### A PROCLAMATION

Under the Munitions of War Acts, 1915. And 1916.

#### GEORGE R.I.

HEREAS by section three of the Munitions of War Act, 1915, as amended by the Munitions of War (Amendment) Act, 1916, it is provided that the differences to which Part I. of the first-mentioned Act applies. are differences as to rates of wages, hours of work, or otherwise as to terms or conditions of. or affecting munitions work, and also any differences as to rates of wages, hours of work, or otherwise as to terms or conditions of or affect. ing employment on any other work of any description, if that Part of that Act is applied to such a difference by His Majesty by Proclamation, on the ground that in the opinion of His Majesty the existence or continuance of the difference is directly or indirectly prejudicial to the manufacture, transport, or supply of Munitions of War; and it is also provided that the said Part of the said Act may be so applied to such a difference at any time, whether a lock-out or strike is in existence in connection with the difference to which it is
