HEREAS by Section 2 of the Pharmacy
Act, 1868, it is enacted that the
several articles named or described in
Schedule (A) to that Act shall be deemed
poisons within the meaning of that Act, and
that the Council of the Pharmaceutical Society
of Great Britain may, from time to time, by
Resolution, declare that any article in such
Resolution named ought to be deemed a poison
within the meaning of that Act, and that
thereupon the said Society shall submit the
same for the approval of the Privy Council;
and that if such approval shall be given, then
such Resolution and approval shall be advertised in the London Gazette; and, on the expiration of one month from such advertisement, the article named in such Resolution
shall be deemed to be a poison within the
meaning of that Act:

And whereas by Section 1 of the Poisons and Pharmacy Act, 1908, it is enacted that Schedule (A) to the Pharmacy Act, 1868, be repealed, and the Schedule to the Poisons and Pharmacy Act, 1908, substituted therefor, and that the said last-named Schedule may be amended by adding thereto, or removing therefrom, any article, or transferring any article from one part of the said Schedule to the other, in the manner provided by Section 2 of the Pharmacy Act, 1868, for adding to the list of articles deemed to be poisons within the meaning of that Act:

And whereas the Council of the Pharmaceutical Society of Great Britain did, on the 2nd day of February, 1916, pass the following Resolution:—

"That by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in the Council of the Pharmaceutical Society of Great Britain by the Pharmacy Act, 1868, as amended by the Poisons and Pharmacy Act, 1908, the said Council does hereby resolve and declare:—

"That the article in Part 1 of the "Schedule to the last-named Act 'Opium "and all preparations or admixtures containing 1 or more per cent. of Morphine, "ought to be removed therefrom, and that

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"the article 'Opium and all preparations or admixtures containing 0.75 per cent. of Morphine' ought to be added thereto':

And whereas the said Society have submitted their Resolution for the approval of the Privy Council, and the Lords of the Privy Council are of opinion that the said Resolution should be approved:

Now, therefore, their Lordships are hereby pleased to signify their approval of the said Resolution.

# ORDER OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL IN ENGLAND.

Whereas by the 21st Section of the Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1874, it is enacted that the Registrar-General, with the sanction of the Local Government Board, may from time to time alter Registration Sub-districts:—

#### 1. And whereas it is expedient

- (1) that the parts of Bedford Municipal Borough, now included in Bedford and Kempston, and Bedford and Cardington Sub-districts of Bedford Registration District respectively should be detached therefrom, and together constituted a separate Sub-district, co-extensive with that Borough, to be called and known as Bedford Borough Sub-district, and
