The KING was pleased, at Buckingham Palace, on Wednesday, the 21st instant, to present to Superintendent Robert John Forbes, of the Bradford City Fire Brigade, the Albert Medal of the Second Class for gallantry in saving life on land.

On the 21st of August, 1916, at 2.30 p.m., a fire broke out at the works of the Low Moor Munition Company, Limited. Three motor fire engines answered the alarm, one of which, in charge of the Chief Officer, drove into the yard of the premises, where a violent explosion had already taken place, while the other two remained outside. Another explosion took place almost immediately, injuring the Chief Officer and his chauffeur, and stunning Superintendent Forbes. On recovery Forbes went to the assistance of the Chief Officer and chauffeur, when a still more violent explosion occurred, killing seven firemen and seriously injuring twelve others, including Forbes. Forbes nevertheless brought the Chief Officer to a place of safety and returned and rescued two other injured firemen, who would otherwise have lost their lives. After driving the engines away from the yard, and thus saving them from damage, he collapsed.

His injuries incapacitated him from duty for five weeks.

The KING has been graciously pleased to confer the Decoration of the Albert Medal of the First Class upon Mr. Peter Thomson, Second Officer of the steamship "Polpedn," of London.

The following is an account of the services in respect of which the Decoration has been conferred:—

On the 14th November, 1916, the steamship "Polpedn," of London, was torpeded in the English Channel, and rapidly began to sink.

The crew had just time to get into the starboard lifeboat and cut the painter, the steamer's bridge-deck being then level with the water line, when the lifeline was found to be fastly coiled round Mr. Thomson's leg.

Realising the danger of the boat being capsized, Mr. Thomson at once jumped overboard, thus freeing the boat, and allowing her to be pushed away as the vessel foundered.

While under water Mr. Thomson managed to free his leg from the lifeline, and he was afterwards picked up by those in the boat.

Mr. Thomson ran the greatest possible risk of losing his life, and by his self-sacrifice undoubtedly prevented serious loss of life.
