THE TRADE BOARDS (BOOT AND FLOOR POLISH)
ORDER, 1920.

Special Order, dated October 29, 1920, made by the Minister of Labour under section I. of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, applying the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 (9 Edw. 7, c. 22) and 1918 (8 & 9 Geo. 5, c. 32), to the Boot and Floor Polish Trade.

Whereas the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, apply to the trades specified in the Schedule to the Trade Boards Act, 1909, and to the trades specified in the Schedule to the Trade Boards Provisional Orders Confirmation Act, 1913, and the Minister of Labour is empowered under, and by virtue of section I. of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, to make a Special Order applying the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, to any specified trade to which they do not at the time apply, if he is of opinion that no adequate machinery exists for the effective regulation of wages throughout the trade, and that accordingly, having regard to the rates of wages prevailing in the trade, or any part of the trade, it is expedient that the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, should apply to that trade;

And whereas the Trade Boards Acts, 1909

And whereas the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, do not apply to the trade specified in the appendix to this Order, and the Minister of Labour as respects that trade is of the

opinion aforesaid:

Now, therefore, the Minister of Labour, in pursuance of the powers in him vested by section I. of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, and by any other statute in that behalf, does hereby make a Special Order that from and after the sixth day of November, 1920, the following provisions shall have effect (that is to say):—

Article 1.—The Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, shall apply to the trade specified in the appendix to this Order.

Article 2.—This Order may be cited as the Trade Boards (Boot and Floor Polish) Order, 1920.

TRADE.

The Boot and Floor Polish Trade, that is to say:—

(1) the manufacture of boot and shoe polish or cream; blacking; dubbin; or floor polish or cream; and

(2) the manufacture of stain for leather or of polish for leather or furniture when carried on in association with or in conjunc-

tion with the manufacture of any of the articles specified in paragraph (1) above;

including the following or similar operations when incidental to operations included in paragraph (1) or (2) above:—

(i.) Checking, testing, grading, weighing, measuring;

(ii.) Filling, lidding, boxing, bottling,

packeting, labelling;

(iii.) Facking. unpacking, despatching, warehousing, portering, time-keeping, storing, stock-keeping;

but excluding the manufacture of boxes, canisters, or other containers.

THE TRADE BOARDS (OSTRICH AND FANCY FEATHER AND ARTIFICIAL FLOWER) ORDER, 1920. SPECIAL ORDER, DATED 2ND NOVEMBER, 1920, MADE BY THE MINISTER OF LABOUR, UNDER SECTION ONE OF THE TRADE BOARDS ACT, 1918, APPLYING THE TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 (9 EDW. 7, c. 22) AND 1918 (8 AND 9 GEO. 5, c. 32), TO THE OSTRICH AND FANCY FEATHER AND ARTIFICIAL FLOWER TRADE.

Whereas the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, apply to the trades specified in the Schedule to the Trade Boards Act, 1909, and to the trades specified in the Schedule to the Trade Boards Provisional Orders Confirmation Act, 1913, and the Minister of Labour is empowered under and by virtue of Section One of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, to make a Special Order applying the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, to any specified trade to which they do not at the time apply, if he is of opinion that no adequate machinery exists for the effective regulation of wages throughout the trade, and that accordingly, having regard to the rates of wages prevailing in the trade, or any part of the trade, it is expedient that the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, should apply to that Trade:

And whereas the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, do not apply to the Trade specified in the appendix to this Order, and the Minister of Labour as respects that trade is of the opinion aforesaid:

Now, therefore, the Minister of Labour, in pursuance of the powers in him vested by Section One of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, and by any other Statute in that behalf, does hereby make a Special Order that from and after the fifth day of November, 1920, the following provisions shall have effect (that is to say):—

Article 1. The Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, shall apply to the Trade specified in the appendix to this Order.

Article 2. This Order may be cited as the Trade Boards (Ostrich and Fancy Feather and Artificial Flower) Order, 1920.

APPENDIX.

TRADE.

The Ostrich and Fancy Feather and Artificial Flower Trade, that is to say:—

- 1. The preparation throughout of ostrich or fancy feathers from the natural condition to the finished feather product.
- 2. The making of artificial flowers, fruit, foliage, grasses, mosses, seeds or pods from paper, wax, textile materials, porcelain, glass, plaster, metal, composition, rubber, leather, raffia, celiphane and similar materials.
- 3. The preservation of natural flowers, foliage, grasses, mosses, ferns, seeds or pods.
- 4. The making of hats of any of the articles specified in paragraphs 1, 2 and 3 above, when made in or in association with or in conjunction with any business or establishment or branch or department or workroom mainly engaged in any of the operations specified in those paragraphs.
- 5. The making of feather garments (including neckwear and muffs), feather trimmings for dresses, feather fans or feather mountings of any description when made in or in association with or in conjunction with any business or establishment or branch or department or workroom mainly engaged in the preparation of ostrich or fancy feathers.
- 6. The cleaning, dyeing or renovating of any of the articles specified in paragraphs 1, 2 and 3 above, when carried on as a main business or in association with or in conjunction with any business or establishment or branch or department or workroom mainly engaged in any of the operations specified in those paragraphs.

Including:

- 7. A. Any of the following and similar operations or processes known in the trade as:—
 - (i) The sorting, stringing, washing, bleaching, dyeing, beating, scraping, laying-up, sewing, curling, finishing, sticking, twisting, mounting of ostrich or fancy feathers;
 - (ii) Pattern-making, dyeing, stiffening, waterproofing, waxing, cutting, stamping, shading, veining, goffing, mould making, mounting, in connection with the manufacture of artificial flowers, fruits, foliage, grasses, mosses, seeds or pods:

grasses, mosses, seeds or pods;
(iii) The dyeing, preserving, painting,
varnishing, or decorating of natural
flowers, foliage, grasses, mosses, ferns,
seeds or pods.

- B. The making of any of the articles specified in paragraph 2 above by needlework processes when carried on in or in association with or in conjunction with a business or establishment or branch or department or workroom mainly engaged in any of the operations specified in that paragraph.
- C. The making or mounting of any of the articles specified in paragraphs 1, 2 and 3 above for cakes or cracker ornaments, except when made or mounted in or in association with or in conjunction with an establishment or business or branch or department or workroom which is mainly engaged in the making of crackers.

- D. The mounting (whether singly or in festoons or garlands) or assembling of any, of the articles specified in paragraphs 1, 2 and 3 above for the purpose of decoration when mounted or assembled in a business or establishment or branch or department or workroom mainly engaged in these operations.
- E. The warehousing of, the packing of, and similar operations in regard to any of the articles specified in paragraphs 1 to 5 above, when carried on in or in association with or in conjunction with a business or establishment or branch or department or workroom mainly engaged in any of the operations specified in paragraphs 1 to 6 above.

But excluding:-

- 8. A. The making of any of the articles mentioned in paragraph 2 above in a business or establishment or branch or department or workroom which is mainly engaged in the manufacture of the materials specified in that paragraph, and not of the articles therein specified.
- B. The preparation, making, or preservation of any of the articles specified in paragraphs 1, 2 and 3 above when carried out in a business or establishment or branch or department or workroom mainly engaged in the manufacture of stationers' sundries.
- C. The stiffening or preparation of textile materials for the making of any of the articles mentioned in paragraph 2 above when carried on in a business or establishment or branch or department or workroom mainly engaged in the preparation of textile materials for other purposes.
- D. The making of any of the articles specified in paragraph 2 above wholly from metal, or the mounting thereof when so made or the making or mounting of plaster flowers, fruit or foliage, except when made or mounted:—
 - (i) For funeral tokens, wreaths or crosses.
 - (ii) In association with, or in conjunction with the making of any of the articles specified in paragraph 2, from any of the other materials specified therein.
 - (iii) For cake or cracker ornaments as specifically mentioned in the operations and processes included in the trade.
- E. The making from rubber of any of the articles mentioned in paragraph 2 above, or the mounting thereof when so made, where carried on in or in association with or in conjunction with a business or establishment or branch or department or workroom mainly engaged in the manufacture of other rubber articles.
- F. All operations covered by the following orders:—
 - (i) The Trade Boards (Sugar, Confectionery and Food Preserving) Order, 1913.
 - (ii) The Trade Boards (Hat, Cap and Millinery) Order, 1919.
 - (iii) The Trade Boards (Women's Clothing) Order, 1919.
 - (iv) The Trade Boards (Toy) Order, 1920.

PROPOSAL TO FIX MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR CERTAIN CLASSES OF MALE WORKERS.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, in England and Wales for the Grocery and Provisions Trade, as specified in the Trade Boards (Grocery and Provisions) Order, 1920, HEREBY GIVE NOTICE, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that THEY PROPOSE TO FIX General Minimum Time-Rates for certain classes of Male Workers, as follows:—

SECTION III.—(a) As respects workers other than those set out in Sub Section (b) below, the above rates are based upon a week of 48 hours and for the purpose of calculating the hourly rates applicable in respect of the number of hours of employment in any week the week shall be taken to be a week of 48 hours.

week shall be taken to be a week of 48 hours.

(b) As respects whole time workers employed by the week or longer period whose customary working week is less than 48 hours but not less than 44 hours (being separate classes within the meaning of the Act) the rate applicable to such workers shall be based upon the number of hours customarily worked by such workers; that is to say, for the purpose of calculating the hourly rate applicable in respect of the number of hours of employment in any week the week shall be taken to be the number of hours customarily worked by such workers.

PART II.

For the purpose of this Notice the following definition shall apply:—

A porter is a male worker employed wholly or mainly in, or in connection with, a Store, Warehouse, Shop or Factory in cleaning, removing goods, loading or unloading, delivery by hand and making himself generally useful.

PART III.

The proposed rates set out in the respective scales A. B and C in Part I of this Notice shall apply as follows:—

Section (i).—The rates set out in Scale A shall apply (a) to all areas administered by

Rural District Councils, and (b) to all areas which are administered by Municipal Borough Councils or Urban District Councils and which according to the Census of 1911 had a population of less than 5,000; but so as in neither case to apply to any area within the Metropolitan Police District.

SECTION (ii).—The rates set out in Scale B shall apply to all areas other than those specified in Sections (i) and (iii) of this Part of this Notice.

Section (iii).—The rates set out in Scale C shall apply to the area comprising the City of London and the Metropolitan Police District

PART IV.

The above proposed minimum rates of wages shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all workers in England and Wales as specified in this Notice in respect of any time during which they are employed in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Grocery and Provisions) Order, 1920, that is to say :-

- . The retail sale of any of the articles specified in Schedule I. in or in connection with any establishment or business or branch or department in which:
 - (a) twelve or more such articles are sold or exposed for sale, whether or not the sale of such articles is the main business in the establishment or business or branch or department; or

(b) the retail sale of any one or more of such articles is the main or principal business of that establishment or business or branch or department.

- 2. The wholesale sale (except when incidental to manufacture or production) of any of the articles specified in Schedule II. in or in connection with any establishment or business or branch or department in which such sale is the main or principal business of that establishment, business, branch or department.
- 3. The sale of other goods when any such sale is carried on in association with the sales specified in paragraph 1 or paragraph 2 above if such sale involves the employment of workers who are also employed in those sales:

Including the following or similar operations when incidental to or carried on in conjunction with the sales specified in 1, 2 or 3 above:

(i). Checking, testing, grading.(ii). Weighing, measuring.

(iii). Packeting, boxing, bundling, bagging, parcelling, packing, unpacking, labelling.

(iv). Collecting, despatching, delivering. (v). Stock-keeping, warehousing, storing,

cold storing, refrigerating. (vi). Portering, loading, unloading, lift

or hoist operating.

(vii). Timekeeping, cleaning premises. (viii). Adjusting implements, cleaning implements, utensils or receptacles.

(ix). Cleaning goods.
(x). Window or show-case dressing.

(xi). Garaging, horse or motor keeping,

cleaning vehicles.
(xii). Mixing, blending, crushing, grind-

ing, mincing, shredding, cutting.

(xiii). Sausage making, bacon processing, ham processing, ham boiling, ham or bacon curing.

- (xiv). Roasting coffee, blanching almonds. (xv). Cooking, preparing or serving food or drink for consumption by the public on or off the premises by workers principally engaged in the sales specified in 1, 2 or 3 above
- (xvi). Clerical work, commercial travelling or canvassing;

But excluding-

(a) Operations performed at docks, wharves or warehouses by workers not directly employed by employers engaged in the business specified in 1, 2 or 3 above.

(b) The sale of goods for export and operations incidental thereto except when carried on in conjunction with the sale of goods for distribution within the United Kingdom.

(c) The transport of goods by common

carriers.

(d) Operations performed by workers engaged in any industry or trade concerned exclusively with carting and operations incidental thereto.

(e) Post Office business.

(1) Operations in agriculture within the meaning of the Corn Production Act, 1917.

- (g) Operations performed by workers employed by wholesale brokers or merchants who do not employ warehouse workers or carters.
- (h) Sales and operations incidental thereto covered by the Trade Boards (Milk Distributive) Order, 1920.

PART V.

SECTION (i.)—The above proposed General Minimum Time-Rates shall be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any Superannuation or other Provident Fund.

SECTION (ii.)—The above proposed General Minimum Time-Rates are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages or to agreements made or that may be made between employers and workers for the payment of wages in excess of these minimum rates

of wages.

The Trade Board will consider any objections to the above proposals to fix which may be lodged with them within two months from 8th November, 1920. Such objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary, the Grocery and Provisions Trade Board (England and Wales), 5, Chancery-lane, London, W.C. 2.

It is desirable that objections should state precisely and, so far as possible, with reasons, what is objected to.

PART III.

In the application of the General Minimum Time-rates set out in Parts I. and II. of this Schedule the following provisions apply:

Section I.—(a) In the case of classes of whole-time workers, employed by the week or longer period, whose customary working week consists of a number of hours less than 48 but not less than 40, a "week" means a week of the number of hours customarily worked by the class in question;

(b) In all other cases a "week" means a

week of 48 hours.

Section II.—For the purpose of calculating the hourly rate applicable in respect of each hour of employment the General Minimum Time-Rates set out must be divided:

(a) In the case of the workers referred to in Section I. (a) of this part of this Schedule by the number of hours per week customarily worked by the class in question;

(b) In all other cases by 48.

PART IV.

Proposed Overtime Rates for Male and Female Workers (All Ages).

Section I.—In accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board propose to declare the normal number of hours of work in the trade to be as follows:

In any week, 48.

On Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, 6.

Section II.—The Trade Board propose to fix for all Male and Female Workers Overtime Rates in respect of hours worked by a worker in excess of the declared normal number of hours of work in the trade as follows:

(a) For all hours worked in excess of six on Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays the Overtime Rate shall be twice the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable, i.e.,

Double Time.

(b) For all hours worked in excess of 48 in any week the Overtime Rate shall be One-anda-Quarter times the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable, i.e., Time-and-a-Quarter for the first eight hours, and thereafter One-and-a-Half time the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable, i.e., Time-and-a-Half, except in so far as a higher Overtime Rate is payable under the provisions of Sub-Section (a) of this Section.

PART V.

For the purpose of this notice the following definitions shall apply:-

Section I.—A Foreman is a person who is employed in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Milk Distributive) Order, 1920, and to whom is deputed the duty of exercising supervising authority over workers exceeding five in number (exclusive of the foreman) working in any shop, department or other branch of the trade.

Section II.—A Roundswoman is a female

person in charge of a round or rounds.
SECTION III.—A Shop Assistant is a male or female person wholly or mainly employed in a shop in serving customers and/or in checking in and out.

PART VI.

The above Minimum Rates of Wages shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all Male and Female workers in Scotland in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Milk Distributive) Order, 1920, that is to say :-

- 1. (a) The wholesale or retail sale of fresh milk when carried on as a main or distinct business or as a distinct branch or department of a business
- (b) The sale of food or drink for consumption on the premises, or of other goods, when any such sale is carried on in association with and as a subsidiary part of such business, branch or department as aforesaid, if such sale involves the employment of workers who are principally employed in the sale specified in (a) above.

2. (a) The following operations when incidental to the sales specified in 1 above:—

(i.) Boxing, parcelling, labelling, weighing, measuring, checking, bottling, unpacking, packing;
(ii.) Collecting, delivering, despatching,

horsekeeping, cleaning vehicles;

(iii.) Portering, lift or hoist operating, timekeeping, storing, stock-keeping, warehousing, cleaning premises;
(iv.) Pasteurizing, cooling, separating of

milk;

- (v.) Cleaning utensils or receptacles; (vi.) Blending, testing, sampling; (vii.) Other incidental operations;
- (b) Clerical work or canvassing when incidental to and carried on in conjunction with the work specified in 1 above.

But excluding any operations in:—

- (a) The transport of goods by common carriers;
- (b) Any industry or trade concerned exclusively with carting and operations incidental thereto;

(c) Post Office business;

(d) Agriculture within the meaning of the Corn Production Act, 1917.

PART VII.

SECTION I.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages shall be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other provident fund.

Section II.—The above minimum rates of wages are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages, or to agreements made or that may be made between employers and workers for the payment of wages in excess of these minimum rates of wages.

The Trade Board will consider any objections to the above proposals to fix which may be lodged with them within two months from 2nd November, 1920. Proposed Overtime Rates for Male and Female Workers.

SECTION I .- In accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board hereby Propose to Declare the normal number of hours of work per week in the trade to be 48.

Provided that all hours worked on Sundays shall be regarded as Overtime to which the

Overtime Rates shall apply.

Section II.—The mimimum rates for Overtime in respect of hours worked by a worker in excess of the declared normal number of hours of work per week in the trade shall be as follows:

(a) For the first two hours of overtime in any week (excluding all hours worked on Sundays), the Overtime Rate shall be oneand-a-quarter times the minimum rate other-

wise applicable, i.e., Time-and-a-quarter.

(b) For overtime after the first two hours of overtime in any week (excluding all hours worked on Sundays), the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-half times the minimum rate otherwise applicable, i.e., Time-and-a-half.

(c) For all hours worked on Sundays the Overtime Rate shall be Twice the minimum rate otherwise applicable, i.e., Double Time.

Note.—The hours which females, young persons and children are allowed to work are subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts.

PART III.

The above Minimum Rates of Wages shall, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, apply, as specified above, to all male and female workers in Great Britain in respect of any time during which they are employed in any section of the Cotton Waste Branch of the Waste Materials Reclamation trade as defined in the Regulations made by the Minister of Labour, dated 27th August, 1920, that is to

1. The collecting, sorting or grading of cotton waste when carried on in an establishment in which such operations are the main or prin-

cipal business;

2. The following operations when carried on in or in association with or in conjunction with any establishment of the kind specified in paragraph 1 above:—
(a) The willowing, machining, breaking-

up, scouring or putting down mixings of

cotton waste;

(b) The collecting, sorting or grading of any of the materials or articles, other than cotton waste, specified in paragraph 1 or paragraph 2 of the Appendix to the Trade Boards (Waste Materials Reclamation) Order 1920 *

Order, 1920.*

(c) The operations specified in paragraph
3 of the Appendix to the above-mentioned
Order, other than those specified in sub-

paragraph (a) above;†
3. The operations of receiving, packing, compressing, teagling, craning, despatching or warehousing when carried on in association with or in conjunction with any of the operations included in paragraphs 1 and 2 above;

But excluding:-

(i) Any of the operations mentioned in paragraphs 1, 2 and 3 above when carried on in the establishment in which the waste materials are produced or in which they are used as raw materials for further manufacture:

(ii) The making or repairing of sacks or bags when carried on in a factory or workshop engaged solely or mainly in the making or repairing of sacks or bags.

*List of Materials and Articles:-

Rags, waste paper, paper stock; woollen, worsted, jute, flax, hemp or other textile waste; textile clippings or cuttings; used bags, sacks or sacking; scrap rubber; scrap iron or other scrap metal; fur cuttings; rabbit skins; bones or fat; used tins; broken glass or earthenware; discarded clothing (including head-gear or foot-gear); discarded textile articles; old ropes; used bottles or used jars.

†List of Operations:-

The ripping of worn clothes for rags; the picking of old ropes; the trimming of paper salvage; the washing of used bottles or used jars; the washing of used tins; the breaking of scrap metal; the drying of rabbit skins; the making or repairing of sacks or bags; the willowing, pulling, scouring, carbonising or putting down mixings of textile waste (other than cotton waste).

FOREIGN ANIMALS (AMENDMENT) ORDER OF 1920 (No. 2).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:-

Animals from the Channel Islands Prohibited.

1. Unless and until the Minister otherwise orders, it shall not be lawful to land any animal brought from the Channel Islands, and the First Schedule (Prohibited Countries and Parts of Countries) to the Foreign Animals Order of 1910 shall be read and have effect as if those Islands were included in the list of Prohibited Countries and Parts of Countries mentioned in that Schedule.

Interpretation.

2. In this Order terms have the same meaning as in the Foreign Animals Order of 1910.

Commencement.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the third day of November, nineteen hundred and twenty.

Short Title.

4. This Order may be cited as the Foreign Animals (Amendment) Order of 1920 (No. 2).

WILTSHIRE AND DISTRICT (MUZZLING AND CONTROL OF DOGS) ORDER OF 1920 (No. 7).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as

Provision for temporary Movement of Dogs by Licence into and out of the Scheduled District (excepting the Inner Controlled Area).

- 1.—(1.) Notwithstanding the provisions of the Wiltshire and District (Muzzling and Control of Dogs) Order of 1920, a dog may be temporarily moved from any premises in the Scheduled District to which that Order for the time being applies not situate in the Inner Controlled Area to which the provisions of the Wiltshire and District (Muzzling and Control of Dogs) Order of 1920 (No. 3) for the time being apply, to any place outside the Scheduled District, if such movement is authorised by a licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the district in which the premises from which the dog is to be moved are situate, but subject to and in accordance with the following conditions, which shall be specified in the licence, namely:
 - (i) The dog shall be moved back into the Scheduled District within twenty-four hours after its movement out of the Scheduled District:
 - (ii) The licence shall forthwith immediately after the completion of the return movement of the dog be delivered up to the Inspector by whom the licence was granted, or to his representative.
 - (iii) The dog shall at all times during the movement under the licence be efficiently muzzled with an effective wire cage muzzle, but this condition shall not apply to any dog in charge of a competent person while being used for sporting purposes, or for the capture or destruction of vermin, or for the driving or tending of cattle or sheep, or to any pack of hounds while being exercised under the supervision of two or more competent attendants.
- (2.) The restrictions imposed by the abovementioned Orders on the movement of dogs out of the Scheduled District shall not apply to a dog which has been moved to any place in the Scheduled District, not situate in the abovementioned Inner Controlled Area, premises outside the Scheduled District for sporting purposes or for the capture or destruction of vermin, or for the driving or tending of cattle or sheep, provided that the return movement of the dog out of the Scheduled District is authorised by a licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District, and that the return movement is completed within twenty-four hours of the movement of the dog into the Scheduled District.
- (3.) Before a licence is granted by an Inspector under this Order the owner or person in charge of the dog shall produce to him a certificate signed by a Veterinary Surgeon or Veterinary Practitioner showing that the dog was examined by him within four days before the date of the intended movement and was found to be free from any symptoms indicative of rabies.

Application of the existing Orders to Licences under this Order.

2. For the purposes of the Orders referred to in the preceding Article a licence under this Order shall be treated as a licence under those Orders.

Offences.

3. If the conditions of any licence granted under this Order are not complied with, the owner or person in charge of the dog in respect of which the licence is granted shall, each in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Commencement.

4. This Order shall come into operation on the ninth day of November, nineteen hundred and twenty.

Short Title, etc.

5. This Order may be cited as the WILT-SHIRE AND DISTRICT (MUZZLING AND CONTROL of Dogs) Order of 1920 (No. 7), and shall be read with the Orders referred to in Article 1.

To empower the Council to erect or construct hydrants and ballast bins and pits in streets, highways and open spaces, and to authorize any such hydrants and ballast bins and pits erected or constructed before the passing of the Bill.

To confer on the Council, their officers and servants, all powers necessary or expedient for or in relation to any of the purposes aforesaid.

To incorporate, with or without amendment, all or some of the provisions of such public or other Acts or enactments as it may be necessary to incorporate, in order to effect the carrying into execution by the Council of any of the provisions of the Bill.

The Bill will vary and extinguish any rights and privileges which would interfere with its objects, and may confer, vary and extinguish other rights and privileges.

Printed copies of the Bill will be deposited in the Private Bill Office of the House of Commons on or before the 17th day of December next.
