ROYAL PROCLAMATION.

GEORGE THE FIFTH, by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, King, Defender of the Faith, EMPERON OF INDIA.

To my Viceroy and Governor-General, and to the Princes and Rulers of the Indian States: .GREETING.

 In My Royal Proclamation of December, 1919, I gave earnest of My affectionate care and regard for the Ruling Princes and Chiefs of the Indian States by signifying My assent to the establishment of a Chamber of Princes. During the year that has since passed My Viceroy and many of the Princes themselves have been engaged in framing for My approval a constitution for the Chamber and the rules and regulations necessary to ensure the smooth and efficient performance of its important func-This work is now complete, and it remains for Me to take the final steps to bring the Chamber into being, in the confident hope that the united counsels of the Princes and Rulers; assembled in formal conclave, will be fruitful of lasting good both to themselves and their subjects, and by advancing the interests that are common to their territories

and to British India, will benefit My Empire as a whole. It is in this hope that I have charged My revered and beloved Uncle, His Royal Highness the Duke of Connaught and Strathearn, to perform on My behalf the ceremony of the inauguration of the Chamber of Princes.

2. It is My firm belief that a future full of great and beneficent activities lies before the Chamber thus established. To the Princes, long versed in the arts of government and statesmanship, it will open still wider fields of Imperial Service. It will afford them opportunities, of which, I am convinced, they will be prompt to avail themselves, of comparing experience, interchanging ideas, and framing mature and balanced conclusions on matters of common interest. Nor will less advantage accrue to My Viceroy and the officers serving under him, to whom the prudent counsels and considered advice of the Chamber cannot fail to be of the greatest assistance. The problems of the future must be faced in a spirit of co-operation and mutual trust. It is in this spirit that I summon the Princes of India to a larger share in My Councils. I do so in full reliance upon their devotion to My Throne and Person. proved as it has been both in long years of peace and in the terrible ordeal of the Great War, and in the confident anticipation that by

this means the bonds of mutual understanding will be strengthened and the growing identity of interest between the Indian States and the rest of My Empire will be fostered and de-

veloped.

3. In My former Proclamation I repeated the assurance, given on many occasions by My Royal predecessors and Myself, of My determination ever to maintain unimpaired the privileges, rights and dignities of the Princes of India. The Princes may rest assured that this pledge remains inviolate and inviolable. I now authorise My Viceroy to publish the terms of the Constitution of the new Chamber. My Viceroy will take its counsel freely in matters relating to the territories of the Indian States generally, and in matters that affect those territories jointly with British India, or with the rest of My Empire. It will have no concern with the internal affairs of individual States or their Rulers or with the relations of individual States to My Government, while the existing rights of the States and their freedom of action will be in no way prejudiced or impaired. It is my earnest hope that the Princes of India will take regular part in the deliberations of the Chamber; but attendance will be a matter of choice, not of constraint. There will be no obligation upon any member to record his opinion, by vote or otherwise, upon any question that may come under discussion; and it is further My desire that, at the discretion of My Vicercy, an opportunity shall be given to any Prince who has not taken a part in the deliberations of the Chamber to record his views on any question that the Chamber has had under its consideration.

4. I pray that the blessing of Divine Providence may rest upon the labours of the Chamber; that its deliberations may be inspired by true wisdom and moderation; and that it may seek and find its best reward in promoting the general weal and in increasing the strength and unity of the mighty Empire over which I have been called upon to rule.

BY THE KING.

A PROCLAMATION FOR PROHIBITING THE EXPOR-TATION OF GOLD AND SILVER COIN AND GOLD BULLION.

GEORGE R.I.

WHEREAS it is provided by section eight of the Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1879, that certain articles therein mentioned may by Proclamation be prohibited to be exported:

And whereas it is provided by section one of

the Gold and Silver (Export Control, &c.) Act, 1920, that the said section eight shall, until the thirty-first day of December, nineteen hundred and twenty-five, have effect as if, in addition to the articles in the said section mentioned, there were included gold or silver coin and gold or silver bullion:

And whereas by Proclamation, dated the tenth day of May, nineteen hundred and seventeen, and made under the powers therein recited, as amended by Orders of Council, dated, respectively, the first day of April, nineteen hundred and nineteen, and the twenty-sixth day of November, nineteen hundred and twenty, the exportation of gold coin and bullion and silver bullion and British silver coin is prohibited:

And whereas it is expedient that the last recited Proclamation, so far as it relates to the said matters, should be revoked, and that gold and silver coin and gold bullion should be prohibited to be exported under the powers conferred by the said section eight of the Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1879, as amended by the said section one of the Gold and Silver (Export Control, &c.) Act, 1920:

Now, therefore, We, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, in pursuance of the said Acts and all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, do proclaim, direct and ordain as follows:—

1. As from the date of this Our Proclamation, and subject as hereinafter provided, gold and silver coin and gold bullion are prohibited to be exported from Our United Kingdom:

Provided always, and it is hereby declared, that this prohibition shall not apply to any such coin or bullion which is exported under licence given by the Board of Trade and in accordance with the conditions (if any) of the licence.

- 2. Gold produced in any part of Our Dominions and imported into Our United Kingdom under any arrangement approved by the Treasury may, notwithstanding anything in this Our Proclamation, be exported in accordance with the terms of the arrangement, and licences will be granted accordingly.
- 3. In the foregoing provisions of this Our Proclamation the expression "gold bullion" includes gold partly manufactured and any mixture or alloy containing gold.
- 4. The said Proclamation of the tenth of May, nineteen hundred and seventeen, as amended by the above recited Orders of Council, is hereby revoked, so far as it relates to gold coin and bullion or to silver bullion and British silver coin:

Provided that this revocation shall not affect the previous operation of the said Proclamation, and any licence given under the said Proclamation with respect to the said articles shall continue in force until the time when it would otherwise have expired, as though given under this Our Proclamation.

LIGHT RAILWAYS ACTS, 1896 AND 1912.

The Minister of Transport has recently confirmed the undermentioned Order made by the Light Railway Commissioners:—Llantrisant Light Railway Order, 1921, authorising the construction of a Light Railway in the Parish of Llantrisant, in the Rural District of Llantrisant and Llantwit Fardre, in the County of Glamorgan.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on him by the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, the Minister of Labour is pleased to establish a Trade Board for the Ostrich and Fancy Feather and Artificial Flower Trade in Great Britain, as specified in the Trade Boards (Ostrich and Fancy Feather and Artificial Flower) Order, 1920, namely:—

- 1. The preparation throughout of ostrich or fancy feathers from the natural condition to the finished feather product.
- 2. The making of artificial flowers, fruit, foliage, grasses, mosses, seeds or pods from paper, wax, textile materials, porcelain, glass, plaster, metal composition, rubber, leather, raffia, celiphane and similar materials.
- 3. The preservation of natural flowers, foliage, grasses, mosses, ferns, seeds or pods.
- 4. The making of hats of any of the articles specified in paragraphs 1, 2 and 3 above, when made in, or in association with, or in conjunction with, any business or establishment, or branch or department or work-room mainly engaged in any of the operations specified in those paragraphs.
- 5. The making of feather garments (including neckwear and muffs), feather trim-

mings for dresses, feather fans or feather mounting: of any description, when made in or in association with, or in conjunction with, any business or establishment or branch or department or workroom mainly engaged in the preparation of ostrich or fancy feathers.

6. The cleaning, dyeing or renovating of any of the articles specified in paragraphs 1, 2 and 3 above, when carried on as a main business or in association with, or in conjunction with, any business or establishment or branch or department or workroom mainly engaged in any of the operations specified in those paragraphs.

Including-

7.—A. Any of the following and similar operations or processes known in the trade as:—

(i.) The sorting, stringing, washing, bleaching, dyeing, beating, scraping, laying-up, sewing, curling, finishing, sticking, twisting, mounting of ostrich or fancy feathers;

(ii.) Pattern-making, dyeing, stiffening, waterproofing, waxing, cutting, stamping, shading, veining, goffing, mould making, mounting, in connection with the manufacture of artificial flowers, fruits, foliage, grasses, mosses, seeds or pods;

(iii.) The dyeing, preserving, painting, varnishing or decoration of natural flowers, foliage, grasses, mosses, ferns,

seeds or pods.

B. The making of any of the articles specified in paragraph 2 above by needlework processes, when carried on in or in association with, or in conjunction with, a business or establishment or branch or department or workroom mainly engaged in any of the operations specified in that paragraph

graph.

C. The making or mounting of any of the articles specified in paragraphs 1, 2 and 3 above for cakes or cracker ornaments, except when made or mounted in or in association with, or in conjunction with, an establishment or business or branch or department or workroom which is mainly engaged in the

making of crackers.

D. The mounting (whether singly or in festoons or garlands) or assembling of any of the articles specified in paragraphs 1, 2 and 3 above for the purpose of decoration, when mounted or assembled in a business or establishment or branch or department or workroom mainly engaged in these operations.

E. The warehousing of, the packing of, and similar operations, in regard to any of the articles specified in paragraphs 1 to 5 above, when carried on in or in association with, or in conjunction with, a business or establishment or branch or department or workroom mainly engaged in any of the operations specified in paragraphs 1 to 6 above.

But excluding-

8.—A. The making of any of the articles mentioned in paragraph 2 above in a business or establishment or branch or department or workroom which is mainly engaged in the manufacture of the materials specified in that paragraph, and not of the articles therein specified.

B. The preparation, making or preserva-

tion of any of the articles specified in paragraphs 1, 2 and 3 above, when carried out in a business or establishment or branch or department or workroom mainly engaged in the manufacture of stationers' sundries.

C. The stiffening or preparation of textile materials for the making of any of the articles mentioned in paragraph 2 above, when carried on in a business or establishment or branch or department or workroom mainly engaged in the preparation of textile materials for other purposes.

D. The making of any of the articles specified in paragraph 2 above wholly from metal, or the mounting thereof when so made, or the making or mounting of plaster flowers, fruits or foliage, except when made

...or mcunted:-

(i) For funeral tokens, wreaths or crosses.

(ii) In association with, or in conjunction with, the making of any of the articles specified in paragraph 2, from any of the materials specified therein.

(iii.) For cake or cracker ornaments as specifically mentioned in the operations and processes included in the trade.

E. The making from rubber of any of the articles mentioned in paragraph 2 above, or the mounting thereof when so made, where carried on in or in association with, or in conjunction with, a business or establishment or branch or department or workroom mainly engaged in the manufacture of other rubber articles.

F. All operations covered by the follow-

ing orders:—

(i) The Trade Boards (Sugar Confectionery and Food Preserving) Order, 1913.

(ii) The Trade Boards (Hat, Cap and

Millinery) Order, 1919.

(iii) The Trade Boards (Women's Clothing) Order, 1919.

(iv) The Trade Boards (Toy) Order,

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trades Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established in Great Britain under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, for the Made up Textiles Trade Specified in the Trade Boards (Made up Textiles) Order, 1920, HEREBY GIVE NOTICE, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that THEY PROPOSE TO FIX General Minimum Time-Rates, Piecework Basis Time Rates and Overtime Rates for Male and Female Workers and to DECLARE the Normal Number of Hours of Work in the Trade for the purpose of the application of the Overtime Rates, as shown in the Schedule set out below.

PART III.

Proposed Overtime Rates for Mute and Female: Workers (all ages).

SECTION I.—In accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board Propose to Declare the Normal Number of Hours of Work in the Trade to be as follows:—

In any week, 48.

On any day (other than Saturday), 9

On Saturday, 5.

this Schedule.

Provided that all hours worked by a worker on Sundays and on Customary Public and Statutory Holidays shall be regarded as Overtime to which the Overtime Rates shall apply.

Section II.—The Trade Board Propose to fix Minimum Rates for Overtime in respect of hours worked by a worker in excess of such normal number of hours as follows:—

- (A) For Workers employed on Time-work:
- (1) For the First Two Hours' Overtime on any day, except Sundays and Customary Public

and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Quarter times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, i.e.

Time-and-a-Quarter.

(2) For Overtime After the First Two Hours' Overtime on any day, except Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Half Times General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, i.e., Time-and-a-Half.
(3) For All Time worked on Sundays and

Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be Twice the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, i.e.,

Double Time.

(4) For all hours worked in any week in excess of 48 the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Quarter Times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, i.e., Time-anda-Quarter, except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the Provisions of paragraphs (2) and (3) of this Section.

The Overtime shall be payable where on any day (not being a Sunday or a Customary Public or Statutory Holiday) the number of hours worked exceeds nine, or, in the case of Saturday, exceeds five, notwithstanding that the number of hours worked in the week does not exceed 48.

(B) For Workers employed on Piece-work:

Workers employed on Piece-work shall be entitled to receive in respect of each hour of Overtime worked, in addition to Piece-Rates, each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the Case, to an Ordinary worker, not less than the Piece-work Basis Time-Rate applicable, a sum equivalent to One-Quarter of the appropriate Piece-work Basis Time-Rate, One-Half of the appropriate Piece-work Basis Time-Rate or the appropriate Piece-work Basis Time-Rate, according as the Overtime Rate which would have been payable under the Provisions of paragraph (A) of this Section if the worker had been employed on Time-work, were Time-and-a-Quarter, Time-and-a-Half or Double Time, respectively

Provided that where it is or may become the established practice of an employer to require attendance only on 5 days a week, the Overtime Rates shall only be payable on such days after

9½ hours have been worked.

Note.—The hours which Female Workers, young persons and children are allowed to work are subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts.

PART IV.

Section I.—The above Proposed Minimum Rates of Wages shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all Male and Female Workers in Great Britain in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of the Trades specified in the Trade Boards (Made-Up Textiles) Order, 1920, that is to sav:

1. The making from woven fabrics of any of the following articles, or the repairing there-

tarpaulins; tents; marquees; rick, cart or wagon covers; nose-bags; oilskin clothing or headgear or linings therefor; flags made of more than one piece; baths, basins, buckets, beds, cots, hammocks, ground sheets or similar articles; girths and articles known in the trade as horse-clothing;

2. The making of any of the following

articles from fabrics of the kind specied in paragraph 1 above, or the repairing thereof, when carried on in association with or in conjunction with the making or repairing of any of the articles mentioned in the said paragraph:-

rope-bound coal and coke sacks; haversacks or knap-sacks; outside and inside blinds or awnings; flags made of one piece; bunting

decorations;

including:-(A) The following operations when carried on in association with or in conjunction with the operations specified in paragraphs 1 and 2 above, viz., operations known in the trade

(i) the dyeing, ciling, tarring, chemically treating, or otherwise proofing of the fabrica mentioned in paragraph 1 and the preparation of dressings therefor

(ii) cutting, sewing, finishing, stencilling or branding by hand or machine;

(B) The following or similar operations performed by hand or machine when incidental to and carried on in association with or in conjunction with the operations specified in parágraphs 1 and 2 above:-

(i) the splicing or braiding of rope, cord or

twine:

(ii) the making of fittings of leather or webbing, including the assembling of metal or other parts;

(iii) the sewing or attaching to any of the articles mentioned in paragraphs 1 or 2 above

of:

(a) rope, cord or twine,

(b) leather, webbing or metal or fittings made thereof;

(C) The warehousing of, the packing of, and similar operations in regard to any of the articles mentioned in paragraphs 1 and 2 above, when carried on in association with or in conjunction with the operations specified in the said paragraphs;

(D) the warehousing of, the packing of, and similar operations in regard to any other articles when carried on in or in association with or in conjunction with any business, estabor department mainly lishment, branch engaged in any of the operations mentioned in

sub-paragraph (C) above;

but excluding:

(i) the making of haversacks and knapsacks when made in association with or in conjunction with the making of and as part of military web equipment;

(ii) the making of folding or deck chairs; (iii) the making or repairing of horseclothing, girths and nose-bags when carried

on in association with or in conjunction with the making or repairing of leather saddlery or harness,

(iv) the making or repairing of rubberised

articles;

(v) the making or repairing of tarpaulins or of rope-bound coal and coke sacks in an establishment, business, branch or department in which the making of sails is the main or principal business of the establishment, business, branch or department;

(vi) the printing by hand or machine of

any business, establishment, branch or department mainly engaged in the warehousing of, the packing of, and similar operations in regard to corn sacks, flour sacks, coal sacks, sugar sacks, cement bags, sand bags, nail bags, potato bags, seed bags and similar eacks or bags;

(viii) operations performed by workers

directly employed by railway companies;
(ix) operations included in the Trade Boards (Hat, Cap and Millinery) Order,

(x) operations included in the Trade Boards (Linen and Cotton Handkerchief and Household Goods and Linen Piece Goods) Order, 1920;

(xi) operations included in the Trade Boards (Rope Twine and Net) Order, 1919, but not specifically mentioned in this Order.

PART V.

SECTION I .- The above Proposed Minimum Rates of Wages shall be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect if

contributions to any Superannuation or other Provident Fund.

Section II.—The above Proposed Minimum Rates of Wages are without prejudice to Workers who are earning higher Rates of Wages, or to Agreements made, or that may be made, between Employers and Workers for the Payment of Wages in Excess of these Minimum Rates of Wages.

The Trade Board will consider any Objections to the above Proposals which may be lodged with them within two months from 4th February, 1921. Such Objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary of the Made-Up Textiles Trade Board (Great Britain), 5, Chancery Lane, London, W.C. 2.

It is desirable that the Objections should

state precisely, and so far as possible with reasons, what is objected to.

MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES (AS VARIED AND FIXED). Effective as from 4th February, 1921.*

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, the Lace Finishing Trade Board estab-lished under that Act for certain branches of the Machine-made Lace and Net Finishing Trade as defined in the Regulations made by the Board of Trade, and dated 16th March, 1914, having given due notice on 8th November, 1920, of Proposal further to Vary General Minimum Time-Rates and General Minimum Piece-Rates as therein shown, and To Fix certain other General Minimum Piece-Rates, HEREBY GIVE NOTICE THAT THEY HAVE VARIED and FIXED such General Minimum Tim rates and General Minimum Piece-Rates, and that the Minimum Rates of Wages as Varied and Fixed are shown in the Schedule set out below, which is incorporated herewith.

And the Trade Board FURTHER GIVE NOTICE that they have received notification from the Minister of Labour that he has made an Order, dated 1st February, 1921, under Section 4 (2) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, confirming the minimum rates of wages as varied and fixed by the Trade Board and specifying 4th February, 1921,* as the date from which such minimum rates of wages shall become effective.

* Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, the rates shall become effective as from the beginning of the next full pay period, but in no case later than 10th February, 1921.

SECTION I.—The General Minimum Piece Rates shall not apply in any case where specia difficulty is caused by bad cotton, making or dressing. In all such eases the piece rates paid must be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an ORDINARY worker at least the equivalent of the General Minimum Time Rate applicable.

SCHEDULE. PART III .- continued.

SECTION II.—Workers who fetch their own work from the Warehouse, and do not receive it through a Middlewoman or Middleman, shall be entitled to a Minimum Rate not less than 15 per cent. above that otherwise payable.

SECTION III.—The General Minimum Piece-Rates set out above apply to the actual workers and not to Middlewomen or Middlemen; the practice of good employers is to pay Middlewomen or Middlemen in addition to such Rates a commission of 25 per cent.

NOTE.—As regards all work for which no General Minimum Piece-Rates are fixed, the piece-rates paid by the employer must be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an ORDINARY worker at least the equivalent of the General Minimum Time-Rate.

PART IV.

General Minimum Time-Rates.

For the Trade of Machine-made Lace and Net Finishing, including the Finishing of those Hair Nets, Veilings and Quillings which are the Product of Plain Net Machines, but excluding the Finishing of all other Products of Plain Net Machines.

A.—Workers (other than Learners, as defined in Part V. of this Schedule), 7½d. per hour. Provided that:—

(a) In the case of workers specified in Section II. of Part III. of this Schedule the General Minimum Time-Rate shall be 8½d. per hour.

(b) In the case of workers entering the trade for the first time after the age of 18, the General Minimum Time-Rate applicable during the first six months of their employment shall be 3d. per hour, and thereafter the General Minimum Time-Rate applicable shall be the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate for workers other than Learners.

The General Minimum Time-Rates for Learners are weekly rates based on a week of 48 hours, but they shall be subject to a proportionate increase or decrease according as the number of hours of employment in any week is more or less than 48.

In reckoning the period of employment for the purpose of determining the General Minimum Time-Rate applicable to a learner, previous experience in any section of the trade covered by this Notice must be included except (1) that experience in finishing Hair Nets shall be included only in cases where the worker is employed in that section of the trade, and (2) in the Hair Net section of the trade no experience except in finishing Hair Nets shall be included.

(c) Are working on frame clipping in either a warehouse or a workshop.
(d) Hold a certificate from the Trade Board issued on an application made at the commencement of the employment or within such period thereafter as the Trade Board may in any case or class of cases allow. Provided always that in granting or withholding such certificate the Trade Board may take into consideration whether, having regard to the number of learners employed in any factory or workshop or under any journeyman or worker, the learner proposed to be certificated has a reasonable prospect of receiving due instruction. Provided also that any certificate may be withdrawn if the Trade Board consider that the conditions of employment have ceased to be such as would have originally justified the grant thereof.

PART VI.

The above minimum rates of wages shall be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other provident fund.

In the administrative county of Middlesex:

The parishes of Harefield. Uxbridge, Hillingdon East, Hillingdon West and Cowley;

And also comprising:

The county borough of Reading.

The petty sessional divisions of Hungerford and Lambourn, and the parishes of Welford, East Shefford, Great Shefford, Fawley, Letcombe Bassett, Childrey, Sparsholt, Kingston Lisle, Uffington, Woolstone, Compton Beauchamp, Ashbury, and Bourton; and

In the administrative county of Dorset:

The borough of Poole, the petty sessional divisions of Shaftesbury, Wimborne, Sturminster, and Blandford, such portions of the petty sessional divisions of Sherborne, Cerne, Dorchester and Wareham as lie to the north and east of the railway line from Yeovil via Maiden Newton, Dorchester, Wareham, and Wimborne to Ringwood.

- (5) An Area comprising the borough of Ealing, the petty sessional divisions of Brentford and Willesden, and the parish of Wembley (including its detached part), in the administrative county of Middlesex; and the Metropolitan borough of Hammersmith, in the administrative county of London.

*In this area dogs are not required to be muzzled, but movement out is prohibited.
