A PROCLAMATION

RELATING TO THE IMPORTATION OF CERTAIN ARTICLES INTO THE UNITED KINGDOM.

GEORGE, R.I.

**W**HEREAS by Section forty-three of the Customs Consolidation Act, 1876, it is provided that the importation of arms, ammunition, gunpowder, or any other goods may be prohibited by Proclamation:

And whereas by certain Proclamations entitled Prohibition of Import Proclamations the importation of certain goods has been prohibited accordingly:

And whereas it is expedient that the import-

ation into the United Kingdom of certain other goods should be prohibited:

Now, therefore, We, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, in pursuance of the said Act and of all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, do hereby proclaim, direct and ordain as follows:—

As from and after the date hereof, subject as hereinafter provided, the importation into the United Kingdom of the following articles is hereby prohibited, viz.:—

Oleo stearine and tallow.

Olive oil.

Onions.

Provided always, and it is hereby declared, that this prohibition shall not apply to any such goods which are imported under licence given by or on behalf of the Board of Trade, and subject to the provisions and conditions of such licence.

This Proclamation may be cited as the Prohibition of Import (No. 28) Proclamation, 1918.

Given at Our Court at Buckingham Palace, this Eighth day of November, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and eighteen, and in the Ninth year of Our Reign.

**W**HEREAS by Section 16 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, as amended by the Pluralities Act, 1850, it is, amongst other things, enacted, "That whenever it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, with respect to his own Diocese, and whenever it shall be represented to him by the Bishop of any Diocese, or by the Bishops of any two Dioceses, that two or more Benefices, or that one or more Benefice or Benefices, and one or more Spiritual Sinecure Rectory or Rectories, Vicarage or Vicarages, in his or their Diocese or Dioceses, being either in the same Parish or contiguous to each other, and of which the aggregate population shall not exceed 1,500 persons, may, with advantage to the interests of religion, be united into one Benefice, the said Archbishop of the Province shall inquire into the circumstances of the case; and if on such Inquiry it shall appear to him that such Union may be usefully made, and will not be of inconvenient extent, and that the Patron or Patrons of the said Benefices, Sinecure Rectory or Rectories, Vicarage or Vicarages respectively, is or are consenting thereto, such Consent being signified in writing under the hands of such Patron or Patrons, the said Archbishop shall, 6 weeks before certifying such Inquiry and Consent to His Majesty as hereinafter directed, cause, with respect to his own Diocese, a Statement in writing of the facts, and in other cases a Copy in writing of the aforesaid Representation, to be affixed on or near the Principal Outer Door of the Church, or in some public and conspicuous place in each of such Benefices, Sinecure Rectories, or Vicarages, with notice to any person or persons interested that he, she, or they may, within such 6 weeks, show cause in writing under his, her, or their hand or hands, to the said Archbishop against such Union; and if no sufficient cause be shown within such time, the said Archbishop shall certify the Inquiry and Consent aforesaid to His Majesty in Council, and thereupon it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council to make and issue an Order or Orders for uniting such Benefices, Sinecure Rectory or Rectories, Vicarage or Vicarages, into one Benefice, with Cure of Souls, for ecclesiastical purposes only; and it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council to give directions for regulating the course and succession in which the Patrons, if there be more than one Patron, shall present or nominate to such United Benefice, from time to time, as the same shall become vacant."

And whereas the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, hath, pursuant to the provisions of the said Acts, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Certificate in writing, bearing date the 26th day of July, 1918, in the words following:—

"We, Randall Thomas, Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury, Primate of all England and Metropolitan, do hereby certify to Your Majesty in Council:—

"That the Right Reverend George Wyndham, Lord Bishop of Bath and Wells, as Bishop of the Diocese within which are situate the

Rectory of Oare, and the Rectory of Culbone, both in the County of Somerset, having represented unto us that the said Benefices, being contiguous to each other, and of which the aggregate population does not exceed 1,500 persons, might, with advantage to the interests of religion, be united into one Benefice, we inquired into the circumstances of the case:

"That on such Inquiry it appeared to us that such Union might be usefully made, and would not be of inconvenient extent, and that Constance Caroline Halliday, being the Patron or person entitled to present to the Rectory of Oare, and the Right Honourable Mary Caroline, Countess of Lovelace, being the Patron or person entitled to present to the Rectory of Culbone, have consented to the proposed Union:

"That 6 weeks and upwards before certifying such Inquiry and Consents to Your Majesty in Council we caused a Copy in writing of the aforesaid Representation of the said Lord Bishop to be affixed to the Principal Outer Door of the Parish Church of each of the said Benefices, with notice to any person or persons interested that he, she, or they might, within such 6 weeks, show cause in writing under his, her, or their hand or hands, to us, the said Archbishop, against such Union, and no such cause has been shown:

"The Representation of the said Lord Bishop of Bath and Wells, our Inquiry into the circumstances of the case, the Statement of circumstances in reply thereto, the Consents in writing of the Patrons, and the copies of the Representation and Notice before mentioned, are hereunto annexed:

"And we do hereby certify the Inquiry and Consents aforesaid to Your Majesty in Council, to the intent that Your Majesty in Council may, in case Your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do, make and issue an Order for uniting the said Benefices into one Benefice, with Cure of Souls, for ecclesiastical purposes only.

"And we further recommend that the course and succession in which the respective Patrons for the time being shall present or nominate to the said Benefices, after the same shall be united into one Benefice, and come to be holden by the same Incumbent, from time to time as the same shall become vacant, shall belong to and be vested in the said Constance Caroline Halliday, and her successors in title, and the said Mary Caroline, Countess of Lovelace, and her successors in title, alternately, and that the first right of presentation to the said United Benefice shall belong to and be vested in the said Constance Caroline Halliday, and her successors in title.

"RANDALL, CANTUAR."

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the Rectory of Oare, situate in the County of Somerset, and Diocese of Bath and Wells, and the Rectory of Culbone, situate in the same County and Diocese, shall be united into one Benefice, with Cure of Souls, for ecclesiastical purposes only.

And His Majesty in Council, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased to direct that the course and succession in which the respective Patrons for the time being shall present or nominate to the said Benefices, after the same shall be united into one Benefice, and

come to be holden by the same Incumbent, from time to time as the same shall become vacant, shall be as follows, that is to say:—the right of presentation shall belong to and be vested in the said Constance Caroline Halliday, and her successors in title, and the said Mary Caroline, Countess of Lovelace, and her successors in title, alternately—the first right of presentation to the said United Benefice being vested in the said Constance Caroline Halliday, and her successors in title.

His Majesty The KING has been pleased to award the Edward Medal to John Garner under the following circumstances:—

On the 29th April, 1918, one of a battery of seven boilers in the boiler-house of the factory of the British Thomson-Houston Co., Ltd., at Rugby, exploded. Garner, a stoker,

at once entered the house, which was filled with steam and boiling water and in a serious condition, in the hope of rescuing any person who might be injured. Large masses of masonry were threatening to fall, and either of the remaining two boilers under steam was likely to explode at any time. The only light available was a hand lamp carried by Garner. After searching some five minutes, Garner discovered an injured man lodged on a projecting beam; but was unable to reach him. He stood by him, however, until the beam canted and the injured man fell to the ground without further hurt. No other persons were injured by the accident. Garner undoubtedly risked his life to save a fellow-workman.

Also the Edward Medal in silver to James Simpson, a fireman at the Glencraig Colliery, Fife:—

On the 21st May, 1918, a repairer, whilst engaged with two other workmen in carrying out repairs, was killed by a fall of roof. The two workmen were both caught and held by the fall. Simpson, who arrived half an hour later, found the men imprisoned and realised that if he went for help they would be suffocated before it could arrive. He immediately set to work unaided and worked for three hours without relaxation, though exposed to danger from the falling roof. At last he succeeded in releasing one of the men. Simpson was then so exhausted that he could not release the second man; but he protected him with timber before going for help. Had it not been for Simpson's presence of mind and devotion the two men would have lost their lives.

Also the Edward Medal to Charles Sellars, Deputy, and Laurence Wiseman, a collier, employed at the Grimethorpe Colliery, Barnsley:—

On the 20th April, 1918, a collier was buried by a fall of roof. Sellars was soon on the spot, and, after failing in an effort to get at the man by working under falling ground, he got on the top of the fall and worked along with Wiseman. After two hours and a half of persistent effort they succeeded in rescuing the workman. Both Sellars and Wiseman ran the risk of being injured by further falls.

Also the Edward Medal in silver to Frederick Holdway, a Deputy, and the Edward Medal to George Henry Laver, Under Manager, and Thomas Harper, Collier, all employed at the Ackton Hall Colliery, Featherstone:—

On the 6th May, 1918, three miners were working at the face in the Ackton Hall Colliery when a heavy fall of roof occurred, imprisoning one of the men. Holdway, who was soon on the spot, immediately began the work of rescue, and, with six others, including Harper and Laver, succeeded, after working hard for nearly 24 hours, in rescuing the imprisoned workman. The rescue was carried out with exceptional skill and determination under very dangerous conditions. Holdway specially distinguished himself and showed a fine example of courage and coolness. Harper and Laver were also specially mentioned for their resource and presence of mind.

Also the Edward Medal to John Johnson, Deputy at the Newdigate Colliery, Bedworth, Nuneaton:—

On the 29th July, 1915, a heavy fall of roof occurred at the Newdigate Colliery, by which a man named Pacey was buried. Johnson ran at once to the spot, where others were already at work, and, finding that the roof was still very uneasy, ordered props to be set. Leaving the men at work, he found his way to the other side of the fall, where the roof was also very uneasy. Estimating correctly, however, that it was from this side Pacey could most easily be reached, he decided to carry on the work, and himself started to set props. Almost immediately, however, a further heavy fall occurred, burying and severely injuring him. The roof then ceased to be uneasy, and Johnson and Pacey were rescued alive. Pacey unfortunately died in hospital. Johnson was in and out of hospital for nearly two years, and had to undergo many operations as a result of his injuries.

Also the Edward Medal to Edward Colwell and Frederick Lindley:—

On the 17th July, 1918, three men were ascending a steel chimney 175 feet high at Vickers' River Don Works, Sheffield, for the purpose of fixing a scaffold in order to paint the exterior chimney. They ascended by means of iron rungs permanently bolted to the chimney, at distances of 12 inches throughout its height, by rivets bolted through the exterior casing of the chimney. The men were about 10 feet apart. When the topmost had reached a height of about 100 feet, one of the rungs supporting the second man broke away and he fell, in his fall breaking 10 other rungs beneath him and striking the third man, who, fortunately, managed to retain his hold and descend to the ground. The man who fell was killed instantaneously.

The topmost man was left on the upper part of the ladder, 100 feet from the ground, with a gap of 10 feet below him preventing his descent. Although it was likely that many of the rungs below him were defective, Colwell and Lindley at once volunteered to rescue him. They ascended the rungs bearing the weight of a long wooden ladder with lifting and lashing tackle. In the course of the ascent they discovered another defective rung, which they easily wrenched out and threw to the ground. They nevertheless proceeded and lashed the wooden ladder against the chimney and across the gap, thus enabling the man, who was cut off by the gap, to descend to the ground.

The KING has been pleased to award the Albert Medal to Lieutenant-Colonel (Temporary Brigadier-General) Alfred Burt, D.S.O., and Sergeant Victor Brooks, Canadian Cavalry Field Ambulance; and (*posthumous awards*) to Private Arthur Johnson and Driver Alfred Horn, late of the Army Service Corps, in recognition of their gallantry in saving or endeavouring to save life in France in June last. The circumstances are as follows:—

On the 30th June, 1918, a Corporal of the Royal Air Force, who had been lowered by

a rope into a crater caused by a bomb which had been dropped by a hostile aeroplane, was overcome by carbon monoxide gas, which had accumulated in large quantities in the crater. Endeavours were made to haul him out, but his head became caught, and Private Johnson volunteered to descend and re-adjust the rope, which he did successfully, and the Corporal was rescued, but Johnson was himself overcome. Driver Horn at once put on his respirator and lowered himself to the rescue, but was likewise overcome. Sergeant Brooks then volunteered to attempt to rescue both men, but was also overcome by the gas; fortunately he was hauled out.

At this stage Brigadier-General Burt refused to permit anyone else to descend, but did so himself, and succeeded in dragging one of the unconscious men some way towards the rope; he, however, became unconscious and had to be pulled out.

There can be no doubt that all knew the risk that they were running; and willingly incurred it in the hope of saving life.

#### BRITISH NATIONALITY AND STATUS OF ALIENS ACTS, 1914 AND 1918.

In the Matter of Arthur Hermann Eberlein.

Revocation of Certificate of Naturalization.

Whereas I am satisfied that Arthur Hermann Eberlein, to whom a Certificate of Naturalization, numbered A.5777, was granted on the 21st May, 1888, pursuant to the provisions of the Naturalization Act, 1870, has since the date of the grant of the Certificate been for a period not less than seven years ordinarily resident out of H.M. Dominions otherwise than as a representative of a British subject, firm or company carrying on business or an institution established in H.M. Dominions or in the service of the Crown, and has not maintained substantial connection with H.M. Dominions, and further that the continuance of the said Certificate is not conducive to the public good:

Now, therefore, by this Order made in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by Section seven of the British Nationality and Status of Aliens Act, 1914, I revoke the said Certificate, and I direct such revocation to have effect from the date hereof; and I further order the said Certificate to be given up and to be cancelled.

#### BRITISH NATIONALITY AND STATUS OF ALIENS ACTS, 1914 AND 1918.

In the Matter of Wolf Millner.

Revocation of Certificate of Naturalization.

Whereas I am satisfied that Wolf Millner, to whom a Certificate of Naturalization, numbered A.7431, was granted on the 15th March, 1893, pursuant to the provisions of the Naturalization Act, 1870, has since the date of the grant of the certificate been for a period not less than seven years ordinarily resident out of H.M. Dominions otherwise than as a representative

of a British subject, firm or company carrying on business or an institution established in H.M. Dominions or in the service of the Crown, and has not maintained substantial connection with H.M. Dominions, and further that the continuance of the said Certificate is not conducive to the public good:

Now, therefore, by this Order made in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by Section seven of the British Nationality and Status of Aliens Act, 1914, I revoke the said Certificate, and I direct such revocation to have effect from the date hereof, and I further order the said Certificate to be given up and to be cancelled.

ORDER BY THE BOARD OF TRADE, DATED THE 31ST OCTOBER, 1918, AS TO RATES, DUES AND CHARGES OF THE PORT OF LONDON AUTHORITY.

Whereas by Regulation 39BB of the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, it is provided that if in the case of any harbour or dock undertaking carried on under statutory authority it appears to the Board of Trade that it is necessary for the successful prosecution of the war that the undertaking should be carried on in an efficient manner, but that owing to circumstances arising out of the war it cannot be so carried on without charging rates, dues or charges in excess of those which the undertakers are authorised by statute to charge, the Board may by Order authorise the undertakers to charge such rates, dues or charges in excess of the statutory maxima as the Board think necessary in the circumstances, subject to such conditions as may be specified in the Order.

And whereas it appears to the Board of Trade that it is necessary for the successful prosecution of the war that the undertaking of the Port of London Authority should be carried on in an efficient manner, but that owing to circumstances arising out of the war the undertaking cannot be so carried on unless the dock rates, dues and charges on vessels and goods levied by the said Authority be increased to an amount not exceeding seventy per cent. above the corresponding rate, due or charge in operation before the twenty-third day of April, 1917, in any case except on grain and certain other commodities in respect of which it is necessary that the rates, dues or charges should be increased to an amount not exceeding eighty-five per cent. above the corresponding rate, due or charge in operation before the said date.

And whereas such increased rates, dues and charges would be in some cases in excess of the rates, dues and charges which the said Authority are authorised by statute to charge.

Now, therefore, the Board of Trade in the exercise of the powers conferred upon them by the said Regulation by this Order do hereby authorise the Port of London Authority to charge increased dock rates, dues and charges on vessels and goods in excess of the statutory

maxima, provided that the rates, dues and charges to be charged under the authority of this Order shall not in the case of vessels or of goods other than those hereinafter mentioned exceed by more than seventy per centum or, in the case of grain, seed, flour, oil cake, and other agricultural feeding stuffs, haricot and butter beans, peas and lentils, rice and rice meal, rolled oats, canary seed, flaked maize and flaked rice, agricultural seed, starch flours, bran, pearl barley and hominy, eighty-five per centum, the rates, dues and charges for the like services in operation before the 23rd day of April, 1917.

The Orders made by the Board of Trade with regard to the rates, dues and charges to be levied by the said Authority, dated the 23rd day of April, 1917, the 15th day of August, 1917, the 21st day of December, 1917, and the 18th day of May, 1918, are hereby revoked without prejudice to any matter or thing done or suffered, or any due, rate or charge levied, paid or to be paid thereunder or to any proceeding instituted thereunder.

THE PETROLEUM PRODUCTS (WHOLESALE PRICES) No. 3 ORDER, DATED THE 5TH DAY OF NOVEMBER, 1918, MADE BY THE BOARD OF TRADE UNDER REGULATIONS 2F AND 2JJ OF THE DEFENCE OF THE REALM REGULATIONS.

The Board of Trade, deeming it expedient to make further exercise of the powers conferred upon them by Regulations 2F and 2JJ of the Defence of the Realm Regulations as respects Petroleum Products, hereby order as follows:—

1. The Schedule to the Petroleum Products (Wholesale Prices) No. 2 Order, 1918 (S.R.O., 1918, No. 923), is hereby amended by substituting the sum of 3½d. per gallon for the sum of 2½d. per gallon as the additional charge that may be made for the delivery of both Gas Oil and Fuel Oil in barrels ex wharf.

2. This Order may be cited as The Petroleum Products (Wholesale Prices) No. 3 Order, 1918.

THE ROAD TRANSPORT (No. 3) ORDER, 1918, DATED 7TH NOVEMBER, 1918, MADE BY THE BOARD OF TRADE UNDER REGULATION 2-JJJ OF THE DEFENCE OF THE REALM REGULATIONS.

In pursuance of the powers vested in them by Regulation 2 JJJ of the Defence of the Realm Regulations the Board of Trade hereby order as follows:—

1. Paragraphs 1, 2 and 3 of the Road Transport Order, 1918, may by notice be applied within any particular area specified in such notice to horse-drawn vehicles having a load capacity of less than 15 cwt. either as regards all such vehicles or as regards such vehicles used by any particular class of trader.

2. A notice under this Order shall be given by the Road Transport Board and shall specify the date by which and the form in which and the person to whom returns relating to the vehicles to which such notice applies are to be made.

3. From and after such day as may be specified in such notice no person shall use any vehicle to which notice applies for the transport of goods by road except under and in accordance with the terms of a permit granted by the Road Transport Board on behalf of the Board of Trade.

4. A notice under this Order shall be advertised in such manner as the Road Transport Board may determine, and by further notice given by the said Board may be cancelled or suspended in whole or in part.

5. This Order shall, so far as may be necessary, be read and construed together with the Road Transport Order, 1918.

6. The Order may be cited as the Road Transport (No. 3) Order, 1918.

In cases where a maker of sulphuric acid has, in order to supply his customers, to purchase supplies of acid from a third party, it will be permissible for him, in so far as this is a departure from his normal procedure, to charge to his customers any extra cost of carriage thereby incurred.

#### ARMY COUNCIL ORDER.

#### THE QUININE (DEALINGS) ORDER, 1918.

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by the Defence of the Realm Regulations, the Army Council hereby order as follows:—

1. No person shall purchase or sell or make or take delivery of or payment for any Sulphate of Quinine at prices exceeding those indicated in the Schedule hereto annexed, or such other prices as in any particular case may be determined by or on behalf of the Director of Army Contracts.

2. No person shall, without a permit issued by or on behalf of the Director of Army Contracts, sell or purchase any Sulphate of Quinine in quantities exceeding 1,000 ozs.

3. All persons having in their possession, custody or control any stocks of Quinine or Quinine Salts exceeding 25 ozs., shall furnish such particulars as may be required by or on behalf of the Director of Army Contracts.

4. This Order may be cited as the Quinine (Dealings) Order, 1918.

#### AGRICULTURAL WAGES BOARD (ENGLAND AND WALES).

#### PROPOSAL TO FIX MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR MALE WORKERS UNDER THE AGE OF 18 YEARS IN MERIONETH AND MONTGOMERY.

The Agricultural Wages Board (England and Wales), duly established and constituted under Section 5 (1) of the above Act and the Regulations made by the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries dated the 8th November, 1917, having had regard to the provisions of sub-sections (6) and (7) of the said Section, hereby give Notice, as required by Section 5 (4) of the above Act, and by paragraph 4 of the Agricultural Wages Regulations, 1918, that they propose to fix the following minimum rates of wages and the following differential rates for overtime employment, as hereinafter defined, for male workmen under the age of 18 years employed in agriculture for time-work in the area comprising the administrative counties of Merioneth and Montgomery, and to define for the purpose of the application of such differential rates for overtime the employment which is to be treated as overtime employment as follows, that is to say :—

1. The wages payable for employment of any male workman under the age of 18 who is wholly or partially boarded and lodged by his employer and whose duties include attending to horses or other stock, for a week consisting of the hours of employment, whether on weekdays or on Sunday customary in the above area in the case of workmen under the said age and so employed shall be not less than wages at the following minimum rates, that is to say :

(1) For workmen of 17 and under 18 years of age, 30s. per week.

(2) For workmen of 16 and under 17 years of age, 25s. per week.

(3) For workmen of 15 and under 16 years of age, 23s. per week.

(4) For workmen of 14 and under 15 years of age, 19s. per week.

(5) For workmen under 14 years of age, 15s. per week.

2. The wages payable for employment of all other male workmen in agriculture under the age of 18 shall be not less than wages at the following minimum rates, that is to say :—

(a) In respect of employment in summer (as hereinafter defined) :—

(1) For workmen of 17 and under 18 years of age, 25s. for 54 hours.

(2) For workmen of 16 and under 17 years of age, 20s. for 54 hours.

(3) For workmen of 15 and under 16 years of age, 18s. for 54 hours.

(4) For workmen of 14 and under 15 years of age, 14s. for 54 hours.

(5) For workmen under 14 years of age, 10s. for 54 hours.

(b) In respect of employment in winter (as hereinafter defined):—

(1) For workmen of 17 and under 18 years of age, 25s. for 48 hours.

(2) For workmen of 16 and under 17 years of age, 20s. for 48 hours.

(3) For workmen of 15 and under 16 years of age, 18s. for 48 hours.

(4) For workmen of 14 and under 15 years of age, 14s. for 48 hours.

(5) For workmen under 14 years of age, 10s. for 48 hours.

3. Provided that where a whole-time workman (other than a workman to whom Clause 1 of this Notice applies) is employed by the week or any longer period, the wages payable to him for the hours of work agreed between him and the employer in any week (excluding hours of overtime employment) shall not be less than the respective amounts set out in Clause 2 (a) and (b) above, notwithstanding that those hours are less than 54 in summer or 48 in winter.

4. The differential rates for overtime employment shall be as follows, that is to say:—

(a) In respect of overtime employment on weekdays:—

(1) For workmen of 17 and under 18 years of age, 7d. per hour.

(2) For workmen of 16 and under 17 years of age, 5½d. per hour.

(3) For workmen of 15 and under 16 years of age, 5d. per hour.

(4) For workmen of 14 and under 15 years of age, 4d. per hour.

(5) For workmen under 14 years of age, 3d. per hour.

(b) In respect of overtime employment on a Sunday:—

(1) For workmen of 17 and under 18 years of age, 8½d. per hour.

(2) For workmen of 16 and under 17 years of age, 6½d. per hour.

(3) For workmen of 15 and under 16 years of age, 6d. per hour.

(4) For workmen of 14 and under 15 years of age, 4½d. per hour.

(5) For workmen under 14 years of age, 3½d. per hour.

5. For the purpose of the above rates the following employment is defined as overtime employment, that is to say:—

(a) In respect of a workman to whom Clause 1 of this Notice applies, all employment in excess of the customary hours of employment referred to in that Clause.

(b) In respect of other workmen:—

(1) All employment in excess of 54 hours in any week (excluding Sunday) in summer.

(2) All employment in excess of 48 hours in any week (excluding Sunday) in winter.

(3) All employment on a Sunday.

6. For the purpose of the above rates employment in summer shall be deemed to be employment during the period commencing on the first Monday in March and terminating on the last Sunday in October; and employment in winter shall be deemed to be employment during the rest of the year.

7. 8. For the purpose of the above rates the hours of work shall not include meal times; but shall include any time during which by reason of weather conditions an employer has prevented from working a workman who was present at the place of employment and ready to work.
