PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by "The Consular Salaries and Fees Act, 1891," His Majesty the King is authorized by Order in Council to fix the fees to be taken in respect of any matter or thing done by a Consular officer in the execution of his office, and to vary such fees by way of increase or decrease, and to abolish fees, and to create new fees:

And whereas by "The Foreign Marriage Act, 1892," by "The Marriage with Foreigners Act, 1906," and by "The Foreign Marriages Order in Council, 1913," it is provided that certain things may or shall be done on payment of the proper fee, and those Acts further provide that the proper fee shall be such fee as may for the time being be fixed under "The Consular Salaries and Fees Act, 1891," and that the fee so fixed as respects a Consul shall be the fee which may be taken by any Marriage officer:

And whereas it is expedient that the tables of fees fixed by "The Consular Fees (General) Order in Council, 1906," "The China (Consular and Marriage Fees) Order in Council, 1906," and "The Japan (Consular and Marriage Fees) Order in Council, 1906," should in

certain respects be amended, and that the whole of the fees to be taken by Consular officers and Marriage officers should be fixed by an Order in Council made under the provisions of "The Consular Salaries and Fees Act, 1891":

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in pursuance of the before-mentioned Acts, is pleased by and with the advice of His Privy Council to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. This Order may be cited as "The Consular Fees Order in Council, 1921."

2. The several fees set forth in the tables annexed to this Order are hereby established, and the said tables and notes thereto shall be construed as part of this Order.

The fees specified in column 1 of the tables are to be paid and taken in all foreign countries other than China and Japan; the fees specified in column 2 are to be paid and taken in Japan; and the fees specified in column 3 are to be paid and taken in China.

3. The fees to be paid and taken in respect of matters arising under "The China and Corea (Shipping Registry) Order in Council, 1904," shall be the fees contained in tables annexed to this Order numbered 1 to 9H respectively.

The fees to be paid and taken in respect of matters arising under "The China (Passenger-ships Fees) Order in Council, 1908," and "The China (Consular Fees) Order in Council, 1909," shall be the fees contained in Part V of the

tables annexed to this Order, numbered 114 to 117 and 118 to 120 respectively.

The fees to be paid and taken in respect of matters arising under "The Consular Fees (Amendment) Order in Council, 1921," are the fees set out under No. 77 of the tables annexed to this Order.

4. This Order shall come into operation forthwith.

5. On and after the day on which this Order comes into operation in any place to which this Order applies, the Orders in Council mentioned in the second schedule to this Order shall be repealed as to that place, but this repeal shall not affect any right or liability existing at the commencement of this Order in any place.

And the Right Honourable George Nathaniel Earl Curzon of Kedleston, K.G., one of His

Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein.

2.—(i) The Secretary of State, with the concurrence of the Commissioners of the Treasury, may impose a surtax not exceeding 25 per cent. over and above the scale of fees established by "The Consular Fees Order in Council, 1921."

(ii) The Secretary of State may, at his discretion, except from the application of such surtax any particular fee or fees set forth in the tables annexed to the Order above referred to.

3. This Order shall come into operation at the same time as "The Consular Fees Order in Council, 1921."

WHEREAS by Section 26 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, after reciting that "Whereas in some instances Tithings, Hamlets, Chapelrys, and other Places or Districts may be separated from the Parishes or Mother Churches to which they belong, with great

advantage, and Places altogether Extra-Parochial may, in some instances, with advantage be annexed to Parishes or Districts to which they are contiguous, or be constituted Separate Parishes for ecclesiastical purposes," it is, amongst other things, enacted, "That when with respect to his own Diocese it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, or when the Bishop of any Diocese shall represent to the said Archbishop, that any such Tithing, Hamlet, Chapelry, Place or District within the Diocese of such Archbishop, or the Diocese of such Bishop, as the case may be, may be advantageously separated from any Parish or Mother Church, and either be constituted a Separate Benefice by itself or be united to any other Parish to which it may be more conveniently annexed, or to any other adjoining Tithing, Hamlet, Chapelry, Place, or District, Parochial or Extra-Parochial, so as to form a Separate Parish or Benefice, or that any Extra-Parochial Place may with advantage be annexed to any Parish to which it is contiguous, or be constituted a Separate Parish for ecclesiastical purposes; and the said Archbishop, or Bishop, shall draw up a Scheme in writing (the Scheme of such Bishop to be transmitted to the said Archbishop for his consideration) describing the mode in which it appears to him that the alteration may best be effected, and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to Ecclesiastical Jurisdiction, Glebe Lands, Tithes, Rent Charges and other Ecclesiastical Dues, Rates and Payments, and in respect to Patronage and rights to Pews, may be made with justice to all parties interested; and if the Patron or Patrons of the Benefice or Benefices to be affected by such alteration shall consent in writing under his or their hands to such Scheme, or to such modification thereof, as the said Archbishop may approve, and the said Archbishop shall, on full consideration and inquiry, be satisfied with any such Scheme, or modification thereof, and shall certify the same and such consent as aforesaid, by his report to His Majesty in Council, it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council to make an Order for carrying such Scheme, or modification thereof, as the case may be, into effect."

And whereas the Right Reverend Bertram, Lord Bishop of Norwich, hath made a Representation in a writing dated the 1st day of March, 1921, to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, as follows:—

"I Bertram Lord Bishop of Norwich do hereby represent to Your Grace that within the County of Norfolk and my Diocese of Norwich are the Rectory and Parish of Overstrand and the Vicarage and Parish of Cromer.

"That according to the last Census the population of the said Parish of Overstrand is one thousand three hundred and four and the population of the said Parish of Cromer is three thousand and one hundred.

"That there is a District in the said Parish of Overstrand known by the name of Suffield Park lying at a distance from the Parish Church and contiguous to the Parish of Cromer the main population of such District being resident at a distance from the Parish Church of Overstrand of one thousand and four hundred yards or thereabouts.

"That the population of the said District of Suffield Park amounts to nine hundred and forty-nine persons or thereabouts.

"That the said District is edged red on the map hereto annexed.

"That it appears to me that the said District may under the provisions of the Act of Parliament of the first and second years of Queen Victoria Cap. 106 and the second and third years of Her said Majesty Cap. 49 be advantageously separated from the remainder of the said Parish of Overstrand and be united to the said contiguous Parish of Cromer.

"That pursuant to the direction contained in the twenty-sixth section of the said first-named Act of Parliament I the said Lord Bishop have drawn up a Scheme in writing appended to this Representation describing the mode in which it appears to me that the alteration above proposed may be best effected and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to Ecclesiastical Jurisdiction Glebe Lands Tithes Rent Charges and other Ecclesiastical Dues Rates and Payments and in respect to Patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested and I do hereby submit the same to Your Grace together with the consents in writing of Sir Samuel John Gurney Hoare Bt. The Reverend Canon Sidney Pelham John Henry Gurney Esquire Gerard Hudson Gurney Esquire and Sarah Evelyn Gurney the Patrons of the said Rectory of Overstrand and Robert Barclay Esquire John Henry Buxton Esquire Francis Hubert Barclay Esquire and the said Canon Sidney Pelham the Patrons of the said Vicarage of Cromer and also of the Reverend Edmund Mark Davys, Clerk, the Vicar of Cromer to the intent that if Your Grace shall on full consideration and inquiry be satisfied with such Scheme you may certify the same and such consents as aforesaid to His Majesty in Council."

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the Consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows:—

"SCHEME.

"It is proposed to separate the District of Suffield Park in the Parish of Overstrand in the Diocese of Norwich edged red in the plan hereto annexed from the remainder of the said Parish and to unite the same to the contiguous Parish of Cromer in the same County and Diocese.

"That such District shall be subject to the same ecclesiastical jurisdiction as the said Parish of Cromer.

"That except as hereinafter mentioned no alteration shall be made in the emoluments of the said Rectory of Overstrand.

"That Baptisms Churchings Marriages and Burials of persons living and dying within the said District of Suffield Park shall be performed in the Church of Cromer and that all fees for any such offices and all ecclesiastical dues offerings and other emoluments of like character arising in the said District and hitherto usually payable to the Rector of Overstrand shall belong to the Vicar of Cromer aforesaid.

"That the Vicar of Cromer shall have exclusive cure of souls within the limits of the said District of Suffield Park.

"That the Patronage of the said two benefices shall not be affected by this Scheme.

"That the inhabitants of the said District shall be exonerated from all liability to repair the Parish Church of Overstrand aforesaid but shall (subject to the provisions of the Compul-

sory Church Rates Abolition Act 1868) be liable with the inhabitants of the said Parish of Cromer to the repairs of the Parish Church of Cromer aforesaid.

"That the inhabitants of such District shall be entitled to accommodation in the Parish Church of Cromer but shall cease to be entitled to any right or accommodation in the Church of Overstrand except nevertheless any person or persons (if any) possessing a legal right by Faculty or otherwise to any pew or sitting in the Church of Overstrand or to any Vault or burial place in the Churchyard of Overstrand and who may not be willing to relinquish and give up the same.

Provided that:—

(a) In the case of workers entering the trade for the first time between the ages of 16 and 18 years, the General Minimum Time-Rates and Guaranteed Time-Rates for Piece-workers payable during the first six months' period of employment shall be ½d. per hour less than the minimum rates otherwise applicable as set out above. Such workers, on completing six months' employment in the trade, shall be entitled to the minimum rates applicable to their age as set out in the foregoing Table.

(b) In the case of workers entering the trade for the first time at or over the age of 18 years, the General Minimum Time-Rates payable during the first twelve months' period of employment shall be as follows:—

(i) During 1st three months of employment, 6d. per hour.

(ii) During 2nd three months of employment, 6½d. per hour.

(iii) During 3rd three months of employment, 7½d. per hour.

(iv) During 4th three months of employment, 8d. per hour.

The General Minimum Time-Rate applicable to such workers on completing twelve months' employment in the trade shall be 8½d. per hour.

SECTION II.—(a) The Piece-work Basis Time-Rates set out in Section I. are applicable to the workers specified therein as follows, that is to say: where a worker is employed on Piece-work, each Piece-Rate paid must be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an Ordinary Worker, not less than the Piece-work Basis Time-Rate applicable.

(b) The Guaranteed Time-Rates for Piece-workers set out in Section I. are for the purpose of securing to workers employed on Piece-work a Minimum Rate of remuneration on a Time-Work Basis, and such workers shall be entitled to be paid at not less than the Guaranteed Time-Rate applicable to a worker of her age as set out in Section I. in any case where her earnings on Piece-work are less than such sum.

PART II.

Overtime Rates (as Varied) for Female Workers (All Ages).

SECTION I.—In accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board have declared the normal number of hours of work in the trade to be as follows:—

In any week	48
On Saturday	4½
On any other week-day	9

Provided that all hours worked by a worker on Sundays shall be regarded as Overtime, to which the Overtime Rates shall apply.

SECTION II.—The Minimum Rates for Overtime for all Female Workers in respect of hours worked by a worker in excess of the declared normal number of hours shall be as follows:—

(a) For the first two hours of Overtime on any day except Sunday, the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Quarter times the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, Time-and-a-Quarter.

(b) For Overtime after the first two hours of Overtime on any day except Sunday, the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Half times the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, Time-and-a-Half.

(c) For all time worked on Sunday, the Overtime Rate shall be Twice the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, Double-Time.

(d) For all hours worked in any week in excess of 48, the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Quarter times the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, Time-and-a-Quarter, except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of paragraphs (b) and (c) of this Section.

The Overtime Rates shall be payable where on any day (not being a Sunday) the number of hours worked exceeds 9, or in the case of Saturday exceeds 4½, notwithstanding that the number of hours worked in the week does not exceed 48.

SECTION III.—The provisions of this Part of this Notice are without prejudice to the payment of Overtime Rates after a lesser number of hours than those declared by the Trade Board to be the normal number in the trade, in cases where such lesser number of hours constitutes the number customarily worked in the establishment.

NOTE.—The hours which Female Workers, Young Persons and Children are allowed to work are subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts and to the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920.

PART III.

The above Minimum Rates shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all Female Workers in respect of all time during which they are employed in Great Britain in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Linen and Cotton Handkerchief and Household Goods and Linen Piece Goods) Order, 1920, that is to say:—

1. The making of such articles as are specified in (a) and (b) below, from linen or cotton or mixed linen and cotton fabrics (excepting knitted fabrics), or from other textile fabrics when the work is carried on in establishments mainly engaged in the

making of such articles from the beforementioned fabrics, *viz.*:—

(a) Handkerchiefs (including Mufflers or Flags when made in association or in conjunction with handkerchiefs);

(b) Bed-Linen, Towels, Dusters, Table-napery, Bed-spreads, Tea-cloths, Table-centres, Sideboard-covers, Cushion-covers or similar household articles;

including all or any of the following operations:—

(i) Hooking, cutting or tearing the material;

(ii) Vice-folding;

(iii) Machine hemming, hem-stitching, spoking, overlocking, tambouring, button-holing, and other plain or fancy machine stitching;

(iv) All processes of embroidery or decorative needlework done by machine, whether before or after the making of the articles of the description specified above;

(v) The following processes, if done by machine:—Thread-drawing, thread-clipping, top-sewing, scalloping, nickelling and paring;

(vi) All processes of laundering, smoothing, folding, ornamenting, boxing, finishing, warehousing, packing, and other similar operations incidental to or appertaining to the making of the articles of the description specified above.

2. The making-up in linen warehouses or in establishments mainly engaged in linen lapping, of linen or mixed linen and cotton or other textile fabrics in the piece, or of linen or mixed linen and cotton or other textile articles cut from the piece, including:—

Measuring, cutting, lapping, ornamenting, boxing, warehousing, packing and similar operations.

PART IV.

SECTION I.—The above Minimum Rates shall be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other provident fund.

SECTION II.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages.

SECTION I.—In accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board have declared the normal number of hours of work per week in the trade to be 48. Provided that all hours worked on Sundays shall be regarded as Overtime to which the Overtime Rates shall apply.

SECTION II.—The minimum rates for Overtime in respect of hours worked by a worker in excess of the declared normal number of hours of work in the trade shall be as follows:—

(a) For the first two hours of overtime in any week (excluding all hours worked on Sundays), the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Quarter times the minimum rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, Time-and-a-Quarter.

(b) For overtime after the first two hours of overtime in any week (excluding all hours worked on Sundays), the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Half times the minimum rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, Time-and-a-Half.

(c) For all hours worked on Sundays the Overtime Rate shall be Twice the minimum rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, Double Time.

Note.—The hours which females, young persons and children are allowed to work are subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts, and of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920.

PART III.

The above Minimum Rates of Wages shall, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, apply, as specified above, to all male and female workers in Great Britain in respect of all time during which they are employed in any section of the Cotton Waste Branch of the Waste Materials Reclamation Trade as defined in the Regulations made by the Minister of Labour, dated 27th August, 1920, that is to say:—

1. The collecting, sorting or grading of cotton waste when carried on in an establishment in which such operations are the main or principal business.

2. The following operations when carried on in or in association with or in conjunction with any establishment of the kind specified in paragraph 1 above:—

(a) The willowing, machining, breaking-up, scouring or putting down mixings of cotton waste;

(b) The collecting, sorting or grading of any of the materials or articles, other

than cotton waste, specified in paragraph 1 or paragraph 2 of the Appendix to the Trade Boards (Waste Materials Reclamation) Order, 1920;*

(c) The operations specified in paragraph 3 of the Appendix to the above mentioned Order, other than those specified in sub-paragraph (a) above.†

3. The operations of receiving, packing, compressing, teagling, craning, despatching or warehousing when carried on in association with or in conjunction with any of the operations included in paragraphs 1 and 2 above;

But excluding:—

(i) Any of the operations mentioned in paragraphs 1, 2 and 3 above when carried on in the establishment in which the waste materials are produced or in which they are used as raw materials for further manufacture;

(ii) The making or repairing of sacks or bags when carried on in a factory or workshop engaged solely or mainly in the making or repairing of sacks or bags.

**List of Materials and Articles:—*

Rags, waste paper, paper stock; woollen, worsted, jute, flax, hemp or other textile waste; textile clippings or cuttings; used bags, sacks or sacking; scrap rubber; scrap iron or other scrap metal; fur cuttings; rabbit skins; bones or fat; used tins; broken glass or earthenware; discarded clothing (including head-gear or foot-gear); discarded textile articles; old ropes; used bottles or used jars.

†*List of Operations:—*

The ripping of worn clothes for rags; the picking of old ropes; the trimming of paper salvage; the washing of used bottles or used jars; the washing of used tins; the breaking of scrap metal; the drying of rabbit skins; the making or repairing of sacks or bags; the willowing, pulling, scouring, carbonising or putting down mixings of textile waste (other than cotton waste).

PART IV.

SECTION I.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages shall be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other provident fund.

SECTION II.—The above Minimum Rates of wages are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages, or to agreements made, or that may be made, between Employers and Workers for the payment of wages in excess of these Minimum Rates of Wages.

SECTION III.—The Minimum Rates of Wages set out in this Schedule which are marked ¶ have been effective as from 31st January, 1921.

1.—(1) Part I (*Restriction on Movement of Sheep out of a Movement Area*) of the Sheep (Double Dipping) Order of 1920, hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Order," is hereby applied to the Area described in the First Schedule hereto, which shall be a Movement Area for the purposes of that Order.

(2) This Article shall come into operation on the tenth day of August, nineteen hundred and twenty-one, and shall cease to operate on the tenth day of September, nineteen hundred and twenty-one.

Application of Part II of Sheep (Double Dipping) Order of 1920, subject to certain modifications.

2. Part II (*Double Dipping of Sheep in a Double Dipping Area*) of the Principal Order

is hereby applied, subject to the modification hereinafter appearing, to the lands described in the Second Schedule hereto, which shall comprise a Double Dipping Area for the purposes of that Order.

Period Prescribed as Double Dipping Period.

3.—(1) The dates between which all sheep on lands in the Double Dipping Area described in the Second Schedule hereto are to be dipped within the Area by the owner or person in charge of the sheep under and in accordance with Part II of the Principal Order are hereby fixed to be the tenth day of August and the tenth day of September, nineteen hundred and twenty-one.

(2) Each dipping shall be carried out on such date, at such dipping place, and in such manner as shall be required by a Notice signed by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District wherein the sheep are, and served by post, or otherwise, on the owner or person in charge of the sheep referred to in the Notice.

(3) Each dipping shall, where practicable, take place on lands to which this Article applies, but where such dipping is not practicable, the Notice may require the dipping to be carried out on other premises specified in the Notice, and may impose any conditions as to movement, detention, isolation and dipping of the sheep which the Inspector may consider desirable and specify in the Notice.

(4) If the owner or person in charge of sheep to which a Notice served under paragraph (2) of this Article relates fails to comply with any condition specified in such Notice he shall, according to his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

4.—(1) The provisions of Articles 2 and 3 of this Order shall apply also to any lands in the neighbourhood to which they may be applied by a Notice to that effect signed by an Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority and served upon the occupier of the lands described in such Notice, and shall cease to apply to any such lands upon service on the occupier thereof of a Notice to that effect signed by an Inspector of the Ministry.

(2) A copy of every notice served under this Article by an Inspector of the Local Authority shall forthwith be sent to the Ministry by the Inspector signing the same.

Revocation.

5. The Sheep Dipping (Black Mountain District) Orders of 1919 and 1920 are hereby revoked.

Short Title, &c.

6. This Order may be cited as the SHEEP DIPPING (BLACK MOUNTAIN DISTRICT) ORDER OF 1921.
