(hereinafter called "The Order of 1894"), so as to include therein the parishes of Long-thorpe, Castor, Marholm, Helpston, Etton, Glinton, Werrington, Walton, Eye, Paston, Gunthorpe and Peterborough Without, in the rural district of Peterborough, in the administrative county of the Soke of Peterborough, the urban district of Whittlesey, the parish of Whittlesey Rural, in the rural district of Whittlesey, and the parish of Stanground North, in the rural district of Thorney, in the administrative county of the Isle of Ely, the urban district of Old Fletton, and the parishes of Yaxley, Farcet and Orton Longueville, in the rural district of Norman Cross, in the administrative county of Huntingdon (the said area of supply so extended being hereinafter referred to as "the extended area of supply"), and to authorize the Corporation to supply, distribute and sell electrical energy for public and private purposes, as defined by the said Acts, within the extended area of supply.

supply under the Order of 1894.

4. To confer upon the Corporation all or some of the powers of the Electricity (Supply) Acts, 1882 to 1919, and enactments incorporated therein, and to alter, vary or extinguish all rights and privileges which would or might interfere with any of the objects of the Order, and to confer all other rights and privileges necessary for carrying such objects into effect.

5. To alter the maximum price which the Corporation are authorized by the Order of 1894 to charge for the supply of electricity by the substitution of "ten pence" for "eight pence" as the charge for each unit over twenty units, and by a corresponding increase in the amount which the Corporation may charge for any amount up to twenty units.
