“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to approve of Officers being allowed at our discretion to qualify as Interpreters in the Roumanian language under the same general conditions as are laid down in the aforesaid Orders in Council for Officers qualifying in modern Greek:

And whereas Her late Majesty Queen Victoria was pleased, by Her Order in Council of the 29th April, 1869, in pursuance of the said Act, to direct the observance of the Bye-law in

the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, whose names are hereunto subscribed, being Commissioners of Sea Fisheries, acting in pursuance of the sixty-seventh section of an Act passed in the Session of Parliament of the thirty-first and thirty-second years of Her present Majesty, chapter forty-five, called 'The Sea Fisheries Act, 1868,' do hereby decide and appoint that the close time, during which it shall not be lawful to dredge for, take, catch, or destroy any oyster or oyster-brood, on or off any part of the east and south-east coast of Ireland, within the distance of twenty miles measured from a straight line drawn from the eastern point of Lambay Island, in the county of Dublin, to Carnsore Point, in the county of Wexford, outside the exclusive fishery limits of the British Islands, shall be between the thirtieth day of April and the first day of September in each year.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Act, 1919, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of two neighbouring Benefices, that is to say, the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Aston Rowant and the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Crowell, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Oxford and in the Diocese of Oxford:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Hubert Murray, Bishop of Oxford, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Act,

1919, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Aston Rowant and Crowell duly made their report to the said Bishop of Oxford and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Oxford signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas each of the said Benefices of Aston Rowant and Crowell is now full, the Reverend Thomas Duke Hickes being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Aston Rowant and the Reverend George Victor Collier being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Crowell:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England with the consent of the said Hubert Murray, Bishop of Oxford (in testimony whereof he has hereunto set his hand), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Aston Rowant and the said Benefice of Crowell shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Aston Rowant with Crowell,' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant, the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith; and if upon that day both of the said two Benefices shall not be vacant then the union of the said two Benefices shall take effect on the next avoidance after that day of that one of the said two Benefices which shall last be avoided by the said present Incumbent thereof, and the then Incumbent (if any) of the other of the said two Benefices shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Aston Rowant shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"4. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present and nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say:—the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices alternately, the Patron of the said Benefice of Aston Rowant having the right upon the first presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate right of presentation and the Patron of the said Benefice of Crowell having the right upon the second presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate turn thereafter.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been published locally in the manner prescribed in the Statutory Rules made under the said Act and also transmitted in the manner so prescribed to the Patrons affected together with a Notice in each case requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas neither of the two Benefices affected by the said Scheme is situate in a City or Municipal Borough:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the two Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Oxford.

"And whereas the said D'Oyley Scott Ransom is desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Bawtry with Austerfield now vested in him as aforesaid should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop for the time being of the said Diocese of Southwell:

THE GERMAN REPARATIONS (RECOVERY) (NO. 1) ORDER, 1921, DATED THE SEVENTH DAY OF APRIL, 1921, MADE BY THE BOARD OF TRADE.

The Board of Trade, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by Section 5, sub-section 1, of the German Reparations (Recovery) Act, 1921, and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, upon the recommendation of a Committee constituted under Section 5, sub-section (2), of the said Act, hereby make the following Order:

1. This Order may be cited as the German Reparations (Recovery) (No. 1) Order, 1921.

2. Any article of the following description if imported into the United Kingdom before the 15th day of May, 1921, shall be exempt from the provisions of the said Act, that is to say, any article in respect of which it is proved to the satisfaction of the Commissioners of Customs—

(a) that a contract was entered into before the 8th day of March, 1921, and

(b) that a sum of not less than 20 per cent. of the purchase price was irrevocably paid before the said 8th day of March, 1921, in pursuance of such contract, or,

(c) that the physical possession and property in the article the subject of such contract had passed to some person other than a German national prior to the said 8th day of March, 1921.

BOOT AND SHOE REPAIRING TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

PROPOSAL TO VARY GENERAL MINIMUM TIME-RATES AND OVERTIME RATES FOR CERTAIN CLASSES OF MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour and dated 31st Octo-

ber, 1918, the Trade Board established under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, in Great Britain, for the branches of trade specified in the Trade Boards (Boot and Shoe Repairing) Order, 1919, hereby give Notice, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they Propose to Vary the General Minimum Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for certain classes of male and female workers as set out in the Schedules to the Notices issued by the Trade Board and dated 15th November, 1919, and 12th April, 1920, the proposed Minimum Rates of Wages being as shown in the Schedule set out below.

SCHEDULE.
PART I.

Proposed Variation of General Minimum Time-Rates for Certain Classes of Male Workers.

General Minimum Time-Rates at present Fixed.

A. For Male Workers (as specified in Part I of the Schedule to the Notice issued by the Trade Board and dated 15th November, 1919):—

1. For Workers of 21 years of age and upwards, 65s. per week of 48 hours:
2. For Workers of 20 years and under 21, 45s. per week of 48 hours.
3. For Workers of 19 years and under 20, 37s. 6d. per week of 48 hours.
4. For Workers of 18 years and under 19, 32s. per week of 48 hours.
5. For Workers of 17 years and under 18, 27s. per week of 48 hours.
6. For Workers of 16 years and under 17, 22s. per week of 48 hours.

B. For Male Workers employed on Surgical work (as specified in Part IV of the Schedule to the Notice issued by the Trade Board and dated 12th April, 1920), 2s. per hour.

Variation Proposed.

SECTION I.—For Male Workers (other than the classes of workers specified in Sections II and III of Part I of this Schedule, and in paragraphs (a), (b), and (c) of the Proviso to Section I of Part V of this Schedule), 72s. per week of 48 hours.

SECTION II.—For Male Learners (other than Male Indentured Apprentices as specified in paragraph (c) of the Proviso to Section I of Part V of this Schedule), as defined in Section I of Part IV of this Schedule:—

Workers of 20 years and under 21 years of age, 50s. per week of 48 hours.

Workers of 19 years and under 20 years of age, 37s. 6d. per week of 48 hours.

Workers of 18 years and under 19 years of age, 32s. per week of 48 hours.

Workers of 17 years and under 18 years of age, 27s. per week of 48 hours.

Workers of 16 years and under 17 years of age, 22s. per week of 48 hours.

NOTE.—The General Minimum Time-Rates at present effective for Male Workers of 16 and under 21 years of age shall cease to apply to Male Workers other than Learners, as defined in Section I of Part IV of this Schedule, on and after the date on which the General Minimum Time-Rates set out in this Schedule become effective.

SECTION III.—For Male Surgical Boot-Makers as defined in Section II of Part IV of this Schedule), 2s. per hour.

PART II.

Proposed Variation of General Minimum Time-Rates for certain Classes of Female Workers.

General Minimum Time-rates at present Fixed.

A. For Female Workers (as specified in Section I (a) of Part II of the Schedule to the Notice issued by the Trade Board and dated 12th April, 1920):—

1. For Workers of 21 years of age and upwards, 65s. per week of 48 hours.
2. For Workers of 20 years of age and under 21 years of age, 45s. per week of 48 hours.
3. For Workers of 19 years of age and under 20 years of age, 37s. 6d. per week of 48 hours.
4. For Workers of 18 years of age and under 19 years of age, 32s. per week of 48 hours.
5. For Workers of 17 years of age and under 18 years of age, 27s. per week of 48 hours.
6. For Workers of 16 years of age and under 17 years of age, 22s. per week of 48 hours.

B. For Female Workers employed on Surgical work (as specified in Section II of Part II of the Schedule to the Notice issued by the Trade Board and dated 12th April, 1920), 2s. per hour.

Variations Proposed.

SECTION I.—For Female Workers (other than workers employed in a productive department on Patching Machines and Female Surgical Boot-makers as defined in Section II of Part IV of this Schedule):—

1. For Workers of 21 years of age and upwards, 72s. per week of 48 hours.
2. For Workers of 20 years of age and under 21 years of age, 50s. per week of 48 hours.
3. For Workers of 19 years of age and under 20 years of age, 37s. 6d. per week of 48 hours.
4. For Workers of 18 years of age and under 19 years of age, 32s. per week of 48 hours.
5. For Workers of 17 years of age and under 18 years of age, 27s. per week of 48 hours.
6. For Workers of 16 years of age and under 17 years of age, 22s. per week of 48 hours.

SECTION II.—For Female Surgical Boot-makers (as defined in Section II of Part IV of this Schedule), 2s. per hour.

NOTE.—No variation is proposed in respect of the Minimum Rates at present effective for Female Workers employed in a Productive Department on Patching Machines.

PART III.

Proposed Variation of Overtime Rates for all Male and Female Workers (other than Workers employed on Piece-work to which General Minimum Piece-Rates are applicable).

SECTION I.—In accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board propose to declare the normal number of hours of work in the trade to be as follows:—

In any Week	48
On Monday	8
On any Day other than Monday,				
Saturday, Sunday or Custom-				
ary Public and Statutory				
Holidays	9

Provided that all hours worked by a worker on Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, and all hours worked on Saturdays (subject to the provisions set out below)

shall be regarded as Overtime, to which the Overtime Rates shall apply.

The above-mentioned provision shall not prejudice a worker's claim to a Saturday Half-holiday where it is now given.

SECTION II.—The proposed Minimum Rates for Overtime in respect of hours worked by a worker in excess of the declared normal number of hours shall be as follows:—

1. On any day other than Saturdays, Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays:—

(a) For the first two hours' Overtime, One-and-a-Quarter times the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, Time-and-a-quarter.

(b) For Overtime after the first two hours of Overtime, One-and-a-Half times the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, Time-and-a-Half.

Provided that where it is or may become the established practice of an employer to require attendance only on five days a week, the Overtime rates set out in paragraphs 1 (a) and (b) of this Section shall not be payable on any day except Friday, Saturday, Sunday and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays until the number of hours worked exceeds $9\frac{1}{2}$ and $11\frac{1}{2}$ respectively, and shall not be payable on Friday until the number of hours worked exceeds 10 and 12 respectively. In the application of this proviso, one other, day in each week, not being Saturday or Sunday, may be, by agreement between the employer and the worker, substituted for Friday.

2. On Saturday in respect of—

(a) That class of worker who customarily attends on five days a week:

i. For the first two hours of Overtime (that is to say, for the first two hours worked on Saturday) One-and-a-Quarter times the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, Time-and-a-Quarter.

ii. For Overtime after the first two hours of Overtime, One-and-a-Half times the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, Time-and-a-Half

(b) That class of worker who customarily attends on six days a week:

For the first two hours' Overtime worked after the first four hours of work on Saturday One-and-a-Quarter times the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, Time-and-a-Quarter; and for all subsequent Overtime, One-and-a-Half times the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, Time-and-a-Half.

Note.—During the first four hours worked on Saturday the Minimum Rate applicable for this class of worker is the appropriate Minimum Rate set out in Parts I. or II. of the Schedule to this Notice, in Part II. of the Schedule to the Notice dated 13th May, 1920, or in Part I. of the Schedule to the Notice dated 4th September, 1920.

3. On Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, for all time worked, Twice the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, Double Time.

In the application of the above Overtime Rates, any other day, not being Sunday, may be by agreement in writing between an employer and a worker substituted in place of Saturday as the weekly short day.

Note.—The Overtime Rates set out in Paragraphs 1, 2 and 3 of this Section are payable in respect of all hours of Overtime worked on any day, notwithstanding that the number of hours worked in the week does not exceed 48.

PART IV.

For the purposes of this Notice the following definitions shall apply:—

SECTION I.—A Male Learner (not being a Male Indentured Apprentice) is a worker who—

(a) During the whole or a substantial part of his time is employed in learning the various branches of the trade, of which benching and finishing must form a part, by an employer who provides the Learner with adequate facilities for such learning, and

(b) Is registered with or has been granted a certificate by the Trade Board in accordance with Rules from time to time laid down by the Trade Board, or has made an application for such registration or certificate, which has been duly acknowledged and is still under consideration. Provided that the certification or registration of the Learner may be cancelled if the other conditions of learnership are not complied with:

Provided that an employer may employ a Learner at his first employment without a certificate or registration for a probation period not exceeding four weeks; but in the event of such Learner being continued thereafter at his employment, the probation period shall be included in his period of learnership:

Provided also that—

in cases where the number of Journeymen employed in the workshop in which the Learner is employed throughout the period of 12 months prior to the date of application for registration is:—

Three or less,
Four to six,
Seven to nine,

the registration and employment of male workers as Learners at the Minimum Rates of Wages set out in Part I of this Schedule for Learners, shall be limited to:—

One,
Two,
Three,

and thereafter not more than one additional Learner may be employed for every additional three or fewer than three Journeymen.

For the purpose of determining the Proportion of Learners to Journeymen in accordance with the foregoing Provision, an Apprentice shall count as a "Learner," notwithstanding that such Apprentice does not come within the scope of the Minimum Rates set out in this Notice.

SECTION II.—"A Surgical Bootmaker" is a worker who is capable of carrying throughout any job in Surgical Bootmaking coming into the Shop or Factory, that is to say, the making or repairing of a boot or a shoe for a foot very malformed or very abnormal in shape, either from birth or as the result of any subsequent injury or disease.

PART V.

SECTION I.—The Proposed Minimum Rates of Wages set out in this Schedule shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards

Acts, to all workers of the classes specified in the Schedule to this Notice in Great Britain, in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of the Trade specified in the Trade Boards (Boot and Shoe Repairing) Order, 1919, that is to say, the repairing, wherever carried on, of boots, shoes, slippers, and all kinds of leather footwear, including the making of Bespoke Handsewn, rivetted, or pegged leather footwear, but excluding the manufacture of leather footwear on a large scale, the repairing of saddlery and leather goods other than leather footwear, and the retailing of leather footwear.

Provided that the Proposed General Minimum Time-Rates set out in Part I of the Schedule to this Notice shall not apply to the following classes of Male Workers:—

(a) Foremen and Managers as specified in Part II of the Schedule to the Notice issued by the Trade Board and dated 13th May, 1920.

(b) Male Workers employed in operating Power Sole-Stitchers, Blake or Richardson Machines, and Male Workers employed as Pressmen and responsible for Cutting and Costing, all as specified in Part I of the Schedule to the Notice issued by the Trade Board and dated 4th September, 1920.

(c) Male Indentured Apprentices as specified in Section I of Part I of the Schedule to the Notice of Proposal issued by the Trade Board and dated 1st February, 1921.

SECTION II.—The Proposed Minimum Rates of Wages set out in this Schedule are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages.

The Trade Board will consider any Objections to the above Proposal to Vary which may be lodged with them within two months from 26th March, 1921. Such Objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary of the Boot and Shoe Repairing Trade Board (Great Britain), 5, Chancery Lane, London, W.C. 2.

It is desirable that the Objections should state precisely, and so far as possible with reasons, what is objected to.

The effect of the said Order is to empower the Council to grant upon such terms and conditions and for such period as they may think fit licences for pleasure boats and pleasure vessels to be let or to be used for carrying passengers for hire, and to the boatmen or persons assisting in the charge or navigation of such boats and vessels, and to suspend or revoke any such licence whenever they shall deem such suspension or revocation necessary or desirable in the interest of the public; to

prohibit the letting for hire of, and the carrying of passengers for hire in, any pleasure boat or vessel not so licensed or during the suspension of the licence therefor, to restrict the number of passengers to be carried in any such boat or vessel to the number specified in the licence applying thereto, and to require the name of the owner of the said boat or vessel and the number of persons which it is licensed to carry to be painted in letters and figures not less than one inch in height and three-quarters of an inch in breadth on a conspicuous part of the said boat or vessel.

A licence under the said Section is not required for any boat or vessel duly licensed by or under any regulations of the Board of Trade.

Every person who shall act in contravention of the provisions of the said Section shall for each offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding 40s.

Any person deeming himself aggrieved by the withholding, suspension, or revocation of any licence under the provisions of the said Section may appeal to a Petty Sessional Court held after the expiration of two clear days after such withholding, suspension, or revocation on giving 24 hours' written notice of such appeal and the ground thereof to the Clerk to the Council, and the Court shall have power to make such Order as they see fit and to award costs.
