# TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 AND 1918. HAT, CAP AND MILLINERY TRADE BOARD (SCOTLAND).

MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES AS VARIED FOR  
FEMALE LEARNERS IN THE HAT, CAP AND  
MILLINERY TRADE (OTHER THAN THE WHOLE-  
SALE CLOTH HAT AND CAP MAKING BRANCH).

Effective as from 8th August, 1921.

Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, the rates shall become effective as from the beginning of the next full pay period, but in any case not later than 14th August, 1921.

(a) The General Minimum Time-Rate for Learners under 14 years of age shall be 1½d. per hour, and from the age of 14 years they shall be entitled to the amounts shown in Column I above as if they had commenced at 14.

(b) A Learner shall cease to be a Learner, and be entitled to the full General Minimum Time-Rate applicable to workers other than Learners upon the fulfilment of the following conditions:—

#### Age of Entering upon Employment and Conditions.

Under 15 years of age:—The completion of 3 years' employment and the attainment of the age of 18 years.

15 and under 17 years of age:—The completion of 3 years' employment.

17 and under 19 years of age:—The completion of 3 years' employment.

19 years of age and over:—The completion of 3 years' employment.

(c) No Female Learner shall be held to be entitled to the full General Minimum Time-Rate under Section I of Part I of the Schedule to the Notice H.M.S. (2) issued by the Trade Board, and dated 23rd September, 1920, viz., 8½d. per hour until she has attained the age of 18 years, notwithstanding any employment she may have had. Provided that in determining the age of entry and the length of employment, all service prior to the age of 14 shall be disregarded.

#### SECTION II.—

The General Minimum Time-Rate for all Female Workers in the Branches of the Trade specified in Part IV of this Schedule *other than* Female Learners as defined in Part III of this Schedule, is the General Minimum Time-Rate applicable to workers other than Learners set out in Section I of Part I of the Schedule to the above-mentioned Notice H.M.S. (2), dated 23rd September, 1920, viz., 8½d. per hour.

NOTE:—The Minimum Rates for Female Learners in the Wholesale Cloth Hat and Cap Making branch of the Trade, which are set out in the Trade Board's Notice H.M.S. (2), dated 23rd September, 1920, and are effective under an Order of the Minister of Labour dated 17th September, 1920, are unaffected by this Notice.

### PART II.

*Overtime Rates for Female Workers in the Hat, Cap and Millinery Trade other than the Wholesale Cloth Hat and Cap Making Branch.*

Overtime Rates, calculated on the Minimum Rates of Wages specified in Part I of this Schedule in the manner specified in Part III of the Schedule to the Notice H.M.S. (2) issued by the Trade Board and dated 23rd September, 1920, shall apply, in substitution for the minimum rates set out in Part I of this Schedule in respect of all hours worked in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board in the Schedule to the above-mentioned Notice, dated 23rd September, 1920, to be the normal number of hours of work in the trade.

NOTE:—The hours which female workers, young persons and children are allowed to work are subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts, and of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920.

## PART III.

For the purpose of this Notice the following definitions shall apply:—

A) Female Learner is a worker who:—

(a) Is employed by an Employer who provides such Learner with reasonable facilities for practically and efficiently learning the branch of the Trade as carried on by him and the various processes involved in the making of any of the articles specified in the definition of the trade referred to in Part IV of this Schedule, other than the Wholesale Manufacture of Cloth Hats and Caps; and

(b) Has received a certificate or has been registered in accordance with rules from time to time laid down by the Trade Board, and held subject to compliance with the conditions contained in this Section, or has made an application for such certificate or registration, which has been duly acknowledged and is still under consideration. Provided that the certification or registration of a Learner may be cancelled if the other conditions of learnership are not complied with.

Provided that an Employer may employ a Female Learner on her first employment without a certificate or registration for a probation period not exceeding four weeks, but in the event of such Learner being continued thereafter at her employment, the probation period shall be included in her period of learnership.

Provided that, notwithstanding compliance with the conditions contained in this Section, a person shall not be deemed to be a Learner if she works in a room used for dwelling purposes, and is not in the employment of her parent or guardian.

## PART IV.

The above Minimum Rates of Wages shall apply subject to the provisions of the Trade Board Acts to all female workers in Scotland in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of the Trade specified in the Trade Board (Hat, Cap and Millinery) Order, 1919, as set out in Part V of the above-mentioned Notice H.M.S. (2) dated 23rd September, 1920, other than the Wholesale Cloth, Hat and Cap-making branch.

## PART V.

## SECTION I.—

The above Minimum Rates of Wages are to be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any Superannuation or other Provident Fund.

## SECTION II.—

The above Minimum Rates of Wages are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages or to agreements made or that may be made between employers and workers for the payment of wages in excess of the Minimum Rates.

## MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES AS VARIED FOR FEMALE LEARNERS IN THE RETAIL BRANCH OF THE DRESSMAKING AND WOMEN'S LIGHT CLOTHING TRADE.

Effective as from 8th August, 1921.

Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding seven days the rates shall become effective as from the beginning of the next full pay period, but in any case not later than 14th August, 1921.

(a) The General Minimum Time-Rate for Learners under 14 years of age shall be 1½d. per hour, and from the age of 14 years they shall be entitled to the amounts shown in Column I of the table set out in this Section, as if they had commenced at 14.

(b) A Learner shall cease to be a Learner and be entitled to the full General Minimum Time-Rate applicable to her upon the fulfilment of the following conditions:—

*Age of Entering upon Employment and Conditions.*

Under 15 years of age: The completion of five years' employment and the attainment of the age of 20 years.

15 and under 17 years of age: The completion of four years' employment and the attainment of the age of 20 years.

17 and under 19 years of age: The completion of four years' employment.

19 years of age and over: The completion of four years' employment.

(c) No Female Learner shall be held to be entitled to the full General Minimum Time-Rate as set out in Section I of Part I of the Schedule to the Notice W.D.S. (2) issued by the Trade Board and dated 23rd September, 1920, until she has attained the age of 20 years, notwithstanding any employment she may have had. Provided that in determining the age of entry and the length of employment all service prior to the age of 14 shall be disregarded.

SECTION II.—

The General Minimum Time-Rate for all Female Workers in the Retail Branch (as defined in Section II of Part III of this Schedule) of the Trade specified in Part IV of this Schedule other than Female Learners as defined in Section I of Part III of this Schedule is the General Minimum Time-Rate applicable to Workers other than Learners set out in Section I of Part I of the Schedule to the Notice W.D.S. (2) issued by the Trade Board and dated 23rd September, 1920, viz., 9½d. per hour.

PART II.

*Overtime Rates for Female Workers in the Retail Branch of the Dressmaking and Women's Light Clothing Trade.*

Overtime Rates calculated on the Minimum Rates of Wages specified in Part I of this Schedule, in the manner set out in Part III of the Schedule to the Notice W.D.S. (2), issued by the Trade Board and dated 23rd September, 1920, shall apply in substitution for the Minimum Rates set out in Part I of this Schedule in respect of all hours worked in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board, in the Schedule to the above-mentioned Notice W.D.S. (2), to be the normal number of hours of work in the trade.

NOTE.—The hours which female workers, young persons and children are allowed to work are subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts and of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920.

PART III.

For the purpose of this Notice the following definitions shall apply:—

SECTION I.—

A Female Learner is a worker who:—

(a) Is employed by an employer who provides such Learner with reasonable facilities for practically and efficiently learning one of the branches of trade as carried on by the

employer or the various processes involved in the making of any of the articles specified in the definition of the trade referred to in Part IV. of the Schedule to this Notice; and

(b) Has received a certificate or has been registered in accordance with rules from time to time laid down by the Trade Board, and held subject to compliance with the conditions contained in this Section, or has made an application for such certificate or registration which has been duly acknowledged and is still under consideration. Provided that the certification or registration of a Learner may be cancelled if the other conditions of Learnership are not complied with.

Provided that an employer may employ a Female Learner on her first employment without a certificate or registration for a probation period not exceeding four weeks, but in the event of such Learner being continued thereafter at her employment, the probation period shall be included in her period of Learnership.

Provided that, notwithstanding compliance with the conditions contained in this section, a person shall not be deemed to be a Learner if she works in a room used for dwelling purposes and is not in the employment of her parent or guardian.

SECTION II.—

The *Retail Branch* of the Trade is that branch of the Trade referred to in Part IV. of this Schedule, in which it is the usual practice for the employer to supply the garment direct to the wearer.

PART IV.

The above Minimum Rates of Wages shall apply, subject to the provision of the Trade Boards Acts, to all Female Workers in Scotland in respect of all time during which they are employed in the Retail Branch of the Trade specified in the Trade Boards (Women's Clothing) Order, 1919, as varied by the Trade Boards (Shirtmaking) Order, 1920, as set out in Part V. of the above-mentioned Notice W.D.S. (2), dated 23rd September, 1920.

PART V.

SECTION I.—

The above Minimum Rates of Wages are to be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any Superannuation or other Provident Fund.

SECTION II.—

The above Minimum Rates of Wages are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages or to agreements made or that may be made between employers and workers for the payment of wages in excess of the Minimum Rates.

## PAPER BOX TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

## PROPOSAL TO VARY MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR FEMALE WORKERS AND FOR CERTAIN CLASSES OF MALE WORKERS.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established under that Act for that branch of the Box Trade in Great Britain which is engaged in the making of boxes or parts thereof made wholly or partially of paper, card-board, chip or similar material, HEREBY GIVE NOTICE as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they PROPOSE TO VARY the General Minimum Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for certain classes of Male Workers at present fixed and set out in their Notice B. (5) dated 15th November, 1920, and the General Minimum Time-Rates, Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for all Female Workers at present fixed and set out in their Notice B. (6) dated 18th November, 1920, as shown in the Schedule set out below.

The General Minimum Time-Rate for Learners under 14 years of age shall be 10s. 6d. per week of 48 hours or 2½d. per hour, and such Learners shall, on reaching the age of 14, be entitled to the amount shown in Column I. above, all employment prior to that age being for this purpose disregarded.

In the case of all female persons employed on piece work each piece rate paid must be such as will yield in the circumstances of the case not less than 8½d. per hour to an Ordinary worker. In determining whether any piece rate satisfies this condition regard must be had only to the earnings of ordinary workers, i.e., workers of ordinary skill and experience in the class of work in question and not to the earnings of workers of less than ordinary skill and experience, e.g., learners and infirm workers.

## PART IV.

*Variation of Overtime Rates for Male and Female Workers.*

Overtime Rates calculated on the proposed Minimum Rates of Wages specified in Parts I, II and III of this Schedule, in the manner set out in Part III of the Schedule to the above mentioned Notice B (6), shall apply in substitution for the proposed Minimum Rates of Wages set out in Parts I, II and III of this Schedule in respect of all hours worked in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board in the Schedule above referred to to be the normal number of hours of work in the trade.

## PART V.

The above Proposed Minimum Rates shall apply subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to (a) all Male Workers of the classes specified in Part I of this Schedule in respect of all time during which they are employed in that branch of the Box Trade in Great Britain which is engaged in the making of boxes or parts thereof, made wholly or partially of paper, cardboard, chip or similar material; and to

(b) All Female Workers in Great Britain who:—

- (i) Are engaged in manufacturing processes upon boxes or parts thereof made wholly or partially of paper, cardboard, chip or similar material, and, generally, to all workers directly connected with such processes; or
- (ii) Are engaged in transferring material from the store-room to the factory or work-

shop, and to workers engaged in transferring finished boxes from the factory or workshop to the warehouse, if such workers are also to any considerable extent engaged in connection with the work of distributing the material among, or collection of the finished boxes from, the workers engaged in the processes of box-making.

They shall not apply to Female Workers who:—

(i) Are wholly or mainly engaged in occupations in a store-room which involve no change in, or treatment of, the material necessary to its being made into boxes; or

(ii) Are wholly or mainly engaged in a warehouse on occupations directly connected with the storage or despatch of finished boxes which involve no examination or change in the form of such boxes; or

(iii) Are wholly or mainly engaged in transferring material *in bulk* from the store-room to the factory or workshop; or

(iv) Are wholly or mainly engaged in transferring finished boxes from the factory or workshop to the warehouse, or from the warehouse for despatch to customers; or

(v) Wherever employed are engaged as clerks, telephone attendants, and others whose work stands in a relationship to the trade similar to that of such workers.

## PART VI.

The above Proposed Minimum Rates of Wages shall be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other provident fund.

The Trade Board will consider any objections to the above Proposal to Vary which may be lodged with them within two months from 5th August, 1921. Such objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary of the Paper Box Trade Board (Great Britain), 7-11, Old Bailey, London, E.C. 4.

It is desirable that the objections should state precisely, and so far as possible with reasons, what is objected to.

## PART II.

*Proposed Variation of Overtime Rates for certain classes of Female Workers (other than Apprentices and Learners).*

Overtime Rates, calculated on the appropriate Minimum Rates of Wages proposed in Part I of this Schedule in the manner set out in Part II of the Schedule to the Notice R.B. (7), issued by the Trade Board, dated 8th October, 1920, shall apply in substitution for the Minimum Rates of Wages set out in Part I of this Schedule in respect of all hours worked in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board in their said Notice R.B. (7) to be the normal number of hours of work in the trade.

## PART III.

SECTION I.—Subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts the respective Minimum Rates of Wages set out in this Schedule shall apply to all Female Workers specified in this Notice, in respect of all time during which they are employed in Great Britain in any branch of Retail Bespoke Tailoring, as defined in the Regulations made by the Minister of Labour and dated 12th December, 1919.

SECTION II.—The Retail Bespoke Section of the Tailoring Trade specified in the above-mentioned Regulations is as follows:—

Those branches of Men's, Women's, Boys' and Girls' Bespoke Tailoring in which the tailor supplies the garment direct to the individual wearer and employs the worker direct.

A worker shall be deemed to be employed by the tailor direct, if employed by another worker in the employ of the tailor, to whom a Minimum Rate of Wages fixed under the Trade Boards Acts is applicable, or if employed by a sub-contractor engaged in cutting, making or finishing garments exclusively for the tailor in the tailor's shop, or in a building of which the shop forms part or to which the shop is attached.

*Including:—*

(1) (a) The altering, repairing, renovating, or re-making of Men's, Women's, Boys' or Girls' Tailored Garments, where carried out for the individual wearer by a tailor who employs the worker direct as defined above.

(b) The cleaning of such garments where carried on in association with, or in conjunction with, the repairing, renovating, or re-making of the garments.

(2) The lining with fur of the above-mentioned garments where carried out in association with, or in conjunction with, the making of such garments;

(3) All processes of embroidery or decorative needlework where carried out in association with, or in conjunction with, the above-mentioned branches of tailoring.

(4) The packing and all other operations incidental to, or appertaining to, any of the above-mentioned branches of tailoring;

*But excluding:—*

(1) All or any of the above-mentioned operations where carried on in a factory where garments are made up for three or more retail establishments.

(2) The making of headgear.

NOTE.—The employment of Women, Young Persons and Children is subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts and to the provisions of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920.

## PART IV.

The above proposed Minimum Rates of Wages are without prejudice to workers earning higher rates of wages, or to agreements made, or that may be made, between employers and workers for the payment of wages in excess of these Proposed Minimum Rates of Wages.

The Trade Board will consider any objections to the above Proposals to Vary which may be lodged with them within two months from 4th August, 1921. Such objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary of the Retail Bespoke Tailoring Trade Board (Great Britain), 7-11, Old Bailey, London, E.C. 4.

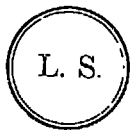

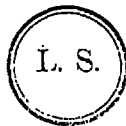

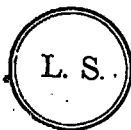

The following Districts are subject to restrictions imposed by Order of the Minister in connection with Rabies. In these Districts dogs are required to be muzzled, and the movement of dogs out of such districts is prohibited, except by licence of the Minister and subject to quarantine:—

## 1. A District comprising:—

*In the administrative county of Berks:*

The boroughs of Maidenhead and Wokingham, the petty sessional divisions of Maidenhead (including its detached part), Forest and Reading, and the detached part of the petty sessional division of Newbury.

*In the administrative county of Oxford:*

The borough of Henley-on-Thames, the petty sessional divisions of Henley, and Watlington, and the parishes of Thame, Kingsey, Tetsworth and Attington.

*In the administrative county of Buckingham:*

The borough of Chepping Wycombe, the First Division of the Hundred of Desborough (including its detached part), the Hundred of Burnham (including the Chesham Division), the petty sessional division of Wycombe, and the Three Hundreds of Aylesbury, *except the parishes of Lower Winchendon, Upper Winchendon, Waddesdon, Westcott, Fleet Marston, Quarrendon, Hardwick, Weedon, Hulcott, Bierton with Broughton, and Aylesbury*, and such part of the Hundred of Slough as lies to the north and west of the Great Western Railway line from London to Windsor, *via* Slough, and

*In the administrative county of Southampton:*

The borough of Basingstoke, the petty sessional divisions of Odiham (*except the parishes of Aldershot, Crondall, Long Sutton and South Warnborough*), Basingstoke (*except the parishes of Upton Grey, Tunworth, Weston Corbett, Weston Patrick and its detached part,*

*Herriard, Ellisfield, Nutley, Preston Candover, Bradley, Woodmancott, and Popham*), and Kingsclere;

And also comprising:—

The county borough of Reading.

## 2. A District comprising:—

*In the administrative county of Wilts:*

The city of Salisbury and the borough of Wilton.

The petty sessional division of Salisbury and Amesbury (*except the parishes of Maddington, Orcheston St. Mary, Orcheston St. George, Shrewton, Rolleston, Winterbourne Stoke, Durrington, Amesbury, Bulford, Cholderton, Newton Tony, Allington, Boscombe, Fovant, Ebbesborne Wake, and Bower Chalke*); and

*In the administrative county of Southampton:*

The city of Winchester, the borough of Ramsey, the petty sessional divisions of Eastleigh (including its detached part), Winchester, Romsey, Fareham, Gosport, Havant, Droxford, Petersfield (including its detached part), Alresford, and Alton, and the parishes of Nether Wallop, Longstock, Stockbridge, Leckford, Upper Clatford, Goodworth Clatford, Wherwell, Chilbolton, Barton Stacey, Bullington, Popham, Woodmancott, Nutley, Preston Candover, Bradley, Ellisfield, Herriard, Tunworth, Weston Corbett, Weston Patrick (including its detached part), Upton Grey, South Warnborough, Long Sutton, Crondall, Bramshaw East, Copythorne, Netley Marsh, Colbury, Eling, Marchwood, Dibden and Fawley;

7. An area comprising the holdings known as Tullich, Glenbeg, Cuilfail, Kames and Duchra, in the parish of Kilninver and Kilmelfort, and the holding known as Turnault, in the parish of Craignish.

8. An area comprising the holding known as Callumkil, in the parish of Kildalton.

9. An area comprising the holdings known as Pole Farm and Lochgoilhead, in the parish of Lochgoilhead and Kilmorich.

10. An area comprising the holdings known as Rhonadale, Dippen, Lephincorrach, Kil-michael, Ifferdale, Whitestone, Duchran and Auchenreigh, in the parish of Saddell and Skipness, and the holdings known as Arnicle and Garbhalt, in the parish of Killeen and Kilchemzie.

*Bute*.—An Area comprising the holdings known as Nether Ardrosedale, Ballycaul, Upper Ardrosedale and Dunalunt, in the parish of North Bute, in the county of Bute.

*Inverness*.—(1) An Area comprising the islands known as the Outer Hebrides (*except the islands of St. Kilda, Dune, Soay, and Boreray*), in the county of Inverness.

(2) An Area in the county of Inverness, comprising the islands known as Skye or Inner Hebrides.

*Kent*.—The administrative counties of Kent and East Sussex.

And also comprising:—

The county boroughs of Brighton, Canterbury, Eastbourne and Hastings.

*Kincardine*.—An Area comprising the farms of Tippetty, Bogburn, Denside, Honeybank, Mains of Glenfarquhar, Galloquhine, Drumelzie, Mains of Drumtochty, and Cosbald (*including the hill grazings attached to the said farms*), in the parish of Fordoun, in the county of Kincardine.

*Merioneth*.—An Area comprising the parishes of Llangelynin, Llanegryn, Towyn, Pennal, Tal-y-Llyn, and Llanfihangel-y-Pennant, and such portions of the parishes of Mallwyd, and Brithdir and Islaw'r-dref, as lie to the south and west of the road from Cammaes, via Dinas, Mawddwy, Tynyddawdd, and Dolgelly to Llanelltyd; and
