Notice of the decision of His Majesty's Government to terminate the Agreement between Great Britain and Liberia relative to the navigation of the Manoh River, signed at Monrovia on April 10th, 1913, was given to the Liberian Government by the Acting British Consul-General at Monrovia on September 23rd, 1919. In accordance with the terms of the notice the Agreement should have ceased to have effect from December 23rd, 1919—i.e., three months from the date of notification, but in deference to the wishes of the Liberian Government it was agreed that March 23rd, 1920, should be substituted as the date of termination. The Agreement accordingly ceased to have effect from the latter date, viz., March 23rd, 1920.

Prior to the termination of the Agreement, assurances were given to the Liberian Government that it was not the intention of His Majesty's Government, after the expiration of the Agreement, to close the Manoh River to navigation or to interfere with its navigation by Liberian vessels. These assurances were confirmed in an official note addressed to the Liberian Government by the Acting British Consul-General at Monrovia on March 24th, 1920.

## FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACT, 1901.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice, in pursuance of Section 80 of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, that he has certified the use of wood-working machinery to be dangerous, and that he proposes to make regulations to apply to factories or parts thereof, and to any place to which the provisions of Section 79 of the said Act are applied by the Act, in which any wood-working machinery is used.

For the purposes of the proposed Regulations, wood-working machinery means a circular saw, plain band saw, planing machine, vertical

spindle moulding machine or chain mortising machine operating on wood.

#### WELFARE OF WORKERS IN FACTORIES AND WORKSHOPS.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice, that in pursuance of the powers conferred on him by Section 7 of the Police, Factories, etc. (Miscellaneous Provisions), Act, 1916, of making Orders for securing the welfare of the workers employed in factories and workshops, he proposes to make an Order to apply to all textile factories and workshops, to all print works, bleaching and dyeing works, and to rope works in which the process of spinning the fibre is carried on.

- (c) the modifications asked for.

Where an objection is made jointly on behalf of a number of occupiers, the names of the occupiers and their addresses must be stated, or, if the objection is made by an association of occupiers on behalf of its members, the number of the members affected by the Order.

#### MINING INDUSTRY ACT, 1920.

DIRECTIONS BY THE BOARD OF TRADE AS TO THE MAXIMUM PITHEAD PRICE CHARGEABLE FOR COAL SOLD FOR CONSUMPTION IN THE BRITISH ISLANDS, AND FOR COAL SOLD FOR THE BUNKERING OF CERTAIN VESSELS AT PORTS IN THE BRITISH ISLANDS..

Whereas under Section 3 (1) (b) of the Mining Industry Act, 1920, the Board of Trade may from time to time give directions regulating the pithead price to be charged for coal sold for consumption in the British Islands and for coal sold for the bunkering of vessels, other than vessels proceeding to a port outside the British Islands. Now, therefore, the Board of Trade direct that—

1. Subject as hereinafter provided coal shall not be sold or offered for sale directly or indirectly by the owner of the coal or on his behalf at a pithead price exceeding by more than the standard amount per ton specified in paragraph 2 of these Directions, the pithead price of coal of the same description sold in similar quantities and under similar conditions affecting the sale at the same coal mine in the corresponding month (or as near thereto as having regard to the course of business may be practicable) in the twelve months ended the 30th June, 1914.

Provided that where any description of coal is washed before sale the price of the washed coal may exceed the price charged for the same description of washed coal in the corresponding month as aforesaid by an amount not exceeding two shillings and sixpence per ton in addition to the standard amount.

For the purpose of such comparison in the case of contracts for sales otherwise than for immediate delivery the date to be taken shall be the date of the contract in writing and not the date of any delivery under the contract.

2. The standard amount shall be twenty-three shillings and twopence in the case of coal mines in the Monmouthshire and South Wales and the Forest of Dean districts and in South Staffordshire and East Worcestershire south of a line drawn from Bushbury Station on the London and North Western Railway to Streetly Station on the Midland Railway and in so much of the area in South Staffordshire and East Worcestershire north of this line as is comprised in the Wolverhampton Union for poor law purposes or the East Division of Wolverhampton for Parliamentary purposes, and in the case of mines situated elsewhere the standard amount shall be twenty shillings and eightpence.

3. Where coal at the pithead is sold or offered for sale at a price in excess of the pithead price as fixed in these Directions by reason that the price at which the coal is sold or offered for sale includes charges for services rendered, the person selling the coal or offering it for sale, shall, if requested by the purchaser, state in the price charged or quoted how much thereof is in respect of the pithead price of the coal.

4. If for any reason there are not adequate data at any coal mine from which to ascertain in accordance with the provisions of these Directions the corresponding price of coal, whether washed or unwashed, at that mine, the Board of Trade may fix that price having regard to data afforded from sales of coal at other mines.

5. These directions shall apply to

(a) coal sold for consumption in the British Islands but not to coal sold for the manufacture of patent fuel for export or of coke-oven-coke for export.

(b) coal sold for the bunkering of vessels other than vessels proceeding to a port outside the British Islands.

Vessels engaged in the fishing industry and landing their catches in the British Islands shall for this purpose be treated as vessels not proceeding to a port outside the British Islands.

In the case of vessels carrying cargo coastwise for discharging at a port in the British Islands and thence proceeding to a port outside the British Islands, the maximum price in these Directions shall apply only to the estimated quantity of coal which will be used on the coastwise voyage.

6. The price to be charged for coal sold for the manufacture of patent fuel for export or of coke-oven-coke for export, shall be the market price which would be obtainable for such coal if sold for export and this Direction shall apply to

(a) Coal supplied to patent fuel works

and/or coke ovens not connected with a colliery undertaking;

(b) Coal transferred from a colliery undertaking to patent fuel works and/or coke ovens in the same ownership as the colliery undertaking.

7. These Directions shall not apply to coal raised in Ireland.

8. The Directions of the Board of Trade as to the sale of coal for bunkering certain ships at ports in the United Kingdom, dated the 27th November, 1919, are hereby cancelled.

9. These Directions shall come into operation as from the 1st day of September, 1920.

NOTE.—If any person sells or offers for sale any coal at a price in contravention of these Directions he is liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding one hundred pounds or, at the discretion of the Court, to a fine not exceeding treble the amount by which the sum paid or payable on any coal supplied, or sold by him in contravention of these Directions exceeds the maximum sum which would have been paid or payable for the coal if there had been no such contravention.

A prosecution for an offence under this Section may be instituted at any time within one year of the commission of the offence.

## TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 AND 1918.

### FLAX AND HEMP TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

#### PROPOSAL TO VARY AND FIX MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR CERTAIN CLASSES OF MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated the 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established in Great Britain under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, for the Flax and Hemp Trade, as specified in the Trade Boards (Flax and Hemp) Order, 1919, HEREBY GIVE NOTICE, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that THEY PROPOSE TO VARY the General Minimum Time Rates and Overtime Rates at present fixed and set out in the Schedule to their Notice dated 30th July, 1920, in their application to Certain Classes of Male and Female Workers, and TO FIX General Minimum Time Rates, a Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate and Overtime Rates for certain classes of Female Workers and General Minimum Piece Rates for certain Male Workers, the proposed Minimum Rates of Wages being as shown in the Schedule set out below.

The Minister of Labour has given his consent to the Notice of Proposal to Vary being given.

SECTION III.—The weekly rates set out in Sections I and II of this Part of this Schedule are based on a week of 48 hours, and shall be subject to a proportionate deduction according as the number of hours of employment in any week is less than 48.

Provided that in the case of whole time workers employed by the week or longer period, where the normal number of hours per week in the establishment as agreed between the employer and his workers is less than 48, but not less than 44:—

- (i) The weekly wage payable for such shorter normal working week shall be not less than the weekly rates set out in Sections I and II of this Part of this Schedule.
- (ii) The weekly rates set out in Sections I and II of this Part of this Schedule shall be subject to a proportionate deduction or increase up to 48 hours according as the number of hours of employment in any week is less or more than the agreed normal number of hours in the establishment.

PART II.

*Proposed Piece-work Basis Time-Rate for Female Workers.*

SECTION I.—For Female Workers of all ages ... .. Proposed Piece work Basis Time-Rate. 9d. per hour.

SECTION II.—In cases where a worker is employed on Piece-work, each Piece-Rate paid must be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an ORDINARY Worker not less than 9d. per hour. Provided that in determining as to whether any

Piece-Rate satisfies the foregoing condition, regard shall be had only to the earnings of workers of 18 years of age and over, who have had not less than six months' experience in the trade.

## PART IV.

*Proposed Overtime Rates and Variation of Overtime Rates for Male and Female Workers.*

SECTION I.—Male and Female Workers employed on Time-Work:—

Overtime Rates calculated on the General Minimum Time-Rates specified in Part I of this Schedule in the manner set out in Part II of the Schedule to the Notice issued by the Trade Board, dated 30th July, 1920, fixing Overtime Rates for Male and Female Workers, shall apply in substitution for the General Minimum Time-Rates set out in Part I of this Schedule in respect of all hours worked in excess of the number declared by the Trade Board in the said Notice dated 30th July 1920, to be the normal number of hours of work in the trade.

SECTION II.—All Male and Female Workers employed on Piece-Work:—

(a) Male Workers employed on Piece-Work shall receive in respect of each hour of Overtime worked, in addition to the General Minimum Piece-Rate applicable, as set out in Part III of this Schedule, or where no General Minimum Piece Rate has been fixed and made effective to Piece Rates, each of which would yield in the circumstances of the case to an ordinary worker not less than the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate, the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate, One-Half of the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate, or One-Quarter of the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate, One-Half of the Overtime Rate which would have been payable under the provisions of the said Notice dated 30th July, 1920, if the worker had been employed on Time-work, were Double Time, Time-and-a-Half, or Time-and-a-Quarter respectively.

(b) Female Workers, employed on Piece-work, shall receive in respect of each hour of Overtime worked, in addition to Piece-Rates, each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an Ordinary Worker not less than the Piece-work Basis Time-Rate, the appropriate Piece-work Basis Time-Rate, One-Half of the appropriate Piece-work Basis Time-Rate, or One-Quarter of the appropriate Piece-work Basis Time-Rate, according as the Overtime Rate which would have been payable under the provisions of the said Notice dated 30th July, 1920, if the worker had been employed on Time-work, were Double-Time, Time-and-a-Half, or Time-and-a-Quarter respectively.

NOTE.—The hours which female workers, young persons and children are allowed to work

are subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts.

## PART V.

For the purpose of this Notice, a Female-Learner shall be deemed to mean a female worker who is employed during the whole or a substantial part of her time in learning weaving, warping, winding, spinning or card-cutting by an employer who ensures that she shall receive reasonable and proper facilities for such learning.

## PART VI.

The above Minimum Rates of Wages shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade-Boards Acts, to Male and Female Workers in Great Britain, specified in Parts I, II, III and IV of this Schedule in respect of any time during which they are employed in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Flax and Hemp) Order, 1919, namely:—

The preparing, spinning and weaving (a) of scutched flax, (b) of hemp, (c) of a mixture of scutched flax and any other fibre, or (d) of a mixture of hemp and any other fibre.

*Including:—*

(1) The preparing and spinning of waste-reclaimed at any stage; and

(2) All packing, despatching, warehousing, storing or other operations incidental to or appertaining to any of the above-mentioned work;

*But excluding:—*

(1) The calendering, bleaching, dyeing or finishing of any of the above-mentioned materials; and

(2) The preparing or spinning of materials required for the making or re-making of (a) rope (including driving rope and banding), (b) cord (including blind and window cord, but excluding silk, worsted and other fancy cords), (c) core for wire ropes, (d) lines, (e) twine (including binder and trawl twine), (f) lanyards, (g) net and similar articles when such spinning or preparing is carried on in the same factory or workshop as the said making or re-making; and

(3) The making or repair of sacks or bags; and also

(4) The weaving of carpets, rugs and mats.

## PART VII.

SECTION I.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages shall be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any Superannuation or other Provident Fund.

SECTION II.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages.

The Trade Board will consider any Objections to the above Proposals to Vary and Fix which may be lodged with them within two months from 1st September, 1920. Such Objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary of the Flax and Hemp Trade Board (Great Britain), 5, Chancery Lane, London, W.C. 2.

It is desirable that the Objections should state precisely, and so far as possible with reasons, what is objected to.

### MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.

#### COUNTY OF WEST SUSSEX.

Whereas by sub-section 1 of section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903, it is enacted that within any limits or place referred to in regulations made by the Local Government Board with a view to the safety of the public on the application of the Local Authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour:

And whereas the power to make such regulations has been transferred to the Minister of Transport:

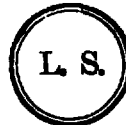
