WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Act, 1919, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 19th day of Janu-

ary, 1922, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Act, 1919, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of two neighbouring Benefices, that is to say, the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Copford and the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Easthorpe, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Essex and in the Diocese of Chelmsford:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend John Edwin, Bishop of Chelmsford, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Act, 1919, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Copford and Easthorpe duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Chelmsford and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Chelmsford signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas each of the said Benefices of Copford and Easthorpe is now full, the Reverend Edmund Ralph Ruck-Kene being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Cop-

ford and the Reverend Mowbray Pinckney Mason being the present Incumbent of Easthorpe:

"And whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Copford is vested in Your Majesty, Your Heirs and successors and is exercised on behalf of Your Majesty by the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain for the time being:

"And whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Easthorpe is vested in Your Majesty, Your Heirs and successors in right of Your Duchy of Lancaster, and is exercised on behalf of Your Majesty by the Chancellor of the Duchy for the time being:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said John Edwin, Bishop of Chelmsford (in testimony whereof he has hereunto set his hand), and with the consent of the Right Honourable Frederick, Viscount Birkenhead, now Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), and with the consent of the Right Honourable William Robert Wellesley, Viscount Peel, G.B.E., now Chancellor of Your Majesty's said Duchy of Lancaster (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Copford and the said Benefice of Easthorpe shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Copford with Easthorpe' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That if upon the day when an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant, the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith; and if the said Benefice of Easthorpe only shall be then vacant the said union shall also take effect forthwith if the Incumbent of the other of the said two Benefices shall consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice; but if he shall not so consent, then the said union shall take effect upon the then next avoidance of the said Benefice of Copford, and the then Incumbent of Easthorpe shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice; and if the said Benefice of Copford only shall be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Easthorpe; and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant, then the said union shall take effect on the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Easthorpe if the Incumbent at that time of the said Benefice of Copford shall have been instituted to Copford subsequently to the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or if instituted before that date shall consent to become the Incumbent of the United Benefice; but if he shall have been instituted to Copford before that date and shall not so consent, then the said union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacancy of the Benefice of Copford following such avoidance of the Benefice of Easthorpe and the then Incumbent of Easthorpe shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"3. That a Curate be appointed to assist in performing the duties of the United Benefice.

"4. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Copford shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice, and that so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Easthorpe and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall be held and invested by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for the benefit of the Benefice of Feering situate in the said County of Essex and in the said Diocese of Chelmsford.

"5. That after the said union has taken effect all the tithe rentcharges glebe lands and all (if any) other the endowments belonging to the said United Benefice or which may hereafter belong to the same United Benefice shall be charged and for ever after be chargeable in favour of the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Feering, with the annual sum or yearly rentcharge hereinafter mentioned that is to say a clear annual sum or yearly rentcharge of £55 the same annual sum or yearly rentcharge of £55 to be as from the said union due and payable to the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Feering and the same annual sum or yearly rentcharge to be apportionable between any outgoing Incumbent of the said Benefice of Feering or his representatives on the one hand and his successors in the same Incumbency on the other hand; and to be receivable by the Incumbent in whose favour it is charged as aforesaid by equal half-yearly payments on the first day of May and the first day of November in every year; and for the recovery of the said yearly rentcharge the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Feering and his successors shall have and be entitled to all the powers and remedies provided by Section 44 of the Conveyancing and Law of Property Act, 1881, in respect of rentcharges to which that Section applies.

"Provided always that if at any time the Incumbent for the time being of the said United Benefice shall by any Deed duly executed by him under his hand and seal in accordance with the provisions of any Statute in that behalf enabling him grant convey and annex to the said Benefice of Feering any part or parts of the endowments, belonging to the said United Benefice which shall in the opinion of the Bishop of Chelmsford for the time being be a just and fair equivalent or not less than an equivalent for the said yearly charge of £55 hereby proposed to be created as aforesaid then the said annual sum or yearly charge of £55 shall thereupon and thenceforth cease and determine and be no longer payable as hereinbefore recommended and proposed.

"And provided always that the whole of the First Fruits and Tenths now or hereafter payable to the Governors of Queen Anne's Bounty in respect of the United Benefice shall continue to be payable by the Rector or Incumbent of the said United Benefice.

"6 That after the said union has taken

effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices alternately, the Patron of the said Benefice of Copford having the right upon the first presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate right of presentation and the Patron of the said Benefice of Easthorpe having the right upon the second presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate turn thereafter.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been published locally in the manner prescribed in the Statutory Rules made under the said Act and also transmitted in the manner so prescribed to the Patrons affected together with a Notice in each case requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same rules:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Chelmsford has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Act against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas neither of the two Benefices affected by the said Scheme is situate in a City or Municipal Borough:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the two Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Chelmsford.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, Chapter 77, of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, and of the Act of the 37th and 38th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 63, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 16th day of February, 1922, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, Chapter 77, of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, and of the Act of the 37th and 38th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 63, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme with respect to the Archdeaconries of Saint Albans and Bedford, in the Diocese of Saint Albans, and to some of the Rural Deaneries within such Archdeaconries:

"Whereas it has been represented to us by the Right Reverend Michael, Bishop of Saint Albans, that the arrangements which are hereinafter recommended and proposed with respect to the said Archdeaconries of Saint Albans and Bedford and with respect to some of the Rural Deaneries within such Archdeaconries are desirable and should be carried into effect, and we are of opinion that the same may be properly carried into effect:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Michael, Bishop of Saint Albans (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and Episcopal Seal to this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that as from the day on which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, firstly, the Rural Deanery of Bennington within the said Archdeaconry of Saint Albans and comprising the Parishes of Aspenden, Aston, Bennington, Cottered with Broadfield, Great Munden, Little Munden, Sacombe, Throcking, Walkern, Westmill and Yardley (otherwise Ardley), shall cease to exist and the said Parishes of Aspenden, Cottered with Broadfield, Great Munden, Throcking, Westmill and Yardley (otherwise Ardley) shall be included in the Rural Deanery of Buntingford, the said Parish of Walkern shall be included in the Rural Deanery of Hitchin, the said Parishes of Little Munden and Sacombe shall be included in the Rural Deanery of Ware, and the said Parishes of Aston and Bennington shall be included in the Rural Deanery of Welwyn, all such Rural Deaneries being at present in the said Archdeaconry of Saint Albans; secondly, the following Parishes shall be transferred from one Rural Deanery to another in the said Archdeaconry of Saint Albans, that is to say, the Parish of Eastwick, at present in the Rural Deanery of Ware, and the Parishes of Pelham Brent with Pelham Furneaux, and

Pelham Stocking, at present in the Rural Deanery of Buntingford, shall be transferred to the Rural Deanery of Bishop's Stortford; the Parish of Braughing, at present in the Rural Deanery of Bishop's Stortford, shall be transferred to the Rural Deanery of Buntingford; and the Parish of Shenley, at present in the Rural Deanery of Barnet, shall be transferred to the Rural Deanery of Saint Albans; and, thirdly, the Parishes of Bromham with Oakley, Ravensden, Stagsden, Wilden, and Willington, at present in the Rural Deanery of Bedford, in the said Archdeaconry of Bedford, shall be transferred to other Rural Deaneries in the same Archdeaconry as follows, that is to say, the said Parishes of Bromham with Oakley and Stagsden to the Rural Deanery of Felmersham, the said Parishes of Ravensden and Wilden to the Rural Deanery of Riseley, and the said Parish of Willington to the Rural Deanery of Biggleswade; and each of the Parishes hereinbefore referred to shall be subject to the jurisdiction and authority of the Rural Dean of the Rural Deanery to which it is hereby transferred and shall not belong to or be a part of any other Rural Deanery nor be subject to the jurisdiction and authority of any other Rural Dean.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other matter or thing with respect to the matters aforesaid, or any of them by virtue of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas notices of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Archdeacons affected by the Scheme, that is to say, to the Archdeacon of Saint Albans, and to the Archdeacon of Bedford, and they have expressed their approval of the same:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Saint Albans.

WHEREAS in pursuance of the powers conferred on Him by the Treaty of Peace Act, 1919, and the Treaties of Peace (Austria and Bulgaria) Act, 1920, and the Treaty of Peace (Hungary) Act, 1921, His Majesty in Council was pleased to make the

Treaty of Peace Order, 1919, the Treaty of Peace (Austria) Order, 1920, the Treaty of Peace (Bulgaria) Order, 1920, and the Treaty of Peace (Hungary) Order, 1921, and various Orders amending the aforesaid Orders:

And whereas it is expedient that the aforesaid Orders as amended should be further amended in manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

1. The Orders made under the said Acts shall have effect and shall be deemed always to have had effect as if the words "shall be the period ending the ninth day of February, nineteen hundred and twenty-three" were substituted:

(a) In Article 1 (xviii) of the Treaty of Peace Order, 1919, (as amended) for the words "shall be nineteen months from the coming into force of the Treaty";

(b) In Article 1 (xxiv) of the Treaty of Peace (Austria) Order, 1920, (as amended) for the words "shall be eighteen months from the coming into force of the Treaty";

(c) In Article 1 (xvii) of the Treaty of Peace (Bulgaria) Order, 1920, (as amended) for the words "shall be eighteen months from the coming into force of the Treaty"; and

(d) In Article 1 (xxiv) of the Treaty of Peace (Hungary) Order, 1921, for the words "shall be ten months from the coming into force of the Treaty."

2. This Order may be cited as the Treaties of Peace Orders (Amendment) Order, 1922, and the Treaty of Peace Orders 1919 to 1921 and this Order, the Treaty of Peace (Austria) Orders, 1920 to 1921 and this Order, the Treaty of Peace (Bulgaria) Orders, 1920 to 1921 and this Order, and the Treaty of Peace (Hungary) Order, 1921 and this Order, may respectively be cited together as the Treaty of Peace Orders 1919 to 1922, the Treaty of Peace (Austria) Orders, 1920 to 1922, the Treaty of Peace (Bulgaria) Orders, 1920 to 1922, and the Treaty of Peace (Hungary) Orders, 1921 to 1922.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by treaty, capitulation, grant, usage, sufferance and other lawful means His Majesty the King has jurisdiction in the Ottoman Dominions:

And whereas such jurisdiction is now exercised as provided in the Ottoman Order in Council, 1910 (in this Order referred to as the Principal Order), and it is desirable to amend the said Order:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as "The Turkey

Order in Council, 1922," and shall be read as one with the Principal Order.

2. This Order shall not apply to Egypt.

3.—(1) The operation of so much of the Principal Order as relates to the power and jurisdiction of courts is hereby suspended until His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, shall otherwise order, in such portions of the Ottoman Dominions as may be subject to the military occupation of Great Britain or of an Allied Power or Powers provided that Courts have been established therein by the occupying Power or Powers which are recognised by His Majesty as competent to exercise jurisdiction over British subjects and their property and over British ships.

(2) The Secretary of State shall from time to time give notice of any such suspension of the Principal Order and shall specify the areas within which such suspension shall operate.

Any notice by the Secretary of State under this Article may be rescinded, revoked, varied or amended and shall be published as he may direct.

(3) Provided that where any proceedings have been taken previous to the issue of any such notice by the Secretary of State before any court established under the Principal Order of which the jurisdiction is suspended and are still pending at the date of such notice, such proceedings may be completed before the court, in which they were instituted or may by order of the Supreme Court be transferred to the Supreme Court. All steps taken, and any act done by any judge, consular officer or other person in the course of such proceeding shall be deemed to be valid if they would have been valid but for the issue of such notice, and no action shall be entertained in any court against such judge, officer or person in respect of any such act.

Supreme Court.

4. The Supreme Court shall subject to the provisions of Article 6 of this Order consist of a judge to be appointed in accordance with the provisions of Article 8 of the Principal Order.

The judge shall be, at the time of his appointment, a member of the Bar of England, Scotland or Ireland, of not less than seven years standing.

5. During a vacancy in the office of judge, or in case of the illness or incapacity of the judge or of his absence from the Ottoman Dominions, the Secretary of State may appoint a fit person to act as judge.

An acting judge shall, during the continuance of his appointment, have all the power and authority of the judge.

Full Court.

6.—(1) The judge of the Supreme Court for Egypt for the time being shall, without further appointment, be a member of the Full Court provided for in Article 8 (3) of the Principal Order, and the judge of the Supreme Court for Egypt and the judge of the Supreme Court, sitting together, shall constitute the Full Court for the purposes of the said Order.

(2) When there is a difference of opinion in the Full Court, the opinion of the judge of the Supreme Court for Egypt shall prevail.

Registration.

7. The following provisions are substituted for Articles 151-161 inclusive of the Principal Order:—

(1) A register of British subjects shall be kept in the office of every Consulate in the Ottoman Dominions.

(2) Every British subject resident in the Ottoman Dominions shall, in the month of January of each year, be registered at the Consulate of the consular district within which he resides, provided that if some other Consulate is more easy of access, he may, with the assent of the Consular Officer, be registered there. A British subject arriving in the Ottoman Dominions must apply for registration within one month after his arrival; provided that a person who fails to apply for or to obtain registration within the time limited by this Article may be registered at any time if he excuses his failure to the satisfaction of the Consular Officer.

(3) Where a person is in possession of a valid British passport the Consular Officer shall, on the first registration of any such person, endorse on the passport without further fee than that provided for in sub-Article (6) hereunder, a certificate of registration in such form as may be prescribed by the Secretary of State. Where any such person applies for the renewal of the registration and produces his passport, the renewal of the registration shall, without further fee than that provided for in sub-Article (6) hereunder, be endorsed thereon.

(4) Every person who has not previously been registered applying to be registered under this Order shall, unless excused by the Consular Officer, attend personally for that purpose at the Consulate, but any person applying for the renewal of his registration need not attend personally unless directed by the Consular Officer so to do, provided that the registration of the wife or wives of a man who is registered under this Order may, if living with him, be effected without their personal attendance being required, and provided also that the registration of minors, being his relatives in whatever degree, living with the head of a family who is registered under this Order, may be effected without their personal attendance being required.

(5) A person registered in any register of British subjects established under the provisions of any Order in Council which have been repealed shall be registered under the provisions of this Order, unless the Consular Officer is satisfied after enquiry that the previous registration was erroneous or that such person is not entitled to registration under the provisions of this Order.

(6) Every person shall, on every registration of himself, and on every renewal of the registration, pay a fee of 2s. 6d., or such other fee as the Secretary of State from time to time appoints. The amount of the fee may be uniform for all persons or may vary according to the position and circumstances of different classes, if the Secretary of State from time to time so directs, but may not in any case exceed 5s.

(7) Where any person applies to be registered, he shall be entitled without a fee to the assistance of the Consular Officer in the preparation of any affidavit that may be required.

(8) The Consular Officer may require the production of such evidence that an applicant for registration is entitled to the status of a British subject as he may see fit, but subject to such directions as may be issued by the Secretary of State.

(9) If any British subject neglects to obtain registration under the provisions of this Order, he shall not be entitled to be recognised or protected as a British subject in the Ottoman Dominions, and shall be liable to a fine not exceeding £2 for each instance of such failure, but he shall, although not registered, be subject to the jurisdiction of His Majesty's Courts in the Ottoman Dominions.

8. From and after the commencement of this Order, Articles 151-161 inclusive of the Principal Order are repealed, but this repeal shall not prejudice any rights, obligations, or liabilities accrued thereunder.

9. The Secretary of State may, by notice in writing published in such manner as he may think fit, suspend the operation of Article 7 of this Order in any part of the Ottoman Dominions in which he considers that sufficient provision is made by local enactments for the registration of British subjects.

General.

10. No proceedings which may have been taken previous to the making of this Order in any place within the limits of this Order before any court established under the Principal Order shall be questioned upon the ground of any lack of validity on the part of the court in or before which, or of the judge before whom, such proceedings were taken.

11. In Article 103 of the Principal Order the words "except the jurisdiction relative to dissolution or nullity or jactitation of marriage" are hereby repealed and from and after the commencement of this Order the Supreme Court shall, as far as circumstances admit, have for and within the Ottoman Dominions with respect to British subjects all such jurisdiction in matrimonial causes as for the time being belongs to the High Court in England.

12.—(1) This Order shall take effect as soon as it is first exhibited in the public office of the Supreme Court, and that date is in this Order referred to as the commencement of the Order.

(2) For that purpose the Judge of the Supreme Court shall, on the receipt by him of a certified printed copy of the Order, cause the same to be affixed and exhibited conspicuously in that Office. He shall also keep the same so affixed and exhibited during one month from that first exhibition.

(3) Proof shall not in any proceeding or matter be required that the provisions of this Article have been complied with, nor shall any act or proceeding be invalidated by any failure to comply with any such provisions.

day of March, 1922, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877."

(B) A worker employed upon Piece Work is entitled to receive not less than the Guaranteed Time Rate appropriate to her age (as set out in Column III. above) in any case where her earnings on Piece-Work are less than such sum.

PART III.

OVERTIME RATES (AS VARIED) FOR

SECTION I.—In accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board HAVE DECLARED THE NORMAL NUMBER OF HOURS OF WORK IN THE TRADE to be as follows :—

Provided that all hours worked by a worker on Sundays shall be regarded as Overtime, to which the Overtime Rates shall apply.

SECTION II.—The Minimum Rates for Overtime for all Workers in respect of hours

worked by a worker in excess of the declared normal number of hours shall be as follows :—

(a) For the first two hours of Overtime on any day except Sunday, the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Quarter times the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable, i.e., TIME-AND-A-QUARTER.

(b) For Overtime after the first two hours of Overtime on any day except Sunday, the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Half times the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable, i.e., TIME-AND-A-HALF.

(c) For all time worked on Sunday, the Overtime Rate shall be Twice the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable, i.e., DOUBLE-TIME.

(d) For all hours worked in any week in excess of 48, the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Quarter times the Minimum

Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-QUARTER, except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of paragraphs (b) and (c) of this Section.

The Overtime Rates shall be payable where on any day (not being a Sunday) the number of hours worked exceeds 9, or in the case of Saturday, exceeds $4\frac{1}{2}$, notwithstanding that the number of hours worked in the week does not exceed 48.

SECTION III.—The provisions of this Part of this Notice are without prejudice to the payment of Overtime Rates after a lesser number of hours than those declared by the Trade Board to be the normal number in the trade, in cases where such lesser number of hours constitutes the number customarily worked in the establishment.

NOTE.—The hours which Female Workers, Young Persons and Children are allowed to work are subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts and to the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920.

PART IV.

SECTION I.—The above Minimum Rates apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all Workers in Great Britain in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Linen and Cotton Handkerchief and Household Goods and Linen Piece Goods) Order, 1920.

SECTION II.—The Trade as specified in the above-mentioned Order is as follows:—

1. The making of such articles as are specified in (a) and (b) below, from linen or cotton or mixed linen and cotton fabrics (excepting knitted fabrics), or from other textile fabrics when the work is carried on in establishments mainly engaged in the making of such articles from the before-mentioned fabrics, *viz.*:—

(a) Handkerchiefs (including Mufflers or Flaps when made in association or in conjunction with handkerchiefs);

(b) Bed-Linen, Towels, Dusters, Table-napery, Bed-spreads, Tea-cloths, Table-centres, Sideboard-covers, Cushion-covers or similar household articles;

including all or any of the following operations:

(i) Hooking, cutting or tearing the material;

(ii) Vice-folding;

(iii) Machine hemming, hem-stitching, spoking, over-locking, tambouring, button-holing, and other plain or fancy machine stitching;

(iv) All processes of embroidery or decorative needlework done by machine, whether before or after the making of the articles of the description specified above;

(v) The following processes, if done by machine:—Thread-drawing, thread-clipping, top-sewing, scalloping, nickelling and paring;

(vi) All processes of laundering, smoothing, folding, ornamenting, boxing, finishing, warehousing, packing, and other similar operations incidental to or apper-

taining to the making of the articles of the description specified above.

2. The making-up in linen warehouses or in establishments mainly engaged in linen lapping, of linen or mixed linen and cotton or other textile fabrics in the piece, or of linen or mixed linen and cotton or other textile articles cut from the piece, including:—

Measuring, cutting, lapping, ornamenting, boxing, warehousing, packing and similar operations.

PART V.

SECTION I.—The above Minimum Rates must be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other provident fund.

SECTION II.—THE ABOVE MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES ARE WITHOUT PREJUDICE TO WORKERS WHO ARE EARNING HIGHER RATES OF WAGES.

* Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, the rates shall become effective as from the beginning of the next full-pay period, but in any case not later than 17th March, 1922.

SCHEDULE.

PART I.

OVERTIME RATES FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS EMPLOYED ON PIECE-WORK.

SECTION I.—In accordance with Section 3 (i) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board have declared the normal number of hours of work in the trade to be as follows:—

In any week	48
On any day (other than Saturday)	$8\frac{3}{4}$
On Saturday	$4\frac{1}{2}$

Provided that *all* hours worked on Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays

shall be regarded as Overtime to which the Overtime Rates shall apply.

SECTION II.—The Minimum Rates for Overtime in respect of hours worked by Male and Female Workers EMPLOYED ON PIECE-WORK in excess of the declared normal number of hours of work in the trade shall be:—

(a) For all time worked on Sundays or Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, Piece-Rates which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an ordinary worker not less than the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate as fixed by the Trade Board with the addition of THE FULL AMOUNT OF THE APPROPRIATE GENERAL MINIMUM TIME-RATE which would have been payable if the worker had been employed on time-work.

(b) For Overtime on any day except Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, Piece-Rates which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an ordinary worker not less than the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate as fixed by the Trade Board with the addition of ONE-HALF OF THE APPROPRIATE GENERAL MINIMUM TIME-RATE which would have been payable if the worker had been employed on time-work.

(c) For all time worked, in any week, in excess of 48 hours, Piece-Rates which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an ordinary worker not less than the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate as fixed by the Trade Board with the addition of ONE-HALF OF THE APPROPRIATE GENERAL MINIMUM TIME-RATE which would have been payable if the worker had been employed on time-work, except where a higher amount is payable under Sub-section (a) of this Section.

(d) The Overtime Rates shall be payable where on any day (not being a Sunday or Customary Public or Statutory Holiday) the number of hours worked exceeds $8\frac{1}{2}$, or in the case of Saturday exceeds $4\frac{1}{2}$, notwithstanding that the number of hours worked in the week does not exceed 48.

Provided that in the case of those classes of workers in the Municipal Burgh of Brechin, the Parish of Brechin, the Municipal Burgh of Forfar, the Parish of Forfar, the Burgh of Kirriemuir, the Parish of Kirriemuir, the Parishes of Blairgowrie and Rattray, the Burgh of Carnoustie or the Parish of Logie Pert, who in accordance with the established practice of the establishment attend for nine hours per day on five days of the week and for three hours on Saturday, the Overtime Rate specified in Sub-section (b) of this Section shall not be payable in respect of the first quarter of an hour in excess of $8\frac{1}{2}$ hours on any day except Saturdays, Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, but shall be payable in respect of all hours worked on any such day in excess of nine hours.

Provided also that in the case of those classes of workers in the areas specified in the first proviso to this Section who, in accordance with the established practice of the establishment, attend only on five days a week, the Overtime Rate specified in Sub-section (b) of this Section shall not be payable in respect of the first

three-quarters of an hour in excess of $8\frac{1}{2}$ hours on any day except Saturdays, Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, but shall be payable on any such day in respect of all hours worked in excess of $9\frac{1}{2}$ hours.

Note.—The hours which female workers, young persons and children are allowed to work are subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts and of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920.

PART II.

GENERAL.

SECTION I.—The above Overtime Rates shall apply, subject to the provisions of this Schedule and of the Trade Boards Acts, to all Male and Female Workers employed on Piece-Work in respect of all time worked in excess of the declared normal number of hours of work in any branch of the Jute Trade as specified in the Trade Boards (Jute) Order, 1919, that is to say:—The preparing, spinning or weaving (a) of jute or (b) of jute and any other fibre, except flax or hemp;

Including:—

(1) The preparing and spinning of waste reclaimed at any stage; and

(2) All packing, despatching, warehousing, storing, or other operations incidental to or appertaining to any of the above-mentioned work; but

Excluding:—

(1) The calendering, bleaching, dyeing or finishing of any of the above-mentioned materials; and

(2) The preparing or spinning of materials required for the making or re-making of (a) rope (including driving rope and banding), (b) cord (including blind and window cord, but excluding silk, worsted and other fancy cords), (c) core for wire ropes, (d) lines, (e) twine (including binder and trawl twine), (f) lanyards, (g) net and similar articles, when such preparing or spinning is carried on in the same factory or workshop as the said making or re-making; and

(3) The making or repair of sacks or bags; and also

(4) The weaving of carpets, rugs or mats.

SECTION II.—The above minimum rates of wages shall be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other provident fund.

SECTION III.—The above minimum rates of wages shall be without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, for the Flax and Hemp Trade in Great Britain as specified in the Trade Boards (Flax and Hemp) Order, 1919, HEREBY GIVE NOTICE, that they PROPOSE TO VARY the General Minimum Time-Rates, Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate, General Minimum Piece Rates, and Overtime Rates at present fixed and set out in their Notice F.H. (6), dated 21st October, 1921, in their application to certain Classes of Male and Female Workers, the proposed variations being as shown in the Schedule set out below.

The Minister of Labour has given his consent to the issue of this Notice.

Candidates who fall short of this adequate proficiency but show such minimum proficiency as is evidence that with a moderate amount of practice they can attain full proficiency, will receive marks ranging between 1 and 100; they will be allowed to proceed to India and will on their arrival there be subjected to such further tests in riding as may be prescribed by their local Government, and shall receive no increase to their initial salary until they have passed such tests to the satisfaction of that Government.

A candidate who fails at the end of the period of probation to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners that he has reached the minimum standard of proficiency in riding will be liable to have his name removed from the list of selected candidates.

Selected candidates will also be examined in riding at such time or times as the Commissioners may appoint during the course of the probationary period.

(11) Such deductions as the Civil Service Commissioners may consider necessary will be made from the marks assigned to candidates at the Intermediate and Final Examinations in order to secure that no credit is allowed for merely superficial knowledge.

(12) The Civil Service Commissioners will prepare lists of the candidates in order of merit; the order for the one-year probationers being based on the sum of the marks obtained by the candidates at the Open Competitive and Final Examinations, the order for the two-year probationers being based on the sum of the marks obtained by the candidates at the Intermediate and Final Examinations.

(13) The selected candidates whose performance in the compulsory subjects of the prescribed Examinations—namely, the Final Examination for one-year men and the Intermediate and Final Examinations for two-year men—is such as to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners, and who have also satisfied the Commissioners of their eligibility in respect of nationality, age, health, character and conduct during the period of probation, shall be certified by the Commissioners to be entitled to be appointed to the Indian Civil Service, provided that they shall comply with the regulations in force, at the time, for that service.

(14) If any candidate is prevented by sickness or any other adequate cause from attending the Final Examination, the Commissioners may, with the concurrence of the Secretary of State for India in Council, allow him to appear at the Final Examination to be held in the following year, or at a special examination. A selected candidate absent for such adequate cause from the Intermediate Examination may, under similar conditions, be allowed to appear at the Intermediate Examination a year later, or at a special examination, or may be excused the Intermediate Examination and allowed to

appear for the Final Examination in regular course.

The above regulations will be the first regulations issued for the probation and Intermediate and Final Examinations of selected candidates recruited by Competitive Examinations held in India, and will also take the place of sections 16 to 27 of the Regulations previously made by the Secretary of State for India in Council for the examination of candidates for the Indian Civil Service at the Open Competition held annually in the United Kingdom.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 8TH MARCH 1922.)

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

1. The restrictions on movement of swine imposed by the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, and the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Application Order of 1917 (No. 1), shall not apply to the movement of swine from the sale mentioned in the Schedule hereto to any premises in Great Britain not being a Swine-Fever Infected Place, and not being in any Scheduled District for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Control of Movement) Order of 1920, if the swine are accompanied by a licence in the Form F set forth in the First Schedule to the said Order of 1908, granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the county of Dorset, and the following conditions, which shall be specified in the licence, are complied with:—

(i) The swine shall be moved to the place of destination specified in the licence and not elsewhere, and shall be there detained and kept separate from all other swine for twenty-eight days, unless they are slaughtered on such premises before the expiration of that period, or are moved under and in accordance with the conditions of a licence in the Form C set forth in the said First Schedule to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse in the same Scheduled Area.

(ii) The swine shall be moved by the nearest available route without unnecessary delay, and during the movement shall, so far as is practicable, be kept separate from all swine not being moved with a licence under this Order.

(iii) After completion of the movement the licence shall forthwith be delivered up

at, or sent by post to, the nearest police-station in the same district by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing such movement.

2. Swine may also be moved from the Sale mentioned in the Schedule hereto, to premises situate in any Scheduled District described in the First Schedule to the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Great Britain) Order of 1922 (No. 9), if accompanied by a licence under that Order. Swine so moved shall be subject to the conditions set out in paragraphs (i) (ii) and (iii) of Article 1 of this Order.

3. A copy of a licence issued under Article 1 of this Order shall be sent by the Inspector granting the same to the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination specified in the licence is situate.

4. A licence under this Order shall for the purposes of the Orders mentioned in Article 1 of this Order be treated as a licence under those Orders.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 9TH MARCH 1922.)

FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (GREAT BRITAIN) ORDER OF 1922 (No. 11).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Disinfection and Cleansing of Vehicles used for the conveyance of animals in certain areas.

1.—(1) Any float, cart, van or other vehicle (other than a railway truck) used for the conveyance of any animal or carcass thereof (not being a dressed carcass) into, within, or out of any area for the time being included in the Second Schedule to the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Great Britain) Order of 1922 (No. 9), shall, as soon as practicable after each occasion on which it is so used, and before any other animal is placed therein, be disinfected

and cleansed by, and at the expense of, the person using the same for such purpose in the manner following:—

(a) The floor of the vehicle, and all other parts thereof with which any animal or its droppings have come in contact, and all dung, litter or other thing that has been in contact with or used by such animals whilst being conveyed therein, shall be thoroughly saturated with carbolic acid or other suitable disinfectant.

(b) The same parts of the vehicle shall thereafter be scraped and swept out, and all dung, litter and sweepings shall be effectually removed from contact with animals and buried or otherwise destroyed.

(2) Every rope, net, or other apparatus used in connection with any such conveyance of animals as aforesaid otherwise than on a railway shall, as soon as practicable after being so used, and before being used for other animals, be disinfected to the satisfaction of an Inspector of the Local Authority by being thoroughly saturated with a solution of carbolic acid or other suitable disinfectant.

2. If the person using any such vehicle or thing for the conveyance of an animal fails to disinfect and cleanse it as required by this Article, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894, and it shall be lawful for the Local Authority, without prejudice to the recovery of any penalty for the offence, to cause such vehicle or thing to be disinfected and cleansed and to recover summarily the expenses of such disinfection and cleansing from such person.

3. Where the power of causing any vehicle or thing to be disinfected and cleansed under this Article is exercised by a Local Authority, the owner of the vehicle or thing and the person using the same shall give all reasonable facilities for that purpose, and any person failing to give such facilities shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Interpretation.

4. "Animals" means cattle, sheep, goats and swine.

"Carcass" means the undressed carcass of an animal, and includes a part of such carcass.

"The Act of 1894" means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

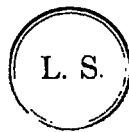

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF
AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 9TH MARCH 1922.)

FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (AMEND-
MENT) ORDER OF 1922.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Amendment of Article 1 of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease Order of 1895.

1. Article 1 (*Notice of Disease*) of the Foot-and Mouth Disease Order of 1895 (hereinafter referred to as the "principal Order") is hereby revoked, and the following substituted therefor:—

" Notice of Disease.

" 1. (1) Every person having or having had in his possession or under his charge an animal or carcase affected with or suspected of foot-and-mouth disease shall with all practicable speed give notice of the fact of the animal or carcase being so affected or suspected to a constable of the police force for the police area wherein the animal or carcase so affected or suspected is or was.

" (2) The constable receiving such notice shall immediately transmit the information by telegraph to the Secretary, Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries, 4, Whitehall Place, London, S.W. 1.

" (3) The constable shall also forthwith give information of the receipt by him of the notice to an Inspector of the Local Authority, who shall forthwith report the same to the Local Authority and to the Medical Officer of Health of the Sanitary District in which the animal or carcase so affected or suspected is or was."

Amendment of Article 2 of the Principal Order.

2. Paragraph (3) of Article 2 of the principal Order is hereby revoked, and the following substituted therefor:—

" (3) Every such Inspector shall, on leaving any premises on which foot-and-mouth disease exists, or is suspected to exist, thoroughly disinfect his hands and boots."

Amendment of Article 3 of the Principal Order.

3. Paragraph (2) of Article 3 of the principal Order is hereby revoked, and the following substituted therefor:—

" (2) Every such Veterinary Inspector shall, before entering any premises in which foot-and-mouth disease exists, or is suspected to exist, put on suitable overall clothing and boots which are disinfectable, and he shall on leaving such premises, thoroughly disinfect his hands, overall clothing and boots."

Amendment of Rules for Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Place.

4. Article 4 of the principal Order is hereby revoked, and the following substituted therefor:—

" Rules for Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Place.

" 4. In addition to the Rules for foot-and-mouth disease contained in Part II. of the First Schedule to the Act of 1894, the following Additional Rules shall have effect in relation to an Infected Place:—

" Rule 1. Animals shall not be moved into or out of an Infected Place except with a Licence of an Inspector or Officer of the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries.

Rule 2. Dressed carcasses shall not be removed from an Infected Place except with the permission in writing from an Inspector or Officer of the Ministry or an Inspector of the Local Authority. The heads, feet, stomachs and intestines from such carcasses shall be buried or otherwise destroyed on the Infected Place. The hides from such carcasses shall not be removed from the Infected Place except with the permission, in writing, of an Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority, and only after they have been immersed in the prescribed disinfectant solution for not less than one hour. The carcasses (except the hides) of animals that have not been slaughtered but have died from causes other than Foot-and-Mouth Disease shall be destroyed by and at the expense of the owner on the Infected Place, or, where this is impracticable, at such other place as may be prescribed by the Local Authority. The hides of animals which have so died may be removed from the Infected Place with the permission, in writing, of an Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority after they have been immersed in the prescribed disinfectant solution for not less than one hour.

Rule 3. Fodder, litter, dung, utensils, pens, hurdles or other things shall not be removed from an Infected Place except with the permission in writing from an Inspector or Officer of the Ministry or an Inspector of the Local Authority, which permission shall not be granted until such things have been thoroughly disinfected. Dung shall not be removed out of an Infected Place otherwise than to a destructor or to a suitable place of storage approved by the Local Authority for the purpose. Provided that dung shall not be moved into the district of another Local Authority unless the consent of that Local Authority, either generally or in the particular instance, has been previously obtained. In any case in which dung or litter is removed from any shed, field or other place in which a diseased or suspected animal is or has recently been kept to any other site within the limits of the Infected Place, such dung or litter shall, after removal, be closely packed and the outside of the heap sprayed with a prescribed disinfectant, and any dung or litter added to the heap shall likewise be closely packed, and thereafter at once sprayed with a prescribed disinfectant. Such disinfection shall be carried out by and at the expense of the owner.

Rule 4. All liquid manure, urine or shed washings shall be thoroughly disinfected

by and at the expense of the owner, to the satisfaction of an Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority, before being permitted to drain or escape from any shed, yard or other like place in which a diseased or suspected animal is or has recently been kept.

Rule 5. No person (except the person tending the animal) shall, unless authorised in writing by an Inspector or Officer of the Ministry or by an Inspector of the Local Authority, enter any shed, field or other place being part of an Infected Place.

Rule 6. Every person entering any shed, field or other place in which a diseased or suspected animal is or has recently been kept shall wear suitable overall clothing and boots which are disinfected, to be approved by an Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority.

Rule 7. Every person upon leaving any shed, field or other place in which a diseased or suspected animal is or has recently been kept shall leave the overall clothing in such shed, field or other place, and shall thoroughly disinfect his hands and boots.

Rule 8. A person tending a diseased or suspected animal shall not tend any animal not so diseased or suspected except with the permission in writing of an Inspector or Officer of the Ministry.

Rule 9. Any Veterinary Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority, and any valuer or any veterinary practitioner or other person employed by the owner to treat the animals on any part of the Infected Place, shall, before entering the Infected Place, put on suitable overall clothing made of rubber or other material impervious to liquid, and rubber boots, and shall before leaving the Infected Place thoroughly disinfect his hands, and thoroughly swab his overall clothing and rubber boots with a prescribed disinfectant solution and remove therefrom all extraneous matter, dung, mud, or like matter.

Rule 10. A receptacle containing a prescribed disinfectant shall be kept in some convenient place at all such exits from the Infected Place as may be required by an Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority. Fresh disinfectant shall be placed in such receptacles as often as may be necessary, and at least once in every twenty-four hours.

Rule 11. Milk from any diseased or suspected animal shall not be used for the food of any other animals unless and until it has been boiled or otherwise sterilised. Any utensil in which such milk is placed before being so treated shall be thoroughly cleansed with boiling water before any other milk is placed therein. For the purposes of this Rule the expression "milk" shall be deemed to include whey, butter milk, or separated milk.

Rule 12. The disinfectant prescribed for use under these Rules shall be supplied by and at the expense of the Local Authority unless the Local Authority by Regulation require the occupier of the premises to supply it at his own expense.

Amendment of Article 9 of the Principal Order.

5. Article 9 of the Principal Order is hereby revoked and the following substituted therefor:—

"Final Disinfection for Foot-and-Mouth Disease."

"9.—(1) Every shed or other place in which an animal affected with Foot-and-Mouth disease has been kept while so affected, or has died or been slaughtered, shall be disinfected and cleansed as follows:—

(a) The whole of the interior of such shed or other place, including the fittings, shall be thoroughly washed or sprayed with the prescribed disinfectant; then

(b) all dung and other discharges shall be scraped from the walls, fittings, and floors, and the shed or other place swept out, and all litter, dung, or other thing that has been in contact with, or used about, any animal shall be effectually removed therefrom; then

(c) the floor of the shed or other place and all other parts thereof with which an animal or its droppings or any discharge from the mouth or nostrils has come in contact shall be thoroughly washed or sprayed with the prescribed disinfectant.

(2) All litter, dung, or other thing that has been removed from the shed or other place shall be forthwith disinfected, or burnt or otherwise destroyed.

(3) Where any yard or other place of that nature is not capable of being so disinfected and cleansed, it shall be sufficient if such yard or place be disinfected and cleansed so far as practicable.

(4) The Local Authority may by Regulation require the occupier of any such shed or other place to disinfect and cleanse the same in accordance with this Article at the expense of the Local Authority or at the expense of such occupier.

(5) Where the Local Authority have made no Regulation under this Article the provisions of this Article shall be executed by the Local Authority at their own expense, except so far as is otherwise provided by this Order.

(6) If the occupier of any place fails to disinfect and cleanse it in accordance with any Regulation made by a Local Authority under this Article, it shall be lawful for the Local Authority, without prejudice to the recovery of any penalty for the infringement of such Regulation, to cause such place to be disinfected and cleansed and to recover summarily the expenses of such disinfection and cleansing from such occupier."

Prescribed Disinfectant.

6. The expression "prescribed disinfectant" in this Order means:—

(a) A one per cent. (minimum) solution of chloride of lime containing not less than thirty per cent. of available chlorine; or

(b) a five per cent. (minimum) solution of carbolic acid (containing not less than ninety-five per cent. of actual carbolic acid); or

(c) a disinfectant equal in disinfective efficiency to the above-mentioned solution of carbolic acid.

Existing Regulations of Local Authority.

7. All Regulations made by a Local Authority under Article 9 of the principal Order, and in force immediately before the commencement

of this Order, shall be deemed to have been made under this Order, and shall continue in force until altered or revoked by the Local Authority.

Extent.

8. This Order extends to Great Britain.

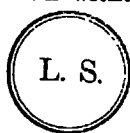
