THEREAS by an Order in Council, dated the twenty-eighth day of November, nineteen hundred and fourteen, His Majesty was pleased to make regulations (called the "Defence of the Realm Regulations") under the Defence of the Realm Consolidation Act, 1914, for securing the public safety and the defence of the realm:

And whereas the said Act has been amended by the Defence of the Realm (Amendment) Act, 1915, the Defence of the Realm (Amendment) (No. 2) Act, 1915, and the Munitions of War Act, 1915, and other enactments:

And whereas the said regulations have been amended by various subsequent Orders in Council:

And whereas it is expedient further to amend the said regulations in manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the following amendments be made in the said regulations:—

- 1. At the end of Regulation 2x the following paragraph shall be inserted:—
 - "The Food Controller may, as respects articles to which his powers under Regulations 2F to 25 extend, exercise the like powers as are by this regulation conferred on the Admiralty, Army Council, and Minister of Munitions".
- 2. In Regulation 2F sub-section (3) shall be omitted.
- 3. Regulation 2g shall be amended as follows—
- (1) By the substitution for sub-section (1) thereof of the following sub-section:—
 - "The Food Controller may by order require persons engaged in the production, manufacture, purchase, sale, distribution, transport, storage, or shipment, of any article to which the powers of the Food Controller extend, to make returns giving such particulars as to their businesses as may be specified by or on behalf of the Food Controller and may require the returns to be verified as he may direct;"
- (2) By the substitution in sub-section (2) thereof for the words "articles to which the provisions of this regulation are applied" of the words "articles with respect to which an order under this regulation has been made;"
- (3) By the omission of sub-section (5) thereof.
- 4. Regulation 2GG shall be amended as follows:—
- (1) By the insertion of the word "stored" after the word "manufactured;"
- (2) By the insertion of the words "or to any plant used in connection therewith" after the words "adapted for sale;"
- (3) By the omission of the words from "and any such order may apply" to the end of subsection (1) thereof;
- (4) By the insertion of the words "or plant" after the word "premises" wherever

- that word occurs in sub-sections (2) and (3) thereof;
- (5) By the omission of sub-section (4) thereof and by the insertion after sub-section (3) thereof of the following new sub-sections:—
 - "(4) It shall be lawful for the Food Controller—
 - "(a) To require any work in any such factory or workshop or other premises as aforesaid to be done in accordance with his directions given with the object of making the factory or workshop or other premises or the plant or labour therein as useful as possible for the production of food.
 - "(b) To regulate or restrict the carrying on of any work in any such factory, workshop, or other premises as aforesaid, or the engagement or employment of any workman, or all or any classes of workmen, therein, or to remove the plant therefrom, with a view to maintaining or increasing the production of food.
 - "(5) The occupier and every officer and servant of the occupier of any factory, workshop or other premises, or any other person affected by any such directions, regulations, or restrictions, and where the occupier is a company, every director of the company, shall obey the directions, regulations or restrictions of the Food Controller, and if he fails to do so he shall be guilty of a summary offence against these regulations.
 - "(6) Where under this regulation any directions regulating the priority to be given to work at any factory, workshop, or other premises, have been given and any person in any certificate or document given or issued for the purpose of securing priority for any work in pursuance of such directions, makes any false statement or false representation, he shall be guilty of a summary offence against these regulations."
 - 5. Regulation 21 shall be amended as follows:—
- (1) By the substitution for the words "Regulations numbered 2F, 2G, and 2H" of the words "Regulations numbered 2B, 2F, 2G, 2H and 7";
- (2) By the omission in sub-section (1) thereof of the words "numbered 2F and 2G";
- (3) By the insertion at the end of sub-section (1) thereof of the words "and any powers and duties necessary to provide for the due discharge of any functions assigned to local authorities by any order made by the Food Controller under the said Regulations";
- (4) By the substitution in sub-section (3) thereof for the words "the said regulations numbered 2F and 2G" of the words "these regulations," and by the insertion at the end of the same sub-section of the words "and any such order may be made either so as to apply generally, or so as to apply to any special locality, or so as to apply to any special supplies of any article or to any special producer, manufacturer, dealer or person, or to any class or description of factories workshops premises or plant, or to any special factory workshop premises or plant; and any such order may direct that all contracts, or any class of contracts, or any special contract, affected by the order shall

be abrogated, or shall remain in force notwithstanding anything in the order but subject to any exceptions or modifications for which provision may be made by the order."

- 6. Regulation 2JJ shall be amended by the substitution for the words "articles 2F to 2J inclusive" of the words "regulations 2B, 2F to 2J inclusive, and 7."
- 7. In Regulation 8c for the words "or Minister of Munitions" wherever those words occur, there shall be substituted these words "Minister of Munitions or Food Controller."
- 8. At the end of Regulation 8cc the following paragraph shall be inserted:—
 - "The Food Controller may, as respects articles to which his powers under Regulations 2F to 2J extend, exercise the like powers as are by this regulation conferred on the Admiralty, Army Council, and Minister of Munitions."
- 9. At the end of Regulation 966 the following sub-section shall be inserted:---
 - "(5) The Army Council may, as respects any road stone quarries, exercise the like powers as are by this regulation conferred on the Minister of Munitions, and the expression 'road stone quarries' includes slag dumps and slag works producing road materials."
- 10. For Regulation 24 the following regulation shall be substituted—
 - "24. (1) No person shall—
 - (a) transmit otherwise than through the post, or convey, to or from the United Kingdom, or receive or have in his possession for such transmission or conveyance, any letter, written message or memorandum; or
- (b) without a permit issued by or under the authority of the Admiralty or Army Council transmit consign or export, otherwise than through the post, or convey, from the United Kingdom to any neutral country in Europe or America or to any enemy country any printed or written matter (including plans photographs and other pictoral representations) to which paragraph (a) does not apply.
 - "The foregoing provisions shall not apply—
 - (i) to 'Shipowners' letters' as defined by section thirty of the Post Office Act, 1908, nor to ship papers;
 - (ii) to any letter message or memorandum or any such written or printed matter as aforesaid conveyed by any person if he proves that it is required for his own use and does not contravene the provisions of any other of these regulations and is otherwise lawful;
 - (iii) to any class of letters, messages and memoranda or any written or printed matter for the time being exempted by a Secretary of State.
- "(2) If any person acts in contravention of the foregoing provision or fails to comply with any condition subject to which a permit under this regulation has been granted, he shall be guilty of an offence against these regulations.
- "(3) This regulation shall be in addition to and not in derogation of the provisions of any enactment order proclamation or regulation re-

- specting the export of merchandise or trading with the enemy."
- 11. For Regulation 24B the following regulation shall be substituted—
- "24B. (1) No person shall, without a permit issued by or under the authority of the Admiralty or Army Council, transmit by post to any neutral country in Europe or America or to any enemy country any printed or written matter (including plans photographs and other pictoral representations) except
 - (a) patent specifications sent with the authority of the Board of Trade;
 - (b) letters and other postal correspondence, trade circulars and catalogues, bills of lading, invoices and similar trade documents, cheques, bills of exchange, and other negotiable or valuable securities, dispatched in accordance with any Post Office regulations for the time being in force.
- "(2) If any person wilfully acts in contravention of the foregoing provision, or fails to comply with any condition subject to which a permit under this regulation has been granted, he shall be guilty of an offence against these regulations.
- "(3) Any person who transmits through the post any printed or written matter by any indirect route or otherwise in such manner as to evade examination by an officer appointed to censor postal correspondence in this country shall be guilty of an offence against these regulations unless he proves that he did not intend that the examination should be evaded and that the printed or written matter does not contravene the provisions of any other of these regulations and is otherwise lawful.
- "(4) This regulation shall be in addition to and not in derogation of the provisions of any enactment order proclamation or regulation respecting the export of merchandise or trading with the enemy."
- 12. After Regulation 27A the following regulation shall be inserted:—
 - "27AA. It shall not be lawful for any person in any newspaper, periodical, circular or other printed publication or in any public speech to publish any report or statement of, or to purport to describe or to refer to, any proceedings of the Convention assembled on the invitation of His Majesty's Government for the purpose of preparing a constitution for the future government of Ireland, or of any committee of that Convention except such report or statement thereof as may be officially authorised by the Chairman of the Convention.
 - "If any person contravenes any provision of this regulation, he shall be guilty of an offence against these regulations."
- 13. (1) After Regulation 48 the following regulation shall be inserted:—
 - "48a. Where the person guilty of an offence or a summary offence against these regulations is a corporation or company every director and officer of the corporation or company shall be guilty of the like offence unless he proves that the act constituting the offence took place without his knowledge or consent."

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the institution (with effect as from 30th April, 1917) of the Rating of Chief Sailmaker with the following rates of pay, viz.:-

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the establishment, for the period of the War, with effect as from the 29th May, 1917, of the Ratings of Petty Officer (Special Service) and Stoker Petty Officer (Special Service), with the following rates of pay, viz.:—

And whereas His Majesty the King is satisfied that the Legislature of the British Possession hereinafter mentioned has made adequate provision for the recognition in that Possession of Probates and Letters of Administration granted by the Courts of the United Kingdom:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers by the above recited Act in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Most Honourable Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

The Colonial Probates Act, 1892, shall apply to the British Possession hereunder mentioned:—

HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of His Majesty, Chapter 19 (local), which Local Act is named the Saint John's Church Kingston-upon-Hull Act, 1916, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 24th day of May, in the year 1917, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

say:—
"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Your Majesty, Chapter 19 (local), which Local Act is named the Saint John's Church Kingston-upon-Hull Act, 1916, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for constituting a Separate District for spiritual purposes, to be taken out of the Parish of Drypool, in the County of York, and in the Diocese of York:

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said Parish of Drypool is a Cure wherein, or in parts whereof, the provision for Public Worship and for Pastoral Superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof, and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular part of the said Parish of Drypool which is hereinafter mentioned and described, should be constituted a Separate District in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed Separate District any Consecrated Church or Chapel in use for the purposes of Divine Worship, but there is therein a site which is intended to be purchased and conveyed to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under the provisions of the Church Building Acts, 1818 to 1884, and upon which it is proposed that a permanent Church, to be called the Church of Saint John the Evangelist, should be erected with or out of the proceeds of the sale of the late Church of Saint John, situate in Victoria-square, Kingston-upon-Hull, (which proceeds are in our hands), in accordance with the provisions of Section 12 of the said Saint John's Church

Kingston-upon-Hull Act, 1916, and of a certain Agreement set forth in the Schedule to

that Act, and thereby confirmed:

"And whereas at the date of the last-mentioned Act and Agreement, the perpetual Advowson of the said late Church of Saint John was vested in the Reverend Louis George Buchanan, as the Vicar or Incumbent of the Vicarage of the Parish of the Holy and Undivided Trinity, Kingston-upon-Hull, in the said County and Diocese:

"And whereas the said Louis George Buchanan has applied to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to take steps for the constitution of the said proposed Separate District in conformity with the provisions of Section 10 of the said Saint John's Church Kingston-

upon-Hull Act, 1916:

"And whereas the said proposed Separate District will, under the provisions of Section 11 of the said Saint John's Church Kingstonupon-Hull Act, 1916, be endowed, on or from the date of its formation, with all the endowments, stipends, payments, emoluments, and rights of, or belonging to, the Vicar or Minister or Incumbent of the said late Church of Saint John except surplice or other fees, rights, or emoluments arising out of or from the Parish or District attached to the said late Church of Saint John, and such endowments produce an income of not less than £200 per annum:

"And whereas the said Section 10 of the said Saint John's Church Kingston-upon-Hull Act. 1916, provides that the right of Patronage of the said proposed Separate District shall be assigned to, and be vested in, the Vicar or Incumbent of the said Vicarage of the Parish of the Holy and Undivided Trinity, Kingstonupon-Hull, for the time being:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of York (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all that part of the said Parish of Drypool which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the Map or Plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid, become and be constituted a Separate District for spiritual purposes, and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint John, Drypool.'

"And we further recommend and propose that, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, the whole right of Patronage of the said District so recommended to be constituted, and when such District shall have become a New Parish under the provisions of the firstly hereinbefore mentioned Act then of the said New Parish, and of the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereto, shall be assigned to, and be absolutely vested in, and shall and may from time to time be exercised by, the said Louis George Buchanan, Vicar or Incumbent of the said Vicarage of the Parish of the Holy and Undivided Trinity, Kingston-upon-Hull, and his successors in the same Vicarage for ever, as contemplated by the said

Section 10 of the said Saint John's Church Kingston-upon-Hull Act, 1916.

And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of either of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"All which we humbly recommend and pro-

pose to Your Majesty in Council.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint John, Drypool,

being:

"All that part of the Parish of Drypool, in the County of York, and in the Diocese of York, which is bounded upon the south by the River Humber, upon the east by the Parish of Marfleet, in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north and upon the west, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said Parish of Marfleet from the said Parish of Drypool crosses the middle of the Withernsea Branch Line of the North Eastern Railway, and extending thence in a straight line north-westward for a distance of 29 chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of Southcoates Lane opposite to the middle of Middleburg Street, and extending thence westward, first in a straight line to the middle of Middleburg Street, and then along the middle of such Street for a distance in all of 39 chains or thereabouts to the junction of Middleburg Street with New Bridge Road, and thence south-westward along the extending middle of New Bridge Road for a distance of 24 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Craven Street, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Craven Street for a distance of 14 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Hedon Road and Earle's Road, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Earle's Road for a distance of 172 chains or thereabouts to its southern end at the entrance to the Earle's Ship-building and Engineering Yard, and continuing thence south-eastward in precisely the same direction and in a straight line (thereby crossing the said yard) to the southern boundary of the said Parish of Drypool in the middle of the River Humber."

And whereas Drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the firstly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbent of the Cure out of which it is intended that the District recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such Patrons and Incumbent have respectively signified their assent to such Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been

approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of York.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 59th year of His late Majesty King George the Third, Chapter 134, of the Act of the 2nd and 3rd years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 49, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Representation, bearing date the 28th day of June, in the year 1917, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 59th year of His late Majesty King George the Third, Chapter 134, of the Act of the 2nd and 3rd years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 49, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Representation as to the assignment of a District Chapelry to the Consecrated Church of Saint Andrew, Avonmouth, situate in the Parish of Shirehampton, in the County of Gloucester, and in the Diocese of Bristol:

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a District Chapelry should be assigned to the said Church of Saint Andrew, Avonmouth, situate as aforesaid:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend George, Bishop of Bristol, (testified by his having signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiasti Commissioners, humbly represent that the said Ecclesiastical would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said Parish of Shirehampton which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the Map or Plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a District Chapelry to the said-Church of Saint Andrew, Avonmouth, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be 'The District Chapelry of Saint Andrew, Avonmouth.'

'And with the like consent of the said George, Bishop of Bristol, (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said Church of Saint Andrew, Avonmouth, situate as aforesaid, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns, and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices, should be paid and belong to the Minister of the same Church for the time being: Provided always that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us, the said Commissioners, to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office

of baptism, or for the registration thereof.
"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your
Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the
premises into Your Royal Consideration, and
to make such Order with respect thereto as to

Your Majesty, in Your Royal Wisdom, shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Saint Andrew,"

Avonmouth, being:

"All that part of the Parish of Shirehampton, in the County of Gloucester, and in the Diocese of Bristol, which is bounded upon the south-west by the Parish of Easton-in-Gordano, in the County of Somerset, and in the Diocese of Bath and Wells, upon the northwest by the Estuary of the River Severn, upon the north-east by the Parish of Henbury, in the said County of Gloucester, and in the said Diocese of Bristol, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the east and upon the south-east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Henbury from the said Parish of Shirehampton at the point in the middle of the stream known as the Shirehampton Rhine where such stream meets the north-eastern side of the road leading from Barracks Cottages towards Shirehampton, and extending thence, first southward to the middle of such road, and then first south-eastward, then southward, then south-westward, and then again southward, along the middle of the same road for a distance in all of 54 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road leading from Shirehampton to Avonmouth, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the lastmentioned road for a distance of 1 chain or thereabouts to its junction with West Town Road, and extending thence, first westward, and then generally south-westward, along the middle of West Town Road (thereby crossing the Bristol Port and Pier Line of the Great Western and Midland Joint Railway) for a distance of 43 chains or thereabouts to its south-western end on the north-eastern bank of the River Avon, and continuing thence south-westward in precisely the same direction as the last part of West Town Road and in a straight line for a distance of 6 chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the River Avon upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Shirehampton from the said Parish of Easton-in-Gordano."

And whereas the said Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Bristol.

And whereas there was this day read at the Board a recommendation from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs to the following

That the Statutory List should be further varied and added to as set forth in the Schedule hereto.

Now, therefore, Their Lordships, having taken the said recommendation into consideration, are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Statutory List be varied and added to as set forth in the Schedule hereto.

NOTE (1).—All persons or firms resident, carrying on business or being in the United Kingdom are prohibited from having with any person or firm mentioned in this List, or in any List issued under the Trading with the Enemy (Statutory List) Proclamation, 1916, No. 3, any dealings other than such as are expressly authorised by Paragraph 5 of the Proclamation. A List, consolidating all previous Lists, was published on the 22nd June, 1917 (The Consolidating List No. 29a), which, together with List No. 30 of the 6th July, 1917, and the List herewith annexed, contains all the names which up to this date are included in the Statutory

Additions to and variations in these Lists will be published at intervals approximately of two weeks.

The Lists are published in the London Gazette and reproduced in the Board of Trade Journal, and separate copies of all Lists may be obtained at a small cost from the Superintendent of Publications, His Majesty's Stationery Office, Imperial House, Kingsway, W.C.

† Note (2).—Where a person or firm mentioned in the List has more than one address in the country or group of countries under which the name of the person or firm appears, all dealings in that country, or in any country in the group, with such person or firm are prohibited, even in cases where one only of the addresses or one only of the countries is specifically mentioned

Note (3).—Trading is prohibited under the Trading with the Enemy Proclamations of 25 June, and 10 November, 1915, with any person or firm of enemy nationality resident or carrying on business in China, Siam, Persia, Morocco, Liberia or Portuguese East Africa. Persons or firms in the United Kingdom are therefore prohibited from trading with any person or firm of enemy nationality in any of those countries, even though such person or firm is not mentioned by name in the Statutory List.

Note (4).—In order to minimise as far as possible any inconvenience which may be caused to British traders by the dislocation of export trade owing to the inclusion in the Statutory List of a former connection, the Foreign Trade Department is collecting and classifying the names of non-enemy firms who may be able to act as substitutes for firms mentioned in the Statutory List. A considerable amount of information is already available at the Foreign Trade Department, and it is in many cases possible to suggest the names of satisfactory substitutes without the necessity of referring the matter abroad. The Department is, however, prepared on application to enquire of His Majesty's Representatives abroad for the names of suitable substitutes. When the applicant wishes this done by telegraph he is required to undertake to pay the cost of telegraphic corre-It would greatly facilitate the spondence. work of the Foreign Trade Department if applicants in making enquiries would specify the particular trade or trades for which substitutes are required.

Note (5).—The Statutory List for each country is telegraphed, on the day of issue, to His Majesty's Representative in that country who is instructed to netify accordingly British Consular Officers, to whom persons abroad should apply for information as to names on the Persons and firms in the United Kingdom with agencies or branches abroad would, however, be well advised to furnish such agencies or branches with issues of the List as they appear. The Lists for all countries in Central or South America are also telegraphed to His Majesty's Ambassador at Washington, who transmits them to H.M. Consul-General at New York and to other centres in the United States likely to be interested.

§ Note (6).—It is not unusual for firms in Holland and the Netherland East Indies to be registered under names commencing with descriptive terms such as "Handel Mattschappy" (Trading Company) or "Naamlooze Venootschap" (Limited Liability Company). In such cases it has been found more convenient to publish the firm under its proper name followed by the general descriptive term "Handel Maatschappy" or "Naamlooze Venootschap" (N.V.) as in the case of an English company. For instance, Handel Maatschappy van den Berg & Company, and Naamlooze Venootschap de Komeet v/h Dumonceau Frères will be found under "Berg" and "Komeet" respectively, and not under "Handel" or "Naamlooze."

DEFENCE OF THE REALM (LIQUOR CONTROL).

ORDER OF THE CENTRAL BOARD (LIQUOR TRAFFIC) FOR THE EASTERN AREA (EXTENsion).

Any person contravening any provision of this Order or of the Liquor Control Regulations is liable to imprisonment for six months with hard labour and a fine of £100.

We the Central Control Board (Liquor Traffic), in pursuance of the powers conferred upon us by the Acts and Regulations relating to the Defence of the Realm, hereby make the following Order:-

Limits of Area.

1. The area to which this Order applies is so much of the Eastern Area as comprises the parishes of Shillington, Upper Stondon, Meppershall, Campton, Shefford, Shefford Hardwick, Clifton, Henlow, Langford, Arlsey, Astwick, and Stotfold, in the County of Bedford, and so much of the parish of Southill in the said County as lies within the circumference of a circle having a radius of 500 yards measured from the Railway Station at Shefford.

Hours during which intoxicating liquor may be sold.

A.—For Consumption ON the Premises.

2. (1) The hours during which intoxicating liquor may be sold or supplied in any licensed premises or club for consumption on the premises shall be restricted and be as follows:—

On Weekdays:-

The hours between 12 noon and 2.30 p.m. and between 6 p.m. and 9 p.m.

On Sundays:-

The hours between 12.30 p.m. and 2.30 p.m. and between 6 p.m. and 9 p.m.

Except between the aforesaid hours no person

(a) Either by himself or by any servant or agent sell or supply to any person in any licensed premises or club any intoxicating liquor to be consumed on the premises; or

(b) Consume in any such premises or club

any intoxicating liquor; or

(c) Permit any person to consume in any such premises or club any intoxicating liquor.

B.—For Consumption OFF the Premises.

(2) The hours during which intoxicating liquor may be sold or supplied in any licensed premises or club for consumption off the premises shall (subject to the additional restrictions as regards spirits) be restricted and be as follows:—

On Weekdays:-

The hours between 12 noon and 2.30 p.m. and between 6 p.m. and 8 p.m.

On Sundays: -

The hours between 12.30 p.m. and 2.30 p.m. and between 6 p.m. and 8 p.m.

Except between the aforesaid hours no person shall—

(a) Either by himself or by any servant or agent sell or supply to any person in any licensed premises or club or (except as hereinafter expressly provided) dispatch therefrom any intoxicating liquor to be consumed off the premises; or

(b) Take from any such premises or club

any intoxicating liquor; or

(c) Permit any person to take from any such premises or club any intoxicating liquor.

Additional Restrictions as to Spirits.

- 3. In addition to the above general restrictions as to hours during which intoxicating liquor may be sold or supplied, the sale and supply of spirits in licensed premises and clubs shall be subject to the following special restrictions, that is to say:—
 - (a) No orders for spirits to be consumed off the premises shall be given by or accepted from any person actually present in any licensed premises or club except on Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays and Fridays and during the hours between 12 noon and 2.30 p.m.

(b) Spirits to be consumed off the premises must not (except as hereinafter expressly provided) be dispatched from any licensed premises or club, nor must they be taken therefrom by the person to whom they are sold or supplied or by any person acting on his behalf, except on the days and during

the hours aforesaid.

(c) Spirits to be consumed off the premises shall not be sold or supplied or taken from any licensed premises or club in any bottle or other vessel not bearing a label showing the name and situation of the premises or club, or in any vessel of a capacity less than one reputed quart, or in any less quantity than one reputed quart, or in any open vessel.

one reputed quart, or in any open vessel.

(d) No spirits to be consumed off the premises shall be sold or supplied in or taken from any refreshment room in any railway

station.

Conditions as to Distribution.

- 4. No person shall either by himself or any servant or agent—
 - (a) Sell, supply, distribute or deliver any intoxicating liquor from any van, barrow,

basket or other vehicle or receptacle unless before the liquor is dispatched it has been ordered and the quantity, description and price thereof, together with the name and address of the person to whom it is to be supplied has been entered in a delivery book or invoice, which shall be carried by the person delivering the liquor, and in a day book which shall be kept on the premises from which the liquor is dispatched.

(b) Carry or convey in any van, barrow, basket or other vehicle or receptacle while in use for the distribution or delivery of intoxicating liquor, any such liquor not entered in such delivery book or invoice and

day book.

(c) Distribute or deliver any intoxicating liquor at any address not specified in such delivery book or invoice and day book.

- (d) Refuse to allow any constable to examine such van, barrow, basket or other vehicle or receptacle or such delivery book or invoice.
- (e) Solicit or canvass for orders for, or collect or receive payment for, intoxicating liquor except at the licensed premises.
- (f) Send or cause to be sent or leave or cause to be left to or at any premises, or to or with any person, any order form for intoxicating liquor.
- (g) Cause or permit any payment for intoxicating liquor to be made on his behalf by any person in the service or employment of the vendor of the liquor, or, being a person in such service or employment, make any such payment as the agent or on behalf of the purchaser of the liquor.

Hours of Opening for the Supply of Food and Non-intoxicants.

- 5. Notwithstanding any provisions of this Order or of the Law relating to licensing or the sale of intoxicating liquor:—
 - (a) Licensed premises may be opened for the supply of food and non-intoxicating liquor at the hour of 5.30 in the morning on all days and be kept open for this purpose from that hour until the evening closing hour prescribed by the general provisions of the Licensing Acts; and
 - (b) Refreshment houses may be kept open for this purpose at any time during which they may be kept open under the general provisions of the said Acts.

Saving Provisions. .

- 6. Nothing in the foregoing provisions of this Order shall be deemed to prohibit, in cases where the same is otherwise lawful;
 - (a) The consumption of intoxicating liquor by any person in any licensed premises or club where he is residing; or
 - (b) The consumption of intoxicating liquor at a meal by any person in any licensed premises or club at any time within half an hour after the conclusion of the afternoon and evening hours during which the sale or supply of intoxicating liquor is permitted by this Order; Provided that the liquor was sold or supplied and served during such hours at the same time as the meal and for consumption at the meal; or
 - (c) The sale or supply of spirits to any person producing a certificate in writing

dated and signed by a duly qualified medical practitioner that the spirits are immediately required for medicinal purposes and specifying the quantity of spirits required; Provided that the quantity sold or supplied shall not exceed the quantity specified in such certifi-

(d) The dispatch from licensed premises for delivery at a place more than five miles distant of any spirits or other intoxicating liquor in the forenoon of any day on which the sale of the same for consumption off the premises is permitted by Article 2 (2) and Article 3 of this Order as the case may be.

Treating Prohibited.

7. No person shall either by himself or by any servant or agent sell or supply any intoxicating liquor to any person in any licensed premises or in any club for consumption on the premises unless the same is ordered and paid for by the person so supplied; nor shall any person order or pay for or lend or advance money to pay for any intoxicating liquor wherewith any other person has been or is to be supplied for consumption on the premises; nor shall any person consume in any licensed premises or club any intoxicating liquor which any other person has ordered or paid for or agreed to pay for or lent or advanced money to pay for;

Provided always that if such intoxicating liquor is supplied or served for consumption at a meal supplied at the same time and is consumed at such meal the provisions of this regulation shall not be deemed to be contravened if the person who pays for such meal also pays

for such intoxicating liquor.

For the purposes of this regulation consumption on the premises includes consumption of intoxicating liquor in or on any highway, open ground or railway station adjoining or near to the licensed premises or club in which the liquor was sold or supplied; and any person consuming intoxicating liquor in or on any such highway, open ground or railway station shall be deemed to consume the liquor in such licensed premises or club as the case may be.

Credit Prohibited.

8. No person shall-

(1) (a) Either by himself or by any servant or agent sell or supply in any licensed premises or club or dispatch therefrom any intoxicating liquor to be consumed either on or off the premises; or
(b) Consume any intoxicating liquor in or

take it from such premises or club;

unless it is paid for before or at the time when it is supplied or dispatched or taken away

Provided always that if the liquor is sold or supplied for consumption at a meal supplied at the same time and is consumed at such meal, this provision shall not be deemed to be contravened if the price of the liquor is paid together with the price of such meal and before the person partaking thereof quits the premises.

(2) Introduce or cause to be introduced into the area any intoxicating liquor unless it is

paid for before it is so introduced.

Long Pull Prohibited.

9. No person shall either by himself or by any servant or agent in any licensed premises or club sell or supply to any person as the measure of intoxicating liquor for which he asks an amount exceeding that measure.

Dilution of Spirits. A.—Compulsory.

10.

- (a) No person shall on or after the sixth day of August, 1917, either by himself or by any servant or agent-
 - (1) Sell or supply to any person in any licensed premises or club for consumption on or off the premises or dispatch therefrom any whisky, brandy, rum or gin unless reduced to 30 degrees under
 - (2) Introduce or cause to be introduced into the area any whisky, brandy, rum or gin unless reduced to 30 degrees under proof.

Provided always that the foregoing provisions of this Article shall not affect the sale or supply in bottles of whisky, brandy, rum or gin which is proved to have been bottled before the thirtieth day of July, 1917.

B.—Permissive.

- (b) The sale of whisky, brandy, rum and gin reduced to a number of degrees under proof which falls between 30 and 50 is hereby permitted.
- (c) In determining whether an offence has been committed under the Sale of Food and Drugs Acts by selling to the prejudice of the purchaser whisky, brandy, rum or gin not adulterated otherwise than by an admixture of water, it shall be a good defence to prove that such admixture has not reduced the spirit more than 50 degrees under proof.

Sale of Light Beer.

11. The Order of the Central Control Board (Liquor Traffic) made on the third day of July, 1916, with reference to the sale of light beer shall apply to the area and come into force on the thirtieth day of July, 1917.

Explanatory Provisions.

- (a) Nothing in this Order authorises any licensed premises to be kept open for the sale of intoxicating liquor except during the hours permitted under the general provisions of the Licensing Acts.
- (b) The prohibition under this Order of the sale, supply and consumption of intoxicating liquor except during certain hours is not subject to the exceptions provided for in the Licensing Acts with respect to bona fide travellers and the supply of intoxicating liquor at railway stations or any other provisions in those Acts enabling intoxicating liquor to be supplied during closing hours in special cases.
- (c) The expression "licensed premises" includes any premises or place where the sale of intoxicating liquor is carried on under a
- (d) This Order does not affect the sale or dispatch of intoxicating liquor to a trader for the purposes of his trade or to a registered club for the purposes of the club.
- (e) This Order does not affect the sale or supply of intoxicating liquor to or in any canteen where the sale of intoxicating liquor is carried on under the authority of a Secretary of State or of the Admiralty.

Exhibition of Order.

13. The secretary of every club to which this Order applies and every holder of a licence for the sale of intoxicating liquor shall keep permanently affixed in some conspicuous place in the club or in each public room in the licensed premises a copy of this Order and any other notice required by the Board to be so affixed.

Commencement of Order.

14. This Order shall come into force on the thirtieth day of July, 1917.

SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER OF THE CENTRAL CONTROL BOARD (LIQUOR TRAFFIC) FOR THE EASTERN AREA (EXTENSION) WITH REFERENCE TO MEDICATED WINES AND NEW EXCISE LICENCES.

Any person contravening any provision of this Order or of the Liquor Control Regulations is liable to imprisonment for six months with hard labour and a fine of £100.

We, the Central Control Board (Liquor Traffic), in pursuance of the powers conferred upon us by the Acts and Regulations relating to the Defence of the Realm, hereby make the following Order, supplemental to the Order made on the nineteenth day of July, 1917, for the Eastern Area (Extension).

Conditions as to the Sale of Medicated Wines.

- 1. On and after the sixth day of August, 1917, no person shall either by himself or by any servant or agent sell or supply to any person in any licensed premises for consumption off the premises or dispatch therefrom any intoxicating liquor in the form of or prepared as (a) medicated wine or (b) any mixture or preparation which contains any drug or medicament or is sold or advertised for sale as containing or purporting to contain medicinal properties except in a bottle or other vessel bearing a label correctly stating in clear and legible words or figures the amount of proof spirit contained in such medicated wine or mixture or preparation. Provided always that nothing herein shall be deemed to affect the sale of—
 - (a) Any medicine mixture or preparation appearing in the British Pharmacopeia or the British Pharmaceutical Codex; or
 - (b) Any medicine mixture or preparation which is made up for a customer on the signed prescription of a medical practitioner; or
 - (c) Medicated or methylated spirits or spirits made up in medicine and sold by medical practitioners or chemists or druggists.
- 2. (a) The expression "licensed premises" in the foregoing Article includes any premises or place where the sale of intoxicating liquor

for consumption off the premises is carried on under a licence.

(b) The foregoing Article does not affect the sale or dispatch of intoxicating liquor to a trader for the purposes of his trade.

Restrictions on the Sale of Intoxicating Liquor under new Excise Licences.

3. No person shall, except with the written authority of the Central Control Board (Liquor Traffic) and in accordance with the terms and conditions subject to which such authority may be granted, either by himself or by any servant or agent sell or supply in any premises any intoxicating liquor under an excise licence granted in respect of such premises on or after the thirtieth day of July, 1917, unless an excise licence authorising such sale was in force in respect of such premises on the twenty-ninth day of July, 1917.

Provided always that nothing in this Article shall be deemed to affect the sale of intoxicating

liquor under-

(a) An excise licence granted on the authority of a Justices' licence; or

(b) An excise licence granted to any person holding a canteen under the authority of a Secretary of State or of the Admiralty; or

(c) A manufacturer's licence.

ARMY COUNCIL ORDER.

LEATHER-ROUGH AND CURRIED, PRODUCED FROM BRITISH OR IRISH MARKET HIDES.

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by the Defence of the Realm Regulations, the Army Council do hereby order that from the 14th July, 1917, until further notice, all persons engaged in the purchase, sale or production of any or all of the Leathers specified in Schedule A hereto annexed, shall comply with the following regulations:

(1) No person shall, without a permit issued by or on behalf of the Director of Army Contracts, sell or deliver any Leather of the description aforesaid otherwise than in exchange for a guarantee in the form set out in Schedule B hereto annexed.

(2) No Tanner shall, without a permit issued by or on behalf of the Director of Army Contracts, sell or deliver any Leather of the description aforesaid at a price exceeding that

authorised in writing by or on behalf of the Director of Army Contracts, in the case of each Tanner

(3) No Currier shall, without a permit issued by or on behalf of the Director of Army Contracts, sell or deliver any curried leather produced by him from rough leather of the description aforesaid at a price exceeding the net cost of the rough leather, labour, and currying materials by more than 121 per cent., such cost to be calculated after deducting all the discounts and allowances received by him, and the currier's sale price as herein determined to include all discounts and allowances made by him.

The Currier on any such sale or delivery shall allow by way of discount for cash payment within thirty days 2½ per cent. of the price cal-culated as aforesaid to the person or persons to whom such sale or delivery is made.

(4) No person other than the Tanner or Currier thereof shall, without a permit issued by or on behalf of the Director of Army Contracts, sell or deliver Leather of the descriptions aforesaid at a price exceeding the Tanner's or Currier's sale price thereof as determined by Clauses 2 and 3 hereof respectively

(5) It shall be the duty of all purchasers of the Leathers aforesaid to require and of all sellers of such Leathers to give the guarantee in the form set out in Schedule C hereto annexed, that the prices at which the Leathers are sold and bought do not exceed those which under the provisions of this Order are duly authorised at the time of sale.

(6) The Orders made by the Army Council relating to Leathers of the descriptions aforesaid, and dated 16th January and 9th March, 1917, are hereby cancelled.

- (iii.) After completion of the movement the licence shall forthwith be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest policestation in the same district by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing such movement.

A licence under this Order shall for the purposes of the above-mentioned Order be treated as a licence under that Order.
