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## CARGOES OF GERMAN VESSELS IN BRAZILIAN PORTS.

His Majesty's Minister at Rio de Janeiro reports that for the purpose of obtaining the release of cargoes on board the German vessels which originally took shelter in Brazilian ports, the owners of such cargoes should forward the documents in support of their claims thereto to their representatives in Brazil, for presentation to the Inspector of Brazilian Customs. The documents must be authenticated by a Brazilian Consular Officer. It is added that cargo which may be cleared in transit for other countries is subject to payment of freight and transit dues.

## DEFENCE OF THE REALM.

## UNDERTAKINGS OF CARRIERS ON CANALS.

Order, dated June 22, 1917, made by the Board of Trade under Regulation 9 H. (6) of the Defence of the Realm Regulations relating to Undertakings of Carriers on Canals.

Whereas the Board of Trade are of opinion that for securing the public safety and the defence of the Realm it is expedient that Regulation 9 H. of the Defence of the Realm Regulations should be applied to the undertakings of carriers by canal where such carriers are unable to carry on their undertakings efficiently.

Now, therefore, the Board of Trade in the

exercise of the powers conferred upon them by sub-section (6) of that Regulation, and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf hereby order as follows:—

Regulation 9 H. shall apply to the undertaking of any carrier by canal who makes an application to the Board for the purpose and satisfies the Board that the undertaking cannot be efficiently carried on unless possession thereof is taken by the Board of Trade.

## TRADE BOARDS ACT, 1909.

SHIRT-MAKING TRADE BOARD  
(GREAT BRITAIN.)PROPOSAL TO VARY CERTAIN MINIMUM RATES  
OF WAGES FOR FEMALE WORKERS IN THE  
SHIRT-MAKING TRADE IN GREAT BRITAIN.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the above Act by the Board of Trade, and dated 27th April, 1910, the Trade Board established under the above Act and the Trade Boards Provisional Orders Confirmation Act, 1913, for the Shirt-making Trade in Great Britain, as defined in the Regulations made by the Board of Trade, and dated the 26th December, 1913,

Hereby give notice as required by Section 4 of the above Act that they propose to vary the

Minimum Rates of Wages for female workers fixed by them and set out in Schedule I of their Notice of the 12th February, 1917, as follows, that is to say:—

- I. (a) For female workers other than home-workers, from 4d. an hour to 4½d. an hour.
- (b) For female homeworkers, from 4d. an hour to 4½d. an hour.

The above proposals are on the basis that the learners' rates are weekly rates based on a week of 50 hours, the rates being subject to a proportionate deduction or increase according as the number of hours actually spent by the worker in the factory or workshop in any week is less or more than 50.

The Trade Board will consider any objections to the above Proposal to Vary which may be lodged with them within three months from the 25th June, 1917. Such objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address) and should be sent to the Secretary of the Shirt-making Trade Board (Great Britain), 5, Chancery Lane, London, W.C. 2.

It is desirable that the objections should state precisely, and so far as possible with reasons, what is objected to.

**GENERAL ORDER OF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT BOARD.**

Reception of Mental Defectives in Poor Law Institutions: Regulations.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the several Poor Law Unions for the time being in England and Wales;—

To the Joint Committees of the Guardians of Poor Law Unions combined in pursuance of Section 8 of the Poor Law Act, 1879;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by the Poor Law Institutions Order, 1913, We, the Local Government Board, made Regulations for the government of certain Institutions provided by Boards of Guardians or by Joint Committees of two or more Boards of Guardians:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We hereby Order that except so far as We other-

wise direct, the Regulations hereinafter contained shall apply and have effect in relation to every Institution to which the Poor Law Institutions Order, 1913, applies and which in pursuance of Section 37 of the Mental Deficiency Act, 1913, is for the time being approved by the Board of Control for the reception of defectives within the meaning of that Act:—

ARTICLE I.—In this Order unless the contrary intention appears:—

(1) The following expressions have respectively the meaning set forth in this subdivision:—

“Act of 1913” means the Mental Deficiency Act, 1913.

“Order of 1913” means the Poor Law Institutions Order, 1913.

“Institution” means any institution to which the Order of 1913 applies.

“Defective” means a mental defective received in any Institution under any agreement made between the Guardians and any local authority in pursuance of Section 37 of the Act of 1913.

(2) Other expressions shall have the same meanings as in the Order of 1913.

ARTICLE II.—The provisions of Articles 16 to 23 inclusive of the Order of 1913 shall apply with any necessary modifications to a defective as if he were an inmate of a sick ward, lunatic ward, or nursery.

ARTICLE III.—The Guardians shall, within 14 days after the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July in every year, cause a complete list of all the defectives in the Institution on those dates respectively to be furnished to the Board of Control.

ARTICLE IV.—The Guardians shall also cause to be furnished to the Board of Control, in relation to every defective admitted to the Institution, the following written notices, copies of orders, documents, reports, and entries:—

(1) Notice within 7 days of admission, together with a medical statement made and signed by the medical officer of the Institution, and copies of the order by which the defective was sent and of the documents on which the order was founded.

(2) Notice within 2 clear days of the removal, discharge, escape, or recapture of a defective or of the transfer of a defective to any other institution.

(3) Not more than one month nor less than 14 days before the expiration of the order or authority under which a defective is detained, the special reports and certificate required under Sections 11 and 12 of the Act of 1913 for the continuance of the order or authority, and any report that may have been made under those sections by a medical practitioner at the request of the parent, guardian, relative or friend of the defective; and

(4) Within 7 days after the end of each quarter, a copy of every entry made during the quarter in the Register of Mechanical Restraint.

ARTICLE V.—On every occasion on which the Institution is visited by the Visitors appointed under the Act of 1913, the Master shall bring to the notice of the Visitors every defective who has, according to the information in his possession, attained since their last visit the age of twenty-one years.

ARTICLE VI.—Within 48 hours of the death of a defective the Master of the Institution

shall notify the death to the Coroner having jurisdiction in the area in which the Institution is situate, to the Clerk to the local authority who made the agreement in pursuance of which the defective was received into the Institution, and to the Board of Control. A copy of any document or other information supplementary to the notice which is sent to the Coroner shall at the same time be transmitted to the Board of Control.

ARTICLE VII.—Leave of absence shall not be allowed to a defective except by direction of the Guardians, or if the Guardians so direct of the House Committee of the Institution, and the Guardians or House Committee as the case may be shall before allowing leave of absence satisfy themselves of the suitability of the place to which the patient will be taken and the means of care and control which will be available: Provided that the Master of the Institution if satisfied as aforesaid, and if the Medical Officer of the Institution concurs, may allow leave of absence to any such person for a period not exceeding 48 hours.

ARTICLE VIII.—Corporal punishment shall not be inflicted upon a defective.

ARTICLE IX.—Except so far as the provisions of the Order of 1913 are inconsistent with or contrary to the provisions of this Order, the provisions of the Order of 1913 shall continue to apply to the Institution and to a defective.

ARTICLE X.—This Order may be cited as the “Poor Law Institutions (Mental Defectives) Order, 1917.”

(Appropriation of Portion of Castle Leazes for Extension of and for Purposes connected with Royal Victoria Infirmary; Conveyance to and Vesting of Fee Simple thereof in Trustees for Infirmary; Stopping up of

Footpaths, Substitution of New Footpath; Extinguishment of Herbage Right and other Rights over Portion of Castle Leazes appropriated; re-vesting of Appropriated Portion in Certain Events and Reincorporation in Castle Leazes; Agreements between Corporation Trustees and Committee of Stewards and Wardens of Freeman; Extension of scope of operations of Infirmary; Miscellaneous and Incidental Provisions; Incorporation, Repeal and Amendment of Acts.)

NOTICE is hereby given, that the Lord Mayor, Aldermen and Citizens of the city and county of Newcastle-upon-Tyne (hereinafter referred to as "the Corporation") and the Royal Victoria Infirmary, Newcastle-upon-Tyne, intend to apply to Parliament in the present Session for leave to introduce a Bill for the following or some of the following purposes, that is to say:—

To allocate and appropriate, or to empower the Corporation as the owners of the fee simple of the Town Moor, Castle Leazes, and Nun's Moor, Newcastle-upon-Tyne, and the Committee (constituted by the Newcastle-upon-Tyne Improvement Act, 1870) of Stewards and Wardens of the Companies of Freeman of Newcastle-upon-Tyne, owners of herbage and other rights on the town moor, to allocate and appropriate and to convey for and in connection with an extension of the Royal Victoria Infirmary and for purposes of or in connection with the said Infirmary and the treatment of sick, disabled and infirm persons, lands (hereinafter referred to as "the said lands") forming part of the said Castle Leazes, bounded on the north by the footpath and roadway separating the Castle Leazes from the property on the southerly side of Claremont-place and Framlington-place, on the south by the present Infirmary, on the east by Queen Victoria-road, and on the west partly by other lands forming part of the Castle Leazes and partly by Richardson-road.

The said lands comprise an area of 15 acres or thereabouts, and are situate in the parish and city of Newcastle-upon-Tyne.

To vest in certain persons to be appointed by or in accordance with provisions contained in the Bill as Trustees for the said Infirmary (hereinafter referred to as "the Trustees") or to authorize and provide for the grant and conveyance by the Corporation and the said Committee of Stewards and Wardens to the Trustees of the said lands without any payment therefor, but subject to such conditions and reservations (if any) as may be prescribed or provided for in the Bill, and to make all such provisions as may be necessary to enable the said lands to be held and used for the purposes of the intended Act.

To provide that the said lands shall be freed and discharged from all herbage and commonable rights, rights of way, rights of user and all other public rights whatsoever therein, thereon and thereover (except so far as may be otherwise provided by the Bill), and from all provisions relating thereto contained in the Newcastle-upon-Tyne Town Moor Act, 1774, the Newcastle-upon-Tyne Improvement Act, 1870, or any other Act, and from any agreements made in pursuance of those Acts or any of them.

To authorize the stopping up of the public footpaths on the said lands and to extinguish all public rights of way or user thereover.

To require the Trustees to provide on the said lands along the westerly boundary thereof a footpath in substitution for the said public footpaths to be stopped up as aforesaid, and to make provisions for the construction and maintenance of such substituted footpath.

To provide that in the event of the said lands to be appropriated under the provisions of the Bill ceasing to be used for the purposes for which they are authorized to be appropriated, the said lands shall thereupon re-vest in the Corporation, and shall for all purposes again form part of the Castle Leazes, and the rights of herbage and other rights thereover as now existing shall thereupon revive.

To empower the Corporation, the said Committee of Stewards and Wardens, and the Trustees, or any of them, to enter into and carry into effect all such contracts, agreements and arrangements, give such consents, execute such instruments, and do all such matters and things as may be requisite or expedient for effecting the purposes aforesaid, or for facilitating the carrying into execution of the objects of the Bill, and the Bill will or may confirm, with or without alteration, any such contract, agreement or arrangement as may have been or which during the progress of the Bill may be entered into for or in relation to the purposes aforesaid or any of them.

To extend the scope of operations of the Royal Victoria Infirmary and to enable the infirmary to admit and treat persons other than the poor of the city and of the adjoining counties of Northumberland and Durham upon such conditions as may be defined in the Bill or prescribed by Parliament.

To provide that the costs, charges and expenses of and incident to the preparing for obtaining and passing of the intended Act, and in carrying into execution the provisions thereof or otherwise in relation thereto shall be paid by the Royal Victoria Infirmary.

The Bill will vary and extinguish all rights and privileges inconsistent with or which would or might interfere with any of its objects, and confer other rights and privileges.

The Bill will or may so far as may be necessary repeal, alter, amend and extend the Newcastle-upon-Tyne Town Moor Act, 1774, the Newcastle-upon-Tyne Improvement Act, 1870, and any other Act relating directly or indirectly to the Town Moor, the Castle Leazes or the Nun's Moor, or the Corporation, or the said Stewards and Wardens, or the said Committee of Stewards and Wardens, and any Act or Charter directly or indirectly relating to the said Infirmary or the Trustees, and will or may incorporate with itself such provisions of the Lands Clauses Acts as may be thought expedient.

Printed copies of the proposed Bill will be deposited in the Private Bill Office of the House of Commons if and so soon as leave shall be given to introduce the Bill.
