In the Matter of HOLLIDAY & GREENWOOD Limited and Reduced, and in the Matter of the Companies (Consolidation) Act, 1908.

NOTICE is hereby given, that an Order of the above named Court, dated the 17th day of December, 1918, confirming the reduction of the capital of the above named Company from £60,000 to £42,000, and the Minute approved by the Court, showing with respect to the capital of the Company, as altered, the several particulars required by the above Statutes, was registered by the Registrar of Companies on the 9th day of January, 1919.
