1. The wholesale or retail sale for human consumption off the premises of any one or more of the commodities specified in the Schedule hereto, or the operations of slaughtering or dressing the animals from which any such commodities are obtained, when such sale or operations is or are carried on in or in association with or in conjunction with any business or establishment or branch or department in which the workers are mainly engaged in such sale or operations;

2. The wholesale or retail sale of any goods when carried on in or in association with or in conjunction with any business or establishment or branch or department of the kind specified in paragraph 1 above.

Including:—

(a) The operations of cold-storing or refrigerating when carried on in association with or in conjunction with the retail sale specified in paragraph 1 above by workers directly employed by employers engaged in any sale or operation specified in that paragraph;

(b) The cooking, preparing or serving of food or drink for consumption by the public.

on or off the premises when performed by workers principally engaged in the sales or operations specified in paragraph 1 or 2 above;

(c) The following or similar operations when carried on in association with or in conjunction with any of the sales or operations specified in paragraph 1 above, by workers directly employed by employers engaged in any sale or operation specified in that paragraph:—

- (i) driving or herding;
- (ii) testing, sealing, sorting, grading, weighing, measuring, checking;
- (iii) the cleaning or washing of carcasses or offal, the dressing of tripe or cowheels;
- (iv) cutting;
- (v) pickling, boning, mincing, preparing;
- (vi) the making or preparation of sausages, sausage meat, brawn, potted meats, edible pastes, meat pies, or similar articles, or of lard or dripping;
- (vii) bacon or ham processing or curing, ham boiling;
- (viii) barrelling, bundling, parcelling, bagging, boxing, packing, unpacking;
- (ix) labelling, ticketing;
- (x) storing, stock-keeping;
- (xi) collecting, delivering, despatching, portering, loading, unloading, lift or hoist operating, time-keeping, the cleaning or heating of premises;
- (xii) the cleaning of implements, receptacles, or utensils, adjusting or sharpening implements;
- (xiii) horse or motor driving and keeping, care of vehicles;
- (xiv) clerical work, buying, commercial travelling or canvassing;

but excluding—

(a) the slaughtering of pigs when carried on in or in association with or in conjunction with any business or establishment or branch or department mainly engaged in bacon or ham processing or curing or ham boiling or the making or preparation of sausages, sausage meat, brawn, potted meats, edible pastes, meat pies or similar articles;

(b) the sale of tripe or cowheels for consumption off the premises when carried on in association with or in conjunction with the sale of fried fish or fried potatoes;

(c) operations performed by workers employed by wholesale brokers or merchants who do not employ warehouse workers or carters;

(d) Post Office business;

(e) operations performed by persons employed by local, Municipal or Public Authorities.

(i) Where an Inspector of the Ministry considers it necessary or expedient, after inquiry, that an animal in a Prohibited Area should be permitted to be moved within such Area as often as occasion may require between different parts of the same farm, he may, notwithstanding any prohibition of movement contained in the principal Order, authorise such movement by an Occupation Licence, and the inspector may insert in the licence such conditions as he may consider necessary or desirable for the purpose of preventing the animals referred to in the licence from coming into contact with any other animals.

(ii) If in respect of any animal the conditions of a licence granted under this Article are not complied with, the owner of the animal and the person for the time being in charge thereof shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2) Part II. of the principal Order is hereby applied to the several boroughs described in the Third Schedule hereto.

Commencement.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

*Prohibition of Movement of Dogs out of
Inner Controlled Area.*

1.—(1) No dog shall be moved out of the Area described in the Schedule hereto (hereinafter referred to as "an Inner Controlled Area"), unless it is accompanied by a licence of the Ministry authorising such movement and signed by an Officer of the Ministry, and any such licence may be subject to such conditions as to the detention and isolation of the dog or otherwise as the Ministry may think necessary or desirable and shall be specified in the licence: Provided that this Article shall not apply to:—(a) the movement of a dog under a licence granted by the Minister under the Importation of Dogs Order of 1914 and the Importation of Dogs (Amendment) Order of 1918 (No. 2) to a port in Great Britain for shipment, or to a place of detention for the purpose of detention and isolation; or (b) the movement of a dog through such area by railway from a place outside the area to another place outside the area without unnecessary delay and without being re-booked within the area.

(2) The provisions of the Wiltshire and District (Muzzling and Control of Dogs) Order of 1920 (No. 7) shall not apply to the movement of dogs out of an Inner Controlled Area.

*Control and Muzzling of Dogs in Inner
Controlled Area.*

2.—(1) A dog in an Inner Controlled Area shall at all times—

(a) whilst in or on any public place be efficiently muzzled with an effective wire cage muzzle, and shall also be led by a person with a collar and chain or other attachment: Provided that the requirement as to leading shall not apply to a dog in charge of a competent person while being used for the driving or tending of cattle or sheep;

(b) whilst in or on any other place be—

(i) confined in a kennel or other enclosure from which the dog cannot escape; or

(ii) secured to some premises by a collar and chain; or

(iii) efficiently muzzled with an effective wire cage muzzle.

Provided that paragraph (b) shall not apply to any pack of hounds while being exercised under the supervision of two or more competent attendants or to any dog in charge of a competent person while being used for the capture or destruction of vermin or rabbits.

(2) The provisions of this Article shall not apply to any dog confined in a suitable hamper, crate, box or other receptacle, so constructed as to render it impossible for such dog while so confined to bite any person or animal.

(3) Article 4 (*Control of Dogs in Scheduled District*) of the Wiltshire and District (Muzzling and Control of Dogs) Order of 1920, hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order," shall not apply to an Inner Controlled Area.

*Seizure, Detention, and Disposal of
Uncontrolled Dogs.*

3.—(1) Any dog found in or on any public place in an Inner Controlled Area in respect of which the provisions of this Order as to control or muzzling are not being complied with, may be seized by the Local Authority or by the police, and any dog so seized shall be dealt with by the Local Authority in the manner directed by Article 5 of the principal Order (*Seizure, Detention, and Disposal of Uncontrolled Dogs*), which Article shall apply accordingly.

(2) Articles 2 and 3 of the principal Order shall apply to dogs moved in contravention of this Order.

Offences.

4.—(1) If a dog is moved in contravention of Article 1 of this Order, the owner of the dog, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the dog, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the dog is moved shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(2) If any dog is not kept under control in manner prescribed by this Order, the owner of the dog, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

5. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.
