The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

**W**HEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 3rd day of February, 1917, in the words following, viz.:—

“Whereas by the Naval Agency and Distribution Act, 1864, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that the several shares of any money distributable among the Officers and Crew of any of His Majesty's Ships of War in the several cases enumerated in the said Act shall be paid to the persons entitled thereto in such manner, and subject and according to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions, as may from time to time be directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas it is by the said Act also enacted that His Majesty in Council may, from time to time, make such Orders as may seem meet for the better execution of the said Act:

“And whereas, in pursuance of the said Act, certain Regulations as to the manner and incidence of payment of such shares as aforesaid were made by Order in Council dated the 12th December, 1865:

“And whereas we consider it desirable that

amendments should be made in such Regulations:

“We beg leave humbly to submit that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to repeal the said Order in Council of the 5th December, 1865, and the Regulations thereby made, and in lieu thereof to make and establish the following Regulations, to come into operation forthwith, and to be effective as regards all moneys now awaiting distribution or hereafter to become distributable:—

“1. Terms used in this Order have the same respective meanings as in the said Act.

“2. All money distributable among the Officers and Crew of any of His Majesty's Ships of War, within the meaning of the said Act (all which money is comprehended under the term ‘prize money’ where hereafter used in this Order) shall be forthwith paid to the account of His Majesty's Paymaster-General at the Bank of England, on account of Naval Prize, or to the Accountant-General of the Navy, in order that it may be transferred to the said account.

“3. Before any money distributable as aforesaid is actually distributed, notification shall be given by advertisement inserted in the London Gazette, under the direction of the Admiralty, unless in any case the Admiralty

shall for sufficient reason dispense with or postpone such advertisement.

"4. No assignment of Prize Money may be made by any Officer or Man in respect of any advance or consideration, but any assignment made by an Officer before the date of this Order shall be discharged as heretofore.

"5. Any amounts due in respect of deceased Officers and Men shall be paid in the manner prescribed for the disposal of residues of Naval Assets generally.

"6. Shares due to persons of unsound mind shall be dealt with in all respects as are Balances of Pay and Allowances payable to such persons.

"7. Payment shall be made in such manner as the Admiralty may from time to time direct.

"8. Prize money which is unclaimed, or to which a claim has not been proved to the satisfaction of the Admiralty, shall be deemed to be forfeited after the expiration of 6 years from the 1st day of April following the date when it first became distributable; but when the relative accounts have not been finally closed the Admiralty may, if good cause is shown, remit such forfeiture and pay the amount out of the Naval Prize Cash Balance.

"9. All accounts relative to any Prize Money shall be finally closed at the expiration of 40 years from the date of distribution.

"10. The net amounts brought to account in any year in respect of percentage deductions and of forfeitures under the Naval Discipline Act, shall be regarded as finally transferred to the Exchequer Consolidated Fund at the expiration of the sixth year after that in which they were brought to account.

"11. An account showing all the receipts and expenditure on account of Prize Money made up to the 31st day of March in each year, and signed by the Accountant-General of the Navy, shall be laid annually before the House of Commons.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

"Whereas by section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being, or having been, an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Order in Council of the 28th March, 1903, it is provided that certain Commissioned Warrant Officers and Warrant Officers therein specified shall be eligible for promotion to the Rank of Lieutenant, or the corresponding relative Rank, as a reward for long and zealous service:

"And whereas we are of opinion that similar advancement should be open to Commissioned Mechanics and Warrant Mechanics:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to approve of Commissioned Mechanics and Warrant Mechanics being eligible for promotion to the Rank of Engineer-Lieutenant as a reward for long and zealous service, under conditions similar to those applicable to Officers promoted from the ranks of Chief Artificer Engineer and Artificer Engineer; the Officers so promoted to be included in the authorized numbers of Officers who may be promoted to the Rank, or relative Rank, of Lieutenant.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

**W**HEREAS by the Isle of Man (War Legislation) Act, 1914, His Majesty has power to extend to the Isle of Man any Act which, in the opinion of His Majesty, was passed for the purpose of meeting any emergency created by the present War, subject to adaptations for the purpose of making the Act applicable to the Isle of Man:

And whereas by Order in Council dated the 17th day of December, 1914, His Majesty was pleased to order that the Defence of the Realm Consolidation Act, 1914, and the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, should extend to the Isle of Man, subject to the adaptations therein contained:

And whereas the said Act and Regulations have been amended by certain other Acts and Regulations, which said Acts and Regulations have been extended to the Isle of Man by various subsequent Orders in Council, subject to the adaptations therein contained:

And whereas the said Regulations have been further amended by Order in Council dated the 10th day of January, 1917:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Regulations amending the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, made by Order of His Majesty in Council dated the

10th day of January, 1917, shall extend to the Isle of Man, subject to the following adaptations:—

Omit Regulations 2f (2), (3), (4), 2g, 2h, 2j, 2jj, 2l (8), 2m (1) and Sub-sections (3) to (9) both inclusive, 2n, 2p and 2q. In Regulation 2f paragraph (1), for the words "*Food Controller*" there shall be substituted the words "*Lieutenant-Governor with the approval of the Secretary of State for the Home Department*"; and at the end of the paragraph shall be inserted the words "*provided that the approval of the Secretary of State for the Home Department shall not be necessary for any orders to the same effect as orders made by the Food Controller for Great Britain.*"

In Regulation 2m (2) "*the Board*" shall mean "*the Board of Agriculture for the Isle of Man*" constituted under the Agricultural and Rural Industries Act, 1914.

In Regulation 41a (1) for the words "*Great Britain*" there shall be substituted the words "*the Isle of Man*"; in Sub-section 3 (1) of such Regulation after the words "*Munitions of War Act, 1915,*" there shall be read the words "*(being an Act of the Imperial Parliament)*"; in Sub-section 3 (3) of such Regulation after the words "*Military Service*" there shall be read the words "*(Isle of Man)*"; and in Sub-section (6) of such Regulation after the words "*in that behalf by*" there shall be read the words "*the Lieutenant-Governor or.*"

WHEREAS by the First Section of the Marriage of British Subjects (Facilities) Act, 1915, it is (amongst other things) enacted as follows:—

"Where His Majesty is satisfied that the law in force in any part of His Majesty's Dominions outside the United Kingdom makes due provision for the publication of banns or for the giving of notice in respect of marriages between British Subjects intended to be solemnized or contracted in the United Kingdom, and for the recognition of certificates for marriage issued by Superintendent Registrars in England, and of certificates for marriage issued by Registrars, and certificates of proclamation of banns, in Scotland, and of certificates for marriage issued by Registrars in Ireland, as sufficient notice in respect of Marriages between British Subjects intended to be solemnized or contracted in that part of His Majesty's Dominions, His Majesty may, by Order in Council, declare that this Section shall apply to that part of His Dominions, and in such case:—

"(a) Where a marriage is intended to be solemnized or contracted in the United Kingdom between a British Subject resident in England, Scotland, or Ireland, and a British Subject resident in that part of His Majesty's Dominions, a certificate of notice of marriage issued in accordance with such law shall in England have the same effect as

a certificate for marriage issued by a Superintendent Registrar, and in Scotland and Ireland have the same effect as a certificate for marriage issued by a Registrar in Scotland and Ireland respectively; and

"(b) Where a marriage is intended to be solemnized or contracted in that part of His Majesty's Dominions between a British Subject resident in that part and a British Subject resident in England, Scotland, or Ireland, a certificate for marriage may be issued in England by a Superintendent Registrar, or in Scotland or Ireland by a Registrar, in the like manner as if the marriage was to be solemnized or contracted under circumstances requiring the issue of such a certificate, and as if both such British Subjects were resident in England, Scotland, or Ireland, as the case may be."

And whereas His Majesty is satisfied that due provision is made in respect of all the matters referred to in the hereinbefore-recited Section of the said Act by the law in force in the parts of His Majesty's Dominions outside the United Kingdom hereinafter mentioned:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers by the above-recited Act in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

The First Section of the Marriage of British Subjects (Facilities) Act, 1915, shall apply to the parts of His Majesty's Dominions outside the United Kingdom hereunder mentioned:—

The Bermudas or Somers Islands.  
The Colony of British Honduras.

And the Right Honourable Walter Hume Long, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by Section 670 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, it is enacted that when any Lighthouse, Buoy, or Beacon has either before or after passing of that Act been erected or placed on or near the coast of any British Possession by or with the consent of the Legislature of that Possession, His Majesty may, by Order in Council, fix such Dues (in that Act referred to as Colonial Light Dues) to be paid in respect of that Lighthouse, Buoy, or Beacon by the Owner or Master of every Ship which passes the same and derives benefit therefrom as His Majesty may deem reasonable, and may by like Order increase, diminish or repeal such Dues, and those Dues shall from the time mentioned in the Order be leviable throughout His Majesty's Dominions, and further that Colonial Light Dues shall not be levied in any British Possession unless the Legislature of that Possession has, by address to the Crown or by Act or Ordinance duly passed, signified its opinion that the Dues ought to be levied:

And whereas the Great Basses Lighthouse, the Little Basses Lighthouse, and the Minicoy Lighthouse are Lighthouses which have been

duly erected under and pursuant to the said Section:

And whereas by Orders in Council, dated respectively the 22nd day of May, 1883, the 9th day of May, 1892, the 29th day of June, 1896, and the 10th day of August, 1903, the Dues leviable in respect of the said Lighthouses for the Classes of Ships therein respectively mentioned were duly fixed:

And whereas by Order in Council, dated the 21st day of October, 1912, His Majesty directed that, as from the 1st day of April, 1913, or from the time of the receipt of notice of that Order, if that be later, by the Officers authorized to collect Light Dues, the Dues thenceforth to be levied should be as follows, that is to say, in respect of the Great Basses Lighthouse and the Little Basses Lighthouse, three-sixteenths of one penny per ton, and in respect of the Minicoy Lighthouse one-sixteenth of one penny per ton, of the burden of every Ship on every voyage in which she passes or derives benefit from the said Lights respectively, subject in each case to a reduction of 25 per cent:

And whereas it has been made to appear to His Majesty that the said Dues should be altered in manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in exercise of the powers so vested in Him by the above recited provisions, and by and with the advice of His Privy Council, doth by this Order in Council order, and it is hereby ordered, that as from the 1st day of April, 1917, or from the time of the receipt of this Order, if that be later, by the Officers authorized to collect Light Dues, the Dues thenceforth to be levied shall be as follows, that is to say, in respect of the Great Basses Lighthouse and the Little Basses Lighthouse, three-eighths of one penny per ton, and in respect of the Minicoy Lighthouse one-eighth of one penny per ton of the burden of every Ship on every voyage in which she passes or derives benefit from the said Lights respectively.

**W**HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 14th day of December, in the year 1916, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the

31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called 'the said Benefice') of Harlington, in the County of Middlesex, and in the Diocese of London:

"Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Harlington is vested for an estate in fee simple, subject only to a Mortgage, in Emily Pauline Batty, wife of Erskine Fitzherbert Batty, of Ballyhealy, in the County of Westmeath, Ireland, Barrister-at-Law, Pauline Anna French, wife of Major Arthur French, of Cloonyquin, in the County of Roscommon, Ireland, and Annette Mary Victoria Haddock, of No. 24, Bathwick Street, Bath, in the County of Somerset, Spinster:

"And whereas the said mortgage is vested in Archibald Edward Wilson, of Kingsgate House, Winchester, in the County of Hants, Esquire, upon trust for Mary Lady Wilson, of The Moorings, Woking, in the County of Surrey, Widow, for her life, and afterwards for Jeannie Catherine Wilson, of The Moorings aforesaid, Spinster:

"And whereas the said Emily Pauline Batty, Pauline Anna French, Annette Mary Victoria Haddock, Archibald Edward Wilson, Mary Lady Wilson, and Jeannie Catherine Wilson are desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Harlington should be transferred to and be vested in the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Arthur Foley, now Bishop of London, and his Successors in the same Bishopric:

"And whereas the said Arthur Foley, Bishop of London, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness, and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore-mentioned Act recited, or by some or one of them, is made necessary, he the said Arthur Foley, Bishop of London, has executed this Scheme as herein-after mentioned:

"And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Harlington, which is hereinbefore mentioned, and hereinafter recommended and proposed, will, in our opinion, tend to make better provision for the Cure of Souls in the Parish or District in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson, so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid, arises or exists, that is to say, in the Parish of Harlington:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Emily Pauline Batty, Pauline Anna French, Annette Mary Victoria Haddock, Archibald Edward Wilson, Mary Lady Wilson and Jeannie Catherine Wilson, (in testimony whereof they have severally signed and sealed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Arthur Foley, Bishop of London, (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme, and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the

whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Harlington shall be transferred to the said Arthur Foley, Bishop of London, and his Successors in the same Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in, and shall and may from time to time be exercised by, the said Arthur Foley, Bishop of London, and his Successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of London.

**W**HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 59th year of His late Majesty King George the Third, Chapter 134, of the Act of the 2nd and 3rd years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 49, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Representation, bearing date the 14th day of December, in the year 1916, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 59th year of His late Majesty King George the Third, Chapter 134, of the Act of the 2nd and 3rd years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 49, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Representation as to the assignment of a District Chapelry to the Consecrated Church of Saint Paul, Fairhaven, situate in the Parish of Lytham, in the County of Lancaster, and in the Diocese of Manchester:

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a District Chapelry should be assigned to the said Church of Saint Paul, Fairhaven, situate as aforesaid:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Edmund Arbutnott, Bishop of Manchester, (testified by his having signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent that it would, in our opinion, be expedient

that all that part of the said Parish of Lytham which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the *Map* or *Plan* hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a District Chapelry to the said Church of Saint Paul, Fairhaven, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Paul, Fairhaven.'

"And with the like consent of the said Edmund Arbutnott, Bishop of Manchester, (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said Church of Saint Paul, Fairhaven, situate as aforesaid, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns, and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices, should be paid and belong to the Minister of the same Church for the time being: Provided always, that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us, the said Commissioners, to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism, or for the registration thereof.

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal Consideration, and to make such Order with respect thereto as to Your Majesty, in Your Royal Wisdom, shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Saint Paul, Fairhaven, being:—

"All that part of the Parish of Lytham, in the County of Lancaster, and in the Diocese of Manchester, which is bounded upon the south by the existing Parish Boundary, upon the west by the boundary of the Urban District of Saint Anne's-on-the-Sea, upon the north-west by the District Chapelry of Saint Thomas, Saint Anne's-on-the-Sea, in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north-east, and upon the south-east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said District Chapelry of Saint Thomas, Saint Anne's-on-the-Sea, from the said Parish of Lytham at the junction of Smithy Lane with Heyhouses Lane, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Heyhouses Lane for a distance of 12½ chains or thereabouts to the junction with Blackpool Road, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Blackpool Road for a distance of 53½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Ansdell Road, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Ansdell Road (thereby crossing the Kirkham, Lytham and Blackpool Coast Line of the Lancashire and Yorkshire and London and North Western Joint Railway) for a distance of 29¼ chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road called Inner Promenade, and continuing thence south-westward in precisely the same direction and in a straight line to the existing Parish Boundary."

And whereas the said Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased

hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Manchester.

## GENERAL ORDER OF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT BOARD.

HIGHWAYS AND LOCOMOTIVES (AMENDMENT) ACT, 1878, AND LOCOMOTIVES ON HIGHWAYS ACT, 1896.

Varying Provisions as to Construction of Wheels of Locomotives on Highways.

To the County Councils of the several ADMINISTRATIVE COUNTIES IN ENGLAND AND WALES;—

To the Councils of the several County Boroughs in England and Wales:—

To the Mayor, Aldermen, and Commons of the City of London;—

To the Councils of the several Metropolitan Boroughs;—

To the Urban District Councils of the several Urban Districts in England and Wales;—

To the Rural District Councils of the several Rural Districts in England and Wales;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by Section 28 of the Highways and Locomotives (Amendment) Act, 1878, it is enacted that it shall not be lawful to use on any highway a locomotive constructed otherwise than in accordance with the provisions therein set forth, including sub-section (4) thereof, which relates to the driving wheels of a locomotive:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by Section 9 of the Locomotives on Highways Act, 1896, We do hereby Order as follows:—

ARTICLE I.—In this Order the expression “agricultural locomotive” has the meaning assigned to it by Section 17 of the Locomotives Act, 1896.

ARTICLE II.—Notwithstanding anything in sub-section (4) of Section 28 of the Highways and Locomotives (Amendment) Act, 1878, the driving wheels of an agricultural locomotive which are shod with diagonal cross-bars may, while the locomotive is being used on a frost-bound road, be provided with studs constructed and attached as follows:—

1. The studs shall be fixed securely in the diagonal cross-bars of the driving wheels of the locomotive at regular intervals and not more than nine inches apart.

2. The studs shall be not less than one inch nor more than two inches in diameter, and shall have a well-rounded and approximately semi-circular head.

3. The studs shall not project more than

one-and-a-half inches from the diagonal cross-bars of the wheels.

ARTICLE III.—This Order may be cited as “The Locomotives on Highways (Agricultural Locomotives) Regulations, 1917,” and shall have effect during the continuance of the present war.

## MILK AND CREAM REGULATIONS: Amending Order.

To the several Local Authorities in ENGLAND AND WALES for the time being authorised to appoint an analyst for the purposes of the Sale of Food and Drugs Acts, 1875 to 1907:—

To Officers of Customs and Excise;—

To the Principal Chemist of the Government Laboratories;—

To Medical Officers of Health;—

To Public Analysts;—

To Dairymen, and to Wholesale and Retail Dealers in Milk and Cream;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas, for the prevention of danger arising to public health, We, the Local Government Board, by the Public Health (Milk and Cream) Regulations, 1912 (hereinafter referred to as “the Regulations”), made certain Regulations in relation to Milk and Cream;

And whereas by sub-division (1) of Article IV. comprised in Part II. of the Regulations it is, amongst other things, provided that no person shall add, or order or permit any other person to add to cream containing 35 per cent. or more by weight of milk fat any preservative substance other than—

(i) boric acid, borax or a mixture of those preservative substances; or

(ii) hydrogen peroxide

in any case in which the cream is intended for sale for human consumption; and by sub-division (2) of Article IV. it is provided that no person shall sell, or expose or offer for sale, or have in his possession for the purpose of sale, any cream to which any preservative substance has been added in contravention of the provisions of sub-division (1) of the Article;

And whereas by sub-division (2) of Article V. comprised in Part II. of the Regulations it is, subject as therein mentioned, provided that no seller of preserved cream shall deposit for sale in any place, or dispatch or deliver to any purchaser, or to any other person, any receptacle containing preserved cream intended for human consumption unless the receptacle is labelled in the manner prescribed in the Schedule to the Regulations and unless, in the case of preserved cream containing boric acid, borax or a mixture of those preservative substances, the amount of those substances calculated as boric acid ( $H_3BO_3$ ) is accurately

stated as not exceeding the limit specified on the label in the manner prescribed in the said Schedule;

And whereas by Article VIII. comprised in Part III. of the Regulations it is, amongst other things, provided that no person shall import into England or Wales any foreign cream containing 35 per cent. or more by weight of milk fat to which has been added any preservative substance other than—

(i) boric acid, borax or a mixture of those preservative substances; or

(ii) hydrogen peroxide;

or any foreign preserved cream which is not contained in a vessel or receptacle duly labelled in the manner prescribed in the Schedule to the Regulations;

And whereas it is expedient that the Regulations should be amended as herein-after set forth;

And whereas the Commissioners of Customs and Excise have signified their consent to the amendments of the Regulations so far as they apply to the Officers of Customs and Excise:

Now therefore, We, by this Our Order, and in the exercise of the powers conferred upon Us by the Public Health Act, 1875, the Public Health (London) Act, 1891, the Public Health Act, 1896, and the Public Health (Regulations as to Food) Act, 1907, and of every other power enabling Us in that behalf, do hereby Order that on and after Monday the Second day of April, 1917, the Regulations shall be read and have effect as if—

(a) the words "in amount not exceeding 0.4 per cent. boric acid ( $H_3BO_3$ ) by weight of the preserved cream" were inserted in Article IV. and also in Article VIII. of the Regulations after the words "boric acid, borax or a mixture of those preservative substances";

(b) for the paragraphs numbered respectively 1, 2, and 5 in the Schedule to the Regulations there were substituted the following paragraphs, that is to say:—

"1. Every receptacle containing preserved cream shall be labelled by affixing thereto an adhesive label in the form prescribed, in this Schedule referred to as the 'declaratory label.' Provided that, where the receptacle is made of cardboard, the declaratory label may be printed on the outside of the cardboard itself.

"2. Every declaratory label shall be in the form and contain the information indicated in Label I. or Label II. set out in this Schedule, as the case may require. Such information shall be printed in dark coloured type, of not less size than that shown in the said Label I. or Label II., upon a white or cream coloured ground in the centre of the declaratory label, and nothing else shall be printed on the declaratory label; except that in every case in which Label I. is used the maximum amount per cent. of boric acid ( $H_3BO_3$ ) contained in the preserved cream shall be stated in figures on the declaratory label.

"5. The declaratory label shall not be affixed or printed either over the mouth of the receptacle or beneath the receptacle."

## ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 6TH FEBRUARY 1917.)

### ARGYLLSHIRE (MOVEMENT OF SHEEP) ORDER OF 1917.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

*Application of Part 1 of the Sheep (Double Dipping) Order of 1914.*

1. Part 1 (*Restriction on Movement of Sheep out of a Movement Area*) of the Sheep (Double Dipping) Order of 1914 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order") is hereby applied to each of the Areas described in the Schedule hereto, and shall in its application to such Areas be read and have effect as if paragraph (3) of Article 2 of that Order were omitted.

*Provision for Movement through Areas Nos. 3 and 4 by Road.*

2. For the purposes of the principal Order and this Order, sheep shall not be deemed to be moved out of Area No. 3 or Area No. 4, as the case may be, described in the Schedule hereto, where they are moved through the Area by road from a place outside the Area to another place outside the Area, provided that such movement is authorised by a licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority.

*Commencement.*

3. This Order shall come into operation on the fourteenth day of February, nineteen hundred and seventeen.

*Short Title.*

4. This Order may be cited as the ARGYLL-SHIRE (MOVEMENT OF SHEEP) ORDER OF 1917.
