The following Agreement for the reciprocal notification by the British and Swedish Governments of certain particulars regarding lunatic Swedish subjects in the United Kingdom and British subjects in Sweden has been concluded by a recent exchange of Notes between the two Governments, and came into operation on the 21st ultimo:—

#### AGREEMENT.

Swedish Government by His Britannic Majesty's Representative at Stockholm.

Article 2.—The notifications mentioned in Article 1 must mention the name of the asylum where the lunatic is confined, and, if possible, contain the following details of information regarding the patient:—

1. Name and Christian names.

2. Date and place of birth.

3. Rank or profession.

4. Place of residence at the time of confinement in the lunatic asylum.

5. Last place of residence in the country of

origin.

6. Names and Christian names, etc., of the parents, or, if they are deceased, of the nearest relatives, mentioning their place of residence.

7. If the patient is married, name and Christian name of his wife her husband indicating her place of residence.

8. Date on which the patient was confined in the asylum, or on which he was discharged from it, or on which he died there.

9. Name of the person on whose petition the patient was confined in the establishment.

10. If the admission followed in consequence of a medical report, the date of this report as

well as the name and place of residence of the doctor,

Article 3.—In all cases where the Swedish British Government demands the repatriation of a British Swedish subject suffering from mental derangement, the demand shall be accompanied by a notification containing the information specified in Article 2.

Article 4.—When a British Swedish subject, suffering from mental derangement, is repatriated, the patient's medical dossier kept at the asylum shall be communicated to the competent British Swedish authorities.

GERMAN REPARATION RECOVERY (No. 12) Order, 1921, Dated 29th September, 1921, MADE BY THE BOARD OF TRADE.

The Board of Trade, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by Section 5 of the German Reparation (Recovery) Act, 1921, and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, upon the recommendation of a Committee constituted under Section 5 of the said Act, hereby make the following Order:

1. This Order may be cited as the German

Reparation Recovery (No. 12) Order, 1921.

2. Any Article of the following description shall be exempt from the provisions of the said Act, that is to say, any Article in regard to which it is proved to the satisfaction of the Commissioners of Customs and Excise that after being consigned to Germany by a per-

son or persons not resident in Germany it is thence consigned to the United Kingdom, provided that the said Commissioners are satisfied that it has not undergone any process of manufacture in Germany, and has not whilst in Germany passed out of the ownership of the person or persons by whom it was consigned thereto.

(c) No Female Learner shall be entitled to the full General Minimum Time-Rate applicable to her under Section I. of this Part of this Schedule until she has attained the age of 18 years, notwithstanding any employment she may have had. Provided that, in determining the age of entry and the length of employment, all service prior to the age of 14 shall be disregarded.

#### PART III.

General Minimum Time-Rates for Male Workers.

age, 1s. per hour.

Male Workers of 20 and under 21 years of

age, 10½d. per hour.

age, 6d. per hour.

Male Workers of 16 and under 17 years of

age, 5d. per hour.
Male Workers of 15 and under 16 years of

age, 4d. per hour.
Male Workers under 15 years of age, 3d. per hour.

Workers commencing employment in the Dressmaking and Women's Light Clothing Trade for the first time at and over the age of 19 may serve a period of six months at 7d. per hour, and thereafter a period of six months at 8¾d. per hour.

On the expiration of one year's service in the trade, these workers shall receive such rates as

their age may entitle them to under the foregoing provisions.

#### PART IV.

Piece-Work Basis Time Rates.

SECTION I.—Female Workers:

(a) All Female Workers other than Home-

workers, 9½d. per hour.

(b) Homeworkers, 9½d. per hour.

In the case of all Female Workers employed on piece-work, each piece-rate paid must be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, not less than 9½d. per hour to an ordinary worker, i.e., a worker of ordinary skill and experience in the class of work in question.

#### SECTION II.—Male Workers:

All Male Workers, 1s. 3½d. per hour. In the case of all Male Workers employed on

piece-work, each piece-rate paid must be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, not less than 1s. 32d. per hour to an ordinary worker, i.e., a worker of ordinary skill and experience in the class of work in question.

#### PART V.

Overtime Rates.

Male and Female Workers (all Ages).

SECTION I.—In accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board hereby declare the normal number of hours of work in the trade to be as follows:—

In any week, 46.

On any day (other than Saturday), 8½ On Saturdays, 4.

Provided that any other day (not being Sunday) may be substituted by an employer for Saturday as the weekly short day, and in such case the normal number of hours of work on such substituted day shall be 4, and the normal number of hours on Saturday shall be  $8\frac{1}{2}$ .

Previded also that all hours worked by a worker on Sundays and on Customary Public and Statutory Holidays shall be regarded as evertime to which the Overtime Rates shall apply.

SECTION II.—The Minimum Rates for Overtime in respect of hours worked by a worker whether engaged on Time-work or on Piecework, in excess of the declared normal number of hours, shall be as follows:—

(1) For the first two hours' overtime on any day, except Saturdays (or the weekly short day substituted therefor), Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be one and a quarter times the minimum rate otherwise applicable, i.e., Time and a Quarter.

(2) For overtime after the first two hours of overtime on any day except Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, and for all overtime on Saturdays (or the weekly short day substituted therefor), the Overtime Rate shall be one and a half times the minimum rate otherwise applicable, i.e., Time and a Half.

(3) For all time worked on Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be twice the minimum rate otherwise applicable, i.e.. Double

(4) For all hours worked in any week in excess of 46, the Overtime Rate shall be Time and a Quarter, except in so far as higher overtime rates are payable under the provisions of paragraphs 2 and 3 of this section. The Overtime Rate shall be payable where on any day (not being a Sunday or a Customary Public or Statutory Holiday) the number of hours worked exceeds  $8\frac{1}{2}$ , or in the case of Saturday (or the weekly short day substituted therefor) exceeds 4, notwithstanding that the number of hours worked in the week does not exceed 46

Provided-

- (a) That where it is or may become the established practice of an employer only to require attendance on 5 days a week, the Overtime Rate shall only be payable on such days after 9½ hours have been worked.
- (b) That where it is or may become the established practice of an employer to require attendance only on alternate Saturdays, the overtime rates shall only be payable in the week in which attendance on Saturday is required after 50 hours have been worked.
- (c) That where it is or may become the established practice of an employer to require attendance on Sunday instead of Saturday, the Minimum Rates for Overtime as set out above shall apply in like manner as if in the provisions of this Notice as to Overtime the word "Saturday" were substi-

tuted for "Sunday" and the word "Sunday" for "Saturday."

Note.—The hours which female workers, young persons and children are allowed to work are subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts and of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920.

#### PART VI.

Section I.—For the purpose of this Notice the following definitions shall apply:—

A Female Learner is a worker who-

- (a) Is employed by an employer who provides such Learner with reasonable facilities for practically and efficiently learning one of the branches of trade as carried on by the employer or the various processes involved in the making of any of the articles specified in the definition of the Trade referred to in Part VII of the Schedule to this Notice; and
- (b) has received a certificate or has been registered in accordance with rules from time to time laid down by the Trade Board, and held subject to compliance with the conditions contained in this section, or has made an application for such certificate or registration which has been duly acknowledged and is still under consideration. Provided that the certification or registration of a Learner may be cancelled if the other conditions of learnership are not complied with.

Provided that an employer may employ a Female Learner on her first employment without a certificate or registration for a probation period not exceeding four weeks, but in the event of such Learner being continued thereafter at her employment, the probation period shall be included in her period of learnership:

Provided that, notwithstanding compliance with the conditions contained in this section, a person shall not be deemed to be a Learner if she works in a room used for dwelling purposes and is not in the employment of her parent or guardian.

Section II.—The expression "Homeworker" means a worker who works in her own home or any other place not under the control or management of the employer.

SECTION III.—The Retail Branch of the Trade is that branch of the Trade specified in Part VII of this Schedule, in which it is the usual practice for the employer to supply the garment direct to the wearer.

#### PART VII.

Section I.—Subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts the respective minimum rates set out in this Schedule apply to all workers in Scotland in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of the Dressmaking and Women's Light Clothing Trade as specified in the Regulations made by the Minister of Labour, dated 29th March, 1920 (as varied by the Trade Boards (Shirtmaking) Order, 1920), and as set out below.

Section II.—The Trade as specified in the above-mentioned Regulations is as follows:—

Those branches of the Women's Clothing Trade that are engaged in the making of non-tailored garments, namely, the making from textile or knitted fabrics of (a) nontailored wearing apparel (other than handkerchiefs) worn by women or girls or by children without distinction of sex, or (b)boys' ready-made washing suits or sailor suits, where carried out in association with or in conjunction with the making of garments to be worn by women or girls or by children without distinction of sex:

(1) All operations and processes of cutting, making or finishing by hand or machine of dresses, non-tailored skirts, blouses, blouse-robes, jumpers, sports-coats, neckwear, tea-gowns, dressinggowns, dressing-jackets, pyjamas, underunderskirts, aprons, clothing, nurses' and servants' caps, juvenile clothing, baby-linen, or similar non-tailored articles;

(2) The making of field-bonnets, sunbonnets, boudoir caps or infants' millinery where carried on in association with or in conjunction with the making of any of the articles mentioned in paragraph 1 above;

(3)—(a) The altering, repairing, renovating or re-making of any of the above-men-

tioned articles;

(b) The cleaning of any of the above-mentioned articles, where carried on in association with or in conjunction with the altering, repairing, renovating or re-making of such

garments;

(4) All processes of embroidery or decorative needlework where carried on in association with or in conjunction with the making, altering, repairing, renovating or remaking of such articles other than hand embroidery or hand-drawn thread-work on articles made of linen or cotton or of mixed linen and cottón;

(5) The following processes if done by machine:—thread drawing, thread clipping, top sewing, scalloping, nickelling and

paring;

(6) Laundering, smoothing, ornamenting, boxing, packing, warehousing or other operations incidental to or appertaining to the making, altering, repairing, renovating or remaking of any of the above-mentioned articles;

but excluding-

(a) The making of knitted articles; the making of underclothing, socks and stockings, from knitted fabrics; and the making from knitted fabrics of articles mentioned in paragraphs (1) and (2) above, where carried on in association with or in conjunction with the manufacture of the knitted

(b) The making of gloves, spats, gaiters, boots, shoes and slippers;

The restrictions on movement of swine imposed by the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 and the Norfolk (Swine-Fever) Order of 1915 shall not apply to the movement of swine from the sale mentioned in the Schedule hereto to any premises in Great Britain not being a Swine-Fever Infected Place, if the swine are accompanied by a licence in the Form F. set forth in the First Schedule to the said Order of 1908, granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the city of Norwich and the following conditions, which shall be specified in the licence, are complied with:—
  - (i) The swine shall be moved to the place of destination specified in the licence and not elsewhere, and shall be there detained and kept separate from all other swine for twenty-eight days, unless they are slaughtered on such premises before the expiration of that period, or are moved under and in accordance with the conditions of a licence in the Form C set forth in the said First Schedule to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse in the same Scheduled Area.
  - (ii) The swine shall be moved by the nearest available route without unnecessary delay, and during the movement shall, so far as is practicable, be kept separate from all swine not being moved with a licence under this Order.
  - (iii) After completion of the movement the licence shall forthwith be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest policestation in the same district by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing such movement.
- 2. A copy of a licence issued under this Order shall be sent by the Inspector granting the same to the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination specified in the licence is situate.
- 3. A licence under this Order shall for the purposes of the above-mentioned Orders be treated as a licence under those Orders.
