Parliament for the said Borough at the end of six days after the insertion of this Notice in the London Gazette.

In the Matter of Isaac Barrett.

Revocation of Certificate of Naturalization.

Whereas I am satisfied, as the result of an inquiry conducted by the Certificates of Naturalization (Revocation) Committee, that Isaac Barrett, to whom a certificate of naturalization, numbered 1930, was granted on the 29th May, 1916, has shown himself by act and speech to be disaffected and disloyal to His Majesty.

Now, therefore, by this Order, made in pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by Section 7 of the British Nationality and Status of Aliens Act, 1914, I revoke the said certificate, and I direct such revocation to have effect from the date hereof, and I further order the said certificate to be cancelled.

And I further direct that Annie Barrett, the wife, and Rene, Sadie, Joseph and Thelma, the children of the said Isaac Barrett, shall cease to be British subjects.

HAMPSHIRE (FOOT - AND - MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1920.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

Movement into, out of, or within Scheduled District.

1.—(1.) No cattle, sheep, goats or swine shall be landed in or moved into or out of the District described in the Schedule to this Order, hereinafter referred to as the Scheduled District, or be moved along, over, or across, or be allowed by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray upon a highway or thoroughfare within the Scheduled District; provided that nothing in this Order shall be deemed to apply to the movement of animals into or out of the Scheduled District where they are moved through such District by railway from a place outside such District to another place outside such District, without unnecessary delay, and without the animals being untrucked within such District except for the purposes of feeding or watering the animals within the railway station premises where such untrucking takes place.

(2.) If any farm (except any detached part) is partly within and partly without the Scheduled District, the whole shall be deemed

to be within the Scheduled District.

Power to Restrict Movement of Persons in Certain Cases.

- 2.—(1.) An Inspector of the Local Authority acting under their direction may serve a Notice on the occupier of any field, shed, or other place in the Scheduled District, prohibiting the entry of any person into any such field, shed, or other place, and thereupon, notwithstanding the existence of any footpath or right-of-way, no person shall enter the field, shed, or other place to which the Notice relates while any cattle, sheep, goats or swine are therein, otherwise than in accordance with the following regulations, that is to say;
 - (i) The owner of the field, shed, or other place, or of the animals therein, or the agent or servants of such owner, may enter such field, shed, or other place so far as may be necessary for the feeding or tending of the animals:
 - (ii) Any other person may enter such field, shed, or other place with a licence of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries.
- (2.) Copies of such Notice shall be affixed or exhibited by the Inspector in such manner as he shall think desirable for ensuring notification of the restrictions thereby imposed.
- (3.) A copy of every such Notice shall forthwith be sent by the Inspector to the Board of

Agriculture and Fisheries, Whitehall Place, London, S.W.

Power to restrict Movement of Dogs and Poultry in Certain Cases.

- 3.—(1.) An Inspector of the Board, or of the Local Authority acting under their direction, may, for the purpose of preventing the spread of Foot-and-Mouth Disease, by a Notice served on the occupier of any premises in the Scheduled District, require him:—
 - (a) to keep in confinement, or under control, as may be prescribed by the Notice, dogs on such premises;

or (b) to confine live poultry on such premises in a pen or other like enclosure;

or (c) to prevent the access of live poultry to any specific part of the premises to which cattle, sheep, goats, or swine have, or recently have had, access;

and if any occupier after service of any such Notice shall fail to comply with the requirements thereof, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894

(2.) An Inspector of the Board, or of the Local Authority acting under their direction, may, for the purpose of preventing the spread of Foot-and-Mouth Disease, by Notice affixed or exhibited by the Inspector in such manner as he shall think desirable for ensuring notification of the restrictions thereby imposed, require dogs to be kept by the person in charge thereof under control while passing along any road or footpath specified in such Notice, and if any person in charge of a dog while passing along any road or footpath to which any such Notice relates fails to keep the dog under control, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(3.) Every Notice served on an occupier of premises shall remain in operation until it is withdrawn by a further Notice served by an Inspector of the Board or of the Local

Authority.

(4.) A copy of every Notice served by an Inspector of the Local Authority under this Article shall forthwith be sent by the Inspector to the Secretary, Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, Whitehall Place, London, S.W.

Local Authority to Enforce Order.

4. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

5.—(1.) If an animal is landed in contravention of this Order, the owner, and the charterer and the master of the vessel from which it is landed, and the owner of the animal and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing or permitting the landing, and the person landing the same, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been landed in contravention as aforesaid, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(2.) If an animal is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the animal and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the animal, and the consignee or other

person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the animal is moved shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(3.) If any person enters any field, shed, or other place in contravention of this Order, or of a Notice served thereunder, such person shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

The Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

Modification of Order.

7. 1. The East Kent (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Worder of 1919, hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order," is modified in the manner hereinafter contained.

Continued Prohibition of Movement in certain Prohibited Area.

Where an Inspector of the Local Authority considers it necessary or expedient that an animal in his district should be pernitted to be moved from premises in the scheduled District not situate in the Prolibited Area to any other premises in the Scheduled District not situate in the Prolibited Area, he may authorize such movement by a Movement Licence.

Provisions as to Movement Licences.

5.—(1) Where the movement authorized by Movement Licence granted under this Order movement to a slaughterhouse from premises other than a railway station or landing place, in animal shall not be moved with the Licence nless before the movement is commenced it is

marked by and at the expense of the owner in manner following:—

Cattle.—By the clipping of a broad arrow, about six inches long, on the left hindquarter of each of the cattle, and by the clipping of the hair off the end of the tail.

Sheep.—By the clipping of a broad arrow on the forehead of each of the sheep; and also by the painting or stamping of the letter M, about six inches long, on both sides of each of the sheep with the following composition, namely: Rosin, five parts; oil of turpentine, two parts; and blue or red ochre, one part; melted and used warm; or with some other adhesive composition of a blue or red colour.

Swine.—By the painting or stamping of the letter M, about six inches long, on both sides of each of the swine with the composition above mentioned.

(2) A' Movement Licence under this Order shall not be granted by an Inspector of a Local Authority unless he is satisfied that the proposed movement will not involve movement on a road in a Prohibited Area.

(3) Where the movement authorized by a Movement Licence is movement as often as occasion may require, either between different parts of the same farm or between different farms, the Licence shall be marked with the words "Occupation Licence," and shall be in force until it is revoked by an Inspector of the Local Authority, or of the Ministry by a Notice served on the occupier of the farm on which the animals then are.

(4) Every Licence shall specify the name and address of the person to whom the Licence is granted, the number and description of the animals authorized to be moved, and the name or description of the several premises to and from which the animals are authorised to be moved.

(5) Where animals are moved with a Licence under this Order, unless the Licence is an Occupation Licence, the Licence shall forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered up to an officer of the Local Authority or be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station in the same District by the person in charge of the animals at the time of completing the movement.

(6) A Movement Licence granted under this Order, except where it is otherwise expressly authorized by this Order, shall be in force for four days, inclusive of the day of issue, and shall be in the form set forth in the Second Schedule to this Order or to the like effect.

(7) A Movement Licence granted under this Order shall not be available if granted by the owner of the animal to be moved, or by his agent, or by the consignee of the animal, or by the occupier of the farm or premises or slaughterhouse from or to which the animal is to be moved, or by any individual member of an Executive Committee or Sub-Committee of a Local Authority.

(8) A copy of a Licence which authorizes movement to premises in a District other than the District for which the person granting the Licence acts as Inspector shall forthwith be sent by the Inspector to the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination is situate.

Movement through the Prohibited Area by Rail.

6. Nothing in this Order shall be deemed to apply to the movement of animals into or out

of the Prohibited Area where they are moved through the Prohibited Area by railway from a place outside such area to another place outside such area without unnecessary delay and without the animals being untrucked within such area except for the purposes of feeding or watering the animals within the railway station premises where such untrucking takes place.

General Provisions as to Movement.

7. Animals while being moved under this Order shall, so far as is practicable, be kept separate from all animals which are not being so moved, and shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay to the place of destination specified in the Licence, and where the place of destination is a slaughterhouse they shall be there detained until they are slaughtered.

(i) movement of an animal which is affected with foot-and-mouth disease, which has during the preceding twenty-eight days been in any way exposed to the infection of such disease; or

(iii) movement of an animal the movement of which is prohibited by notice of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Ministry given under any Order of the Ministry.

Saving for Orders and Regulations.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

Holding of Markets and Sales in the Scheduled District (except in the Prohibited Area).

-(1) A market or sale of animals may be held on any premises in the Scheduled District except in the Prohibited Area if the Local Authority are satisfied that the market or sale will be restricted to animals intended for immediate slaughter, and the market or sale is authorized by the Local Authority under this Article.

(2) The Local Authority shall cause a Veterinary Inspector to attend at every market or sale authorized under this Article and

examine the animals exposed thereat. (3) An animal exposed at a market or sale, authorized under this Article shall not be moved therefrom unless before such movement it is marked, by and at the expense of the owner, in the manner described in Article 5 c, this Order.

Offences.

WIRELESS DIRECTION FINDING STAITTONS.

Former Notice.-No. 1988 of 1919.

1. Wireless direction finding (D.F.) stations are stations set up ashore equipped with receiving apparatus which enables them to ascertain the direction from which wireless signals transmitted by another station emanate.

2. The accuracy with which bearings can be taken depends on the conditions outlined below; but, although in general the bearings taken by a station within the sector over which it is designed to work can generally be considered accurate to within two degrees, the administrations controlling these stations cannot accept any responsibility for the consequences of a bearing being inaccurate.

3. It is, however, pointed out that if at least three D.F. stations can be employed and if they are so situated as to give intersecting bearings, considerable reliance can be placed upon the result of 3 simultaneous bearings thus obtained, provided that the "triangle of error" (sometimes called the "cocked hat") formed by the intersection of the bearings is small.

4. In order to obtain the greatest possible degree of accuracy, it is important that the ship should not transmit with too much power. Signals should, however, be fairly strong and clear; great care must be taken to keep the note and strength steady, and to pay strict attention to spacing.

5. It must be borne in mind that it is impossible for the majority of existing D.F. stations to distinguish between a bearing and its reciprocal (i.e., there is always a possible error of 180°), and that bearings are often unreliable at night and in very bad weather, also when the direction runs roughly parallel with the coast line.

6. The methods of asking for and giving bearings and the waves to be used will shortly be standardised by International agreement; and the particulars of the D.F. stations will eventually appear in the International list of Radiotelegraph stations. Meanwhile, each country is publishing regulations governing the use of its own D.F. stations as set out below.

7. It should be noted that there are two principal systems of D.F. stations at present in use, viz.:

(a) Where each D.F. station is fitted with transmitting and receiving gear and works independently of others.

(b) Where several D.F. stations (all of them usually near a harbour entrance or difficult passage) are linked together by special land telegraph lines, being thus controlled by one station which alone is fitted with transmitting apparatus. The controlling station in such cases is not necessarily a D.F. station, but may be an ordinary coast station.

- 9. These stations keep watch and take bearings on the 600-metre wave.
- 10. A ship requiring a bearing should call the D.F. station required, and transmit a government message requesting the bearing. O

Example: —A ship S.S. "Nonsuch," call sign XYZ, calls up Chebucto Head in the ordinary way and, on receiving "K" (go on), makes the message as follows:

- "Call" S Radio Nonsuch 1, 5, 10 (day of month) 10.50 M (time) = Officer in charge Chebucto Head = Request bearing = Master +
- 11. The D.F. station will then acknowledge receipt of the message and, if not ready to take the bearing at once, will direct the ship to wait.
- 12. When ready to take the bearing, the D.F. station will make "K" (go on), whereupon the ship will make the figure "2" 30 times, commencing with the "Call" and ending with the "Cross" and her own call signal.
- 13. If the D.F. station is not satisfied with the bearing, it will make the "repeat" sign (?) and the ship will again make the figure "2" as above, but only 20 times.
- In default of such request for a repetition, the D.F. station does not transmit until it is ready to give the bearing. To do so, the station calls the ship and sends (as a government message) the TRUE bearing of the ship from the station in degrees from 0° to 359°, the angles being measured from true north (0°) clockwise through true east (90°), true south (180°), and true west (270°).

- The ship calls up the station or stations required and requests her bearing or position by means of the abbreviations shown below. Meaning.

- 20. The station will, if necessary, direct the ship to wait and, when ready for taking the bearing, will make "K" (go on).
 - 21. The ship will then transmit:-
 - (i.) Her own call signal repeated for 30
 - (ii.) A "dash" 5 seconds long.
 - (iii.) Her own call signal thrice.
 - (iv.) A "dash" 5 seconds long.
 - (v.) Her own call signal thrice, then a "dash," and so on for one complete minute (i.e., for 1½ minutes in all), finishing with "K" (go on).
- 22. The station then calls the ship, and makes "QTE" followed by the true bearing in degrees (0° to 359°) as in para. 14, and the name of the D.F. station which obtained the bearing, or else "QTF" and the position in

latitude and longitude. All numbers will be spelt out in words.

- 23. The ship acknowledges receipt by repeating back, in figures, the bearing or bearings or the position as the case may be.
- 24. When working with independent stations ships should always ask for bearings. Controlling stations may be requested to give bearings or positions as the master may elect.
- 25. In order that the operation of shore D.F. stations may be checked up, a record of the actual position of the ship at the time wireless bearings are obtained will be of great assistance to the U.S. Hydrographic Office, and if the ship's officers can determine fairly accurately, by back reckoning or otherwise, such position, a brief report should be forwarded to the Director Naval Communications, Navy Department, Washington, D.C., containing:—
 - (a) Name of ship.
 - (b) Name of D.F. station.
 - (c) Date and G.M.T. at which wireless bearing was given.
 - (d) Bearing given by D.F. station.
 - (e) Estimated position of ship at above time and date by methods other than wireless.
 - (f) The probable degree of accuracy of the estimated position.
 - (g) Weather conditions at above time.
 - (h) Remarks, if any.
 - (i) Signature of master or responsible navigating officer.

- 27. All the above D.F. stations keep watch and take bearings on the 450 metres wave (see note). Except as shown in the notes they all work as independent stations and can transmit, as well as receive, on 450 metres.

Note.—Ships with Marconi apparatus can adjust their transmitting gear very nearly to this wave (using reduced power) by cutting out half the primary transmitting condenser and adjusting the A.T.I. till the earth lamp shows maximum current in the aerial. The primary slider should be "all in."

28. The actual procedure to be adopted by ships requiring bearings will depend upon what stations are concerned. It should be observed that if the stations to be called do not all keep watch on the same wave (e.g., Malin Head and Larne), bearings should be asked for separately. If on the other hand the stations to be called all keep watch on the same wave (e.g.,Lizard and Carnsore), they should be called up together and the bearings taken in one opera-If, however, two or more stations are linked by special land lines (e.g., Amlwch and Rhyl), only one of them should be called up In such cases, however, the ship must specify in the preliminary signal the D.F. stations which are required to supply bearings.

29. The following abbreviations are to be used:—

Signal.

Meaning.

QTE ? ... "What is my true bearing from you (or from ——)?",

QTE ... "Your true bearing from me (or from ——) was —— degrees."

30. The ship calls the station or stations on the appropriate wave, making "QTE?" in conjunction, if necessary, with the call signals of the stations from which bearings are required and also (if the call is nor made on 450 metres) by the figures "450," signifying that the ship will shift to 450 metres for the taking of the bearing. The ship then awaits instructions.

Example 1.

Al ship whose call signal is XYZ requires bearings from Amlweh (BXV) and Rhyl (BZW).

The ship, having first shifted to 450 metres, calls Amlwch thus:—

"Call" BXV BXV de XYZ QTE BXV BZW?

She then awaits instructions.

Example 2.

The ship requires a bearing from Seaview (BXK). The ship has to use 600 metres to call Malin Head (GMH).

She calls on 600 metres, thus:—

"Call" GMH GMH de XYZ QTE BXK! 450

She then gets ready to shift to 450 metres and awaits instructions.

31. The station or stations called then make the necessary arrangements and, when ready, answer in alphabetical order of their call signals (if more than one was originally called) and make "K:" (go on) preceded by "450" if 450 had been made in the original call.

Example 1.

Amlwch, in Example 1 above, warns Rhyl by land line and, when both are ready, makes on 450 metres:—

"|Cail "XYZ de BXV K

Example 2.

Malin Head, in Example 2 above, warns

Seaview by land line and then makes on 600

"Call" XYZ de GMH 450 K

Malin Head then shifts to 450 metres so as to be ready to give the result when received by wire from Seaview.

32. On receiving "K," the ship, having shifted transmitting wave to 450 metres (if not already done), then makes her own call signal for 45 seconds and awaits the result.

Example 1.

The ship, in Example 1 above, makes on

"Call" BXV de XYZ XYZ XYZ, &c. (for 45 seconds) XYZ

Example 2.

The same as Example 1, reading GMH for BXV.

33. The station or stations then reply (in alphabetical order if more than one) either asking the ship to repeat (?) or giving the result. The result is given by the signal QTE followed as necessary by the call signal and by a group of three figures (000 to 359) indicating the true bearing from 0° to 359°, reckoned as in para-graph 14, of the ship from the station. Several bearings can be combined into one message each bearing immediately following the call signal of the station which took it. The time signal of the station which took it. of handing in is always expressed in Greenwich mean time for all messages giving bearings to merchant ships.

Example 1.

Rhyl, in Example 1 above, is not satisfied with the bearing and informs Amlwch. Amlwch makes on 450 metres:-

"Call" XYZ de BXV?

The ship at once complies by making on 450 netres:-

"Call" BXV de XYZ XYZ XYZ, &c. (for 45 seconds) XYZ

Rhyl is then satisfied that the bearing is 340° and informs Amlwch, while Amlwch finds that its own result is 37°. Amlweh therefore makes 450 metres:

"Call" XYZ XYZ de BXV 1 9.45 M (time) = QTE BZW 340 BXV 037 + BXV

Example 2.

Seaview, in Example 2 above, gets a satisfactory bearing of 329° and informs Malin Head. The latter makes on 450 metres:—

"Call" XYZ XYZ de GMH 2 10.46 S (time) = QTEBXK329 + GMH

Example 3.

Had the ship merely asked Lizard (BVY) for a bearing, Lizard, finding it to be 246°, would make on 450 metres:

"Call" XYZ XYZ de BVY 1 7.6 M (time) = QTE 246 + BVY

34. The ship, on receiving the result, acknowledges receipt in the ordinary way, and makes the "end of work" sign. This sign is then repeated by the station or stations concerned. It is important that the end of work "sign should not be omitted, since it not only indicates that the operation is finished, but it also shows that all concerned are about to resume watch on their normal wave.
