HEREAS by Section 16 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, as amended by the Pluralities Act, 1850, it is, amongst other things, enacted, "That whenever it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, with respect to his own Diocese, and whenever it shall be represented to him by the Bishop of any Diocese, or by the Bishops of any Dioceses, that two or more Benefices, or that one or more Benefice or Benefices, and one or more Spiritual Sinecure Rectory or Rectories, Vicarage or Vicarages, in his or their Diocese or Dioceses, being either in the same Parish or contiguous to each other, and of which the aggregate population shall not exceed 1,500 persons, may, with advantage to the interests of religion, be united into one Benefice, the said Archbishop of the Province shall inquire into the circumstances of the case; and if on such Inquiry it shall appear to him that such Union may be usefully made, and will not be of inconvenient extent, and that the Patron or Patrons of the said Benefices, Sinecure Rectory or Rectories, Vicarage or Vicarages respec-

tively, is or are consenting thereto, such Consent being signified in writing under the hands of such Patron or Patrons, the said Archbishop shall, 6 weeks before certifying such Inquiry and Consent to His Majesty as hereinafter directed, cause, with respect to his own Diocese, a Statement in writing of the facts, and in other cases a copy in writing of the aforesaid Representation, to be affixed on or near the principal outer door of the Church, or in some public and conspicuous place in each of such Benefices, Sinecure Rectories, or Vicarages, with notice to any person or persons interested that he, she, or they may, within such 6 weeks, show cause in writing under his, her, or their hand or hands, to the said Archbishop against such Union; and if no sufficient cause be shown within such time, the said Archbishop shall certify the Inquiry and Consent aforesaid to His Majesty in Council; and thereupon it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council to make and issue an Order or Orders for uniting such Benefices, Sinecure Rectory or Rectories, Vicarage or Vicarages, into one Benefice, with Cure of Souls, for ecclesiastical purposes only:

And whereas the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, pursuant to the provisions of the said Acts, hath duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Certificate in writing, bearing date the 7th day of July, 1916, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the undersigned, Randall Thomas, Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury, Primate of all England and Metropolitan, do hereby in pursuance of the Pluralities Act, 1838, certify to Your Majesty in Council:—

"That it having appeared to us that the Benefice of Snargate with Snave, and the Benefice of Brenzett, both in the County of Kent, and our Diocese of Canterbury, might with advantage to the interests of religion be united into one Benefice for ecclesiastical purposes only, we inquired into the circumstances of the case, and on such Inquiry it appeared:

"That the Benefices are contiguous to each other, and, when united, will not be of inconvenient extent:

"That the aggregate population of the Parishes of Snargate Snave and Brenzett (according to the last Census) does not exceed 500 persons, the population of the Parish of Snargate being 108, that of Snave 57, and that of Brenzett 300:

"That there is a Church belonging to each of the three Parishes, and there is sufficient accommodation in Brenzett Church for the entire population of the three Parishes; Brenzett Church is not remote from either of the centres of population of the three Parishes:

"That there is a good House of Residence of reasonable size close to Brenzett Church which will become the Residence House of the United Benefice; There is also a House at Snargate which can be let or sold:

"That the net yearly value of the Benefice of Snargate with Snave is £217 5s. 7d. or thereabouts, and that of Brenzett is £78 3s. 0d. or thereabouts:

"That the Patronage of both the said Benefices of Snargate with Snave and of Brenzett belongs to us by virtue of our Archbishopric, and we consent as such Patron to the Union of the said two Benefices:

"That, when the said Benefices are united into one Benefice for ecclesiastical purposes, it is our purpose and intention that under the authority of a Faculty from Our Consistorial Court it shall be decreed that Brenzett Church shall be constituted the Parish Church of such United Benefice, and that due arrangements shall be made with regard to the other Churches and the use thereof:

"That 6 weeks and upwards before certifying such Inquiry and Consent to Your Majesty in Council we caused a Statement in writing of the facts to be affixed to the principal outer door of the Parish Church of each of the said Parishes, with notice to any person or persons interested that he, she, or they might, within such 6 weeks, show cause in writing under his, her, or their hand or hands to us, the said Archbishop, against such Union, and no sufficient cause has been shown:

"The copies of the Statement of facts and notice referred to, and our Consent as Patron before-mentioned are hereunto annexed:

"And we do hereby certify the Inquiry, Consent, and matters aforesaid to Your Majesty in Council to the intent that Your Majesty in Council may, in case Your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do, make and issue an Order for uniting the said Benefices into one Benefice, with Cure of Souls, for ecclesiastical purposes.

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the Rectories of Snargate and Snave, situate in the County of Kent, and Diocese of Canterbury, and the Vicarage of Brenzett, situate in the same County and Diocese, shall be united into one Benefice, with Cure of Souls, for ecclesiastical purposes only

And whereas the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, pursuant to the provisions of the said Acts, hath duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Certificate in writing, bearing date the 8th day of August, 1916, in the words following:

"We, Randall Thomas, Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury, Primate of all England and Metropolitan, do hereby certify to Your Majesty in Council:-

"That the Right Reverend John, Lord Bishop of Hereford, as Bishop of the Diocese within which are situate the Rectory of Little Birch, and the Perpetual Curacy of Much Birch, both in the County of Hereford, having represented unto us that the said Benefices, being contiguous to each other, and of which the aggregate population does not exceed 1,500 persons, might with advantage to the interests of religion be united into one Benefice, we inquired into the circumstances of the case:

"That on such Inquiry it appeared to us that such Union might be usefully made, and would not be of inconvenient extent, and that Henry Adkins being the Patron or person entitled to present to the Rectory of Little Birch, and Thomas Raymond Symons being the Patron or person entitled to present to the Perpetual Curacy of Much Birch, have consented to the proposed Union:

"That 6 weeks and upwards before certifying such Inquiry and Consents to Your Majesty in Council we caused a Copy in writing of the aforesaid Representation of the said Lord Bishop to be affixed to the principal outer door of the Parish Church of each of the said Benefices, with notice to any person or persons interested that he, she, or they might, within such 6 weeks, show cause in writing under his, her, or their hand, or hands, to us the said Archbishop against such Union, and no such cause has been shown:

"The Representation of the said Lord Bishop of Hereford, our Inquiry into the circumstances of the case, the Statement of Circumstances in reply thereto, the Consents in writing of the said Patrons, and the Copies of the Representation and Notices before-mentioned, are hereunto annexed:

"And we do hereby certify the Inquiry and Consents aforesaid to Your Majesty in Council, to the intent that Your Majesty in Council may, in case Your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do, make and issue an Order for uniting the said Benefices into one Benefice, with Cure of Souls, for ecclesiastical purposes only.

"And we further recommend that the course and succession in which the respective Patrons for the time being shall present or nominate to the said Benefices, after the same shall become vacant, shall belong to and be vested in the said Henry Adkins, his Successors and Assigns, and the said Thomas Raymond Symons, his Successors and Assigns, alternately, and that the first right of presentation to the said

United Benefice shall belong to and be exercised by the said Henry Adkins, his Successors and Assigns.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 59th year of His late Majesty King George the Third, Chapter 134, of the Act of the 2nd and 3rd years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 49, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Representation, bearing date the 14th day of December, in the year 1916, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 59th year of His late Majesty King George the Third, Chapter 134, of the Act of the 2nd and 3rd years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 49, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Representation as to the assignment of a District Chapelry to the Consecrated Church of Saint John, West Byfleet, situate in the Parish of Byfleet, in the County of Surrey, and in the Diocese of Winchester:

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a District Chapelry should be assigned to the said Church of Saint John, West Byfleet, situate as aforesaid:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Edward Stuart, Bishop of Winchester, (testified by his having signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said Parish of Byfleet, which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the Map or Plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a District Chapelry to the said Church of Sainf John, West Byfleet, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint John, West Byfleet.'

"And with the like consent of the said Edward Stuart, Bishop of Winchester, (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials, should be solemnized or performed at the said Church of Saint John, West Byfleet, situate as aforesaid, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns, and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices, should be paid and belong to the Minister of the same Church for the time being: Provided always, that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us, the said Commissioners, to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism, or for the registration thereof.

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal Consideration, and to make such Order with respect thereto as to Your Majesty, in Your Royal Wisdom, shall

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Saint John, West

Byfleet, being:—
"All that part of the Parish of Byfleet, in the County of Surrey, and in the Diocese of Winchester, which is bounded upon the south and upon the west by the Parish of Pyrford, upon the north-west partly by the Consolidated Chapelry of All Saints, Woodham, and partly by the New Parish of Addlestone, all in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the east, and upon the south-east, by an imaginary line commencing at the point north of the bridge which carries the line of the London and South-Western Railway across the River Wey Navigation Canal where such Canal is crossed by the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Addlestone from the said Parish of Byfleet, and extending thence first southward, then south-eastward, then again southward, and then south-westward, along the middle of the said River Wey Navigation Canal for a distance of 1 mile and 26 chains or thereabouts to the point south of Dodd's Bridge where it is crossed by the boundary which divides the said Parish of Byfleet from the said Parish of Pyrford."

And whereas the said Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the

said Diocese of Winchester.

DEFENCE OF THE REALM (LIQUOR CONTROL).

GENERAL ORDER (AMENDING) OF THE CENTRAL CONTROL BOARD (LIQUOR TRAFFIC).

We, the Central Control Board (Liquor Traffic), in pursuance of the powers conferred upon us by the Acts and Regulations relating to the Defence of the Realm, hereby make the

following General Order:-

1. The Article entitled "Dilution of Spirits" in each of the Orders of the Board now in force in the respective areas to which the Defence of the Realm (Liquor Control) Regulations, 1915, and any Regulations amending the same, have been applied, shall be revoked, and in place thereof the following Article shall be inserted:—

DILUTION OF SPIRITS.

A.—COMPULSORY.

(a) No person shall either by himself or by any servant or agent:—

(1) Sell or supply to any person in any licensed premises or club for consumption on or off the premises or dispatch therefrom any whisky, brandy, rum or gin unless reduced to 30 degrees under proof.

(2) Introduce or cause to be introduced into the area any whisky, brandy, rum or gin unless reduced to 30 degrees under

proof.

Provided always that-

(i) The foregoing provisions of this Article shall not affect the sale or supply in bottles of whisky, brandy, rum or gin which is proved to have been bottled before the

6th day of June, 1916; and

(ii) In the application of the said provisions to the sale or supply in bottles of whisky, brandy, rum or gin which is proved to have been bottled on or after the 6th day of June, 1916, and before the 1st day of January, 1917, this Article shall be read as if the figure 25 were substituted for the figure 30.

B.—Permissive.

- (b) The sale of whisky, brandy, rum and gin reduced to a number of degrees under proof which falls between 30 and 50 is kereby permitted.
- (c) In determining whether an offence has been committed under the Sale of Food and Drugs Acts by selling to the prejudice of the purchaser whisky, brandy, rum or gin not adulterated otherwise than by the admixture of water, it shall be a good defence to prove that such admixture has not reduced the spirit more than 50 degrees under proof.

And each of the said Orders of the Board shall be read as if the foregoing Article were

inserted therein.

2. This Order shall come into force on the first day of February, 1917.

- (2) If any person having control of any metal to which this Notice applies without the consent of the Minister of Munitions sells, removes or secretes it, or deals with it in any way contrary to any conditions imposed in any licence or permit that may have been granted in respect thereof, he will be guilty of an offence against the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914.
- (3) All existing licences issued by or on behalf of the Minister of Munitions for dealing in any scrap or swarf to which this Notice applies are hereby cancelled.
- (4) The Minister of Munitions hereby requires every smelter or refiner to make a return to the Director of Materials at the end of each calendar month, including the month of December, 1916, of the total quantites of refined copper of each description in stock, distinguishing between (1) that sold for use on Class "A" or Class "B" work; (2) that allocated for such use in his own works; and (3) the residue not so sold or allocated. further requires every maker and holder of copper scrap or swarf to make a Return to the Director of Materials at the end of each calendar month, including the month of December, 1916, of the total quantities of each class of such scrap or swarf in stock, distinguishing between (1) that sold for use on Class "A" or Class "B" work, (2) that allocated for such use in his own works, and (3) the residue not so sold or allocated.

THE SCHEDULE above referred to.

Copper due for future delivery on sliding scale terms will be paid for at not more than 10s. per ton of metal over the original full contract terms, including all discounts, commis-

sions, or rebates of any sort.

Special circumstances in connection with any copper taken over may be taken into considera-

tion by the Minister.

(b) A Price Schedule for copper scrap and swarf based downwards on the quotation for Electrolytic Copper as a Standard will be drawn up by the Director of Materials for the purpose of the taking over of stocks under the above Order and as a basis for future transactions.

(c) The quantities of Refined Copper specified in the Returns of Smelters or Refiners under Clause (4) of the above Order and not sold or allocated as therein mentioned, will be paid for on delivery by the Minister at the Average of the relative official quotations of the London Metal Exchange for the month in question.

(d) The scrap and swarf specified in the Returns by Makers and Holders under Clause (4) of the above Order and not sold or allocated as therein mentioned will be paid for on delivery as may be directed by the Minister on the basis of the average of the quotations for Electrolytic Copper for the month in question, subject to any adjustments for quality that may be necessary.

(e) In all cases where two prices are quoted for the same description of Copper by the London Metal Exchange, the price paid by the Minister, if based thereon, will be the mean of the two prices, and all prices paid by the Minister will be nett per ton delivered c.i.f. NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE. DEPOSIT CONTRIBUTORS BENEFITS ORDER, 1916.

THE NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE (DEPOSIT CONTRIBUTORS BENEFITS) ORDER, 1916, DATED 21ST NOVEMBER, 1916, MADE BY THE Insurance Commissioners under section 78 OF THE NATIONAL INSURANCE ACT, 1911 (1 & 2 GEO. 5, c. 55).

Whereas by the National Health Insurance (Deposit Contributors Benefits) Order, 1914 (hereinafter called "the principal Order"), and by the National Health Insurance Contributors Benefits) Order, (Deposit 1915, the Insurance Commissioners, for the reasons more particularly set forth in the recitals to the principal Order, have made certain provisions with regard to the payment of benefits to deposit contributors during the years 1915 and 1916, and it is necessary and expedient that the said provisions should be further extended:

Now, therefore, the Insurance Commissioners, in pursuance of the powers conferred on them by the said Act, and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, with the consent

of the Treasury, hereby order as follows:—
1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the National Health Insurance (Deposit Contributors Benefits) Order, 1916.

(2) The Interpretation Act, 1889, applies to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

2. Subject as hereinafter provided, the provisions of the principal Order shall continue to apply up to and including the 31st day of December, 1917, with such variations for the purpose of the year 1917 as are specified in the Schedule hereto.

3. A man who, having been insured under the provisions of Section 46 of the National Insurance Act, 1911, becomes a deposit contributor for the first time after his discharge, shall be entitled to receive medical and sanatorium benefits for such period from the date on which he became a deposit contributor as the Commissioners, having regard to the amount standing to his credit, may think fit, and there shall be deducted from the amount standing to his credit such proportion of the sums payable in respect of him for the purposes specified in paragraph (e) of Section 42 of the Act for the year 1917 as the Commissioners may think just.
