#### PRESENT.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

THEREAS by section 26 Pluralities Act, 1838, after reciting "Whereas in some instances tithings, hamlets, chapelries, and other places or districts may be separated from the parishes or mother churches to which they belong, with great advantage, and places altogether extraparochial may, in some instances, with advantage be annexed to parishes or districts to which they are contiguous, or be constituted separate parishes for ecclesiastical purposes," it is, amongst other things, enacted, when with respect to his own diocese it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, or when the Bishop of any diocese shall represent to the said Archbishop, that any such tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place or district within the diocese of such Archbishop, or the diocese of such Bishop, as the case may be, may be advantageously separated from any parish or mother church, and either be constituted a separate benefice by itself or be united to any other parish to which it may be more conveniently annexed, or to any other adjoining tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place, or district, parochial or extra-parochial, so as to form a separate parish or benefice, or that any extra-parochial place may with advantage be annexed to any parish to which it is contiguous, or be constituted a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes; and the said Archbishop, or Bishop, shall draw up a scheme in writing (the scheme of such Bishop to be transmitted to the said Archbishop for his consideration) describing the mode in which it appears to him that the alteration may best be effected, and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes, rent charges, and other ecclesiastical dues, rates and payments, and in respect to patronage and rights to pews, may be made with justice to all parties interested; and if the patron or patrons of the benefice or benefices to be affected by such alteration shall consent in writing under his or their hands to such scheme, or to such modification thereof, as the said Archbishop may approve, and the said Archbishop shall, on full consideration and inquiry, be satisfied with any such scheme, or modification thereof, and shall certify the same and such consent as aforesaid, by his report to His Majesty in Council, it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council to make an Order for carrying such

scheme, or modification thereof, as the case may be, into effect: "
"And whereas the Right Reverend William, Lord Bishop of Exeter, hath made a Representation in writing dated the 5th day of December, 1921, to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Lord Archbishop of Cantenbury, as follows:—

"I William Lord Bishop of Exeter in pursuance of the 26th Section of the Pluralities Act 1838 do hereby represent to your Grace as follows:—

"There is in the County of Devon and Diocese of Exeter the Benefice or Vicarage of

Barnstaple the Parish whereof contains a population of 3,007 persons or thereabouts with accommodation in the Parish Church for 1,000 persons. The net annual value of the Benefice of Barnstaple is Three hundred and

eighty-one pounds or thereabouts.

"There is also in the same County and Diocese the Benefice or Rectory of Tawstock the Parish whereof contains a population of 1,311 persons or thereabouts with accommodation in the Parish Church for 450 persons. The net annual value of the Benefice of Tawstock is Seven hundred and ninety-nine pounds or thereabouts.

"That it appears to me and I do hereby represent to your Grace that under the provisions of the said Pluralities Act 1838 a small portion of the Parish of Tawstock (the boundaries of which are more particularly described in the Scheme annexed to this Representation and also delineated on the Ordnance Map annexed thereto and thereon edged with pink) may be advantageously separated therefrom and be annexed to the said Parish of Barnstaple to which it is contiguous.

"The Patron of the Benefice of Barnstaple is The Right Reverend the Lord Bishop of Exeter and the Reverend Frank Maxwell

Wallington is the Incumbent thereof.

"The Patron of the Benefice of Tawstock is Sir Philip Bourchier Sherard Wrey of Tawstock, Devon, and the Reverend Albany Bourchier Sherard Wrey is the Incumbent thereof.

"That pursuant to the directions contained in the 26th Section of the Pluralities Act 1838 I the said Lord Bishop have drawn up a Scheme in writing annexed to this Representation describing the mode in which it appears to me that the alteration above proposed may best be effected and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to Ecclesiastical jurisdiction Glebe Lands Tithes Rent Charges and other Ecclesiastical dues rates and payments and in respect to Patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested and I do hereby submit the same together with the consents in writing of the said Patrons and Incumbents of the said Benefices to the intent that if your Grace shall on full consideration and inquiry be satisfied with such Scheme you may certify the same and such consents as aforesaid to His Majesty in Council: "

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the Consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows:—

## " SCHEME.

"It is proposed to separate from the said Parish of Tawstock and annex to the said Parish of Barnstaple all that part of the Parish of Tawstock the boundaries of which are delineated on the Ordnance plan hereto annexed and edged with Pink.

"That the Incumbent of the Benefice of Barnstaple shall have sole and exclusive Cure of Souls within such portion so to be separated

from Tawstock.

"That any inhabitants of such portion shall be entitled to accommodation in the Parish Church of Barnstaple but shall cease to be entitled to any right or accommodation in the Parish Church of Tawstock.

"That any inhabitants of the aforesaid portion shall have such and the same right to have marriages baptisms Churchings and burials solemnized and performed in the Parish Church of Barnstaple as they might have had in the Parish Church of Tawstock.

"That all fees ecclesiastical offerings and emoluments which may arise from the said portion so to be separated from Tawstock shall belong to the Incumbent of Barnstaple.

"That the whole of the Tithe Rent Charge specified in the Schedule hereto arising out of land proposed to be separated from Tawstock and added to the Parish of Barnstaple shall become the property of the Incumbent of Barnstaple.

That no alteration shall be made in the Patronage of the said Benefices or either of

them.

- "1. There is in the County of Warwick and my Diocese of Coventry the Vicarage of Monks Kirby the Parish whereof contains according to the Census of One thousand nine hundred and eleven a population of One thousand seven hundred and fifty-four.
- "2. The net annual value of the said Benefice arising from Tithe Rentcharge, Glebe, Fees, payment by Impropriator and Écclesias-tical Commissioners is Two hundred and twenty pounds or thereabouts.
- "3. There is in the said County of Warwick and my said Diocese of Coventry the Rectory of Harborough Magna the Parish whereof contains according to the Census of One Thousand nine hundred and eleven a population of Three hundred and seventeen.
- "4. The net annual value of the said Benefice arising from Tithe Rentcharge, Glebe and Rent charge is Two hundred and thirty-three pounds or thereabouts.
- "5. A certain portion of the said Parish of Monks Kirby namely the Hamlet of Easenhall lies to the west of the Parish of Harborough Magna and adjacent thereto and is upwards of three miles distant from the Parish Church of The population of the said Monks Kirby. Hamlet is about One hundred and forty per-
- "6. It appears to me that the said Hamlet of Easenhall may under the provisions of the said Act 1 and 2 Vic. cap. 106, and of the Acts of the second and third years of the same Reign cap. 49, and of the 50th and 51st years of the same Reign cap. 68, be advantageously separated from the said Parish of Monks Kirby and united to the said Parish of Harborough

Magna.

'' 7. The Master Fellows and Scholars of the Trinity and Undivided Trinity College of the Holy and Undivided Trinity within the Town and University of Cambridge of King Henry the Eight's foundation are the Patrons of the said Benefice of Monks Kirby and Henry Allesley Ward Boughton Leigh of Brownsover Hall in the County of Warwick, Esquire is the Patron of the said Benefice of Harborough Magna.

- "8. The Reverend Arthur Worsley Smyth is the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Monks Kirby and the Reverend Reginald Ughtred Pilbeam is the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Harborough Magna.
- "9. Pursuant to the directions contained in the 26th Section of the first-mentioned Act of Parliament, I, the said Bishop, have drawn up a Scheme in writing appended to this Re-presentation describing the said Hamlet of Easenhall so as aforesaid proposed to be annexed to the Ecclesiastical Parish of Harborough Magna and the mode in which it appears to me the alterations may be best effected and how the changes consequent thereon in respect of Ecclesiastical jurisdiction Glebe lands, Tithes, Dues, Rates and Payments, and in respect to Patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested and I do hereby submit the same to your Grace together with the Consents in writing of the said Patrons and Incumbents as provided by the said Act of the 50th and 51st years of Her late Majesty's Reign cap. 68 and in case you shall on full consideration and enquiry be satisfied therewith I request that your Grace will be pleased to certify the same and such Consents to His Majesty in Council."

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the Consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows:-

#### "SCHEME.

"It is proposed to separate the Hamlet of Easenhall from the Ecclesiastical Parish of Monks Kirby in the County of Warwick and Diocese of Coventry and unite the same for Ecclesiastical purposes to the adjoining Parish of Harborough Magna in the said County of Warwick and Diocese of Coventry. Hamlet of Easenhall is bounded on the West by the Parish of Brinklow on the South by the Parish of Kings Newnham on the East by the said Parish of Harborough Magna and on the North partly by the Hamlet of Pailton (part of the said Parish of Monks Kirby) and partly by the Hamlet of Stretton under Fosse (also forming part of the said Parish of Monks Kirby).

"The Inhabitants of the said Hamlet shall not after this Scheme takes effect be entitled to any accommodation in the Parish Church of Monks Kirby (except nevertheless any person or persons possessing a legal right by faculty or otherwise to any pews or sitting within the said Church and who may not be willing to relinquish the same) and shall be exonerated from all liability to repair the said Parish Church of Monks Kirby but shall be entitled to accommodation in the Parish Church of Harborough Magna and shall be liable subject to the provisions of the Compulsory Rates Abolition Act 1868 to the repairs of the said Church.

- "The Incumbent of the Parish Church of Harborough Magna shall when this Scheme takes effect have the exclusive cure of souls within the said Hamlet.
- The fees for Marriages and Churchings and all other Ecclesiastical dues arising from the said Hamlet and due to the Incumbent thereof shall when this Scheme takes effect belong to

the Incumbent of the Benefice of Harborough Magna aforesaid.

No alteration shall be made in the Patron.

"The Tithe Rentcharge of Two pounds eight shillings payable in respect of the said Hamlet of Easenhall and belonging to the Vicarage of Monks Kirby shall be assigned to and attached to the Parish and Rectory of Harborough Magna the said sum of Two pounds eight shillings being charged upon the lands comprised in the Schedule hereunder written which is an extract from the Altered Apportionment confirmed on the fifteenth day of December One thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine.

"That pursuant to the directions contained in the said Pluralities Act the said Lord Bishop has drawn up a Scheme in writing describing the mode in which it appears to him that the proposed alterations may best be effected and how the changes consequent upon such alterations in respect of ecclesiastical jurisdiction Glebe lands, Tithe Rent Charges, and other Ecclesiastical Dues, Rates and Payments and in respect to Patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested which Scheme together with the Consents in writing of the Master Fellows and Scholars of the College of the Holy and Undivided Trinity within the Town and University of Cambridge of King Henry the Eight's foundation the Patrons or persons entitled to present to the Benefice of Monks Kirby in case the same were now vacant, the Reverend Arthur Worsley Smyth the Incumbent of the same Benefice, Henry Allesley Boughton Leigh the Patron or person entitled to present to the Benefice of Harborough Magna in case the same were now vacant, and the Reverend Reginald Ughtred Pilbeam the Incumbent of the same Benefice has been transmitted to us for our consideration.

HEREAS by section 26 of the Pluralities 1838, after Act, reciting "Whereas in some instances tithings, hamlets, chapelries and other places or districts may be separated from the parishes or mother churches to which they belong, with great advantage, and places altogether extra-parochial may, in some instances, with advantage be annexed to parishes or districts to which they are contiguous, or be constituted separate parishes for ecclesiastical purposes," it is, amongst other things, enacted, "That when with respect to his own diocese it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, or when the Bishop of any diocese shall represent to the said Archbishop, that any such tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place or district within the diocese of such Archbishop, or the diocese of such Bishop, as the case may be, may be advantageously separated from any parish or mother church, and either be constituted a separate benefice

by itself or be united to any other parish towhich it may be more conveniently annexed, or to any other adjoining tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place or district, parochial or extra-parochial so as to form a separate parish or benefice, or that any extra-parochial place may with advantage be annexed to any parish to which it is contiguous, or be constituted a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes; and the said Archbishop, or Bishop, shall draw up a scheme in writing (the scheme of such Bishop to be transmitted to the said Archbishop for his consideration) describing the mode in which it appears to him that the alteration may best be effected, and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes, rent charges, and other ecclesiastical dues, rates and payments, and in respect to patronage and rights to pews, may be made with justice to all parties interested; and if the patron or patrons of the benefice or benefices to be affected by such alteration shall consent in writing under his or their hands to such scheme, or to such modification thereof, as the said Archbishop may approve, and the said Archbishop shall, on full consideration and inquiry, be satisfied with any such scheme, or modification thereof, and shall certify the same and such consent as aforesaid, by his report to His Majesty in Council, it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council to make an Order for carrying such scheme, or modification thereof,

as the case may be, into effect:"

And whereas the Right Reverend Edwyn, Lord Bishop of Southwell, hath made a Representation in writing dated the 12th day of January, 1922, to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Lord Arch-

bishop of Canterbury, as follows:

"I, Edwyn, by Divine Permission Bishop of Southwell, do hereby, pursuant to the pro-visions of Section 26 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, represent to your Grace:

"(1) That there is in the County of Derby and in my Diocese of Southwell a Benefice (being a Perpetual Curacy) and Ecclesiastical Parish of Turnditch containing an area of eight. hundred and eleven acres and a population according to the 1911 Census of three hundred and twenty persons and there is within the limits of the said Parish the Parish Church of All Saints Turnditch with accommodation for one hundred and sixty persons.

"(2) That there is in the said County of Derby and my Diocese of Southwell a Benefice-(being a Vicarage) and Ecclesiastical Parish of Duffield containing an area of three thousand and ninety acres with a population according to the 1911 Census of two thousand five hundred and nine persons with a Church containing accommodation for five hundred and

seventy-eight persons.

"(3) That there is in the said County of Derby and my Diocese of Southwell a Benefice being a Vicarage) and Ecclesiastical Parish of Hazlewood (otherwise Hazelwood) containing an area of five thousand one hundred and twenty acres or thereabouts and a population. according to the 1911 Census of six hundred and sixty-six persons and there is within the limits of the said Parish the Parish Church of Saint John the Evangelist Hazlewood with accommodation for two hundred and ninety persons.

"(4) Within the said Parishes of Duffield and Hazlewood and at the extremities thereof there is a District known as the Township of Windley contiguous to the Parish of Turnditch containing an area of seven hundred and thirty-five acres or thereabouts and a population of two hundred and seventy persons or thereabouts and the boundaries of the said Township are well known and ascertained. The centre portion of the said Township is distant some three or four miles from Duffield Parish Church. The portion in the Parish of Hazlewood being about an equal distance from each of the Parish Churches of Hazlewood and Turnditch respectively.

"(5) That with the exception of a small strip of land in the Parish of Hazlewood containing a population of fifteen persons or thereabouts the whole of the aforesaid Township of Windley is within the said Ecclesiastical Parish

of Duffield.

(6) That the inhabitants of that portion of the Township of Windley which is situate in the Parish of Duffield while resorting to the Parish Church of Duffield for marriages baptisms and burials have owing to their proximity to the Parish Church of Turnditch and the distance from the Parish Church of Duffield been accustomed to resort for Divine Service on Sundays to the Parish Church of Turnditch.

"(7) The Patronage of the said Vicarage of Duffield belongs to the Reverend Reland Audley Smith, Master of Arts, Clerk in Holy Orders of Hertingfordbury Park, Hertford, and the Reverend Ernest Augustus Causton, Master of Arts, Clerk in Holy Orders, is the

present Vicar thereof.

"(8) The Patronage of the said Vicarage of Hazlewood belongs to me the said Edwyn Bishop of Southwell in right of my Bishopric, and the Reverend William Henry Turner, Bachelor of Arts, Clerk in Holy Orders, is the

present Vicar thereof.
"(9) The Patronage of the said Perpetual Curacy of Turnditch belongs to the before named Ernest Augustus Causton in right of his Vicarage of Duffield, and the Reverend Francis Clifton Cursham, Master of Arts, Clerk in Holy Orders, is the present Incumbent thereof.

"(10) Having regard to the distance separating that portion of the District or Township of Windley which is situated within the Parish of Duffield from the Parish Church of Saint Alkmund, Duffield, and to the consequent difficulty of making adequate provision for the Cure of Souls therein, and to the proximity of such portion of the said Township to the Parish Church of Turnditch, it appears to me that such Township may, under the provisions of the Pluralities Act, 1838, be advantageously separated from the said Vicarage and Parish Church of Duffield and from the said Vicarage and Parish Church of Hazlewood respectively, and be annexed to the contiguous Perpetual Curacy of All Saints', Turnditch, for Ecclesiastical purposes.

"(11) That pursuant to the direction contained in the 26th Section of the Pluralities Act, 1838, I have drawn a Scheme in writing describing the mode in which it appears to me that the alteration above proposed may best be effected and how the changes consequent upon such alteration in respect to Ecclesiastical Jurisdiction, Glebe lands, Tithes and other Ecclesiastical Dues, Rates and Payments, and in respect to Patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested, and I do hereby submit the same to your Grace,

together with the Consents thereto of the Reverend Roland Audley Smith, the Patron of the said Benefice of Duffield, of the Reverend Ernest Augustus Causton, the Incumbent of such Benefice and Patron of the said Benefice of Turnditch, of the said Reverend Francis Clifton Cursham, the Incumbent of the lastmentioned Benefice, of myself as Patron of the said Benefice of Hazlewood, and of the Reverend William Henry Turner, the Incumbent of such Benefice, to the intent that if your Grace shall on full consideration and enquiry be satisfied with such Scheme you may certify the same and such Consents as aforesaid by your Report to His Majesty in Council."

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the Consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows:---

#### " SCHEME.

"That all that part of the Parishes of Duffield and Hazlewood, both in the County of Derby and Diocese of Southwell, comprising the District hereinbefore and hereinafter referred to as the Township of Windley, shall be separated from the Benefice and Parish Church of Saint Alkmund, Duffield, and from the Benefice and Parish Church of Saint John the Evangelist, Hazlewood, and annexed to the contiguous Parish of All Saints', Turnditch,

for Ecclesiastical purposes.

"That the said Township of Windley shall when annexed to the said Parish of All Saints' Turnditch, be subject to the same Ecclesiastical Jurisdiction as the said Parishes of Saint Alkmund, Duffield, Saint John the Evangelist, Hazlewood, and All Saints', Turnditch, and the Incumbent of All Saints', Turnditch, shall have exclusive Cure of Souls within the limits

of the same.

"That all fees and other Ecclesiastical dues and payments for marriages and burials and other Ecclesiastical Offices solemnized and performed as shall arise in respect of the marriages of or burials of inhabitants of the said Township of Windley shall belong and be payable to the Incumbent of the said Benefice of

"That the Tithe amounting to six pounds per annum arising from the Township of Windley and now payable to the Incumbent of Duffield shall continue to be paid to the said Reverend Ernest Augustus Causton during his Incumbency, and after the said Ernest Augustus Causton ceases to be Incumbent of the Benefice of Duffield the said Tithe shall be payable to and received by the Incumbent for the time being of the said Parish of Turn-

"That the parishioners and inhabitants of the said Township of Windley shall not be entitled to Church accommodation or to the solemnization of marriages in any other Church than the Church of All Saints', Turnditch, nor shall they be entitled to the right of burial in any other Churchyard than the Churchyard belonging to the said Parish Church of All Saints', Turnditch, except so far as any person or persons, inhabitants of the said Township of Windley, may possess by Faculty or otherwise the exclusive use of any pews or sittings in any other Church or be lawfully entitled to the right of sepulture in any other Churchyard or Burial Ground.

#### " CONSENTS.

"I, the Reverend Roland Audley Smith being the Patron of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Duffield if the same were now vacant, and I, The Reverend Ernest Augustus Causton the Incumbent of the same Benefice and also the Patron of the Benefice (being a Perpetual Curacy) of Turnditch if the same were now vacant, and I, The Reverend Francis Clifton Cursham the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Turnditch and I, the Right Reverend Edwyn Bishop of South-well being the Patron in right of my Bishopric of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Hazlewood if the same were now vacant, and I, The Reverend William Henry Turner the Incumbent of the said Benefice do hereby respectively signify our Consent to the Scheme above proposed and set forth and to every matter and thing therein contained.

(a) the terms of reference to the Committee:

(b) the time and place at which the Committee propose to hold their first sitting for the taking of evidence, which shall not be less than fourteen days after the date on which publication of the notice is completed.

3. The Board of Trade will appoint a Chairman of the Committee, who shall preside at any

meeting of the Committee.

4. The sittings of the Committee at which evidence is taken shall be held in public, except that the Committee shall refuse to allow the public to be present at any proceedings of the Committee during the hearing of evidence on matters which, in their opinion, are of a confidential character.

The Committee shall be at liberty to take evidence in such manner as they shall think fit.

6. Any person desiring to give evidence shall give notice to the Secretary of the Committee, and shall furnish, with his notice, a statement in writing of the evidence he proposes to give.

7. The Committee shall be at liberty to decide whether they will or will not receive the evidence of any person who desires to give evidence, and their decision shall be final.

8. A witness whom the Committee desire to hear may, if he wishes, be accompanied by solicitor or counsel who may address the Committee on his behalf, but no witness shall be examined or cross-examined except by the Members of the Committee.

IMPORTATION OF HAY, STRAW AND PEAT-Moss LITTER.

N view of the shortage of fodder in the Isla of Man, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, in consultation with the Board of | 202

Agriculture for the Isle of Man, has made an Order under the provisions of the Cattle Diseases Prevention Acts, dated 7th February, 1922 (a copy of which is appended), revoking the Orders made on the 24th February, 1914. and permitting the importation of hay, straw and peat-moss litter into the Island by dealers and others under permit issued from the Government Office.

In consequence of the existence of a serious outbreak of Foot-and-Mouth Disease in Great Britain, permits will only be issued for the time being for importation via the port of Southampton, and only hay and straw pur-chased from Messrs. Drew and Sons, of Devizes, will be licensed.

Forms of application for permits may be obtained from Government Office.

## ISLE OF MAN TO WIT.

Order of His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor (dated the 7th February, 1922).

THE HAY, STRAW, AND PEAT-MOSS LITTER (Importation) Order, 1922.

Whereas it is deemed advisable to modify the Orders for regulating the importation of hay, straw, and peat-moss litter into this Island.

Now I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of two members of the Council, and in exercise of all the powers in that behalf given by the Cattle Diseases Prevention Acts, do hereby order as follows:

- 1. No hay, straw, or peat-moss litter, or any other substance used in substitution for straw for bedding animals shall be imported into this Island unless accompanied by a Permit issued by the Government Secretary, which Permit may contain such conditions as may at the time of issue be considered desirable.
  - 2. This Order shall not apply to:-
  - (a) Hay or straw which at the time of importation is being used for packing merchandise; or
  - (b) Manufactured straw not intended for use as fodder or litter for animals.
- 3. The Hay and Straw (Landing) Order of 1914, dated the 24th February. 1914, and the Peat-Moss Litter (Landing) Order of 1914 dated 24th February, 1914, are hereby revoked.
- 4. This Order may be cited as "The Hay, Straw, and Peat-Moss Litter (Importation) Order of 1922."
