Society shall submit the same for the approval of the Privy Council; and that if such approval shall be given, then such Resolution and approval shall be advertised in the London Gazette; and, on the expiration of one month from such advertisement, the Article named in such Resolution shall be deemed to be a Poison within the meaning of that Act:

And whereas by Section 1 of the Poisons and Pharmacy Act, 1908, it is enacted that Schedule (A) to the Pharmacy Att, 1868, be repealed, and the Schedule to the Poisons and Pharmacy Act, 1908, substituted therefor, and that the said last-named Schedule may be amended by adding thereto or removing therefrom any Article in the manner provided by Section 2 of the Pharmacy Act, 1868:

And whereas the Council of the Pharmaceutical Society of Great Britain did on the 17th day of November, 1920, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them by the Pharmacy Act, 1868, as amended by the Poisons and Pharmacy Act, 1908, resolve and declare as follows:-

"(a) That the description in Part 1 of the schedule to the last named Act 'Coca, any preparation or admixture of, containing 1 or more per cent. of coca alkaloids ' ought to be removed therefrom and that the description 'Coca, any preparation or admixture of, containing 0.1 or more per cent. of coca alkaloids 'ought to be added thereto.

"(b) That Ecgonine and all preparations or admixtures containing 0.1 per cent. of Ecgonine ought to be added to Part 1 of the Schedule to the Poisons and Pharmacy Act,

" (c) That the description in Part 1 of the Schedule to the last named Act 'Opium and all preparations or admixtures containing 0.75 or more per cent. of Morphine 'ought to be removed therefrom, and that the description 'Opium and all preparations or admixtures containing 0.2 or more per cent. of Morphine 'ought to be added thereto.

"(d) That Diamorphine (also known as Heroin) and all preparations or admixtures containing 0.1 per cent. of Diamorphine, ought to be added to Part 1 of the Schedule

to the Poisons and Pharmacy Act, 1908.

"(e) That Zinc Chloride and liquid preparations of Zinc Chloride, except preparations intended to be used for soldering or other purely industrial purpose, provided that they are contained in closed vessels labelled with the word 'Poisonous,' and bearing the name and address of the seller and a notice of the special purpose for which the preparations are intended, ought to be added to Part 2 of the Poisons and Phanmacy Act, 1908.

"(f) That the description in Part 2 of the Schedule to the last named Act 'Coca, any preparation or admixture of, containing more than 0.1 per cent. but not less than 1 per cent. of coca alkaloids,' ought to be re-

moved therefrom."

And whereas the said Society have submitted their Resolution for the approval of the Privy Council, and the Lords of the Privy Council are of opinion that the said Resolution should be approved:

The following Statutes, made by the Governing Body of Clare College, Cambridge, on the 28th day of October, 1920, and sealed on the 22nd day of November, 1920, have been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of their having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877.''

STATUTES to alter the Statutes framed by the Commissioners appointed under the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, in relation to Clare College, in the University of Cambridge, such amending Statutes being duly made at a General Meeting of the Governing Body of the said College specially summoned for the purpose and held on the 28th of October 1920, and passed at the said General Meeting by the votes of not less than two-thirds of the persons present and voting, and now submitted for the approval of His Majesty the King in Council.

We, the Master and Fellows of the said College, in exercise of the powers given us by the 54th Section of the said Act, do hereby alter the Statutes framed by the said Commissioners in manner following, that is to say:

1. By amending Statute 3 in the following

manner, namely:

(a) By omitting paragraph 2, namely, the words, "One of the Fellows shall be called the Fellow on the foundation of Dr. Coles, and by substituting for these words the following words, namely:—
"Two of the Fellows shall be called the

Fellows on the foundation of Dr. Coles.

(b) By omitting the fifth and sixth paragraphs, namely, the words, "The election to vacant Fellowships shall be held on some fixed day in the year, which shall be determined from time to time by the Master and Fellows.

"Twenty-one days before the aforesaid day of election a notice shall be published by the Master of any vacant Fellowship or Fellowships. The Master shall also send notice of such vacancy or vacancies to each one of the Fellows at least fourteen days before the day of election," and by substituting for these paragraphs the following paragraphs, namely,

the words:—
"The election to vacant Fellowships shall be held on such day or days as shall in each case be determined by the Master and

"The Master shall send notice in writing to each one of the Fellows at least fourteen days before the day fixed for any election.

(c) By omitting the twelfth paragraph, namely, the words, "If more than one Fellowship be vacant at the same time, the same form of procedure shall be repeated in filling up each vacancy," and by substituting for these words the following words, namely:-

"If at an election more than one vacancy is to be filled up, the same form of procedure shall be repeated in filling up each vacancy."

2. By amending Statute 5 in the following manner, namely:

By omitting the first paragraph, namely, the words, "The Master and Fellows may, by a vote in which not less than two-thirds of the whole body concur, elect persons distinguished in literature, science, or art to Honorary Fellowships, tenable for life. They may, how-
