Whitby, Ugthorpe, and Ruswarp, and of the Incumbents of the four Parishes concerned therein, as aforesaid, and to be affected thereby, to the intent that Your Majesty in Council, in case it should be thought expedient so to do, may make an Order for carrying such Scheme into effect."

"COSMO, EBOR." ..

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Archbishop and the Consents referred

to in the said Report are in the words following:—

“SCHEME.

“1. The separation of that part of the Township of Newholm-cum-Dunsley aforesaid, coloured *grey* on the said Map or Plan, from the Parish of Whitby, and the annexation of the same to the Parish of Aislaby aforesaid.

“2. The separation of that part of the Township of Hutton Mulgrave, coloured *pink* on the said Map or Plan, from the Parish of Ugthorpe, and the annexation of the same to the Parish of Aislaby aforesaid.

“3. The separation of that part of the Ecclesiastical Parish of Ruswarp, coloured *green* on the said Map or Plan, from that Parish, and the annexation of the same to the Parish of Whitby aforesaid.

“4. The Incumbents of the Parishes of Whitby, Ugthorpe, and Ruswarp, respectively, shall cease to have Cure of Souls within the said portions of their respective Parishes proposed to be transferred as aforesaid, and, as regards the said portions coloured *grey* and *pink*, the Incumbent of Aislaby shall have sole and exclusive Cure of Souls within the same, and, as regards the part of the Parish of Ruswarp coloured *green*, the Incumbent of Whitby shall have sole and exclusive Cure of Souls within the same.

“5. The Inhabitants of the said portions proposed to be transferred from the Parishes of Whitby, Ugthorpe, and Ruswarp, as aforesaid, respectively, shall be exonerated from all liability to repair the Parish Churches to which they now belong, but shall be liable, subject to the provisions of ‘The Compulsory Church Rate Abolition Act, 1868,’ for the repair of the Parish Churches of Aislaby and Whitby aforesaid, respectively, and they shall have the same Rights as to Pews, and the performance of all Offices and Services of the Church at the Parish Church of Aislaby, as regards the portions coloured *grey* and *pink* on the said Map or Plan, and at the Parish Church of Whitby, as regards the portion coloured *green* thereon, and otherwise in relation to the same Churches, and the Parishes belonging thereto, as the other Inhabitants of the same Parishes.

“6. The Fees for such Offices and Services performed for the Inhabitants of the said portions of the Parishes of Whitby, Ugthorpe, and Ruswarp, proposed to be so transferred as aforesaid, or arising within the limits of the same, and usually payable to the Incumbent of a Benefice, shall belong to the Incumbents of the Benefices of Aislaby, and Whitby, aforesaid, respectively.

“7. No alteration shall be made in respect of the Patronage, or any Glebe Land, Tithe, Tithe-Rent-Charge, or other Endowment of any of the said Benefices of Whitby, Ugthorpe, and Ruswarp.”

“CONSENTS.

“We, Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of York, the Patron or person entitled (in right of our See of York) to present to the said four Benefices of Aislaby, Whitby, Ugthorpe, and Ruswarp, were the same now vacant, and we, Arthur Llewelyn Meyricke, Clerk, M.A., the present Incumbent of the Vicarage and Parish Church of Aislaby, in the County and Diocese of York, Chancellor George Austen, Clerk, M.A., the present Incumbent of the Rectory

and Parish Church of Whitby, in the same County and Diocese, John William Edward Walker, Clerk, M.A., the present Incumbent of the Vicarage and Parish Church of Ugthorpe, in the same County and Diocese, and John Groves, Clerk, the present Incumbent of the Vicarage and Parish Church of Ruswarp, in the same County and Diocese, do hereby give our Consents in writing to the foregoing Representation and Scheme, and to the several matters and things therein stated and proposed, so far as the same affect our respective interests therein.

TRADE BOARDS ACT, 1909.

Copy of Official Notice of Minimum Rates Fixed for the Hollow-ware Trade (Great Britain). Operative from 1st January, 1916.*

Section 1.—In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the above Act, by the Board of Trade, and dated 27th April, 1910, the Trade Board established under the above Act and the Trade Boards Provisional Orders Confirmation Act, 1913, for the Hollow-ware Trade as defined by the Regulations made by the Board of Trade and dated 6th July, 1914, hereby give notice, as required by Section 4 (3) of the above Act, that they have fixed the following minimum or lowest time-rates of wages, clear of all deductions,† that is to say :—

FEMALE WORKERS.

(a) For Female Learners:

* The Minimum Rates fixed to come into force on 1st January, 1916, have at first a limited operation as follows :—

(a) Employers must pay wages at not less than the minimum rate unless there is a written agreement under which the worker agrees to accept less. If there is no such written agreement the employer would not be liable to a fine for payment of wages at less than the minimum rate, but wages at the minimum rate could be recovered from the employer as a debt by the worker, or (in cases where a worker has lodged a formal complaint with the Trade Board) by the Trade Board acting on behalf of the worker.

(b) Any employer may give notice to the Trade Board that he is willing to be bound by the rate fixed, and must give such notice before he can receive a contract from a Government Department or Local Authority, involving work to which the minimum rates are applicable. In such cases, agreements to accept less than the minimum rates would not be valid, and the employer would be liable to a fine if he paid wages at less than the minimum rate.

The limited operation period continues until the Board of Trade make an Order making the minimum rates obligatory. Such Order can be made on the expiration of six months from the date on which the rate came into force.

† This provision does not apply to deductions legally made under the National Insurance Acts.

Provided that a female learner entering the trade over the age of 16 may serve a period of one year as a Learner at the following minimum rates, that is to say :—

Thereafter the minimum rate shall be that applicable to the worker's age.

(b) For Female Workers other than Learners:

Provided that a male learner entering the trade between 17 and 21 years of age may serve a period of one year at minimum rates, which during the first six months are 3s. and during the second six months 1s. 6d. less than the rate otherwise payable as set out above.

(d) For Male Workers other than Learners:

24s. 9d. per week (i.e., 5½d. per hour).

For the purpose of this section the term Learner shall mean a person who is employed under conditions which, in the circumstances of the case, afford a reasonable prospect of advancement to the minimum rate for Workers other than Learners. Provided that in the case of males no person shall be deemed to be a Learner who is over 21 years of age.

Section 2.—The weekly rates set out in this Notice are based on a week of 54 hours, and are subject to a proportionate deduction or increase according as the number of hours spent by the worker in the factory or workshop under contract of employment in any week is less or more than 54.

Section 3.—The above rates shall apply to all workers employed in those branches of the Hollow-ware trade which are engaged in the making of Hollow-ware from sheet iron or sheet steel, including the processes of galvanising, tinning, enamelling, painting, japanning, lacquering, and varnishing.

Section 4.—The above minimum rates are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages.

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS the Urban District Council of Hayes (hereinafter referred to as "the Local Authority") have, in pursuance of Section 3 of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1907 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1907"), applied to Us, the Local Government Board, to declare certain Parts of the Act of 1907 to be in force in the Urban District of Hayes (hereinafter referred to as "the District");

And whereas proof has been given to Our satisfaction of the advertisement required by sub-section (2) of Section 3 of the Act of 1907, and at least one month has elapsed after the date of that advertisement:

Now therefore, in the exercise of Our powers in that behalf, We by this Order Declare, Specify, and Direct as follows; that is to say:—

ARTICLE II.—Within the period of three weeks immediately following the date of this Order, or, where in Our opinion the circumstances so require, within such later period as We by Order prescribe, the Local Authority shall cause this Order to be published by advertising the same once at least in one or more of the newspapers circulating in the District, and shall also cause a statement of the effect of this Order to be published in the London Gazette.

ARTICLE III.—This Order shall come into operation on the Ninth day of February, One thousand nine hundred and sixteen.
