PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 4th day of May, 1918, in the words following, viz. :—

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas by Orders in Council dated the 1st April, 1881, and 8th August, 1911, it is provided that Surgeons of Your Majesty's Fleet must pass a prescribed Professional Examination to qualify for promotion to the Rank of Staff Surgeon, and that failure to pass the

Examination entails compulsory retirement with a reduced gratuity:

“And whereas it has not been possible to hold such Examinations during the War, and it will not be possible to re-introduce them immediately on the conclusion of Hostilities:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to authorize us during the period of Hostilities, and for 12 months thereafter, to dispense with this Examination, and to promote to the Rank of Staff Surgeon all Surgeons qualified by length of Service, with retrospective effect accordingly, where necessary, who have had uniformly good reports during their Naval Service, and who are recommended for such promotion by the Director General of the Medical Department.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 2nd day of May, 1918, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called 'the said Benefice') of Filton, in the County of Gloucester, and in the Diocese of Bristol:

"Whereas by virtue of an Indenture dated the 3rd day of November, 1917, and made between Annis Mackie of the 1st part, Hugh de Fylton Mackie of the 2nd part, and the Right Reverend George, Bishop of Bristol, of the 3rd part, it was witnessed that the Advowson or right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Filton was conveyed unto and to the use of the said George, Bishop of Bristol, and his Successors, Bishops of Bristol, for the time being, in fee simple:

"And whereas the said Conveyance was made with the intention of vesting the said Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage or presentation in the said George, Bishop of Bristol, in right of his See, and the parties thereto are desirous that anything which by way of further assurance or otherwise may be required effectually to carry out that intention may be done, and have applied to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, that a Scheme under the Acts hereinbefore mentioned may be prepared for the said purpose, and submitted to Your Majesty in Council:

"And whereas the said Annis Mackie, Hugh de Fylton Mackie, and George, Bishop of Bristol, are consenting to this Scheme, the said George, Bishop of Bristol, as party to the said Indenture of the 3rd day of November, 1917, and as Bishop of Bristol, the Diocese wherein the said Benefice of Filton is situate, approving of and accepting the transfer of the said Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage or presentation as required by the Acts before mentioned, or some or one of them:

"And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Filton, which is hereinbefore mentioned, and hereinafter recommended and proposed, will, in our opinion, tend to make better provision for the Cure of Souls

in the Parish or District in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson, so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid, arises or exists, that is to say, in the Parish of Filton:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Annis Mackie, and Hugh de Fylton Mackie, (in testimony whereof they have signed and sealed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said George, Bishop of Bristol, (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme, and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), We, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Filton shall be transferred to the said George, Bishop of Bristol, and his Successors in the same Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in, and shall and may from time to time be exercised by, the said George, Bishop of Bristol, and his Successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Bristol.

WHEREAS His Majesty has been pleased, in exercise of the power in that behalf conferred on Him by Section one, subsection one, of the Trading with the Enemy (Extension of Powers) Act, 1915, by divers Proclamations, and in particular by a Proclamation dated the 23rd day of May, 1916, and amended on the 16th day of January, 1918, entitled "The Trading with the Enemy (Statutory List) Proclamation," to prohibit all persons or bodies of persons, incorporated or unincorporated, resident, carrying on business, or being in the United Kingdom from trading with any of the persons or bodies of persons mentioned in the List contained in the last mentioned Proclamation, such List being therein referred to as the Statutory List:

And whereas by Section one, sub-section two, of the said Act, it is provided that any List of persons and bodies of persons, incorporated or unincorporated, with whom such trading is prohibited by a Proclamation under the said Act may be varied or added to by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of a Secretary of State:

And whereas the Statutory List contained in the last mentioned Proclamation, has been varied and added to by subsequent Orders of Council:

And whereas there was this day read at the Board a recommendation from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs to the effect that the Statutory List should be further varied and added to as set forth in the Schedule hereto.

Now, therefore, Their Lordships, having taken the said recommendation into consideration, are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered,

That the Statutory List be varied and added to as set forth in the Schedule hereto.

Whereof the Right Honourable Arthur James Balfour, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, the Controller of the Foreign Trade Department, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

NOTE (1).—All persons or firms resident, carrying on business or being in the United Kingdom are prohibited from having, with any person or firm mentioned in this List, or in any List issued under the Trading with the Enemy (Statutory List) Proclamation, any dealings other than such as are expressly authorised by paragraph 5 of the Proclamation. A List (The Consolidated List, No. 51A) consolidating all previous Lists, up to and including that of the 5th April, 1918, together with List No. 52 of 19th April, 1918, List No. 53 of 3rd May, 1918, and the List herewith annexed, contain all the names which up to this date are included in the Statutory List.

Additions to and variations in these Lists will be published at intervals approximately of two weeks.

The Lists are published in the London Gazette and reproduced in the Board of Trade Journal, and separate copies of all Lists may be obtained at a small cost from the Superintendent of Publications, His Majesty's Stationery Office, Imperial House, Kingsway, W.C.

NOTE (2).—Where a person or firm mentioned in the List has more than one address in the country, or group of countries under which the name of the person or firm appears, all dealings in that country, or in any country in the group, with such person or firm are prohibited, even in cases where one only of the addresses or one only of the countries is specifically mentioned.

NOTE (3).—Trading is prohibited under the Trading with the Enemy Proclamations of 25th June, and 10th November, 1915, with any person or firm of enemy nationality resident or carrying on business in China, Siam, Persia, Morocco, Liberia or Portuguese East Africa. Persons or firms in the United Kingdom are therefore prohibited from trading with any person or firm of enemy nationality in any of those countries, even though such person or firm is not mentioned by name in the Statutory List.

NOTE (4).—In order to minimise as far as possible any inconvenience which may be caused to British traders by the dislocation of export trade owing to the inclusion in the Statutory List of a former connection, the Foreign Trade Department is collecting and classifying the names of non-enemy firms who may be able to act as substitutes for firms mentioned in the Statutory List. A considerable amount of information is already available at the Foreign Trade Department, and it is in many cases possible to suggest the names of satisfactory substitutes for individual firms on the Lists, without the necessity of referring the matter abroad. The Department is, how-

ever, prepared on application to enquire of His Majesty's Representatives abroad for the names of suitable substitutes. When the applicant wishes this done by telegraph he is required to undertake to pay the cost of telegraphic correspondence. It would greatly facilitate the work of the Foreign Trade Department if applicants in making enquiries would specify the particular trade or trades for which substitutes are required. *General enquiries for new connections abroad should be addressed to The Comptroller General, Department of Overseas Trade (Development and Intelligence), 73, Basinghall Street, London, E.C. 2.*

NOTE (5).—The Statutory List for each country is telegraphed, on the day of issue, to His Majesty's Representative in that country, who is instructed to notify accordingly British Consular Officers, to whom persons abroad should apply for information as to names on the List. Persons and firms in the United Kingdom with agencies or branches abroad would, however, be well advised to furnish such agencies or branches with issues of the List as they appear. The names on the Lists for all countries in Central or South America are also notified to His Majesty's Ambassador at Washington, who transmits them to H.M. Consul-General at New York and to other centres in the United States likely to be interested.

NOTE (6).—It is not unusual for firms in Holland and the Netherland East Indies to be registered under the names commencing with descriptive terms such as "Handel Maatschappij" (Trading Company) or "Naamlooze Venootschap" (Limited Liability Company). In such cases it has been found more convenient to publish the firm under its proper name, followed by the general descriptive term "Handel Maatschappij" or "Naamlooze Venootschap" (N.V.), as in the case of an English company. For instance Handel Maatschappij van den Berg & Company, and Naamlooze Venootschap de Komeet v/h Dumonceau Frères will be found under "Berg" and "Komeet" respectively, and not under "Handel" or "Naamlooze."

34a. Where the provisions of Section 8 of the Arbitration Act, 1889, apply (whether by virtue of regulations made by the Insurance Commissioners or otherwise) to appeals or disputes referred to in Section 67 of the National Insurance Act, 1911, or Section 27 of the National Insurance Act, 1913, or to inquiries referred to in sub-section (2) of Section 32 of the National Health Insurance Act, 1918, or to arbitrations in which the Insurance Commissioners or any person or persons appointed by them are acting as arbitrators the Solicitor to the Insurance Commissioners may, on the application to him of any party to such an appeal, dispute, inquiry or arbitration, sue out a subpoena on behalf of such party.

Notice is hereby given, that the Rule Committee of the Supreme Court propose to add the following Rule to Order 65, viz. :—

RULE 10A. During the continuance of the present war and thereafter until such date as the Lord Chancellor shall appoint the total in any Bill of Costs of the fees prescribed by this Order (as distinct from payments) shall in respect of business done in any cause or matter in the Supreme Court after the 31st day of December, 1917, be increased by 20 per centum, and such increase shall be allowed upon any taxation of costs in respect of any such business as well between Party and Party as between Solicitor and Client and in taxations under or pursuant to the Solicitors' Act, 1843.

Provided that this rule shall not apply to the remuneration prescribed by the Solicitors' Remuneration Act, 1881, and that it shall not affect the power to direct payment of a sum

in lieu of costs under Order 65, rule 28, or the power to allow a fixed sum for costs under Order 65, rule 27 (38) or a gross sum under Order 65, rule 27 (38a).

Provided also that this rule shall not apply to Bills of Costs which have at the date on which this rule comes into operation already been delivered to the client sought to be charged therewith or to the person chargeable therewith or liable therefor or to bills then already taxed and certified or allowed.

AMMONIA AND AMMONIACAL PRODUCTS.

The Minister of Munitions, in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the Defence of the Realm Regulations, and of all other powers enabling him, hereby orders as follows:—

1. No person shall as on and from the first day of June, 1918, until further notice, produce or manufacture any Ammonia or ammoniacal product, except under a license issued by or under the authority of the Minister of Munitions, and in accordance with the terms and conditions of such license as to the quantities to be manufactured or otherwise. Provided that no license shall be required to manufacture:—

(a) Crude Ammoniacal Liquor or Sulphate of Ammonia in any quantities.

(b) Any other ammoniacal product, in quantities not exceeding $\frac{1}{2}$ ton, during any one calendar month.

2. No person shall as on and from the first day of June, 1918, until further notice supply any Ammonia or Ammoniacal product (other than crude ammoniacal liquor or Sulphate of Ammonia) to any person, except under and in accordance with the terms and conditions of a license issued by or under the authority of the Minister of Munitions pursuant to this Order. Provided that no license shall be required to supply not more than 56 lbs. of anhydrous ammonia, or 1 cwt. of ammoniacal liquor or any ammoniacal product to any person during any one calendar month.

3. All persons engaged in producing or manufacturing Ammonia, or any ammoniacal product, or in any manufacture, trade or business in which any Ammonia or ammoniacal product is used, shall carry out and comply with all instructions and directions which may be issued or given by or on behalf of the Minister

of Munitions with a view to avoiding loss or waste of Ammonia.

4. All persons engaged in producing, manufacturing, selling, distributing, or storing Ammonia, or ammoniacal products, or in any manufacture, trade or business in which any of the same are used, shall make such returns with regard to their businesses (including returns relating to losses or waste of Ammonia), and shall verify the same in such manner (including production of their books to any accredited representatives of the Minister of Munitions) as may from time to time be required by or under the authority of the Minister of Munitions.

5. For the purposes of this Order the following expressions shall have the following meanings:—

“Ammonia” shall mean and include anhydrous ammonia and ammonia in aqueous solution.

“Ammoniacal Products” shall mean and include all compounds of Ammonia and mixtures or preparations containing Ammonia.

“Crude Ammoniacal Liquor” shall mean an aqueous solution of Ammonia containing not more than 5 per cent. of Ammonia.

6. Nothing contained in this Order shall affect or exempt any person from compliance with any of the provisions of the Fertiliser Prices Order, 1918, relating to sales or deliveries of Sulphate of Ammonia.

7. This Order may be cited as the Ammonia Control Order, 1918.

8. All applications in reference to this Order (including applications for licenses) should be addressed to the Ministry of Munitions, Department of Explosives Supply, Storey's Gate, Westminster, S.W. 1, and marked “Fertiliser Section.”

NOTE.—Under clause 9 of the Fertiliser Prices Order, 1918, licenses are required for certain sales and deliveries of Sulphate of Ammonia and in particular for all sales of Sulphate of Ammonia for use in the manufacture of Munitions of War or for other industrial purposes.

ROYAL WARRANT AMENDING SIXTH CLAUSE OF ROYAL RED CROSS WARRANT.

GEORGE R.I.

Whereas by Our Royal Warrant dated 10th
 November, 1915, the Decoration of the Royal
 Red Cross was divided into two Classes, re-
 cipients of the Second Class being eligible for
 advancement to the First Class, and whereas
 no provision was made in Our said Royal War-

 Class of a recipient who is advanced to the First

 said Royal Warrant shall, as from the date
 thereof, be read as follows:

Sixthly.—Recipients of the Second Class
 of the Decoration shall be eligible for ad-
 vancement to the First Class as vacancies may
 arise, and on such advancement the Cross
 shall be returned to the office of Our Secre-
 tary of State for War.

ARMY COUNCIL ORDER.

SALE OF WOOL (GREAT BRITAIN) ORDER, 1918.

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon
 them by the Defence of the Realm Regulations,
 the Army Council hereby order as follows:—

1. No person shall sell any raw wool grown
 or to be grown on sheep in Great Britain or
 the Isle of Man during the season 1918, except
 unwashed daggings or clarts otherwise than to
 persons authorised by or on behalf of the
 Director of Raw Materials or at prices exceed-
 ing those set out in the schedule hereto an-
 nexed, or at such other prices as in any par-
 ticular case may be allowed by or on behalf of
 the Director of Raw Materials.

2. No person shall make or take delivery
 of or payment for any wool of the description
 aforesaid otherwise than in accordance with
 the provisions of this Order, whether in pur-
 suance of any contract entered into prior to the
 date hereof or otherwise.

3. All persons having in their custody or
 control any stocks of wool of the description
 aforesaid are hereby required to sell such wool

to any person authorised by or on behalf of the Director of Raw Materials as may be required by him or on his behalf, and to make delivery to such persons in such quantities and at such times and places as may be specified by him or on his behalf.

4. All persons having in their custody or control any stocks of wool of the description aforesaid are hereby required to furnish such particulars thereof as may be required by or on behalf of the Director of Raw Materials.

5. No person carrying on the business of a manufacturer of woollen, worsted or hosiery goods in any textile factory or workshop in Great Britain or the Isle of Man shall, without a permit issued by or on behalf of the Director of Raw Materials, spin, draw, reel or weave, for the use of the grower thereof, any wool grown or to be grown on sheep in Great Britain or the Isle of Man during the season of 1918, or prior to the 1st of January, 1917.

6. No person shall, without a permit issued by or on behalf of the Director of Raw Materials, buy, sell or deal in daggings or clarts grown or to be grown on sheep in Great Britain or the Isle of Man during the season of 1918.

7. Notice is hereby given, that it is the intention of the Army Council to take possession of all washed or willeyed locks produced from daggings or clarts grown or to be grown on sheep in Great Britain and the Isle of Man during the season 1918.

8. No person shall mix or wind in any fleece wool grown or to be grown on sheep in Great Britain or the Isle of Man during the season of 1918 any brokes or fallen wool, locks, daggings or other matter whatsoever, or wind or cause to be wound the said wool otherwise than in separate fleeces and tied with wool bands or glazed string, supplied by persons authorised to purchase or collect wool by or on behalf of the Director of Raw Materials.

9. No person shall buy, sell or deal in locks, brokes, daggings or fallen or gathered wool grown on sheep in Great Britain during the season of 1917 without a permit granted by or on behalf of the Director of Raw Materials or at prices other than those set out in the schedule annexed to the wool (Offsort) Order, 1917, or at such other prices as in any particular case may be allowed by or on behalf of the Director of Raw Materials.

10. Nothing in this Order shall be deemed to apply to Shetland wool.

11. For the purpose of this Order:—

The expression "Fleece Wool" shall mean the fleece removed entirely by shearing or clipping of sheep or lambs.

The expression "Daggings" or "Unwashed Daggings" or "Clarts" shall mean the wool naturally clotted with dung or earth.

The expression "Locks" shall mean any wool except daggings which may have become detached from the fleece at the time of shearing or thereafter.

The expression "Washed or Willeyed Locks" shall mean daggings, as hereinbefore defined, wherefrom the dung or earth has been extracted by washing or by other process.

The expression "Brokes" shall mean short wool obtained from the edges of the fleece in clipping.

The expression "Fallen Wool" shall mean wool removed from the skins of sheep or lambs which have died a natural death.

The expression "Gathered Wool" shall mean wool left by living sheep on hedges or other places.

12. The Sale of Wool (United Kingdom) Order, 1918, is hereby cancelled.

13. This Order may be cited as the Sale of Wool (Great Britain) Order, 1918.

DURHAM (CONTROL OF DOGS) ORDER OF 1918.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, the Dogs Act, 1906, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

Power to make Regulations.

1.—(1.) The Local Authority of any District specified in the Schedule to this Order may, in accordance with the provisions of this Order, make Regulations, with a view to the prevention of worrying of cattle (including sheep), for requiring that dogs or any class of dogs shall, during all or any of the hours between sunset and sunrise be kept by the owners thereof under control in manner prescribed by the Regulations.

(2.) The Regulations may apply to the whole or any part of the District, and may exempt any class of dogs either generally or under prescribed conditions.

Confirmation of Regulations.

2.—(1.) Regulations made under this Order shall not take effect unless and until they have been submitted to and confirmed by the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries.

(2.) Unless the Board otherwise direct, the following provisions shall apply:—

(i.) Notice of intention to apply for confirmation of any Regulations shall be given in one or more of the local newspapers circulating within the District in two successive issues two weeks at least before the making of the application.

(ii.) For two weeks at least before an application, a copy of the Regulations proposed to be confirmed shall be kept at the office of the Local Authority of the District, and be open during office hours thereat to the inspection of ratepayers of the District without fee or reward.

(iii.) The Clerk of the Local Authority shall on the application of any such rate-

payer furnish him with a copy of the proposed Regulations on payment of sixpence.

(3.) A copy of any Regulations made by a Local Authority under this Order, signed and certified by the Clerk of the Local Authority to be a true copy and to have been duly confirmed, shall be evidence, until the contrary is proved, in all legal proceedings, of the due making, confirmation, and existence of the Regulations without further or other proof.

Seizure of Dogs where Regulations are Contravened.

3. Any dog in respect of which an offence is being committed against a Regulation made under this Order may be seized and treated as a stray dog under the powers conferred by section three of the Dogs Act, 1906.

Extension of Definition in Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

4. Dogs shall be animals for the purposes of the following sections of the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894 (namely):—

Section forty-three (*police*);

Section forty-four (*General administrative provisions*);

and also for the purposes of all other sections of the said Act containing provisions relative to or consequent on the provisions of those sections and this Order, including such sections as relate to offences and legal proceedings.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

5. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Short Title.

6. This Order may be cited as the DURHAM (CONTROL OF DOGS) ORDER OF 1918.

MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FIXED FOR MALE WORKMEN IN NORTHAMPTONSHIRE TO COME INTO FORCE ON THE 27TH MAY, 1918.

The Agricultural Wages Board (England and Wales) duly established and constituted under Section 5 (1) of the above Act and the Regulations made by the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries dated the 8th November, 1917, having given the Notice prescribed by the said Act, and having considered all objections duly lodged with them, and having had regard to the provisions of sub-sections (6) and (7) of Section 5 of the Act, hereby give notice as required by sub-section (4) of the said Section that they have fixed the following minimum rates of wages for male workmen of 18 years of age and over employed in agriculture for time-work in the area comprising the administrative counties of Northampton and Soke of Peterborough and the county boroughs of Northampton, that is to say:

1. The wages payable for employment in Summer (as hereinafter defined) of male workmen in agriculture of 18 years of age and over, shall be not less than wages at the minimum rate of 30s. for 54 hours (exclusive of meal times).

2. The wages payable for employment in Winter (as hereinafter defined) of male workmen in agriculture of 18 years of age and over, shall be not less than wages at the minimum rate of 30s. for 48 hours (exclusive of meal times).

3. The above minimum rates shall apply to all male workmen of 18 years of age and upwards who are wholly or partly employed in agriculture within the meaning of Section 17 (1) of the Corn Production Act, 1917, in the above-mentioned area during such time as they are so employed.

4. For the purpose of the above minimum rates employment in Summer shall be deemed to be employment during the period commencing on the first Monday in March and terminating on the last Sunday in October; and employment in Winter shall be deemed to be employment during the rest of the year.

5. The above minimum rates shall come into operation on the 27th day of May, 1918.
