## THE RULES OF THE SUPREME COURT, ENGLAND.

The following notice is hereby given, in accordance with Section 1 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893:—

We, the Rule Committee of the Supreme Court, propose to make the following Rules:—

1. These Rules may be cited as the Rules of the Supreme Court (Poor Persons Pending Cases), 1920, and shall apply to applications and cases under the Rules of the Supreme Court (Poor Persons), 1914-16, pending on the 1st day of January, 1921 (hereinafter called the appointed day).

2. All cases in which an assignment for conduct has been made prior to the appointed day shall proceed under the Rules of the Supreme Court (Poor Persons), 1914-16, which shall continue to be applicable to such cases notwithstanding the revocation thereof.

3. All cases in which the application has been referred for inquiry before the appointed day but in which no assignment for conduct has been made before that day shall proceed under the Rules of the Supreme Court (Poor Persons), 1914-16, up to assignment for conduct and thereafter shall proceed under the Rules of the Supreme Court (Poor Persons), 1920.

4. All cases in which the application has been made before the appointed day but in which no reference for inquiry has been made before that day shall after that day proceed under the Rules of the Supreme Court (Poor Persons), 1920.

5. In matrimonial causes falling under Rules 3 and 4 applicants or poor persons may

be required to pay into Court the sum or sums specified in Rule 23 of the Rules of the Supreme Court (Poor Persons), 1920, as a condition of being admitted to take or defend or be a party to legal proceedings or of having the application referred for inquiry as the case may be. If in any such cause no deposit shall be required to be made the procedure as to the out-of-pocket expenses of the conducting solicitor prescribed in Rule 31E in the case of causes other than matrimonial causes shall be followed.

And We, the said Rule Committee, hereby certify that on account of urgency these Rules should come into operation on the 1st day of January, 1921, and we hereby make the said Rules to come into operation on that day as Provisional Rules.

### PADIHAM.

Whereas the Urban District Council of Padiham have made application to the Minister of Health for the issue of a Provisional Order under Sections 297 and 303 of the Public Health Act, 1875, to partially repeal, alter, or amend the Padiham Local Board Act, 1882, and the Padiham Local Board Act, 1889, so as:—

(1) To enable the Council, for the purpose of protecting their waters and water-works from pollution, to purchase by agreement:—

(a) Craggs Farm or Estate, situate in the Township of Sabden, in the County of Lancaster, containing 162 acres 1 rood and 36 perches or thereabouts, with the rights of fishing in such part of the reservoir of the Council known as Churn Clough Reservoir, situate in the said Township of Sabden, as is constructed on land formerly forming part of the said Craggs Farm or Estate and the right of killing and taking game, rabbits and wild fowl thereon and all other (if any) the rights and privileges now vested in the owner of the said Estate called Craggs as the same were reserved to the owner for the time being of the Craggs Estate on the sale to the Council or their predecessors of parts of the said estate for the purposes of their water undertaking; and

(b) Woodhouse Farm, situate in the Township of Goldshaw Booth, in the County of Lancaster, containing 117 acres and 9 perches or thereabouts, and the rights and privileges reserved or granted to the owner or owners for the time being of the Woodhouse Estate in and by the said Acts of 1882 and 1889 or either of them or which are now vested in them over the property of the Council formerly forming part of that Estate;

(2) To enable the Council, subject to the sanction of the Minister of Health, to borrow the moneys required for the purchase of the said lands; and

(3) For the several purposes of the Application or for purposes connected with, incidental to, or consequent on those purposes to make any such alteration or amendment of the said Local Acts, or of any other Local Act or of any Act confirming a Provisional Order made in pursuance of any of the Sanitary Acts or of the Public Health Act, 1875, and in force in the said Urban District as may be necessary or desirable;

And whereas it is proposed that a Provisional Order should be issued in compliance with the said Application;

Notice is hereby given, that R. C. Cox, Esquire, A.M.I.C.E., one of the Inspectors of the Ministry of Health, will attend at the Town Hall, Padiham, on Thursday, the thirteenth day of January, 1921, at ten-thirty o'clock in the forenoon, to hold a Local Inquiry into the subject-matter of the said Application and the proposed Provisional Order.

### LINCOLNSHIRE (ORMSBY DISTRICT) (FOOT - AND - MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER, 1920.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

1. Parts I and IV of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Control of Movement) Order of 1920, hereinafter referred to as "The Principal Order," are hereby applied to the District described in the Schedule hereto, which shall be a Scheduled District for the purposes of that Order.

#### *Movement within the Scheduled District.*

2.—(1) Where an Inspector of the Ministry considers it necessary or expedient, after inquiry, that an animal in the Scheduled District should be permitted to be moved within the Scheduled District as often as occasion may require between different parts of the same farm, he may, notwithstanding any prohibition of movement contained in the principal Order, authorise such movement by an Occupation Licence, and the Inspector may insert in the licence such conditions as he may consider necessary or desirable for the purpose of pre-

venting the animals referred to in the licence from coming into contact with any other animals.

(2) If in respect of any animal the conditions of a licence granted under this Article are not complied with, the owner of the animal and the person for the time being in charge thereof shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

*Short Title.*

3. This Order may be cited as the LINCOLNSHIRE (ORMSBY DISTRICT) (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1920.

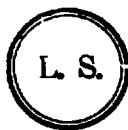
