The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, Chapter 77, of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, and of the Act of the 37th and 38th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 63, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 23rd day of November, in the year 1916, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, Chapter 77, of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, and of the Act of the 37th and 38th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 63, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme with respect to some of the Rural Deaneries within the Archdeaconry of the East Riding, in the Diocese of York:

“Whereas it has been represented to us by the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of York, that the arrangements which are hereinafter recommended and proposed with respect to some of the Rural Deaneries within the said Archdeaconry of the East Riding are desirable and should be carried into effect, and we are of opinion that the same may be properly carried into effect:

“Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of York, (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and Archiepiscopal Seal to this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that as from the day on which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette, and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, *firstly*, within the said Archdeaconry of the East Riding, the Parishes of Anlaby, Hessle, Saint Nicholas Kingston upon Hull, Kirk Ella, North Ferriby, and Welton with Melton, shall be transferred from the Rural Deanery of Howden to the Rural Deanery of Kingston upon Hull; and, *secondly*, within the same Archdeaconry, the Parish of North Newbald shall be transferred from the Rural Deanery of Weighton to the said Rural Deanery of

Howden, and that each of the Parishes hereinbefore referred to shall be subject to the jurisdiction and authority of the Rural Dean of the Rural Deanery to which it is hereby transferred, and shall not belong to or be a part of any other Rural Deanery, nor be subject to the jurisdiction and authority of any other Rural Dean.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other matter or thing with respect to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, by virtue of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas a notice of the said Scheme has, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore-mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Archdeacon affected by the Scheme, that is to say the Archdeacon of the East Riding, and such Archdeacon has expressed his approval of the proposed arrangements:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of York.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 37, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for authorizing the sale and disposal of certain property in the Parishes of Grenton, Moorlinch, and Shapwick with Ashcott, in the county of Somerset, now vested in us:

"Whereas under and by virtue of a certain Indenture, bearing date the 24th day of June, in the year 1874, and made between Sir George Stucley Stucley, of Hartland Abbey, in the County of Devon, Baronet, and Henry Ley, of Chester Square, within the Liberty of Westminster, Esquire, of the *first part*, Trehawke Kekewich, of Peamore, in the County of Devon, Esquire, of the *second part*, Chris-

topher Babbage, and Thomas Henry Boys, both of Bridgwater, in the County of Somerset, Auctioneers, of the *third part*, and us, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, of the *fourth part*, all that the Manor of Grenton, together with the messuages or tenements, farms, lands, and hereditaments, situate in the Parishes of Grenton, Moorlinch, and Shapwick, in the County of Somerset, more particularly described in the Schedule to the said Indenture, and delineated and coloured *pink* on the Plan attached thereto, became, with their appurtenances, and are now vested in us:

"And whereas under and by virtue of a certain other Indenture, bearing date the 21st day of November, in the year 1891, and made between Lucy Stawell Crosse, of South Molton, in the County of Devon, Widow, The Reverend Edward Ilbert Crosse, of Henfield, in the County of Sussex, Clerk in Holy Orders, and Reginald Stawell Crosse, and Frederic Day, both of South Molton, in the County of Devon, Solicitors, of the *one part*, and us, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England of the *other part*, all and singular the messuage or dwelling-house and cottage, with the out-buildings, and gardens, and closes or parcels of land, situate in the Parishes of Grenton, and Ashcott, in the County of Somerset, more particularly described in the first Schedule to the said Indenture, and delineated and coloured *pink* on the Plan drawn thereon, became, with their appurtenances, and are now vested in us:

"And whereas the said manor lands, tenements, and hereditaments, are not subject to any outstanding beneficial lease or grant, but are now in our possession, but some portions thereof on account of their character or situation are unsuitable or inconvenient to be held or applied for the purposes for which estates vested in us are applicable under the Acts by which our proceedings are governed:

"And whereas with a view to the advantageous appropriation of the same, or of the proceeds thereof, for the ultimate improvement of our Common Fund it is expedient that the said manor lands, tenements, and hereditaments, or such part or parts thereof as we shall at any time, and from time to time, think fit should be sold or disposed of; and accordingly that we should be empowered to sell or dispose of our interest in such manor lands, tenements, and hereditaments, or in any part or parts thereof, in such manner as shall appear to us advisable:

"Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose that we may be authorized and empowered, by Instrument or Instruments in writing, duly executed according to law, from time to time to sell or dispose of, and duly to convey, according to the provisions of the said Act, all or any of the said manor lands, tenements, and hereditaments, so vested in us as aforesaid, with their appurtenances, and all our estate, right, title, and interest, therein, or in any part or parts thereof, unto and to the use of any person or persons desirous or willing to purchase the same, and his or their heirs, executors, administrators, or assigns, or otherwise as he or they shall direct or appoint, and for such consideration as shall, upon due calculation and inquiry, appear to us to be just and reasonable, it being our intention to invest the proceeds of such sale from time to time as occasion may arise in the purchase

of other lands, tithes, rent-charges, tenements, or hereditaments, or of some estate or interest therein convenient to be held by us for the purposes of the Acts by which our proceedings are governed, as aforesaid, and in the meantime to invest the said proceeds in some Government or Parliamentary Stock or other Public Securities in England.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the Diocese of Bath and Wells.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by the Burial Act, 1853, as amended by the Burial Act, 1900, it is provided that, in case it appear to His Majesty in Council, upon the Representation of the Local Government Board, that, for the protection of the public health, the opening of any new Burial Ground in any City or Town, or within any other limits, save with the previous approval of the Local Government Board, should be prohibited, or that Burials in any City or Town, or within any other limits, or in any Burial Grounds or Places of Burial, should be wholly discontinued, or should be discontinued subject to any exception or qualification, it shall be lawful for His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order that no new Burial Ground shall be opened in such City or Town, or within such limits, without such previous approval, or (as the case may require) that, after a time mentioned in the Order, Burials in such City or Town, or within such limits, or in such Burial Grounds or Places of Burial, shall be discontinued wholly, or subject to any exceptions or qualifications mentioned in such Order, and so from time to time as circumstances may require: Provided always that Notice of such Representation, and of the time when it shall please His Majesty to order the same to be taken into consideration by the Privy Council, shall be published in the London Gazette, and shall be affixed on the doors of the Churches or Chapels of, or on some other conspicuous places within, the Parishes affected by such Representation, one month before such Representation is so considered: Provided also that no such Representation shall be made in

relation to the Burial Ground of any Parish until 10 days' previous Notice of the intention to make such Representation shall have been given to the Incumbent and the Vestry Clerk or Churchwardens of such Parish:

And whereas the Local Government Board, after giving to the Incumbent and the Churchwardens of the Parish of Cenarth, in the County of Carmarthen, 10 days' previous Notice of their intention in that behalf, have made a Representation to His Majesty in Council that, for the protection of the public health, the opening of any new Burial Ground in the Civil Parish of Cenarth, in the County of Carmarthen, save with the previous approval of the Local Government Board, should be prohibited, and that Burials should be discontinued therein as herein-after directed:

And whereas His Majesty was pleased, by His Order in Council of the 24th day of October, 1916, to give Notice of such Representation, and to order that the same should be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council on the 5th day of December, 1916, and such Order has been published in the London Gazette, and copies thereof have been affixed, as required by the said Act:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, as it is hereby ordered, that no new Burial Ground shall be opened in the said Civil Parish save with the previous approval of the Local Government Board, and that Burials shall be discontinued therein as follows, viz.:—

CENARTH.—Forthwith and entirely in the Church of St. Llawddog, Cenarth, in the County of Carmarthen, and in the Churchyard attached thereto: Provided that

(a) In any walled grave now existing in the said Churchyard burial may be allowed subject to the condition that every coffin buried in such grave be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

(b) In any earthen grave now existing in the said Churchyard the burial may be allowed of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such grave, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than 3 feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

WHEREAS it is provided by Section 2 of the Customs (Exportation Prohibition) Act, 1914, that any Proclamation or Order in Council made under Section 8 of the Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1879, as amended by the Act now in recital, may, whilst a state of war exists, be varied or added to by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of the Board of Trade:

And whereas it is provided by Section 2 of the Customs (Exportation Restriction) Act, 1914, that any Proclamation made under Section 1 of the Exportation of Arms Act, 1900, may, whether the Proclamation was

made before or after the passing of the Act now in recital, be varied or added to, whilst a state of war exists, by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of the Board of Trade:

And whereas by a Proclamation, dated the 10th day of May, 1916, and made under Section 8 of the Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1879, and Section 1 of the Exportation of Arms Act, 1900, and Section 1 of the Customs (Exportation Prohibition) Act, 1914, the exportation from the United Kingdom of certain articles to certain or all destinations was prohibited:

And whereas by subsequent Orders of Council the said Proclamation was amended and added to in certain particulars:

And whereas there was this day read at the Board a recommendation from the Board of Trade to the following effect:—

That the Proclamation, dated the 10th day of May, 1916, as amended and added to by subsequent Orders of Council, should be further amended by making the following amendments in and additions to the Schedule to the same:—

(1) That the following headings should be deleted:—

(c) Bags, wrappers or sacks not otherwise specifically prohibited (except paper bags) other than any such bags, wrappers or sacks as constitute the coverings of goods to be shipped for exportation and are allowed by the Commissioners of Customs and Excise to be shipped as such coverings;

(A) Bags, wrappers or sacks made of jute, other than any such bags, wrappers or sacks as constitute the coverings of goods to be shipped for exportation, and are allowed by the Commissioners of Customs and Excise to be shipped as such coverings;

(B) Fibre, China;

(A) Fibre, Mauritius;

(A) Fibre, Mexican;

(A) Fibre, Mexican Istle;

(A) Jute piece goods and piece goods mainly composed of jute;

(A) Jute threads;

(A) Jute twist;

(A) Jute webbing;

(A) Jute yarns;

Metals and ores, the following:—

(B) Scheelite;

(B) Wolframite;

(B) Strontium sulphate;

(2) That the following headings should be added:—

(c) Bags, wrappers or sacks not otherwise specifically prohibited (except unwoven paper bags) other than such bags, wrappers or sacks as constitute the coverings of goods to be shipped for exportation and are allowed by the Commissioners of Customs and Excise to be shipped as such coverings;

(B) Bags and sacks made wholly or partly of jute, other than such bags or sacks as constitute the coverings of goods to be shipped for exportation and are allowed by the Commissioners of Customs and Excise to be shipped as such coverings;

Now, therefore, Their Lordships, having taken the said recommendation into consideration, are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the same be approved.

Whereof the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs and Excise, the Director of the War Trade Department, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

EAST INDIA KIPS.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on them by Regulation 2 of the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, the Army Council hereby require the persons and/or firms shown on the attached schedule to hold at the disposal of the Army Council such rough tanned East India Kips, of the weight in the case of Bangalore Kips of 7 lbs. and upwards, and in all other cases of the weight of 6 lbs. and upwards, not being Fifth Kips, as were delivered to any of these persons and/or firms on contracts made by them up to and including the 24th day of June, 1916, and as did not form part of any parcel of which the whole or any portion was put into process by them before the 22nd day of July, 1916.

If after this notice any person having control of any such Kips sells, removes or secretes the said Kips, without consent of the Army Council, he will be guilty of an offence against the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914.

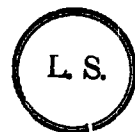
