## BRITISH NATIONALITY AND STATUS OF ALIENS ACTS, 1914 AND 1918.

In the Matter of Isaac Barrett.

Revocation of Certificate of Naturalization.

Whereas I am satisfied, as the result of an inquiry conducted by the Certificates of Naturalization (Revocation) Committee, that Isaac Barrett, to whom a certificate of naturalization, numbered 1930, was granted on the 29th May, 1916, has shown himself by act and speech to be disaffected and disloyal to His Majesty.

Now, therefore, by this Order, made in pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by Section 7 of the British Nationality and Status of Aliens Act, 1914, I revoke the said certificate, and I direct such revocation to have effect from the date hereof, and I further order the said certificate to be cancelled.

And I further direct that Annie Barrett, the wife, and Rene, Sadie, Joseph and Thelma, the children of the said Isaac Barrett, shall cease to be British subjects.
