The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council

HEREAS by the Representation of the People Act, 1918 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), as amended by the Representation of the People (Amendment) Act, 1918, power is conferred on His Majesty to make provision for various matters by Order in Council:

And whereas by the Representation of the People Order, His Majesty was pleased by Order in Council to make provision for various matters under the Act:

And whereas by Section 40 (2) of the Act any Order in Council made thereunder may be revoked or varied as occasion requires by any subsequent Order in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon Him by the Act, and of all other powers enabling Him in that behalf, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

The Representation of the People Order shall be amended as follows:—

1. The following Rule shall be substituted for Rule 34c:—

"34c. The following Sub-section shall be added at the end of Rule, 44 of the Act

(which provides for the application of the rules under the Act to Ireland):—

"(10) An objection under Rule 12 shall not be entertained unless, within the time limited for sending the notice of objection, a copy of the notice of objection sent to the registration officer is sent by the person objecting to the person in respect of whose registration the notice of objection is given. A copy of the notice may be sent by prepaid and registered post to the address of the person objected to as appearing on the lists or to his last known place of abode.

"Rule 13 shall not apply."

2. The following provisions shall be substituted for Part VI.:—

"PART VI.

Temporary Provisions. (See Act. ss. 13 (2), 23, and 46)

Official Telegraphic Information of Issue of

"38. Official telegraphic information of the writ having been issued for a parliamentary election shall be given by the Clerk of the Crown in Chancery, and may be given in the case of any election taking place during the continuance of the present war, to the returning officers for the constituencies specified in Schedule IX. to this Order.

"In the application of this rule to Ireland the Clerk of the Crown and Hanaper shall be substituted for the Clerk of the Crown in Chancery.

Registration Dates for Registers in Great Britain.

- "39. As respects constituencies in Great Britain—
 - "(a) the Third Register prepared under the Act shall remain in force unless otherwise ordered until the 15th day of May, 1920, and shall be kept published until the coming into force of the next succeeding register;
 - "(b) the Spring Register for 1920 shall remain in force unless otherwise ordered until the 15th day of October, 1920, and shall be kept published until the coming into force of the next succeeding register;
 - "(c) the Autumn Register for 1920 shall come into force on the 15th day of October, 1920, and shall remain in force unless otherwise ordered until the 15th day of April, 1921, and in connection with that register the registration dates shall be the dates specified in the third column of Part I of Schedule X. to this Order.

Registration Dates for Registers in Ireland.

- "40. As respects constituencies in Ireland-
- "(a) the Second Register prepared under the Act shall remain in force unless otherwise ordered until the 15th day of October, 1920, and shall be kept published until the coming into force of the next succeeding register;
- "(b) the Third Register to be prepared under the Act shall come into force on the 15th day of October, 1920, and shall remain in force unless otherwise ordered until the 15th day of October, 1921, and in connection with that register the registration dates shall be the dates specified in the third column of Part I of Schedule XI to this Order.

Publication of Documents.

"41. The documents mentioned in Part II, of Schedule X to this Order shall for the purposes of the Autumn Register, 1920, be kept published until the dates specified in the second column of that Part of that Schedule; and the documents specified in Part II of Schedule, XI to this Order shall for the purposes of the third register for Ireland be kept published until the dates specified in the second column of that Part of that Schedule.

Time for Counting Votes.

- "42. The counting of the votes at any election which is held during the continuance of the present war, and a period of twelve months thereafter, shall, instead of taking place as soon as practicable after the close of the poll, take place on the eleventh day after the day of the poll, and shall commence at 10 o'clock in the morning:
- "Provided that as respects constituencies in Scotland, Ireland and Wales, and the Parliamentary counties of Devon and Cornwail, this rule shall have effect as though twelve (noon) were substituted for 10 o'clock in the morning.
- "In reckoning time for the purposes of this rule Sunday, Christmas Day, Good Friday, and any day set apart as a day of public fast or public thanksgiving, shall be excluded.
- "Nothing in this rule shall prevent the returning officer from opening the ballot boxes, taking out the papers therein and counting and recording the number thereof, in accordance with the provisions of rule 34 in Part I of the First Schedule to the Ballot Act, 1872, on the said eleventh day before 10 o'clock in the morning or twelve (noon) (as the case may be), provided that due notice is given to the agents of the candidates of his intention to do so, and of the time and place at which the opening of the ballot boxes will begin."
- 3. The following Schedules shall be substituted for Schedules X to XIII:—

The Governing Body of Shrewsbury School having, on the 9th day of March, 1920, in virtue of the powers conferred upon them by the Public Schools Act, 1868, and of every other power enabling them in that behalf, made a Scheme (which was sealed on the 21st day of April 1920) in the terms appended hereto for

further amending and altering the original Scheme (approved by Order in Council of the 12th day of February, 1876), for the removal of the said School from its former site:

The said Scheme has this day been laid before His Majesty in Council, and is hereby published in the London Gazette in accordance with the provisions in that behalf contained in the said Act. And notice is hereby given, that any person, body of persons, or body corporate, authorized in that behalf by the said Act, may, within two months after the publication of this notification, petition His Majesty in Council to withhold His approval from the whole or any part of the said Scheme.

SCHEME FOR FURTHER AMENDING AND ALTERING THE SCHEME APPROVED BY ORDER IN COUNCIL OF THE 12TH DAY OF FEBRUARY, 1876, FOR THE REMOVAL OF SHREWSBURY SCHOOL FROM ITS ACTUAL SITE.

Whereas by the Public Schools Act, 1868, 31 and 32 Vict., c. 118, it is inter alia enacted as follows:—

Section 25. Any Scheme authorized to be made under this Act may contain all powers and provisions that may be thought expedient for carrying into effect its objects; and where any scheme authorizes the purchase or acquisition of any lands there shall be deemed to be incorporated with such scheme "The Lands Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845," with the exception of the provisions relating to the purchase of lands otherwise than by agreement and of the provisions relating to entry upon land to intersected lands, and to the recovery of forfeitures, penalties, and costs, and of the provisions relating to access to the special Act.

Section 26. The new Governing Body of Shrewsbury School may, if they deem it expedient, at any time after the passing of this Act, lay a scheme before Her Majesty in Council for the removal of the school from its actual site to some other place, and may provide in such scheme for the sale or mortgage of any property belonging to or held in trust for such school and for its appropriation to building or other purposes with power to suspend any Scholarships or Exhibitions payable out of such property and for the purchase of other property and for the erection of new buildings on the property so purchased and generally for all matters (including the sale of any surplus property that may be purchased, and the investment of the money which may be produced by such sale) required to effect such removal in a convenient manner to the same extent as if such Governing Body were the absolute owners of any property they may be dealing with under this section as purchasers, vendors, or otherwise; and any such scheme shall be subject to the same provisions and if approved shall take effect and be subject to alteration in the same manner as Statutes made by a Governing Body, provided, firstly that any scheme made under this section before the expiration of the powers by this Act conferred on the Special Commissioners shall be approved of by them before being laid before Her Majesty in Council; secondly, that the power of making a scheme under this section shall not pass to the Special Commissioners or cease after the first of January, one thousand eight hundred and seventy, or such further time as may be determined by Her Majesty as hereinafter mentioned, but shall continue vested in the New Governing Body of the said school; thirdly, that the school shall not be removed to any site exceeding in distance three miles measured in a straight line from the market place in

And whereas divers other Acts of Parliament have since been passed, continuing and enlarging the powers conferred by the above mentioned Act; and, in particular, it was by the second section of the Public Schools Act, 1869, enacted that "Any Governing Body established for any of the schools to which the said Act (meaning the said Public Schools Act, 1868) applies shall, as in the case of Westminster School, be a body corporate, with perpetual succession and a common seal, and with power to hold lands for the purposes of the school for which it is established, without licence of mortmain."

And whereas the Governing Body of Shrewsbury School did on the twenty-first day of August, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five propose (by virtue and in pursuance of the powers above mentioned) a scheme for the removal of the said School in the terms following, that is to say:—

1. With a view to the removal of Shrewsbury School from its actual site the Governing Body may purchase the messuages, buildings, and several pieces of land situate at Kingsland, near Shrewsbury, and more particularly described in the schedule hereto (that is to say, in the Schedule to the Scheme now being recited), and delineated upon the map or plan thereof annexed hereto (that is to say, to the Scheme now being recited), and thereon coloured pink, which messuages and land are delineated on the plan annexed hereto, and thereon coloured pink.

2. The Governing Body may appropriate the said pieces of land or such part thereof as they may deem necessary for the use of the school, and may either alter and adapt to the purposes of the school any of the existing buildings on the said pieces of land or may pull down the existing buildings thereon, or any of them, and erect such new buildings thereon as they may deem requisite for the use of the school (including residences for the Masters), and may lay out any further part of the said land as a playground for the Scholars, or gardens for the Masters, or any like purposes.

3. With a view to the erection of residences for the Assistant Masters, and of Boarding Houses, the Governing Body may grant building leases of any part or parts of the said pieces of land, subject to the following restrictions (that is to say):—

(I.). No such lease shall be for any longer term than 99 years, to take effect in possession, or within 6 calendar months after the making of the demise

making of the demise.

(II.). The rents to be reserved shall be the best yearly rents that can reasonably be obtained without the payment of any fine or premium, but a peppercorn rent, or any rent less than the rent ultimately made payable, may be made during the first two years of the term.

(III.). The lessee shall covenant to erect on the land demised within a reasonable time, not exceeding two years after the date of the lease, a suitable residence for an Assistant Master, with proper offices and outbuildings, either with or without accommodation for boarders as the case may be.

(IV.). Every such lease shall contain a proviso for re-entry on non-payment of the rent reserved, or non-performance or non-observance of the covenants contained in the lease.

4. As soon as, in the opinion of the Governing Body, the new site shall be ready, the school shall be removed to such new site; and there-

upon the actual site, and the buildings thereon, shall be discharged from the trusts for the use of the school upon which the same are at present held, and shall thenceforth be held upon the trusts and for the purposes hereinafter declared.

5. For the purpose of raising funds for defraying the expenses of carrying the Scheme into effect, the Governing Body may sell or mortgage (but subject as to any such mortgage to the restrictions hereinafter provided) any property belonging to or held in trust for the school, and shall apply the proceeds of any such sale or mortgage, and may apply any capital funds for the time being belonging to or held in trust for the school, in or towards payment of such expenses, provided that the proceeds of any such sale may be applied in discharging the principal moneys raised by any previous mortgage, or any part thereof.
6. No money shall be borrowed by the Gov-

erning Body on mortgage of any part of the property of the school, to be effected under Article 5, at any higher rate of interest than five pounds per cent. per annum; and the Governing Body shall make provision for discharging the principal moneys borrowed within thirty years, either by payment of the same in yearly or other instalments, or by the formation of a sinking or accumulation fund out of the income of the charity.

7. The Governing Body may also sell all or any part of the actual site of the school, or any part or parts of the said pieces of land so to be purchased as aforesaid, which may not be required for the purposes of the school, either subject or not to any building lease thereof to be made under the said power for that purpose at such time or times, and in such manner, and for such sums of money, as the Governing Body All moneys to arise from any may think fit. sale made under this Article may be applied to the same purposes to which the moneys raised by any sale under Article 5 are hereinbefore made applicable, and so far as the same may not be required for those purposes and in the meantime, and until the same shall be so applied, shall be invested in any of the securities which may for the time being be authorized by the Court of Chancery for the investment of cash under the control of the Court, and the income of the stocks, funds, and securities in or upon which the said sale moneys shall be invested, and also the rents and profits of the said lands, until sold, shall be applicable to the same purposes as the income of any other property belonging to or held in trust for the

8. The Governing Body may from time to time, and during such time as they may think necessary, either wholly or partially suspend any Scholarships or Exhibitions payable out of any property belonging to or held in trust for the school which, or the proceeds of the sale or the mortgage of which, may have been appropriated for the purposes of this Scheme.

9. No person dealing with the Governing Body shall be bound to enquire whether any disposition purporting to be made under the powers hereby conferred is in fact proper or authorized, or be bound to see to the application of any moneys to be raised by any sale or purporting to be made under the mortgage powers of this Scheme.

And whereas the said Scheme (hereinafter referred to as "the original Scheme") was duly laid before, and approved and sanctioned by, Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, of blessed memory, in Council on the twelfth day of Feb-

ruary, 1876.

And whereas the Governing Body having in the year 1878 completed the purchase of the messuage, buildings, and pieces of land described in the schedule to the original scheme, with the exception of a piece of land containing 2a. 0r. 19p., therein described as the property of the representatives of the late Mr. John Beck, and having removed the school to its new site, as soon as the buildings then necessary had been erected upon it, thereafter became convinced that owing to the insufficient area or the land originally purchased, and the increasing number of the scholars, it was necessary to take any favourable opportunity which might occur of providing additional adjoining land for the purposes of the school. And whereas And whereas the Governing Body, accordingly, from time to time purchased divers other lands adjacent to the lands mentioned in the schedule to the original Scheme, and ultimately by an Order of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria in Council, dated the 28th day of October, 1892, an amending scheme made by the Governing Body of the said school was duly sanctioned, by which amending scheme the original scheme was altered so as to be read and construed as though the lands so purchased as aforesaid (other than such parts as had been resold), and which lands, other than as aforesaid, were delineated upon the plan thereto annexed, and thereon coloured pink and blue, and are delineated on the plan annexed hereto, and therein coloured green, had been described in the said schedule to the original Scheme, and had been thereby authorized to be purchased. And, also, as though it had been provided by clause 6 of the original Scheme, that the Governing Body should make provision for discharging the principal moneys borrowed by them within forty years from the time of borrowing, instead of thirty years as therein mentioned. And whereas in the year one thousand nine hundred and twelve an offer was made to sell to the Governing Body part of a field known as Kingsland field, lying on the west of the lands, the purchase of which was authorized by the said amending Scheme, such part containing 26,840 square yards, and delineated on the plan annexed to the scheme hereinafter recited, and thereon coloured pink, and delineated on the said plan annexed hereto, and thereon coloured yellow, at the price of one thousand one hundred and seventy pounds. And whereas the Governing Body were of opinion that it was very desirable that such offer should be accepted, but being advised that such purchase could not lawfully be made without an amending Scheme, the Rt. Honble. Henry De Vere Baron Barnard, the then Chairman of the Governing Body, took upon himself the responsibility of purchasing the said piece of land in his own name, with a view of giving to the Governing Body the option of taking over the same upon the terms of repaying to him the said purchase money, with interest thereon at 4 per cent. per annum, from the twenty-ninth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and eleven, together with all costs and expenses incurred by the said Baron Barnard in relation to the transaction. And whereas the said purchase was duly completed by the said Baron Barnard on the sixth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and eleven, And whereas it was considered

that it would be of great benefit to the school that the Governing Body should be empowered to adopt the said purchase, and to acquire the said piece of land for the purposes of the school. And whereas by a deed dated the seventeenth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and eleven the Governing Body took an assignment from one Edward Branthwaite Moser of a piece of leasehold land, containing two thousand eight hundred and sixty-five square yards or thereabouts, delineated and coloured blue on the plan annexed to the amending scheme hereinafter recited, and on the said plan annexed hereto, together with the House erected thereon by the said E. B. Moser, and theretofore used as a Boarding House for Scholars at the said school, of which he was an Assistant Master. And whereas, ultimately, by an Order of His Majesty King George V. in Council, dated the fourteenth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and twelve, an amending scheme made by the Governing Body of the said school was duly sanctioned, by which amending scheme the original Scheme was altered so as to be read and construed as though (a) the said piece of freehold land which the sa'd Baron Barnard had so purchased as aforesaid, and (b) the said piece of leasehold land and Boarding House acquired (or expressed to have been acquired) by the Governing Body from the said E. B. Moser as aforesaid had been respectively comprised in the schedule to the said original scheme, and delineated on the plan thereto annexed and thereon coloured pink, and that the adoption by the Governing Body of the purchase and acquisition of the said freehold piece of land by the said Baron Barnard on the terms aforesaid and the acquisition by the Governing Body of the said piece of leasehold land and Boarding House on the terms aforesaid should be deemed to have been authorized by the said original Scheme. And that the said scheme should be read and construed as though it had been by clause 6 thereof provided that the Governing Body should make provision for discharging the principal moneys borrowed by them within fifty years from the time of borrowing instead of within thirty years (extended to forty years by the said amending Scheme of 1892), as therein mentioned. And whereas by an Indenture dated the twenty-third day of November, one thousand nine hundred and twelve, and made between the said Henry de Vere Baron Barnard of the first part, Alfred Barnes Deakin and Benjamin Blower, both therein described, of the second part, and the Governing Body of the third part, the said piece of freehold land so purchased by the said Baron Barnard as aforesaid was duly conveyed by him to the Governing Body. And whereas of late the married Masters of the said School have experi-And whereas of late the enced very great difficulty in finding houses to reside in in the neighbourhood of the School And whereas owing to the increasing number of the Scholars, particularly of those who row on the River Severn, it is necessary to acquire a site for an additional boat-house with living rooms for the boatman over it. And whereas the Governing Body recently had an offer from Mrs. Gladys Mary Milnes, the wife of Kenneth William Milnes, to sell to the Governing Body the messuage land and hereditaments described in the first schedule hereto and delineated on the plan annexed hereto and therein coloured orange, for the sum of three thousand two hundred and fifty pounds, and as the said

messuage will be suitable as a residence for a married Master of the said School, and as the land adjoining will be suitable in connection with the boathouse and boating of the said School, and as the said Gladys Mary Milnes would not sell part of the said hered taments, the Governing Body considered that they ought not to let the opportunity of acquiring the said premises slip, and accordingly they entered into the Agreement next hereinafter recited. And whereas by an Agreement dated the thirtieth day of January, one thousand nine hundred and twenty, and made between the said Gladys Mary Milnes of the one part and the Governing Body of the other part, the said Gladys Mary Milnes agreed to sell and the Governing Body agreed to buy the said hereditaments described in the said first schedule hereto at the price of three thousand two hundred and fifty pounds, to be paid as to the sum of three hundred and twenty-five pounds upon the signing of the said agreement and the remainder on the twenty-fourth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and twenty, when the purchase should be completed. And it was by the said Agreement provided that it was conditional upon the Privy Council approving of an Amending Scheme under the Public Schools Act, 1868, authorizing the purchase of the said premises upon the terms of such agreement. And whereas by an Indenture dated the eleventh day of September, one thousand nine hundred and eleven, and made between the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Shrewsbury of the one part, and the Rev. Cyril Argentine Alington, the then Head Master of the School, Walter Dodsworth Haydon and Cuthbert William Mitford, assistant Masters in the said School (thereinafter and hereinafter in this recital called "the Lessees ") of the other part, the piece or parcel of land described in the second schedule hereto and delineated on the plan annexed hereto and therein coloured brown, with the appurtenances, was demised unto the lessees as joint tenants for the term of ninety-nine years from the twenty-fourth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and eleven, at the yearly rent of six pounds ten shillings, and subject to the covenants by the lessees and conditions therein contained, including a covenant that the Lessees would within three years after the execution of the said Lease erect and complete upon the said piece of land a messuage with suitable outbuildings and other conveniences of not less than the aggregate clear annual value of sixty pounds at least, exclusive of the ground rent thereby reserved. And whereas the said Cyril Argentine Alington, Walter Dodsworth Haydon and Cuthbert William Mitford, in accordance with the said covenants in that behalf, erected a house upon the said piece of land suitable for the occupation of unmarried assistant Masters at the said School at a cost in the whole of £2,330 4s. 5d., which was eventually defrayed out of funds in which the Governing Body were interested. And whereas when the said Cyril Argentine Alington had been appointed Head Master of Eton College and was consequently on the point of retiring from the Head Mastership of Shrewsbury School at the end of the year 1916, he and the said Walter Dodsworth Haydon and Cuthbert William Mitford were desirous of making over the said leasehold premises to the Governing Body and accordingly by an Indenture dated the ninth day of July, one thousand

nine hundred and seventeen, and made between the said Cyril Argentine Alington, Walter Dodsworth Haydon, and Cuthbert William Mitford of the one part, and the Governing Body of the other part it was agreed and declared that the said Cyril Argentine Alington, Walter Dodsworth Haydon, and Cuthbert William Mitford, their executors, administrators and assigns should stand possessed of the said leasehold premises for all the residue of the term, estate and interest granted therein by the said lease (subject to the rent covenants and conditions therein reserved and contained) in trust for the Governing Body. said Cyril Argentine Alington, Walter Dodsworth Haydon, and Cuthbert William Mitford thereby covenanted and agreed to assign the said premises to the Governing Body or to such person or persons at such time and in such manner as the Governing Body should appoint subject to the said rents, covenants and condi-And whereas the acquisition by the Governing Body of the said Leasehold Premises is highly desirable in the interest of the said School as the house is adapted for the purpose of a residence of assistant Masters at the said School. And whereas it is apprehended that the Governing Body had not power to acquire the said Leasehold premises under or by virtue of the said declaration of trust or otherwise. And whereas at the present day it is difficult and often impossible to borrow money at so low a rate as five pounds per cent. per annum, and accordingly it is desirable that there should . be some relaxation in the requirement as to the rate of interest contained in Clause 6 of the original scheme.

The Governing Body of Shrewsbury School

The Governing Body of Shrewsbury School do hereby propose by virtue of and in pursuance of the powers above mentioned to alter the original scheme as follows, that is to say:

- 1. The Original Scheme shall throughout be read and construed as though
 - (a) The messuage land and hereditaments described in the first Schedule hereto and delineated and coloured orange on the plan annexed hereto
 - (b) And the said Leasehold premises described in the said second Schedule hereto and delineated and coloured brown on the said plan annexed hereto

had been respectively described in the schedule to the said original Scheme and delineated on the plan thereto annexed and thereon coloured pink. Provided that the experience of Special or Measure Cutters shall include three years' experience in Measure Cutting, 1s. $10\frac{1}{2}$ d. per hour.

(b) Male Cutters, other than those specified in Sub-section (a) of this Section, of 22 years of age and over, who are employed during the whole or a substantial part of their time in cutting and who have had not less than five years' experience in Cutting, 1s. 8½d. per hour.

For the purposes of Sub-section (b) of this Section the term "Cutting" shall be deemed to include the operations of Hooking-up, Folding, Marking-in or Marking-out and Dividing.

In cases where a worker is employed on Piecework, each Piece-rate paid must be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an ordinary worker, an amount not less than the Piece-work Basis Time-rate applicable.

PART IV.

Proposed Variation of Overtime Rates. Section I.—For Workers employed on Time-work.

The Overtime Rates for Male and Female Workers in respect of hours worked by a worker engaged on Time-work in excess of the normal number of hours of work in the trade, as declared by the Trade Board in their Notice dated 27th February, 1920, shall be as follows: --

- 1. For the first two hours' Overtime on any day, except Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be equivalent to Time-and-a-quarter, that is to say, one-and-a-quarter times the minimum rate otherwise applicable.
- 2. For the second two hours' Overtime on any day, except Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be equivalent to time-and-a-half, that is to say, one-and-a-half times the minimum rate otherwise applicable.
- For all time worked on Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, and for Overtime after the first four hours' Overtime on any other day, the Overtime Rate shall be equivalent to Double-time, that is to say, twice the minimum rate otherwise applicable.
- 4. For all hours worked in any week in excess of 48, the Overtime Rate shall be Timeand-a-quarter, except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of paragraphs 2 and 3 above.

(a) Where it is or may become the established practice of an employer to require attendance only on five days a week, the Overtime Rate shall only be payable where on any day the number of hours worked exceeds 91.

(b) Where it is or may become the established practice of an employer to require attendance only on alternate Saturdays, the normal number of hours for the week in which attendance on Saturday is required shall be deemed to be 50.

Section II.—For Workers Employed on Piece-work:

1. A Female Worker of the classes specified in Section I. of Part I. of this Schedule and a Male Worker of the classes specified in Section I. of Part II. of this Schedule, employed on Piece-work, shall be entitled to receive in respect of each hour of Overtime worked, in addition to Piece-Rates, each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an Ordinary Worker not less than the respective appropriate Piece-work Basis Time-Rates, as set out in Part III. of this Schedule, the appropriate Piece-work Basis Time-Rate, or one-half of the appropriate Piece-work

Basis Time-Rate, or one-quarter of the appropriate Piece-work Basis Time-Rate, according as the Overtime Rates, which would have been payable under the provisions of Section I. of this Part of this Schedule, if the worker had been employed on Time-work, were Double-Time, or Time-and-a-Half, or Time-and-a-Quarter respectively.

2. All Male Workers, other than those specified in Section I. of Part II. of this Schedule, and Female Learners as specified in Section II. of Part I. of this Schedule employed on Piece-Work, shall be entitled to receive in respect of each hour of Over-time worked, in addition to Piece-Rates, each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an Ordinary Worker not less than the respective appropriate General Minimum Time-Rates applicable, the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate, or one-half of the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate, or one-quarter of the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate, according as the Overtime Rates which would have been payable under the provisions of Section I. of this Part of this Schedule, if the worker had been employed on Time-work, were Double-Time or Timeand-a-half, or Time-and-a-quarter, respectively.

PART V.

For the purpose of this Notice the following definition shall apply:—

A Special or Measure Cutter is a Worker—
(a) who is able to take a complete set of measures and cut from model patterns;

(b) who has sufficient technical knowledge to alter patterns (excluding Stock Patterns).

PART VI.

Section I.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages shall be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorized by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any Superannuation or other Provident Fund.

Section II.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages.

The Trade Board will consider any Objections to the above Proposals to Vary and Fix which may be lodged with them within two months from the 4th May, 1920. Such objections should be in writing, and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address) and should be sent to the Secretary of the Shirtmaking Trade Board (Great Britain), 5, Chancery Lane, London, W.C. 2.

It is desirable that the Objections should state precisely, and so far as possible with reasons, what is objected to.

7½d. per hour. Workers of 17 and under 17½ years of age,

6½d. per hour. Workers of 16½ and under 17 years of age,

6d. per hour.

Workers of 16 and under 16½ years of age,
51d. per hour.

 $5\frac{1}{2}$ d. per hour.

Workers of $15\frac{1}{2}$ and under 16 years of age, $4\frac{2}{3}$ d. per hour.

Workers of 15 and under 15½ years of age, 4d. per hour.

Workers of $14\frac{1}{2}$ and under 15 years of age, $3\frac{1}{2}$ d. per hour.

Workers under 14½ years of age, 3d. per

Provided that the Minimum Rates set out in paragraphs A, B and C above shall not apply to Hand Loom Weavers, to Home Workers, or to Apprentices as defined in Part VI of this Sche-

PART II.

Proposed Piece-work Basis Time-Rates for all Male Workers.

A. For all Male Workers employed in one or more of the occupations specified in Part I A of this Schedule, 1s. 8½d. per hour.

B. For all Male Workers employed in one or more of the occupations specified in Part I B of

this Schedule, 1s. 8d. per hour.

In the case of all Male Workers employed on Piece-work in one or more of the occupations specified in Parts I A and I B of this Schedule, each Piece-Rate must be such as will yield, in the circumstances of the case, not less than the appropriate Piece-work Basis Time-Rate as set out in Parts II A and II B respectively of this Schedule, to an Ordinary worker.

Provided that in determining as to whether any Piece-Rate satisfies the foregoing condition, regard shall be had only to the earnings of Male Workers of 21 years of age and over, who have had not less than three years' experience in one or more of the occupations specified in Parts I A and I B respectively of this Schedule.

PART III.

Proposed General Minimum Time-rates for Female Workers.

...A. For Female Workers of 18 years of age and over who are employed in one or more of the following occupations, and who have had not less than three years' experience in one or more of such occupations:—

Horse Hair Sorter, Hackler, Drawer or

Buncher; Power Loom Weaver, Winder, Damask Seating Hand Loom Weaver, Curler, Spinner, Hair Dyer, Cloth Starcher, Carpet Weaver, 9½d. per hour.

B. For Female Workers of 18 years of age and over who are employed in one or more of the following occupations, and who have had not less than three years' experience in one or more of such occupations:

Fibre Drafter, Dresser or Dyer, Bass Sorter, Dyer, Cutter, Rougher, Mixer or

Finisher, 91d. per hour.

C. For Female Hand Loom Weavers or Home-workers, 72d. per hour.

D. For all other Female Workers:-Workers of 18 years of age and over, 8½d. per hour.

Workers of 17½ and under 18 years of

age, 7½d. per hour.

Workers of 17 and under 17 years of age, 6½d. per hour.

Workers of $16\frac{1}{2}$ and under 17 years of age,

6d. per hour. Workers of 16 and under $16\frac{1}{2}$ years of age,

 $5\frac{1}{2}$ d. per hour. Workers of $15\frac{1}{2}$ and under 16 years of age,

43d. per hour.
Workers of 15 and under 151 years of age, 4d. per hour.

3½d. per hour. Workers under 14½ years of age, 3d. per

Provided that in the case of any worker who enters the trade for the first time at or over the age of 16 years, and who is employed on timework, the general minimum time-rate payable during the worker's first 12 months' employment shall be the respective minimum rates set out above appropriate to a worker in the immediately junior age group in lieu of the general

Provided also that the Rates set out in paragraphs A. B. C and D above shall not apply to Apprentices as defined in Part VI of this Schedule.

PART IV.

Proposed Piece-work Basis Time-rates for all Female Workers.

A. For all Female Workers employed in one or more of the occupations specified in Part

III A of this Schedule, 10½d. per hour.

B. For all Female Workers employed in one or more of the occupations specified in Part III B of this Schedule, 101d. per hour.

In the case of all Female Workers employed on Piece-work in one or more of the occupations specified in Parts III A and III B each Piece-rate must be such as will yield, in the circumstances of the case, not less than the appropriate Piece-work Basis Time-rate as set out in Parts IV A and IV B respectively of this Schedule to an Ordinary Worker.

Provided that in determining as to whether any Piece-rate satisfies the foregoing condition, regard shall be had only to the earnings of Female Workers of 18 years of age and over, who have had not less than three years' experience in one or more of the occupations specified in Parts III A and III B respectively of this Schedule.

C. For all Female Hand Loom Weavers or

Home Workers, 7½d. per hour.

In the case of all Female Hand Loom Weavers or Home-workers employed on Piecework, each Piece-rate paid must be such as will yield, in the circumstances of the case, not less than 71d. per hour to an Ordinary Worker.

PART V.

Proposed Overtime Rates for all Mule and Female Workers.

Section I.—In accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board Propose to Declare the Normal Number of Hours of Work in the Trade in any Week to be 48.

Provided that all hours worked on Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays shall be regarded as Overtime to which the Overtime Rates shall apply.

Section II.—The Trade Board propose to fix Overtime Rates in respect of hours worked by a Worker in excess of the declared normal number of hours of work in the trade as follows, that is to say:

A,—Workers Employed on Time-Work.

Workers employed on Piece-work shall be entitled to receive in respect of each hour of Overtime a Piece-Rate which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an Ordinary Worker, at least the equivalent of the appropriate Piece-work Basis Time-Rate or General Minimum Time-Rate, as the case may be, with the addition of:

(1) As respects each of the first four hours of Overtime in any week, a sum equivalent to One Quarter of the appro-priate Piece-work Basis Time-Rate or General Minimum Time-Rate, as the case

may be;

(2) As respects each hour in excess of four hours of Overtime in any week, a sum equivalent to One Half of the appropriate Piece-work Basis Time-Rate or General Minimum Time-Rate, as the case may

(3) As respects each hour of employment on Sundays and on Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, a sum equivalent to the appropriate Piece-work Basis Time-Rate or General Minimum. Time-Rate, as the case may be.

PART VI.

SECTION I.—For the purpose of this Notice the expression "Home-worker" means worker who works in his or her own home, or in any other place not under the control or management of the employer.

SECTION II.—For the purpose of this Notice the expression "Apprentices" means Indentured Apprentices and Unbound Learners employed under an agreement, written or verbal, providing for the proper instruction of the Learner in one or more of the occupa-tions specified in Parts I A, I B, III A or III B of this Schedule.

PART VII.

SECTION I .- The respective Minimum Rates set out in this Schedule shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts and of this Notice, to all workers in Great Britain who are employed during the whole or any part of their time in any branch of the Trade specified in the Trade Boards (Hair, Bass and Fibre) Order, 1919; that is to say:

2. This Order shall come into operation on the eighth day of May, nineteen hundred and twenty.

- 1. The restrictions on movement of swine imposed by the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 and the Norfolk Swine Fever) Order of 1915, shall not apply to the movement of swine from the sale mentioned in the Schedule hereto to any premises in Great Britain not being a Swine-Fever Infected Place, if the swine are accompanied by a . licence in the Form F set forth in the First Schedule to the said Order of 1908, granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the county of Norfolk, and the following conditions, which shall be specified in the licence, are complied with:
 - i) The swine shall be moved to the place of destination specified in the licence and not elsewhere, and shall be there detained and kept separate from all other swine for twentyeight days, unless they are slaughtered on such premises before the expiration of that period, or are moved under and in accordance with the conditions of a licence in the Form C set forth in the said First Schedule to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse in the same Scheduled Area.
 - (ii) The swine shall be moved by the nearest available route without unnecessary delay, and during the movement shall, so far as is practicable, be kept separate from all swine not being moved with a licence under this Order.
 - (iii) After completion of the movement the licence shall forthwith be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest police station in the same district by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing such . movement.

- 2. A copy of a licence issued under this Order shall be sent by the Inspector granting the same to the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination specified in the licence is situate.
- 3. A licence under this Order shall for the purposes of the above-mentioned Orders be treated as a licence under those Orders.
