At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 5th day of December, 1916.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council, dated the twenty-eighth day of November, nineteen hundred and fourteen, His Majesty was pleased to make regulations (called the "Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914,") under the Defence of the Realm Consolidation Act, 1914, for securing the public safety and the defence of the realm:

And whereas the said Act has been amended by the Defence of the Realm (Amendment) Act, 1915, the Defence of the Realm (Amendment) (No. 2) Act, 1915, and the Munitions of War Act, 1915:

And whereas the said regulations have been amended by various subsequent Orders in Council:

And whereas it is expedient further to amend the said regulations in manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the following amendments be made in the said regulations:—

1. After regulation 2x the following regulation shall be inserted:—

"2L.—(1) Where the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries are of opinion that, with a view to maintaining the food supply of the country, it is expedient that they should exercise the powers given to them under this regulation as respects any land, the Board may enter on the land

(a) without any consent, if the land isfor the time being unoccupied, or was unoccupied on the twenty-ninth day of November, nineteen hundred and sixteen, or if theland is common land, and

(b) in any other case, with the consent of the occupier and the person in receipt of the rent of the land,

and cultivate the land, or arrange for its cultivation by any person either under a contract of tenancy or otherwise.

"(2) The Board may after entry on any land do or authorise to be done all things which they consider necessary or desirable for the purpose of the cultivation of the land or for adapting the land to cultivation, including fencing, and may also during their occupation of the land or on the termination thereof remove any such fencing or work of adaptation.

"(3) Any person who cultivates land under any such arrangement shall, on the determination, by or on behalf of the Board, of the arrangement, if the determination takes effect before the first day of January, nineteen hundred and eighteen, receive from the Board such compensation as may have been agreed under the terms of the arrangement, or, in default of any such agreement, as the Board may consider just and reasonable, and shall not be

entitled to any other compensation.

"(4) On the determination of the occupation of any land by the Board under this regulation, compensation shall be paid by the Board to any person injuriously affected by any deterioration of the land caused by the exercise of the powers under this regulation, the amount of that compensation to be determined, in default of agreement, by a single arbitrator under and in accordance with the provisions of the Second Schedule to the Agricultural Holdings Act, 1908.

"(5) The Board may with respect to any land authorise any local authority to exercise on behalf of the Board any of the powers of the

Board under this regulation.

"(6) In this regulation the expressions occupied and unoccupied in this regulation refer to such occupation as involves liability to payment of poor rates, and the expression 'common land' includes any land subject to be enclosed under the Inclosure Acts, 1845 to 1882, and any town or village green and any other land subject to any right of common

- "(7) This regulation (except the last preceding subsection) shall apply to Scotland with the substitution of the Board of Agriculture for Scotland for the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, of arbiter for arbitrator, and of the Agricultural Holdings (Scotland) Act, 1908, for the Agricultural Holdings Act, 1908; and as regards Scotland 'unoccupied land' shall mean land in respect of which no person was entered as tenant or occupier in the valuation roll for the year ending on the fifteenth day of May, nineteen hundred and seventeen.
- 2. At end of Regulation 9c the following proviso shall be inserted:
- "Provided that it shall be lawful for His Majesty, in lieu of appointing such other day to be a Bank Holiday or public holiday, by Proclamation to direct that all or any classes of employees who have been deprived in consequence of any Proclamation issued under the said Act or this regulation of a holiday to which they were by statute or agreement entitled or which they have been accustomed to receive, shall, subject to any exceptions and conditions that may be contained in the Pro-·clamation, be given an equivalent holiday on such day or within such period as may be specified in the Proclamation, and any employer failing to comply with the provisions of any such Proclamation shall be guilty of a summary offence against these regulations."
 3. The following regulation shall be substi-

tuted for Regulation 30r:

"30E. A person shall not melt down, break up, or use otherwise than as currency, any gold coin which is for the time being current in the United Kingdom or in any British possession or foreign country; and if any person acts in contravention of this regulation he shall be guilty of a summary offence against these regulations.

"If any person contravenes or fails to comply with any directions in an order made under this regulation he shall be guilty of a sum mary offence against these regulations."

4. In regulation 39, after the words "specified in the order" there shall be inserted the words "for enabling the competent naval or

military authority to direct that in the case of any particular vessel pilotage is compulsory."

In the same regulation, after the words "payment of pilots" there shall be inserted the words "Where under this regulation pilotage is compulsory in respect of any vessel it shall be obligatory for the vessel to obtain the services either of a pilot authorised for the purpose by the Admiralty, or, within the limits of any specially defined pilotage district, of a pilot licensed by the pilotage authority of the district, or, without such limits, of a pilot holding a deep sea licence or certificate.'

5. The following regulation shall be substi-

tuted for Regulation 40B.:-

"40B.—(1) If any person sells, gives, procures, or supplies, or offers to sell, give, procure, or supply, cocaine to or for any person, other than an authorised person, in the United Kingdom, he shall be guilty of a summary offence against these regulations unless he proves that the following conditions have been complied with:

(a) the cocaine must be supplied on and in accordance with a written prescription of a duly qualified medical practitioner and dispensed by a person legally authorised to

dispense such prescription:

(b) the prescription must be dated and signed by the medical practitioner with his full name and address and qualifications, and marked with the words 'Not to be repeated,' and must specify the total amount of cocaine to be supplied on the prescription, except that, where the medicine to be supplied on the prescription is a proprietary medicine, it shall be sufficient to state the amount of the medicine to be supplied:

(c) cocaine shall not be supplied more than once on the same prescription except in pursuance of fresh directions duly endorsed on the prescription by the medical practitioner by whom it was originally issued, and signed with his name in full,

and dated:

(d) the name of the person, firm, or body corporate, dispensing the prescription, the address of the premises at which and the date on which it is dispensed, must be marked on

the prescription:

(e) the ingredients of the prescriptions so dispensed, with the name and address of the person to whom it is sold or delivered, shall be entered in a book specially set apart for this sole purpose and kept on the premises where the prescription is dispensed, which book shall be open to inspection by any person authorised for the purpose by a Secretary of State.

"(2) If any medical practitioner gives a prescription for the supply of cocaine otherwise than in accordance with the foregoing provisions he shall be guilty of a summary offence

against these regulations.

"(3) If any person manufactures, or carries on any process in the manufacture of, cocaine, without a licence from a Secretary of State, or otherwise than in accordance with any conditions attached to the licence, he shall be guilty of a summary offence against these regulations.

"(4) If any person, other than an authorised person or a person licensed to import or to manufacture cocaine, has in his possession any cocaine, he shall be guilty of a summary offence against these regulations unless he proves that the cocaine was supplied on and in accordance with such a prescription as aforesaid.

"(5) If any person sells any article into the composition of which cocaine enters, in a package or bottle which has not plainly marked on it the amount and percentage of cocaine in the article, he shall be guilty of a summary offence

against these regulations.

(6) If any person sells, gives, procures, or supplies, or offers to sell, give, procure, or supply, opium to or for any person, other than an authorised person, in the United Kingdom, or if any person, not being an authorised person or a person licensed to import opium, has any opium in his possession, he shall be guilty of a summary offence against these regulations.

"(7) If any person prepares opium for smoking, or deals in or has in his possession any opium so prepared, he shall be guilty of a summary offence against these regulations.

"(8) Every person who deals in cocaine or opium shall keep a record, in such form as may be prescribed by a Secretary of State, of all dealings in cocaine or opium effected by him (including sales to persons outside the United Kingdom), and if he fails to do so he shall be guilty of a summary offence against these regulations; every such record shall be open to inspection by any person authorised for the purpose by a Secretary of State.

"(9) If any person holding a general or special permit from a Secretary of State to purchase or to be in possession of any drug to which this regulation applies fails to comply with any of the conditions subject to which the permit is granted, he shall be guilty of a summary offence against these regulations.

"(10) If any authorised person is convicted of any offence under this regulation or under any proclamation regulating the import or export of cocaine or opium, a Secretary of State may direct that he shall cease to be an authorised person for the purposes of this regu-

lation.

(11) For the purposes of this regulation-The expression 'authorised person' means a duly qualified medical practitioner, a registered dentist, a registered veterinary surgeon, a person firm or body corporate carrying on the retail business of a chemist and druggist under and in accordance with the provisions of the Pharmacy Act, 1868, as amended by the Poisons and Pharmacy Act, 1908, a person carrying on such business in Ireland under and in accordance with the provisions of the Pharmacy Act (Ireland) 1875, as amended by the Pharmacy Act (Ireland) (1875) Amendment Act, 1890, a licentiate of the Apothecaries' Hall in Ireland, or a person holding a general or special permit from a Secretary of State to purchase or to be in possession of the drug in question;

The expression 'cocaine' includes all preparations, salts, derivatives, or admixtures prepared therefrom or therewith and containing 0.1 per cent. (one part in a thousand) or more of the drug, or any solid or liquid extract of the coca leaf containing

O1 per cent. or more of the drug:

The expression 'opium' means raw opium

or powdered or granulated opium;

Cocaine or opium in the order or disposition of any person shall be deemed to be in his possession."

6. After regulation 45B, the following re-

gulation shall be inserted:—
"45c. The Army Council may require any

person who holds, or in respect of whom an application has been made for, a certificate of exemption from military service under the Military Service Acts, 1916, or otherwise, or any person who having held such a certificate is not for the time being liable to be called up for service with the colours, to present himself for medical examination, if such person has not already been examined by a medical board, and, in accordance with the instructions of the Army Council for the time being in force, placed in a medical category.

If any person fails to comply with any requirement under this regulation, he shall be guilty of a summary offence against these regulations."
7. After Regulation 53A the following regu-

lation shall be inserted:—
"53B. For the purpose of testing the accuracy of any information given in pursuance of the Munitions of War Acts, 1915 and 1916, to the Minister of Munitions by the owner of any establishment with respect to persons employed in the establishment or of obtaining information in any case where such information is not given as and when so required in pur-suance of those Acts, or for the purpose of testing the accuracy of any record, register, list, statement, particulars, or information required to be kept, made, or given in pursuance of Regulation 41A, it shall be lawful for the competent naval or military authority or any person duly authorised by him to enter any premises belonging to or in the occupation of the person giving, or who has failed to give, the information, and to carry out such inspections and examinations (including the inspection and examination of books) on the premises as he may consider necessary for any of the purposes aforesaid.

"If any person obstructs or impedes any

person in the exercise of any of his powers under this regulation, or refuses to answer or gives a false answer to any question or refuses or fails to produce any books or documents required for the purposes of this regulation, that person shall be guilty of a summary offence against these regulations."

HEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 29th day of November,

1916, in the words following, viz.:—
"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in $\mathbf{Council}:$

And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased, by Your Orders in Council of the 8th October, 1914, and 22nd December, 1915, to sanction the promotion to Commissioned Rank of a number of selected Warrant and Non-Commissioned Officers of the Royal Marines, and to provide that Officers so promoted should be permitted to retire after 10 years' commissioned service, or on attaining the age of 55 years, on the same conditions as those applicable to Quartermasters, R.M.:

"And whereas we consider that these Officers should be allowed to retire prior to completing 10 years' commissioned service.

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to approve of the proposals contained in the accompanying Schedule.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.

"SCHEDULE.

"GRATUITIÉS AND RETIRED PAY OF WARRANT AND NON-COMMISSIONED OFFICERS PRO-MOTED TO COMBATANT COMMISSIONS IN THE ROYAL MARINES.

"1. Officers who, before being commissioned, were serving as Warrant Officers or Non-Commissioned Officers on ordinary peace attestations, and are promoted to permanent combatant commissions subsequent to the 4th August, 1914, and during the period of the War which commenced on that date, to be permitted to retire, on the termination of Hostilities, with gratuities or retired pay, in accordance with the following scale:—

Position when Commis- Gratuity or Retired sioned. Pay.

- (a) With 9 to 15 years' Gratuity of £400 with service from the an additional £100 age of 18, service for each year over 9. in the Ranks, or as Warrant Officer counting as full time.
- (b) With 15 or more Retired pay of £80 a years' service as year, or a gratuity of above. £1,000.

"Officers who wish to continue to serve after the termination of Hostilities to be permitted to do so, and in that event to be eligible for Retired Pay as laid down in 2 below.

"Officers also to be eligible to retire at any time after the close of Hostilities on the special rate of Gratuity or Retired Pay laid down above, for which they would have been eligible at the close of Hostilities, should they elect to retire before becoming eligible for the rate of Retired Pay in 2 below.

2. Lieutenants or Captains to be granted Retired Pay according to the following scale:—

England, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, Chapter 77, and of the Act of the 5th year of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria (Session 2), Chapter 26, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for authorizing certain works of improvement at Farnham Castle, the Episcopal House of Residence belonging to the See of Winchester:
"Whereas the Right Reverend Edward

Stuart, now Bishop of Winchester, is desirous that certain works should be carried out for the preservation of the ancient boundary walls, and for the provision of a new water supply for Farnham Castle, and has submitted to us the particulars of such works, and we have

approved the same:
"And whereas the said Bishop is also desirous, and it appears to us to be expedient, that towards the cost of the said works a sum of £400 (being a sum which, together with the three sums of £500, £900, and £100, already authorized to be borrowed upon the same security under the authority of the Statutes hereinbefore-mentioned, does not exceed two years' income of the See) should be provided

by the borrowing of the same sum by way of mortgage upon the security of all and every part of the lands, tenements, and hereditaments, endowments, or emoluments, which now belong, or may hereafter belong, to the Bishopric of Winchester:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Edward Stuart, Bishop of Winchester, (testified by his having affixed his signature and episcopal seal to this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that the said Bishop be authorized to borrow from the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne, and that the said Governors be empowered to lend under the provisions of the above-mentioned Acts any sum not exceeding £400, and that as a security for the same the said Bishop do mortgage all and every part of the lands, tenements, and hereditaments, and endowments, or emolu-ments, which now belong, or may hereafter belong, to his said See to the said Governors by deed for the term of 30 years, or until the said sum so to be borrowed as aforesaid, with the interest for the same as hereinafter-mentioned, and all costs and charges which may attend the recovery thereof, shall be fully paid and satisfied, and that such principal sum shall be repaid with interest in the manner following, that is to say, during and in respect of the first period of twelve months of the said term, computed from the day of the date of the mortgage, no part of the said principal sum shall be repayable, but the said Bishop or his Successor shall yearly, at the end of the second period of twelve months so computed, and at the end of every such like period of twelve months thereafter, pay to the said Governors, their Successors or Assigns, one twenty-fifth part of the said principal sum, until the whole thereof shall be repaid, and shall also at the end of the first and each succeeding period of twelve months computed as aforesaid, pay interest at the rate of £4 per cent. per annum on the said principal sum, or on so much thereof as shall from time to time remain unpaid; And that if and when it shall happen that either the principal or the interest directed to be paid as hereinbefore-mentioned shall be in arrear and unpaid for the space of 40 days after the same shall become due it shall and may be lawful for the said Governors, their Successors and Assigns, to recover the same and the costs and charges attending the recovery thereof, by distress and sale in the like manner as rents may be recovered by land-lords or lessors from the tenants by the laws in force at the time of such distress and sale, and that such mortgage deed shall be in the form and to the effect to be approved by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and shall bind as well the said Edward Stuart, now Bishop of the Diocese of Winchester, as every succeeding Bishop of the same Diocese, until the principal money and interest, costs and charges, shall have been paid off and discharged.

"And we further recommend and propose that the said sum so to be borrowed as aforesaid shall be paid to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and that the receipt of one of our. Joint Treasurers for the time being indorsed on the said mortgage deed shall be a good and sufficient discharge of the said Governors, and their Successors, for the same, who shall not be bound or required to see to the application thereof, and that upon the receipt of the said sum so to be borrowed as aforesaid, the whole or any part or parts thereof shall be applied by us at such times and in such manner as shall appear to us to be expedient towards effecting the said proposed works of improvement at Farnham Castle, the Episcopal House of Residence aforesaid.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in conformity with the provisions of the hereinbefore-mentioned Acts, or of either of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Winchester.

an isolated portion of the Parish of Hornsey, in the said County and Diocese, upon the north-east and upon the north-west by the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Stroud Green, upon the south-west partly by the New Parish of Saint Mark, Tollington Park, and partly by the New Parish of Saint Anne, Tollington Park, both in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining part of the east by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Anne, Tollington Park, from the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Brownswood Park, at or near the centre of the bridge which carries the High Barnet Branch Line of the Great Northern Railway across Stroud Green Road, and extending thence northward along the middle of the said Branch Line of Railway for a distance of 3 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Brownswood Park, from the said isolated portion of the Parish of Hornsey.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of London.

*Note (1).—Under the Trading with the Enemy Proclamations of 25 June and 10 November, 1915, all Proclamations relating to Trading with the Enemy apply to all persons or bodies of persons of enemy nationality, resident or carrying on business in Liberia, Persia, Morocco or Portuguese East Africa, and consequently it is an offence to trade with any person or body of persons of enemy nationality, resident or carrying on business in Liberia, Persia, Morocco or Portuguese East Africa, even though such person or body of persons is not included by name in the above List, and the omission of the name of any such person or body of persons from such List is not an authority or licence to trade with such person or body of persons.

Note (2).—Where a firm named in the List

Note (2).—Where a firm named in the List has more than one branch in the same country, all branches in that country are held to be included in the List even in cases where no address, or of several addresses one only is

specifically mentioned.

Note (3).—The List for each country is sent by telegraph to His Majesty's Representative in that country, who will notify British Consular Officers, to whom persons abroad should apply for information as to names on the List; but firms in the United Kingdom with branches abroad are advised to furnish such branches with copies of the Statutory List. The Lists for all countries in Central and South America are also telegraphed to His Majesty's Ambassador at Washington.

The Foreign Trade Department is prepared on application to inquire of His Majesty's Representatives abroad for the names of substitutes for any firm on the Statutory List. When the applicant wishes this done by telegraph he must undertake to pay the cost of the telegraphic correspondence. A considerable amount of information is, however, already available at the Foreign Trade Department, and it is hoped that it may be possible in many cases to suggest the names of satisfactory substitutes in response to inquiries, without the necessity of referring the matter abroad. It would greatly facilitate the work of this Department if applicants in making inquiries would specify the particular trade, or trades, for which substitutes are required.

DEFENCE OF THE REALM (LIQUOR CONTROL).

ORDER OF THE CENTRAL CONTROL BOARD-(Liquor Traffic) for the North-East COAST AREA (EXTENSION).

Any person contravening any provision of this Order or of the Liquor Control Regulations: is liable to imprisonment for six months with. hard labour and a fine of £100.

We, the Central Control Board (Liquor Traffic), in pursuance of the powers conferred upon us by the Acts and Regulations relating to the Defence of the Realm, hereby make the following Order:-

Limits of Area.

1. The area to which this Order applies is somuch of the North-East Coast Area as comprises the Petty Sessional Division of Morpeth: Ward, in the County of Northumberland, and the Parishes of Roxby, Borrowby, Hinderwell, Ellerby, Mickleby, Ugthorpe, and Newton Mulgrave, in the Petty Sessional Division of Whitby Strand, in the North Riding of the. County of York.

Hours during which intoxicating liquor may be sold.

A.—For Consumption ON the Premises.

2. (1) The hours during which intoxicating liquor may be sold or supplied in any licensed premises or club for consumption on the premises shall be restricted and be as follows:-

On Weekdays:

The hours between 12 noon and 2.30 p.m. and between 6 p.m. and 9 p.m.

On Sundays:

The hours between 12.30 p.m. and 2.30 p.m. and between 6 p.m. and 9 p.m.

Except between the aforesaid hours no person

(a) Either by himself or by any servant or agent sell or supply to any person in any licensed premises or club any intoxicating liquor to be consumed on the premises; or

(b) Consume in any such premises or club

any intoxicating liquor; or

(c) Permit any person to consume in any such premises or club any intoxicating liquor.

B.—For Consumption OFF the Premises.

(2) The hours during which intoxicating liquor may be sold or supplied in any licensed premises or club for consumption off the premises shall (subject to the additional restrictions as regards spirits) be restricted and be as follows:—

On Weekdays:

The hours between 12 noon and 2.30 p.m. and between 6 p.m. and 8 p.m.

On Sundays:

The hours between 12.30 p.m. and 2.30 p.m. and between 6 p.m. and 8 p.m.

Except between the aforesaid hours no person shall—

(a) Either by himself or by any servant or agent sell or supply to any person in any licensed premises or club or (except as hereinafter expressly provided) dispatch therefrom any intoxicating liquor to be consumed off the premises; or

(b) Take from any such premises or club

any intoxicating liquor; or

(c) Permit any person to take from any such premises or club any intoxicating liquor.

Additional Restrictions as to Spirits.

3. In addition to the above general restrictions as to hours during which intoxicating liquor may be sold or supplied, the sale and supply of spirits in licensed premises and clubs shall be subject to the following special restrictions, that is to say:

(a) No orders for spirits to be consumed off the premises shall be given by or accepted from any person actually present in any licensed premises or club except on Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays and during the hours between

12 noon and 2.30 p.m.

- (b) Spirits to be consumed off the premises must not (except as hereinafter expressly provided) be dispatched from any licensed premises or club, nor must they be taken therefrom by the person to whom they are sold or supplied or by any person acting on his behalf, except on the days and during the hours aforesaid.
- (c) Spirits to be consumed off the premises shall not be sold or supplied or taken from any licensed premises or club in any bottle or other vessel not bearing a label showing the name and situation of the premises or club, or in any vessel of a capacity less than one reputed quart, or in any less quantity than one reputed quart, or in any open vessel.
- (d) No spirits to be consumed off the premises shall be sold or supplied in or taken from any refreshment room in any railway station.

Conditions as to Distribution.

4. No person shall either by himself or any

servant or agent-

(a) Sell, supply, distribute or deliver any intoxicating liquor from any van, barrow, basket or other vehicle or receptacle unless before the liquor is dispatched it has been ordered and the quantity, description and price thereof together with the name and address of the person to whom it is to be supplied has been entered in a delivery book or invoice, which shall be carried by the

person delivering the liquor, and in a day book which shall be kept on the premises from which the liquor is dispatched.

(b) Carry or convey in any van, barrow, basket or other vehicle or receptacle while in use for the distribution or delivery of intoxicating liquor, any such liquor not entered in such delivery book or invoice and day book.

(c) Distribute or deliver any intoxicating liquor at any address not specified in such delivery book or invoice and day book.

(d) Refuse to allow any constable to examine such van, barrow, basket or other vehicle or receptacle or such delivery book or invoice.

(e) Solicit or canvass for orders for, or collect or receive payment for, intoxicating liquor except at the licensed premises.

(f) Send or cause to be sent or leave or cause to be left to or at any premises, or to or with any person, any order form for in-

toxicating liquor.

(g) Cause or permit any payment for intoxicating liquor to be made on his behalf by any person in the service or employment of the vendor of the liquor, or, being a person in such service or employment, make any such payment as the agent or on behalf of the purchaser of the liquor.

Hours of Opening for the Supply of Food and Non-intoxicants.

- 5. Notwithstanding any provisions of this Order or of the Law relating to licensing or the sale of intoxicating liquor:—
 - (a) Licensed premises and refreshment houses may be kept open for the supply of food and non-intoxicating liquor at any time during which they may be kept open under the general provisions of the Licensing Acts; and
 - (b) Licensed premises may be opened for this purpose at the hour of 5.30 in the morning.

Saving Provisions.

- 6. Nothing in the foregoing provisions of this Order shall be deemed to prohibit, in cases where the same is otherwise lawful:
 - (a) The consumption of intoxicating liquor by any person in any licensed premises or club where he is residing; or
 - (b) The consumption of intoxicating liquor at a meal by any person in any licensed premises or club at any time within half an hour after the conclusion of the afternoon and evening hours during which the sale or supply of intoxicating liquor is permitted by this Order; Provided that the liquor was sold or supplied and served during such hours at the same time as the meal and for consumption at the meal; or
 - (c) The sale or supply of spirits to any person producing a certificate in writing signed by a duly qualified medical practitioner that the spirits are immediately required for medicinal purposes; or
 - (d) The dispatch from licensed premises for delivery at a place more than five miles distant of any spirits or other intoxicating liquor in the forenoon of any day on which the sale of the same for consumption off the premises is permitted by Article 2 (2) and Article 3 of this Order as the case may be.

Treating Prohibitea.

7. No person shall either by himself or by any servant or agent sell or supply any intoxicating liquor to any person in any licensed premises or in any club for consumption on the premises unless the same is ordered and paid for by the person so supplied; nor shall any person order or pay for or lend or advance money to pay for any intoxicating liquor wherewith any other person has been or is to be supplied for consumption on the premises; nor shall any person consume in any licensed premises or club any intoxicating liquor which any other person has ordered or paid for or agreed to pay for or lent or advanced money to

Provided always that if such intoxicating liquor is supplied or served for consumption at a meal supplied at the same time and is consumed at such meal the provisions of this regulation shall not be deemed to be contravened if the person who pays for such meal also pays for

such intoxicating liquor.

For the purposes of this regulation consumption on the premises includes consumption of intoxicating liquor in or on any highway open ground or railway station adjoining or near to the licensed premises or club in which the liquor was sold or supplied; and any person consuming intoxicating liquor in or on any such highway open ground or railway station shall be deemed to consume the liquor in such licensed premises or club as the case may be.

Credit Prohibited.

8. No person shall-

(1) (a) Either by himself or by any servant or agent sell or supply in any licensed premises or club or dispatch therefrom any intoxicating liquor to be consumed either on or off the premises; or

(b) Consume any intoxicating liquor in or

take it from such premises or club; unless it is paid for before or at the time when it is supplied or dispatched or taken away:

Provided always that if the liquor is sold or supplied for consumption at a meal supplied at the same time and is consumed at such meal, this provision shall not be deemed to be contravened if the price of the liquor is paid together with the price of such meal and before the person partaking thereof quits the

(2) Introduce or cause to be introduced into the area any intoxicating liquor unless it is

paid for before it is so introduced.

Long Pull Prohibited.

9. No person shall either by himself or by any servant or agent in any licensed premises or club sell or supply to any person as the measure of intoxicating liquor for which he asks an amount exceeding that measure.

Dilution of Spirits.

A.—Compulsory.

10. (a) No person shall on or after the twenty-fifth day of December, 1916, either by himself or by any servant or agent-

(1) Sell or supply to any person in any licensed premises or club for consumption on or off the premises or dispatch therefrom any whisky, brandy, rum or gin unless reduced to 25 degrees under proof:

(2) Introduce or cause to be introduced into the area any whisky, brandy, rum or gin unless reduced to 25 degrees under

proof:

Provided always that the foregoing provisions of this Article shall not affect the sale or supply of whisky, brandy, rum or gin which is proved to have been bottled before the eighteenth day of December, 1916.

(b) The sale of whisky, brandy, rum and gin reduced to a number of degrees under proof which falls between 25 and 50 is hereby ${f permitted}.$

(c) In determining whether an offence has been committed under the Sale of Food and Drugs Acts by selling to the prejudice of the purchaser whisky, brandy, rum or gin not adulterated otherwise than by an admixture of water, it shall be a good defence to prove that such admixture has not reduced the spirit more than 50 degrees under proof.

Sale of Light Beer.

11. The Order of the Central Control Board Liquor Traffic) made on the third day of July, 1916, with reference to the sale of light beer shall apply to the area and come into force on the eighteenth day of December, 1916.

Explanatory Provisions.

12.

(a) Nothing in this Order authorises any licensed premises to be kept open for the sale of intoxicating liquor except during the

hours now permitted by law.

- (b) The prohibition under this Order of the sale supply and consumption of intoxicating liquor except during certain hours is not subject to the exceptions provided for in the Licensing Acts with respect to bona fide travellers and the supply of intoxicating liquor at railway stations or any other provisions in those Acts enabling intoxicating liquor to be supplied during closing hours in special cases.
- (c) The expression "licensed premises" includes any premises or place where the sale of infoxicating liquor is carried on under a

(d) This Order does not affect the sale or dispatch of intoxicating liquor to a trader for the purposes of his trade or to a registered club for the purposes of the club.

(e) This Order does not affect the sale or supply of intoxicating liquor to or in any canteen where the sale of intoxicating liquor is carried on under the authority of a Secretary of State or of the Admiralty.

Exhibition of Order.

13. The secretary of every club to which this Order applies and every holder of a licence for the sale of intoxicating liquor shall keep permanently affixed in some conspicuous place in the club or in each public room in the licensed premises a copy of this Order and any other notice required by the Board to be so affixed.

Commencement of Order.

14. This Order shall come into force on the eighteenth day of December, 1916.

DEFENCE OF THE REALM (LIQUOR | CONTROL).

SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER OF THE CENTRAL CONTROL BOARD (LIQUOR TRAFFIC) FOR THE NORTH EAST COAST AREA (EXTENSION) WITH REFERENCE TO MEDICATED WINES AND NEW EXCISE LICENCES.

Any person contravening any provision of this Order or of the Liquor Control Regulations is liable to imprisonment for six months with hard labour and a fine of £100.

We the Central Control Board (Liquor Traffic), in pursuance of the powers conferred upon us by the Acts and Regulations relating to the Defence of the Realm, hereby make the following Order supplemental to the Order made on the seventh day of December, 1916, for the North East Coast Area (Extension)

Conditions as to the Sale of Medicated Wines.

- 1. On and after the twenty-fifth day of December, 1916, no person shall, either by himself or by any servant or agent, sell or supply to any person in any licensed premises for consumption off the premises or dispatch therefrom any intoxicating liquor in the form of or prepared as (a) medicated wine or (b)any mixture or preparation which contains any drug or medicament or is sold or advertised for sale as containing or purporting to contain medicinal properties except in a bottle or other vessel bearing a label correctly stating in clear and legible words or figures the amount of proof spirit contained in such medicated wine or mixture or preparation. Provided always that nothing herein shall be deemed to affect the sale of-
 - (a) Any medicine mixture or preparation appearing in the British Pharmacopeia or the British Pharmaceutical Codex; or
 - (b) Any medicine mixture or preparation which is made up for a customer on the signed prescription of a medical practitioner; or
 - (c) Medicated or methylated spirits or spirits made up in medicine and sold by practitioners medical \mathbf{or} chemists druggists.
- 2. (a) The expression "licensed premises" in the foregoing Article includes any premises or place where the sale of intoxicating liquor for consumption off the premises is carried on under a licence.
- (b) The foregoing Article does not affect the sale or dispatch of intoxicating liquor to a trader for the purposes of his trade.

Restrictions on the Sale of Intoxicating Liquor under New Excise Licences.

3. No person shall, except with the written authority of the Central Control Board (Liquor Traffic) and in accordance with the terms and conditions subject to which such authority may be granted, either by himself or by any servant or agent, sell or supply in any premises any intoxicating liquor under an excise licence granted in respect of such premises on or after the eighteenth day of December, 1916, unless an excise licence authorising such sale was in force in respect of such premises on the seventeenth day of December, 1916.

Provided always that nothing in this Article

shall be deemed to affect the sale of intoxicating liquor under-

(a) An excise licence granted on the autho-

rity of a Justices licence; or

(b) An excise licence granted to any person holding a canteen under the authority of a Secretary of State or of the Admiralty; or

(c) A manufacturer's licence.

Provisions as to Christmas.

4. The two Orders of the Board relating to the dispatch of intoxicating liquor from licensed premises on the days preceding Christmas and to the sale and supply of intoxicating liquor on Christmas Day made on the fourth day of December, 1916, shall apply to the area.

(1) No person shall as from the date hereof buy, sell or, except for the purpose of carrying out a contract in writing existing prior to such date, enter into any transaction or negotiation in relation to the sale or purchase of copper of any class, whether wrought or unwrought, situated outside the United Kingdom unless such person is authorised by a Special Permit from the Minister of Munitions to purchase or sell the same.

All applications for Special Permits shall be made to the Director of Materials, Armament Buildings, Whitehall Place, London, S.W., and marked "Copper Permit," and all persons to whom such permits are granted shall observe and perform all the conditions subject to which such permits may be granted.

(2) All persons shall, except as below mentioned, not later than the 16th day of December, 1916, send in to the Director of Materials, Armament Buildings, Whitehall London, S.W., returns of:-

(a) All unwrought copper at the date hereof held by them in stock or otherwise under their control.

(b) All unwrought copper due at the date hereof for future delivery to them.

(c) All contracts existing at the date hereof for the sale to or purchase by them of unwrought copper.

Notwithstanding the above, no return is required from (1) any manufacturer or smelter of stock in hand or due for future delivery for the sole purpose of manufacture or smelting at his works, (2) any person whose total stock in hand and due for future delivery does not exceed two tons.

Ministry of Munitions of War, 8th December, 1916.



The following regulations have been made with a view to safeguarding the interests of shipping in the Pentland and Moray firths:—

I .- RESTRICTION OF TRAFFIC.

1. No vessel, either British, Allied or Neutral, is to be in the shaded area indicated

- (c) Outside a distance of one mile of the coast in any other portion of the shaded area.
- 2. Vessels proceeding to ports in the Moray Firth should therefore endeavour to enter the firth in time to reach their destinations not later than half an hour after sunset. Should they not reach their destinations by that time they are to anchor, weather permitting, subject to the restrictions given in clause 1.
 - 3. Any vessel contravening the foregoing

regulations will run the gravest risk of being sunk.

Caution.—Neutral or Allied vessels are particularly warned that the passage through the Pentland Firth presents very grave risks to a Westbound vessel, and are strongly advised not to take it.

II.—PILOTAGE REGULATIONS.

Pilotage is compulsory at the undermentioned ports for all vessels (including fishing vessels) which have a draught of over eight feet, and it is highly dangerous for any vessel to enter or leave such ports without a pilot. Fishing and other small vessels having a draught of over eight feet are to assemble at the Pilotage stations, and will be conducted into and out of port in groups.

 All vessels bound to Cromarty or Inverness must call for a pilot at Wick or Burghead. Outgoing vessels are to discharge their pilots

at one or the other of these places.

- 2. It is dangerous for any vessel to be under way to the south-westward of a line joining Tarbet ness and Findhorn without a pilot.
- 3. No vessels of any description other than H.M. Ships and Auxiliaries are to be under way between sunset and sunrise in the waters contained between a line drawn from Tarbet ness to Findhorn, and a line drawn from Fort George to Chanonry point.
 - (2) Orkney Isles, Scapa Flow—Traffic Regulations.
- 1. All entrances are dangerous, and entry is absolutely prohibited by any of them except as provided in succeeding paragraphs.
- 2. Examination services have been established in the entrances to Hoxa and Hoy sounds; vessels directed to enter must communicate with the Examination vessel and follow the instructions received from her very carefully.
- 3. No vessel is permitted to approach the entrance to Hoxa sound within a radius of 5 miles under any circumstances whatever, except when actually ordered to Scapa Flow. Vessels ordered to Kirkwall should proceed direct to that port.
- 4. The only vessels permitted to enter Hoy sound from the westward are those ordered to Stromness.
- 5. Vessels are not permitted to enter Hoxa or Hoy sounds by night or in thick weather.
- 6. Passage through Cantick sound is entirely prohibited.
- (3) Shetland Isles—Traffic of Neutral Vessels
 Prohibited.

No vessels other than those of British Nationality or those of the Allied Nations, except vessels calling for the purpose of Examination, shall enter any ports or harbours in, or anchor off any part of, the coasts of the Shetland Isles until further notice.
