WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 2nd day of March, 1922, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for constituting a separate District for spiritual purposes to be taken out of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Christ Church, Luton, in the County of Bedford and in the Diocese of Saint Albans:

“ Whereas we are satisfied that the said

New Parish of Christ Church, Luton, is a Cure wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular part of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Luton, which is hereinafter mentioned and described should be constituted a separate District in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

“ And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate District any consecrated Church or Chapel in use for the purposes of Divine Worship:

“ And whereas we have agreed to make and pay out of the Common Fund created by the firstly herein mentioned Act a grant of £250 per annum to the Minister of the said proposed separate District so soon as a Minister shall have been duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein mentioned Act and to his successors:

“ And whereas the said grant of the said yearly sum of £250 will after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme be made and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111:

" And whereas a piece of land situate within the said proposed separate District has been conveyed to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, as the site for a permanent Church for such District, and there has been contributed and paid to the credit of our account at the Bank of England a sum of £2,000 towards the cost of erecting such permanent Church :

" And whereas the said sum of £2,000 has been contributed and paid as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) the whole right of patronage of the said proposed District, and, when such District shall have become a New Parish, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof should be assigned in the manner which is hereinafter set forth :

" And whereas the contributors of the said sum of £2,000 towards the cost of erecting such permanent Church have nominated to us the Bishop for the time being of the said Diocese of Saint Albans as the person to whom they desire the whole right of patronage of the said proposed District or New Parish should be assigned :

" Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Michael, Bishop of Saint Albans (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all that part of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Luton, which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part together with the boundaries thereof is delineated and set forth on the Map or Plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid, become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of All Saints, Luton.'

" And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of patronage of the said District so recommended to be constituted and when such District shall have become a New Parish as aforesaid then of the said New Parish and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof shall without any assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid be assigned to and be absolutely vested in the said Michael, Bishop of the said Diocese of Saint Albans, and his successors, for ever.

" And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

" The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

" The District of All Saints, Luton, being :

" All that part of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Christ Church, Luton, in

the County of Bedford and in the Diocese of Saint Albans, which is bounded upon the north and upon the north west by the New Parish of Biscot, in the said County and Diocese, upon the west by the Parish of Caddington, partly in the said County of Bedford and partly in the County of Hertford and wholly in the said Diocese of Saint Albans, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south, upon the south east and upon the north east, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said Parish of Caddington from the said New Parish of Christ Church, Luton, crosses the middle of the Hatfield, Luton, and Dunstable Branch Line of the Great Northern Railway, and extending thence eastward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of 1 mile and 14 chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the eastern side of the bridge which carries Clifton Road across the said line of railway, and extending thence north eastward and in a straight line (thereby crossing the Luton Town Football Ground) for a distance of 7 chains or thereabouts to the junction of Beech Road with the roadway running along the north eastern side of the said football ground, and extending thence north eastward along the middle of Beech Road for a distance of 10½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Dunstable Road, and extending thence north westward along the middle of Dunstable Road for a distance of 1 chain or thereabouts to its junction with Legrave Road and Bury Park Road, and extending thence first north eastward and then south eastward along the middle of Bury Park Road for a distance of 13½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Waldeck Road, and extending thence north eastward along the middle of Waldeck Road for a distance of 2½ chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries the Main Line of the Midland Railway across Waldeck Road, and extending thence north westward along the middle of the last mentioned line of railway for a distance of 57½ chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Christ Church, Luton, from the said New Parish of Biscot."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patron and to the Incumbent of the Cure out of which it is intended that the District recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such Patron and Incumbent have respectively signified their assent to such Scheme :

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council :

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Saint Albans.

"Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Wainfleet Saint Mary is vested in an estate in fee simple without incumbrances in the Mayor and Commonalty and Citizens of the City of London Masters Guardians and Governors of the House and Hospital called Bethlem situate without and near to Bishopsgate of the said City of London, (hereinafter called 'the said Governors'):

"And whereas the said Governors are desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Wainfleet Saint Mary, now vested in them as aforesaid should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop of Lincoln for the time being:

"And whereas the Charity Commissioners for England and Wales by an Order dated the 6th day of January, 1922, have authorized the said Governors to do and execute all such acts and assurances as should be necessary or proper for voluntarily transferring to the Bishop of Lincoln the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Wainfleet Saint Mary:

"And whereas the Right Reverend William Shuckburgh, now Bishop of Lincoln, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary, he, the said William Shuckburgh, Bishop of Lincoln, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Wainfleet Saint Mary which is hereinbefore mentioned and herein-

after recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the Parish or District in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the Parish of Wainfleet Saint Mary:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Governors (in testimony whereof they have sealed this Scheme with their Common or Corporate Seal), and with the consent of the said William Shuckburgh, Bishop of Lincoln, (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Wainfleet Saint Mary now vested in them, the said Governors as aforesaid, shall be transferred to the said William Shuckburgh, Bishop of Lincoln, and his successors in the same Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said William Shuckburgh, Bishop of Lincoln, and by his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Lincoln.

"Whereas it has been represented to us by the Right Reverend Edward Stuart, Bishop of Winchester, that the arrangements which are hereinafter recommended and proposed with respect to the said Archdeaconries of Surrey and Winchester and with respect to some of the Rural Deaneries within such Archdeaconries are desirable and should be carried into effect and we are of opinion that the same may be properly carried into effect:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Edward Stuart, Bishop of Winchester, (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and Episcopal Seal to this Scheme) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that as from the day on which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, firstly, the Parish of Ash shall be transferred from the Rural Deanery of Guildford in the said Archdeaconry of Surrey to the Rural Deanery of Aldershot in the said Archdeaconry of Winchester; secondly, the following Parishes shall be transferred from one Rural Deanery to another in the said Archdeaconry of Winchester, that is to say, the Parishes of Greywell and Odiham, at present in the Rural Deanery of Aldershot, shall be transferred to the Rural Deanery of Basingstoke; the Parish of Saint John the Baptist, Burley Ville, at present in the Rural Deanery of Christchurch, and the Parish of Dibden, at present in the Rural Deanery of Southampton, shall be transferred to the Rural Deanery of Lyndhurst; and the Parish of Hamble, at present in the Rural Deanery of Bishops Waltham, and the Parish of Chilworth, at present in the Rural Deanery of Romsey, shall be transferred to the Rural Deanery of Southampton; and thirdly, the Rural Deanery of Stockbridge within the said Archdeaconry of Winchester and comprising the Parishes of Barton Stacy, Bullington with Tufton, Chilbolton, Goodworth Clatford, Leckford, Longparish otherwise Middleton, Longstock, Nether Wallop, Over Wallop, Stockbridge, Upper Clatford, and Wherwell, shall cease to exist and the said Parishes of Chilbolton, Goodworth Clatford, Longparish otherwise Middleton, Upper Clatford, and Wherwell shall be transferred to the Rural Deanery of Andover; the said Parishes of Leckford, Longstock, Nether Wallop, Over Wallop, and Stockbridge shall be transferred to the Rural Deanery of Romsey; and the said Parishes of Barton Stacy, and Bullington with Tufton shall be transferred to the Rural Deanery of Winchester, all such Rural Deaneries being at present in the said Archdeaconry of Winchester; and each of the said Parishes shall be

subject to the jurisdiction and authority of the Rural Dean of the Rural Deanery and of the Archdeacon of the Archdeaconry in which it is hereby included and to which it is hereby transferred, and shall not belong to or be a part of any other Rural Deanery or Archdeaconry, nor be subject to the jurisdiction and authority of any other Rural Dean or of any other Archdeacon.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other matter or thing with respect to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, by virtue of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas notices of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act been transmitted to the Archdeacons affected by the Scheme, that is to say, to the Archdeacon of Surrey and to the Archdeacon of Winchester, and they have expressed their approval of the same:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrars of the said Diocese of Winchester.

WHEREAS by treaty, grant, usage, suffrance or other lawful means, His Majesty the King has jurisdiction within the dominions of His Majesty the Sultan of Morocco and Fez:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as "The Morocco (Amendment) Order in Council, 1921," and shall be read as one with the Morocco Order in Council, 1889, hereinafter called "the Principal Order."

2. The following provisions are substituted for Article 119 of the Principal Order:—

(1) A register of British subjects shall be kept in the office of every Consulate in Morocco.

(2) Every British subject resident in Morocco shall, in the month of January of each year, be registered at the Consulate of the Consular District within which he resides, provided that if some other Consulate is more easy of access, he may, with the assent of the Consular Officer, be registered there. A British subject arriving in Morocco must apply for registration within one month after his arrival; provided that a person who fails to apply for or to obtain registration within the time limited by this article may be registered at any time if he excuses his failure to the satisfaction of the Consular Officer.

(3) Where a person is in possession of a valid British passport, the Consular Officer shall, on the first registration of any such person, endorse on the passport without further fee than that provided for in sub-article (6) hereunder a certificate of registration in such form as may be prescribed by the Secretary of State. Where any such person applies for the renewal of the registration and produces his passport, the renewal of the registration shall without further fee than that provided for in sub-article (6) hereunder be endorsed thereon.

(4) Every person who has not previously been registered applying to be registered under this Order shall, unless excused by the Consular Officer, attend personally for that purpose at the Consulate, but any person applying for the renewal of his registration need not attend personally unless directed by the Consular Officer so to do, provided that the registration of the wife or wives of a man who is registered under this Order may, if living with him, be effected without their personal attendance being required, and provided also that the registration of minors, being his relatives in whatever degree, living with the head of a family who is registered under this Order, may be effected without their personal attendance being required.

(5) A person registered in any register of British subjects established under the provisions of any Order in Council which have been repealed shall be registered under the provisions of this Order, unless the Consular Officer is satisfied after enquiry that the previous registration was erroneous or that such person is not entitled to registration under the provisions of this Order.

(6) Every person shall, on every registration of himself, and on every renewal of the registration, pay a fee of two shillings and sixpence or such other fee as the Secretary of State from time to time appoints. The amount of the fee may be uniform for all persons, or may vary according to the position and circumstances of different classes, if the Secretary of State from time to time so directs, but may not in any case exceed five shillings.

(7) Where any person applies to be registered, he shall be entitled without a fee to the assistance of the Consular Officer in the preparation of any affidavit that may be required.

(8) The Consular Officer may require the production of such evidence that an applicant for registration is entitled to the status of a British subject as he may see fit, but subject to such directions as may be issued by the Secretary of State.

(9) If any British subject neglects to obtain registration under the provisions of this Order, he shall not be entitled to be recognised or protected as a British subject in Morocco, and shall be liable to a fine not exceeding two pounds for each instance of such failure, but he shall, although not registered, be subject to the jurisdiction of His Majesty's Courts in Morocco.

3. From and after the commencement of this Order, Article 119 of the Principal Order is hereby repealed, but such repeal shall not prejudice any rights, obligations or liabilities accrued thereunder.

4.—(1) This Order shall take effect as soon as it is first exhibited in the public office of the Consulate at Tangier, and that date is in this Order referred to as the commencement of the Order.

(2) For that purpose the Consul at Tangier shall, on the receipt by him of a certified printed copy of the Order, cause the same to be affixed and exhibited conspicuously in that office. He shall also keep the same so affixed and exhibited during one month from that first exhibition.

(3) Proof shall not in any proceeding or matter be required that the provisions of this article have been complied with, nor shall any act or proceeding be invalidated by any failure to comply with any such provisions.

The following Scheme for the adjustment of the property, rights, liabilities, &c., of the Urban District Council of Gosport and Alverstoke, in the Administrative County of Southampton, and for other purposes, as settled by a Committee of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, is published in accordance with

the provisions of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1882":—

Whereas by the Municipal Corporation Acts, 1882 and 1885, it is enacted that where a Petition for a Charter of Incorporation is referred to the Committee of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council and it is proposed by the Charter to extend the Municipal Corporation Acts to the Municipal Borough to be created by the Charter, the said Committee of Council may settle a Scheme for the purposes in the said Acts named and containing such provisions as are in the said Acts particularized:

And whereas in the month of February, One Thousand Nine Hundred and Twenty, certain Inhabitant Householders of the Urban District of Gosport and Alverstoke, in the County of Southampton, petitioned His Majesty the King praying for the grant of a Charter of Incorporation:

And whereas the said Petition for a Charter was referred to the Committee of Council, and it was proposed by the Charter to create the Urban District of Gosport and Alverstoke, hereinafter described "a Municipal Borough," and to incorporate the Inhabitants thereof and to extend the Municipal Corporation Acts to the Municipal Borough to be created by the Charter:

And whereas by a Provisional Order of the Local Government Board dated the 19th day of May, 1874, and confirmed by the Local Government Board's Provisional Orders Confirmation Act, 1874 (No. 3); a Local Act passed in the third year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Third intituled "An Act for the better paving of the Streets and for preventing nuisances and other annoyances in the Town of Gosport, in the County of Southampton," and another Local Act passed in the fifty-fourth year of the same reign intituled "An Act for watching, lighting and cleansing the Town of Gosport, in the County of Southampton and for amending and rendering more effectual an Act passed in the third year of His Present Majesty, for better paving the streets and preventing nuisances and annoyances in the said Town," were repealed, and the whole of the Parish of Alverstoke (of which the said Town of Gosport forms a part) was constituted an Urban Sanitary District within the meaning of the Public Health Act, 1872, under the jurisdiction of the Alverstoke Local Board, to whom was transferred the liabilities of the Trustees acting in the execution of the Local Acts aforesaid:

And whereas by the Local Government Board's Provisional Orders Confirmation Act, 1874 (No. 3), the District was divided into 3 Wards to be each represented by 9 elected Members:

And whereas under and by virtue of the Local Government Act, 1894, the Local Board became the Urban District Council for the Urban District of Gosport and Alverstoke (hereinafter called "the District Council"):

And whereas the County Council for the Administrative County of Southampton did on the 27th day of August, 1896, make an Order which was finally approved on the 16th day of November, 1896, by which the apportionment of the members of the District Council among the Wards was altered as follows:—the Gosport Ward 6 elected Members, the North Liberty Ward 9 elected Members, and the South Liberty Ward 12

elected Members, and on the 10th day of August, 1914, did make a further Order dividing the District into 4 Wards to be represented as regards the Gosport Town Ward by 6 elected Members, and as regards the 3 remaining Wards by 7 elected Members each:

And whereas the Local Government Board did on the 29th day of November, 1904, under Section 33 of the Local Government Act, 1894, issue an Order by which the District Council were vested with the power to appoint Overseers of the Poor of the Parish of Alverstoke and the power to appoint and revoke the appointment of Assistant Overseers for such Parish:

And whereas the Local Government Board did on the 9th day of September, 1905, under Section 34 of the Local Government Act, 1894, issue an Order by which the powers of the Vestry under the third and fourth Sections of the Poor Rate Assessment and Collection Act, 1869, were conferred on the District Council:

And whereas the Education Act, 1902, has come into operation in the Urban District of Gosport and Alverstoke, and the District Council thereof is now the Local Education Authority within the said District for the purposes of Part 3 of the said Act, and a Scheme for the constitution of an Education Committee was made by the District Council on the 16th day of March, 1903, and was approved by the Board of Education on the 25th day of June, 1903, and an Amending Scheme was made by the District Council on the 11th day of March, 1915, and was approved by the Board of Education on the 16th day of April, 1915:

And whereas the following Acts are now in force within the District, viz.:—

- Erection of New Market Place, 1811;
- Amending Act as to Erection of New Market Place, 1828;
- Haslar Bridge Act, 1834;
- Gosport Pier Company's Act, 1842;
- Gosport Water Act, 1858;

- Electric Lighting Orders Confirmation (No. 12) Act, 1900:

And whereas the following Acts wholly or in part affect the district, that is to say:—

And whereas the following Acts have been adopted by the Local Board or by the District

Council and are now in force within the District of the Council, viz.:—

- The Public Libraries Acts, 1855 to 1858, adopted on the 22nd day of September, 1886;
- The Infectious Disease (Prevention) Act, 1890, adopted on the 12th day of February, 1891;
- The Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1890, adopted on the 12th day of February, 1891;
- The Private Street Works Act, 1892, adopted on the 11th day of June, 1896:

And whereas by virtue of Orders of the Local Government Board and the Secretary of State for the Home Department, dated respectively the 4th day of August, 1909, and the 20th day of April, 1909, certain Parts and Sections of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1907, are in force in the District of the Council:

And whereas the following Provisional Orders are now in force within the district of the Council:—

- The Gosport Water Order, 1872, as confirmed by the Gas and Water Orders Confirmation Act, 1872;
- The Gosport Water Order, 1883, as confirmed by the Water Orders Confirmation Act, 1883;
- The Gosport Water Order, 1897, as confirmed by the Water Orders Confirmation Act, 1897;
- The Gosport Electric Lighting Order, 1905, as confirmed by the Electric Lighting Orders Confirmation (No. 6) Act, 1905:

And whereas under the provisions of the Public Health Act, 1875, the Local Board on the 19th day of February, 1890, made Bye-laws in respect of Hackney Carriages, Public Bathing, Pleasure Boats and Vessels, Nuisances, Slaughter-houses, the Trade of a Tripe Boiler, the Trade of Bone Boiler, Common Lodging Houses, New Streets and Buildings, all of which Bye-laws were allowed by the Local Government Board upon the 11th day of November, 1891:

And whereas the Local Board made Bye-laws with respect to Slaughter-houses and Hackney Carriages, which Bye-laws were allowed by the Local Government Board on the 15th day of April, 1872:

And whereas under the Public Health Act, 1875, the Local Board on the 14th day of June, 1894, made Bye-laws in respect of New Buildings, which Bye-laws were allowed by the Local Government Board upon the 6th day of August, 1894:

And whereas on the 14th day of September, 1916, the District Council made Rules with respect to Small Holdings and Allotments in the said Urban District, and the same were confirmed by the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries on the 13th day of December, 1916, and are now in force within the said Urban District:

And whereas the District Council on the 12th day of November, 1903, made Regulations under the Dairies, Cowsheds and Milkshops' Order of 1885 and the same are now in force within the said Urban District:

And whereas the Chairman of the District Council for the time being and one Member of the said Council are Trustees of a Charity affecting the District and known as "The Thomas King Trust Fund":

And whereas the County Council of Southampton have made certain Bye-laws for the

good rule and government of the Administrative County of Southampton and the same are now in force in the Urban District of Gosport and Alverstoke:

And whereas it is intended that arrangements shall be made for the consolidation of the Police Force of the Borough of Gosport when constituted by Charter with the Police Force of the County of Southampton:

And whereas the District Council is a Local Authority within the meaning of the Municipal Corporation Acts, 1882 and 1885:

And whereas this Scheme before being settled by the Committee of Council was referred for consideration to His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department, to the Minister of Health, to the Minister of Transport, the Board of Trade, and to the Board of Education:

And whereas it is expedient that a Scheme should be made and settled containing the provisions hereinafter set forth:

Now, therefore, pursuant to the Municipal Corporation Acts, 1882 and 1885, and every other power enabling them in that behalf the Committee of Council have settled a Scheme containing the provisions herein, and do hereby direct, order, and declare, as follows:—

1. This Scheme may be cited for all purposes as "The Borough of Gosport Scheme, 1922."
2. The Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Gosport are in this Scheme referred to as "The Corporation."
3. This Scheme when confirmed shall come into operation on the day of the first meeting of the Council of the Municipal Borough created by the said Charter, and this Scheme shall be construed and applied as if it had been dated and confirmed by Parliament or Order in Council on the day before the day of the said first meeting, and everything thereunder shall be done and had accordingly.

This date is hereinafter referred to as "the commencement of this Scheme." So far as may be necessary this Scheme shall operate retrospectively.

4. From and after the commencement of this Scheme the Municipal Borough created by the said Charter shall be placed within the jurisdiction of the Corporation acting by the Council of the Borough as the Sanitary Authority of the said Borough.
5. The District Council, their powers, duties, rights, obligations and privileges shall continue and be deemed to have continued to exist until the commencement of this Scheme unaffected in any manner whatsoever by the grant of the said Charter or the creation of the said Borough.
6. From and after the commencement of this Scheme the District Council shall be and the same is hereby abolished, and the powers, duties, rights, obligations and privileges thereof shall cease and determine.
7. All the jurisdiction, powers, trusts, duties and property vested in or possessed by the District Council or by any person or body in trust for them or any of their members as such (and not otherwise dealt with or transferred

by or under any part of this Scheme) shall vest in the Corporation and shall be exercised, held and applied for the Municipal and public purposes of the said Borough.

8. All duties and liabilities which immediately before the commencement of this Scheme attached to and were enforceable against the District Council or the property thereof shall attach to and be enforceable against the Corporation or the property thereof.
9. Any investigation, legal proceeding or remedy in respect of any debt, liability, penalty or forfeiture due to or incurred by or on behalf of the District Council before the commencement of this Scheme may be continued, prosecuted or enforced by or against the Corporation.
10. From and after the commencement of this Scheme the Mayor and a member of the Council of the said Borough shall be and act as the Trustees of "The Thomas King Trust Fund" in lieu and instead of the Chairman and a member of the District Council.
11. The term "property" in this Scheme means and includes all property real and personal and all things in action and all rights of common and commonable rights and rights to toll, and all franchises, privileges and rights which have any pecuniary value, and all Charters, records, deeds, books and documents and all rights and all claims to relief and all rights to avoid contracts or otherwise and includes any estate or interest legal or equitable in or in respect of any property so defined.
12. The District Fund and General District Rate of the Borough of Gosport shall for all purposes whatsoever (subject to the provisions of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, with respect to the Borough Fund and Borough Rate and Watch Rate respectively) take the place of and be substituted for the District Fund and General District Rate respectively of the District Council and all sums of money respectively payable to, from, or out of, and all liabilities charged upon or attaching to the District Fund and General District Rate of the said Urban District shall (subject as aforesaid) be paid to, from, or out of, and shall be charged upon the said District Fund and General District Rate of the said Borough respectively.
13. All the rights, interests, powers, property, privileges, liabilities, or obligations, vested in or attached to the District Council under "The Gosport and Portsmouth Ferry Acts, 1809 and 1812," "an Act for erecting a New Market Place at Gosport, 1811," "an amending Act as to erection of New Market Place, 1828," the "Haslar Bridge Act, 1834," the "Port of Portsmouth Floating Bridge Act, 1838," the "London and South Western Railway Act, 1839," the "Port of Portsmouth Floating Bridge Act, 1840," the "Gosport Pier Company's Act, 1842," the "Gosport Water Act, 1858," the "Gosport Gas Acts, 1865 and 1873," the "Gosport Water Order, 1872, as con-

firmed by the Gas and Water Orders Confirmation Act, 1872," the "Pier and Harbour Orders Confirmation (No. 1) Act, 1872," the "Gosport Street Tramways Acts, 1879 and 1881," the "Gosport Water Order, 1883, as confirmed by the Water Orders Confirmation Act, 1883," the "Public Libraries Acts, 1855 to 1919," the "Infectious Disease (Notification) Act, 1888," the "Infectious Disease (Prevention) Act, 1890," the "Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1890," the "Private Street Works Act, 1892," the "Gosport Water Order, 1897, as confirmed by the Water Orders Confirmation Act, 1897," the "Electric Lighting Orders Confirmation (No. 12) Act, 1900," the "Gosport and Fareham Tramways Act, 1903," the "Gosport Water Act, 1904," the "Gosport and Fareham Tramways Act, 1905," the "Gosport Electric Lighting Order, 1905, as confirmed by the Electric Lighting Orders Confirmation (No. 6) Act, 1905," the "Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1907," the "Gosport Gas Act, 1908," the "Gosport and Alverstoke Urban District Council Act, 1919," the "Portsmouth Corporation Act, 1920," the "Portsmouth Floating Bridge Act, 1920"; or under any other Statute, Order, Bye-Law or Regulation, shall pass to, devolve upon, be exercisable by or against, vested in or attached to the Corporation acting by the Council as the Sanitary Authority of the Borough, and from and after the commencement of this Scheme, the Corporation shall be and continue the legal successors of the Urban District Council of Gosport for all purposes. The Town Clerk of the Borough shall be substituted for and perform the duties of the Clerk to the District Council.

14. Any Rules and Regulations under the Public Health Act, 1875, and the Dairies, Cowsheds and Milkshops Order of 1885, the Order made by the Local Government Board on the 29th day of November, 1904, under Section 33 of the Local Government Act, 1894, the Order made by the Local Government Board on the 9th day of September, 1905, under section 34 of the Local Government Act, 1894, the Rules under the Small Holdings and Allotments Act, 1908, and any Bye-Laws in force in the District at the commencement of this Scheme shall, unless duly repealed, revoked or varied, continue in force and have operation in the Borough in like manner and with like effect as if the Corporation acting by the Council and their officers and the Borough were referred to therein instead of the Local Board or the District Council (as the case may be) and their officers and the District.

Provided that the Bye-Laws with respect to Slaughter-houses which were allowed by the Local Government Board on the 11th day of November, 1891, and the Bye-Laws with respect to New Streets and Buildings in force in the Urban District shall be continued in force in the Borough for a period of one year only after the Scheme has come into opera-

tion unless repealed before the expiration of that period, and the Bye-Laws with respect to Slaughter-houses and Hackney Carriages which were allowed by the Local Government Board on the 15th day of April, 1872, shall so far as the same are still in force in the Urban District be repealed.

15. Any Order made under the Shops Act, 1912, and in force in the Urban District of Gosport and Alverstoke immediately before the commencement of the Scheme shall, subject to the provisions of that Act, continue in force in the Borough.
16. The Bye-Laws for the good rule and government of the Administrative County of Southampton, so far as they are in force in the Urban District of Gosport and Alverstoke, shall continue in force and be enforced within the Municipal Borough of Gosport until the expiration of two years from the commencement of this Scheme, or until other Bye-Laws for good rule and government made by the Corporation shall have come into force whichever shall first occur.
17. As soon as may be convenient after the commencement of this Scheme, the Council of the Borough shall prepare and submit to the Board of Education a Scheme for an Education Committee for the Borough, in accordance with the provisions of Section 17 of the Education Act, 1902.

Until such Scheme shall have been approved by the Board of Education, the members of the Education Committee of the District Council who are in Office immediately before the commencement of this Scheme shall be deemed to have been appointed, and shall be the Education Committee for the Borough of Gosport.

As soon as the Scheme of the Borough Council shall have been approved by the Board of Education, the Education Committee appointed by the District Council shall be dissolved and cease to exist.

18. Notwithstanding the Incorporation of the Borough and the provisions of this Scheme all rates, assessments, compositions, charges, mortgages, contracts, leases, conveyances, deeds, documents, acts, matters and things made, entered into, or done before the commencement of this Scheme by to or with reference to the District Council shall be as good, valid and effectual to all intents and purposes whatsoever for, against and with reference to the Corporation as if the same had been done, entered into, or done by, to or with reference to the Corporation instead of the District Council, and may be proceeded on or enforced in the same manner in all respects as if the Corporation instead of the District Council had been party or privy to the same and had been named or referred to therein.
19. (1) In case any officer of the District Council who shall have been employed by the District Council for a period of not less than five years shall not be employed by the Corporation nor offered

by the Corporation a position in their employ of a similar character and of an equal value to that formerly held by him he shall be entitled to be paid compensation for the loss of his position out of the funds of or under the control of the Corporation acting by the Council as the Sanitary Authority or Education Authority (as the case may be) for the Borough, and the amount to be paid in each case shall be determined in accordance with the provisions of Section 120 of the Local Government Act, 1888, and Sub-sections (1) to (7) inclusive of that section shall apply as if they formed part of this Scheme with the substitution of the words "Borough Council" for "County Council" and "this Scheme" for "this Act" and with such other modifications as are necessary to make them applicable thereto.

- (2) Provided nevertheless that if any such officer be so employed by the Corporation and discharged by them (otherwise than for misconduct) within four years after the commencement of this Scheme he shall be entitled to compensation in the same manner as if he had not been employed by the Corporation.
 - (3) Provided also that the term "officer" shall include only persons employed by the District Council whose salaries or emoluments are payable at intervals of not less than one month and no other persons.
 - (4) The provisions of this Clause shall apply to a teacher employed in a non-provided public elementary school as if he were an officer employed by the Corporation if such teacher be discharged by the Corporation or by the directors or with the consent of the Corporation (otherwise than for misconduct) within four years after the commencement of this Scheme.
 - (5) Provided also that the provisions of this Clause shall not apply to the Director of Housing or any other Officer employed by the District Council in or about their Housing Scheme.
20. The Accounts of the District Council and their officers shall be made up to the date of the commencement of this Scheme and shall be (as soon as conveniently may be) audited by the District Auditor in like manner and subject to the like powers, duties, provisions and right of appeal as if the Charter had not been granted and the provisions of sections 247 and 250 of The Public Health Act, 1875, as amended by the District Auditors Act, 1879, and any regulations duly issued by the Local Government Board or Ministry of Health with respect to the audit of accounts of Urban District Councils and of their officers shall apply to such audit and the provisions of this Scheme with respect to the District Council shall be construed so as to admit of such exceptions as may be necessary to enable such audit to be duly made, but such exceptions shall be strictly limited in time, extent, character, and operation to the purposes of such audit;

any money certified to be due from any person by the District Auditor at such audit shall be paid by such person to the Treasurer of the Borough.

And whereas in the month of February, One Thousand Nine Hundred and Twenty One, certain Inhabitant Householdors of the Urban District of Redcar, in the County of the North Riding of Yorkshire, petitioned His Majesty the King praying for the grant of a Charter of Incorporation.

And whereas the said Petition for a Charter was referred to the Committee of Council, and it was proposed by the Charter to create the Urban District of Redcar hereinafter described "A Municipal Borough," and to incorporate the Inhabitants thereof, and to extend the Municipal Corporation Acts to the Municipal Borough to be created by the Charter.

And whereas by an Order in Council made on the 19th day of June, 1855, in pursuance of the provisions of the Public Health Act, 1848, a Local Board of Health for the Parish of Redcar was constituted, and then became invested with various powers and duties, and the Local Board was constituted the Urban Sanitary Authority for the Parish of Redcar.

And whereas by a Provisional Order made by the Secretary of State for the Home Department on the 22nd day of May, 1871, and confirmed by the Local Government Supplemental Act, 1871 (No. 4), the boundaries of the Local Board of Health District of Redcar were altered.

And whereas by a Provisional Order of the Local Government Board, dated the 5th day of June, 1877, the district of the Local Board of Health for the Parish of Redcar was extended by the inclusion of parts of the Parishes of Marske and Upleatham.

And whereas by a Provisional Order of the Local Government Board, dated the 2nd day of July, 1877, the Local Board of Health for the Parish of Kirkleatham was constituted and then became invested with various powers and duties, and the Local Board was constituted

the Urban Sanitary Authority for the Parish of Kirkleatham.

And whereas under and by virtue of the Local Government Act, 1894, the Local Boards of Health became the Urban District Councils for the Urban Districts of Redcar and Kirkleatham.

And whereas by an Order of the County Council of the North Riding of Yorkshire, made on the 27th day of July, 1898, and confirmed by the Local Government Board on the 1st day of March, 1899, the Parish of Kirkleatham was divided, and a new Parish named the Parish of Coatham was created, and the Parishes of Redcar and Coatham were constituted one Urban District, with two wards, hereafter called "The Urban District of Redcar."

And whereas by an Order of the County Council of the North Riding of Yorkshire, made on the 28th day of July, 1909, the number of wards was increased from two to four.

And whereas by an Order of the County Council of the North Riding of Yorkshire made on the 12th day of May, 1920, and confirmed by the Minister of Health on the 23rd day of September, 1920, the Urban District was extended by the inclusion of a portion of the Parish of Kirkleatham.

And whereas by an Order of the County Council of the North Riding of Yorkshire made on the 27th day of October, 1920, and confirmed by the Minister of Health on the 11th day of February, 1921, the townships of Redcar and Coatham were united under the title of the Township of Redcar.

And whereas by an Order of the County Council of the North Riding of Yorkshire made on the 27th day of July, 1921, the number of wards in the Urban District was increased from four to six and the membership of the Urban District Council increased from twelve to eighteen.

And whereas the Local Government Board did on the 20th day of March, 1895, under Section 33 of the Local Government Act, 1894, issue an Order by which the District Council of Redcar were vested with the power to appoint overseers for the Parish of Redcar.

And whereas the Local Government Board did on the 26th day of November, 1895, under Section 33 of the Local Government Act, 1894, issue an Order by which the District Council of Redcar were vested with the power to appoint and revoke the appointment of assistant overseers.

And whereas the Local Government Board did on the 23rd day of July, 1896, under Section 34 of the Local Government Act, 1894, issue an Order by which the District Council of Redcar were vested with the powers of the Vestry under Sections 3 and 4 of the Poor Rate Assessment and Collection Act, 1869.

And whereas the Local Government Board did on the 28th day of July, 1896, under Section 33 of the Local Government Act, 1894, issue an Order by which the District Council of Redcar were vested with the powers, duties and liabilities of the overseers with respect to appeals or objections by the overseers in respect of the valuation list, or appeals in respect of the Poor Rate or County Rate or the basis of the County Rate; and conferring upon the District Council of Redcar the powers of a Parish Council under paragraphs (c) (1) of Sub-Section (1) of Section 6 of the said Act of 1894.

And whereas the Local Government Board did on the 15th day of March, 1895, under Section 33 of the Local Government Act, 1894, issue an Order by which the District Council of Kirkleatham were vested with the power to appoint overseers for the parish of Kirkleatham.

And whereas the Local Government Board did on the 6th day of February, 1896, under Section 33 of the Local Government Act, 1894, issue an Order by which the District Council of Kirkleatham were vested with the power to appoint and revoke the appointment of assistant overseers.

And whereas the Local Government Board did on the 30th day of June, 1896, under Section 34 of the Local Government Act, 1894, issue an Order by which the District Council of Kirkleatham were vested with the powers of the Vestry under Sections 3 and 4 of the Poor Rate Assessment and Collection Act, 1869.

And whereas the Local Government Board did by their Order of the 1st day of March, 1899, uniting the Urban Districts of Redcar and Kirkleatham, vest the powers, duties and liabilities transferred by Orders of the Local Government Board in pursuance of Section 33 or Section 34 of the Local Government Act, 1894, in the United Urban District Council of Redcar.

And whereas the Minister of Health by "The North Riding of Yorkshire (Coatham and Redcar United Townships) Order, 1920" directed that the provisions of any Order made by the Local Government Board under Section 33 or Section 34 of the Local Government Act, 1894, shall have effect as if any reference in those provisions to a township included a reference to the township of Redcar as constituted by the said "North Riding of Yorkshire (Coatham and Redcar United Townships) Order, 1920," and that the Orders of the Local Government Board under Section 33 or Section 34 of the Local Government Act, 1894, conferring certain powers, duties and liabilities on the Urban District Council of Kirkleatham, shall cease to have any operation in the Urban District and Township of Redcar.

And whereas by virtue of the Local Government Board's Provisional Orders Confirmation (No. 3) Act, 1906, confirming a Provisional Order for forming a United District under Section 279 of the Public Health Act, 1875, dated the 20th day of March, 1906, the Urban District of Redcar is part of the Guisborough Joint Smallpox Hospital District.

And whereas by the "Redcar Urban District Council (Gas) Act, 1920" powers were given to the Redcar Urban District Council to purchase the undertaking of the Redcar, Coatham, Marske and Saltburn Gas Company.

And whereas the Redcar Urban District Council have acquired the said undertaking under the said Act.

And whereas the following Acts have been adopted by and are now in force in the district of the Urban District Council of Redcar, that is to say:—

1. The Burial Acts, 1852-1906.
2. The Infectious Diseases (Prevention) Act, 1890.
3. The Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1890.
4. The Private Street Works Act, 1892.

And whereas by virtue of Orders of the Local Government Board, dated the 22nd day of October, 1908, and of the Secretary of State for the Home Department, dated the 8th day of September, 1920, the following parts and sections of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1907 (that is to say, Parts II, III, IV, V, VI, VII, VIII and X, with the exception of Sections 26, 30, 67, 84, 85) are in force within the Urban District of Redcar.

And whereas the following additional Acts of Parliament refer and apply in whole or in part to the Urban District of Redcar or some part thereof:—

- The Cleveland Waterworks Act, 1869.
- The Cleveland Waterworks Act, 1871.
- The Cleveland Waterworks Act, 1876.
- The Electric Lighting Orders Confirmation (No. 2) Act, 1900.
- The Tees Valley Water Act, 1914.

And whereas on the 23rd day of June, 1909, approval was given by the Local Government Board, under the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1907, to the expenditure by the District Council, in any one year of an amount equal to that which would be produced by a rate of one penny in the pound on property liable to be assessed for the purpose of the General District Rate, to provide or contribute towards the expenses of any band of music to perform in any public park or pleasure ground provided by the Council or under their management and control.

And whereas under the powers of the Public Health Acts and other Acts the following Bye-laws have been made and are now in force in the district of the Council, or in parts thereof, that is to say:

Bye-laws as to slaughter-houses, cleansing of footways and pavements, removal of house refuse, cleansing of closets and cesspools; nuisances; made by Kirkleatham Local Board and allowed by the Local Government Board on the 11th November, 1879.

Bye-laws as to horses, ponies, mules, or asses standing for hire, made by the Redcar Local Board and allowed by the Local Government Board on the 2nd August, 1882.

Bye-laws as to horses, ponies, mules or asses standing for hire and with respect to hackney carriages, made by the Kirkleatham Local Board and allowed by the Local Government Board on the 8th June, 1883.

Bye-laws with respect to hackney carriages made by the Redcar Local Board and allowed by the Local Government Board on the 26th June, 1884.

Bye-laws as to cleansing of foot-ways and pavements made by the Redcar Local Board and allowed by the Local Government Board on the 20th May, 1893.

Bye-laws as to common lodging houses made by the Redcar Local Board and allowed by the Local Government Board on the 20th May, 1893.

Bye-laws as to prevention of nuisances arising from snow, filth, dust, ashes, and rubbish, and for the prevention of the keeping of animals on any premises so as to be injurious to health made by the Redcar Local Board and allowed by the Local Government Board on the 20th May, 1893.

Bye-laws as to slaughter houses made by the Redcar Local Board and allowed by the Local Government Board on the 20th May, 1893.

Regulations with respect to dairies, cowsheds, and milkshops made by the Urban District Council of Redcar on the 4th March, 1895.

Regulations with respect to dairies, cowsheds, and milkshops made by the Urban District Council of Kirkleatham on the 3rd May, 1895.

Bye-laws with respect to tents, vans, sheds and similar structures used for human habitation made by the Urban District Council of Redcar and allowed by the Local Government Board on the 29th April, 1912.

Bye-laws with respect to traffic on the Esplanade made by the Urban District Council of Redcar and allowed by the Secretary of State for the Home Department on the 9th March, 1921.

Bye-laws as to the seashore made by the Urban District Council of Redcar and allowed by the Secretary of State for the Home Department on the 9th March, 1921, and by the Secretary of the Board of Trade on the 18th March, 1921.

Bye-laws as to street traffic at the King Edward Memorial Clock in High Street, Redcar, made by the Urban District Council of Redcar and allowed by the Secretary of State for the Home Department on the 22nd March, 1921.

Bye-laws as to public bathing made by the Urban District Council of Redcar and allowed by the Minister of Health on the 9th August, 1921.

Bye-laws as to new streets and buildings made by the Urban District Council of Redcar and allowed by the Minister of Health on the 30th August, 1921.

Bye-laws as to pleasure boats and vessels made by the Urban District Council of Redcar and allowed by the Minister of Health on the 22nd October, 1921.

Bye-laws as to streets and buildings made by the Urban District Council of Redcar and allowed by the Minister of Health on the 10th January, 1922.

And whereas under the provisions of the Public Health Act, 1875, the District Council supply water to the householders in their district.

And whereas regulations have been made for preventing waste and misuse of water supplied by the Council.

And whereas at a meeting of the Vestry for the Consolidated Chapelry of St. Peters, Redcar, held on the 18th day of December, 1871, it was resolved that a Burial Board should be appointed for the said Chapelry and by a letter dated the 30th day of December, 1871, the Secretary of State for the Home Department signified his approval.

And whereas in pursuance of the powers for that purpose contained in Section 62 of the Local Government Act, 1894, the powers, duties and liabilities of the Burial Board have been transferred to the Redcar Urban District Council.

And whereas by virtue of their powers under the Local Government Act, 1888, the County Council of the North Riding of Yorkshire, on the 27th day of July, 1921, made an Order extending the burial district to the whole Urban District and the jurisdiction of the Urban District Council as a Burial Authority to the whole Parish of Redcar as enlarged by the North Riding of Yorkshire (Coatham and Redcar United Townships) Order, 1920.

And whereas a table of fees, payments and sums settled in accordance with the provisions of the Burial Act, 1852, was approved by the Minister of Health on the 27th day of July, 1921.

And whereas the County Council of the North Riding of Yorkshire are the local education authority for the purposes of elementary education as well as of higher education.

And whereas it is intended that arrangements shall be made for the consolidation of the Police Force of the Borough of Redcar when constituted by Charter with the Police Force of the County of the North Riding of Yorkshire.

And whereas the District Council are a Local Authority within the meaning of the Municipal Corporation Acts, 1882 and 1885.

And whereas this Scheme before being settled by the Committee of Council was referred for consideration to His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department, to the Minister of Health, to the Board of Trade and to the Board of Education.

And whereas it is expedient that a Scheme should be made and settled containing the provisions hereinafter set forth.

Now therefore, pursuant to the Municipal Corporation Acts, 1882 and 1885, and every other power enabling them in that behalf, the Committee of Council have settled a Scheme containing the provisions herein, and do hereby direct, order and declare as follows:—

1. This Scheme may be cited for all purposes as "The Borough of Redcar Scheme, 1922."

2. The Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Redcar are in this Scheme referred to as "The Corporation."

3. This Scheme, when confirmed, shall come into operation on the day of the first meeting of the Council of the Municipal Borough created by the said Charter; and this Scheme shall be construed and applied as if it had been dated and confirmed by Parliament or Order in Council on the day before the day of the said first Meeting, and everything thereunder shall be done and had accordingly. This date is hereinafter referred to as "the commencement of this Scheme." So far as may be necessary this Scheme shall operate retrospectively.

4. From and after the commencement of this Scheme the Municipal Borough created by the said Charter shall be placed within the jurisdiction of the Corporation acting by the Council of the Borough as the Sanitary Authority of the said Borough.

5. The District Council, their powers, duties, rights, obligations and privileges, shall continue and be deemed to have continued to exist until the commencement of this Scheme, unaffected in any manner whatsoever by the grant of the said Charter or the creation of the said Borough. From and after the commencement of this Scheme the District Council shall be and the same are hereby abolished, and the powers, duties, rights, obligations and privileges thereof shall cease and determine.

6. The hereinbefore recited Orders of the Local Government Board under Section 33 and Section 34 of the Local Government Act, 1894, shall except as varied by the North Riding of Yorkshire (Coatham and Redcar United Townships) Order, 1920, continue in force and effect in the Borough and in favour of the Corporation as fully as they have been in the Urban

District of Redcar and in favour of the Redcar Urban District Council.

7. The Table of fees duly allowed and approved in accordance with the provisions of the Burial Acts shall continue in force in regard to the Cemetery until the same are repealed, varied, revised or altered by the Council of the Borough, with such approval as is required by law.

8. The County Council of the North Riding of Yorkshire shall remain the Local Education Authority for the purpose of elementary education as well as of higher education.

9. The Council of the said Borough shall not exercise any of the powers or duties or be subject to the liabilities under any of the Acts relating to the following matters mentioned in section thirty-nine of "The Local Government Act, 1888," namely:—

(a) The appointment of Analysts under the Acts relating to the sale of Foods and Drugs, or

(b) The execution of Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, or the Destructive Insects Act, 1877, or

(c) Weights and Measures.

All powers, duties and liabilities in respect of the above matters shall be exercised by and attached to the County Council of the Administrative County of the North Riding of Yorkshire, and the area of the Borough shall for all purposes of the Acts relating to these matters form part of the County in like manner as if it were not a Borough.

10. All the jurisdiction, powers, trusts, duties and property vested in or possessed by the District Council, or by any person or body in trust for them, or any of their members as such (and not otherwise dealt with or transferred by or under any part of this Scheme) shall vest in the Corporation, and shall be exercised, held and applied for the municipal and public purposes of the said Borough.

11. The power of the District Council to appoint a Governor of Sir William Turner's School under the Scheme of the 22nd October, 1909, regulating that Foundation, shall be transferred to and vested in the Corporation without prejudice to the tenure of office of any Governor appointed by the District Council in office at the commencement of this Scheme.

12. All duties and liabilities which immediately before the commencement of this Scheme attached to and were enforceable against the District Council or the property thereof, shall attach to and be enforceable against the Corporation or the property thereof.

13. Any investigation, legal proceeding or remedy in respect of any debt, liability, penalty, or forfeiture due to or incurred by or on behalf of the District Council before the commencement of this Scheme may be continued, prosecuted or enforced by or against the Corporation.

14. The term "property" in this Scheme means and includes all property real and personal, and all things in action and all rights of common and commonable rights and rights to toll, and all franchises, privileges and rights which have any pecuniary value, and all charters, records, deeds, books and documents, and all rights and all claims to relief and all rights to avoid contracts or otherwise, and includes any estate or interest, legal or equitable, in or in respect of any property so defined.

15. The District Fund and General District Rate of the Borough of Redcar shall for all purposes whatsoever (subject to the provisions of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, with respect to the Borough Fund and Borough Rate and Watch Rate respectively) take the place of and be substituted for the District Fund and General District Rate respectively of the District Council, and all sums of money respectively payable to, from, or out of, and all liabilities charged upon or attaching to the District Fund and General District Rate of the said Urban District shall (subject as aforesaid) be paid to, from, or out of, and shall be charged upon the said District Fund and General District Rate of the said Borough respectively.

16. All the rights, interests, powers, property, privileges, liabilities or obligations vested in or attached to the District Council under "the Public Health Acts"; the Burial Acts, 1852 to 1906; the Infectious Diseases (Prevention) Act, 1890; the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1890; the Private Street Works Act, 1892; the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1907; the Local Government Board's Provisional Order Confirmation (No. 3) Act, 1906; the Electric Lighting Orders Confirmation (No. 2) Act, 1900; the Redcar Urban District Council (Gas) Act, 1920; the Cleveland Waterworks Acts, 1869, 1871, and 1876; and the Tees Valley Water Act, 1914, or under any other Statute, Order, Bye-law or Regulation, shall pass to, devolve upon, be exercisable by or against, vested in or attach to, the Corporation acting by the Council as the Sanitary Authority of the Borough, and from and after the commencement of this Scheme, the Corporation shall be and continue the legal successors of the Urban District Council of Redcar for all purposes. The Town Clerk of the Borough shall be substituted for and perform the duties of the Clerk to the District Council.

17. Any rules and regulations under the Public Health Act, 1875, and the Dairies, Cowsheds, and Milkshops Order of 1885; the Orders made by the Local Government Board, under Section 33 and Section 34 of the Local Government Act, 1894; and any Bye-laws, table of fees and charges in force within the Urban District of Redcar at the commencement of this Scheme, shall unless duly repealed, revoked, or varied, continue in force and have operation in the Borough in like manner and with like effect as if the Corporation, acting by the Council and their Officers, and the Borough, were referred to therein instead of the Local Board or the District Council (as the case may be) and their Officers, and the District.

18. The Bye-laws for the good rule and government of the Administrative County of the North Riding of Yorkshire so far as they are in force in the Urban District of Redcar shall continue in force and be enforced within the Municipal Borough of Redcar until the expiration of two years from the commencement of this Scheme, or until other Bye-laws for good rule and government made by the Corporation shall have come into force whichever shall first occur.

19. Any Order made under the Shops Act, 1904, or the Shops Act 1912, or any subsequent Act providing for the closing of shops, and in force immediately before the commencement of this Scheme in the Urban District of Redcar

shall unless and until it is revoked remain in force within the Municipal Borough of Redcar.

SAVING FOR RATES, ETC.

20. Notwithstanding the incorporation of the Borough and the provisions of this Scheme, all rates, assessments, compositions, charges, mortgages, contracts, leases, conveyances, deeds, documents, acts, matters, and things made, entered into, or done before the commencement of this Scheme, by, to, or with reference to the District Council, shall be as good, valid, and effectual to all intents and purposes whatsoever for, against and with reference to the Corporation as if the same had been done, entered into, or done by, to or with reference to the Corporation instead of the District Council, and may be proceeded on or enforced in the same manner in all respects as if the Corporation instead of the District Council had been party or privy to the same and had been named or referred to therein.

21.—(1) In case any officer of the District Council or any officer of the County Council in respect of elementary education in the Urban District who shall have been employed by such Council for a period of not less than five years shall not be employed by the Council of the Borough nor offered by that Council a position in their employ of a similar character and of an equal value to that formerly held by him, he shall be entitled to be paid compensation for the loss of his position out of the funds of or under the control of the Corporation acting by the Council as the Sanitary Authority or Education Authority (as the case may be) for the Borough, and the amount to be paid in each case shall be determined in accordance with the provisions of Section 120 of the Local Government Act, 1888, and sub-sections (1) and (7) inclusive of that section shall apply as if they formed part of this Scheme, with the substitution of the words "Borough Council" for "County Council" and "this Scheme" for "this Act," and with such other modifications as are necessary to make them applicable thereto.

(2) Provided nevertheless that if any such officer be so employed by the Corporation and discharged by them (otherwise than for misconduct) within four years after the commencement of this Scheme he shall be entitled to compensation in the same manner as if he had not been employed by the Corporation.

(3) Provided also that the term "officer" shall include only persons employed by the District Council or by the County Council as aforesaid whose salaries or emoluments are payable at intervals of not less than one month and no other persons.

(4) The foregoing provisions of this Clause shall apply to a teacher employed in any public elementary school at the commencement of this Scheme within the aforesaid district as if he were an officer employed by the County Council, provided that in the case of a teacher employed in a non-provided school the said provisions shall only apply if such teacher be discharged by the Corporation or by the direction or with the consent of the Corporation (otherwise than for misconduct) within four years of the commencement of this Scheme.

22. The Accounts of the District Council and their Officers shall be made up to the date of the commencement of the Scheme and shall be (as soon as conveniently may be) audited by

the District Auditor in like manner, and subject to the like powers, duties, provisions and right of appeal as if the Charter had not been granted, and the provisions of Sections 247 and 250 of "The Public Health Act, 1875," as amended by "The District Auditors Act, 1879," and any regulations duly issued by the Local Government Board or Minister of Health with respect to the Audit of Accounts of Local Boards or Urban District Councils, and of their Officers, shall apply to such audit; and the provisions of this Scheme with respect to the District Council shall be construed so as to admit of such exceptions as may be necessary to enable such audit to be duly made, but such exceptions shall be strictly limited in time, extent, character, and operation to the purposes of such audit; any money certified to be due from any person by the District Auditor at such audit shall be paid by such person to the Treasurer of the Borough.

His Majesty The KING has been graciously pleased to award the Edward Medal to James Walsh, an engine-driver in the employ of the South African Railways Administration, in the following circumstances:—

On the 1st October, 1919, while a passenger train of the South African Railways Administration was proceeding from Mafeking to Johannesburg, the engine developed a defect which resulted in a volume of scalding steam escaping from the boiler. Walsh, the engine-driver, was severely scalded, but, in spite of this, remained on his engine and eventually succeeded in bringing the train to a standstill. As a result of the injuries he sustained, Walsh spent a long period in hospital and will never again be able to follow his occupation of an engine-driver. He displayed great bravery and presence of mind, and, as the train was running down a hill, there is little doubt that, if he had lost control of his engine, a serious accident would have resulted.

His Majesty The KING has been graciously pleased to award the Edward Medal to Samuel Peters, Joseph Harrison, Harold West and Thomas Calladine, in the following circumstances:—

On September 22nd, 1920, a heavy fall of earth occurred in a seam of the Holmewood Colliery, near Chesterfield, imprisoning two men who were working in the seam. It was ascertained that the men were uninjured, but, as it was obvious that the work of reaching them would occupy some days the first necessity was to supply them with food. Peters, the under-manager, with great ingenuity, passed food through a cycle tyre enclosed in iron piping. Further falls occurred during the forty-eight hours following the original fall, but it then became possible to pass some timber through, although gas appeared in the cavity and began to give trouble. A small hole was made through to the imprisoned men, and they were eventually freed after being four days in the seam.

Peters, West, Harrison and Calladine all distinguished themselves greatly in the work of rescue, and were engaged for practically the whole time in a dangerous position at the face of the fall. They were exposed to the risk of injury from falling stones and displayed a dogged courage and endurance.

In lieu of the Overtime Rates as at present fixed, Overtime Rates calculated on the Proposed Minimum Rates specified in Part I of this Schedule in the manner set out in Part II of the Notice M.D. (5) issued by the Trade Board, dated 31st January, 1922, shall apply in substitution for the Proposed Minimum Rates otherwise applicable, as set out in Part I of this Schedule, in respect of all hours worked in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board in the above mentioned Notice M.D. (5) to be the normal number of hours of work in the Trade.

PART III.

DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES OF WORKERS AND AREAS.

SECTION I.—

For the purpose of this Schedule the following definitions shall apply:—

(a) A FOREMAN is a person who is employed in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Milk Distributive) Order, 1920, and to whom is deputed the duty of exercising supervising authority over workers exceeding 5 in number (exclusive of the Foreman).*

(b) A ROUNDSMAN or ROUNDSWOMAN is a person in charge of a round or rounds.

(c) A SHOP ASSISTANT is a male or female person wholly or mainly employed in a shop in serving customers and/or in checking in and out.

(d) A CLERK is a male or female person wholly or mainly employed on clerical work.

*NOTE.—The definition of a FOREMAN for the purpose of the application of the minimum rates of wages at present fixed by the Trade Board and in operation is as follows:—

A FOREMAN is a person who is employed in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Milk Distributive) Order, 1920, and to whom is deputed the duty of exercising supervising authority over workers exceeding 5 in number (exclusive of the foreman) working in any shop, department, or other branch of the trade.

SECTION II.—

The proposed rates set out in the respective Scales A, B and C in Part I of this Schedule shall apply as follows:—

SCALE A.—(a) To all areas administered by Rural District Councils and (b) to all areas administered by Municipal Borough Councils and Urban District Councils which according to the most recent Census had a population of less than 10,000; but so as in neither case to apply to any area within the Metropolitan Police District.

SCALE B.—To all areas other than those to which Scales A and C apply.

SCALE C.—To the area comprising the City of London and the Metropolitan Police District.

PART IV.

The above proposed Minimum Rates of wages apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all workers in England and Wales in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Milk Distributive) Order, 1920, as set out in Part IV of the Board's Notice M.D. (5), dated 31st January, 1922.

PART V.

SECTION I.—

The above proposed General Minimum Time-Rates and Overtime Rates shall be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactment; or deductions authorised by any Act, to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any Superannuation or other Provident Fund.

SECTION II.—

The above proposed Minimum Rates of Wages are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages, to workers of greater skill or length of experience, or to Agreements made or that may be made between employers and workers for the payment of wages in excess of these Minimum Rates of Wages.

The Trade Board will consider any OBJECTIONS to the above PROPOSALS which may be lodged with them within two months from 24th March, 1922. Such Objections should be in writing, and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to The Secretary of the Milk Distributive Trade Board (England and Wales) 7-11, Old Bailey, London, E.C. 4.

It is desirable that the Objections should state precisely, and, so far as possible, with reasons, what is objected to.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF

ANIMALS (LANDING FROM IRELAND)
ORDER OF 1922.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

1. Cattle, sheep, goats or swine landed at any Irish Animals Landing Place in Great Britain shall not be moved therefrom except in accordance with the following provisions of this Order which shall operate notwithstanding anything contained in the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Control of Movement) Order of 1920.

2. Cattle, sheep, goats or swine may be moved from the Landing Place direct to a slaughterhouse if accompanied by a licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the district in which the slaughterhouse is situate.

3. Cattle may also, except as provided in Article 4 of this Order, be moved from the Landing Place direct to any premises other than a market, fairground, saleyard, lair or place of exhibition if accompanied by a licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority

of the district in which such premises are situate, subject as hereinafter provided:—

(a) No such licence shall be granted for movement of cattle to any premises situate within a radius of two miles from any place which is for the time being declared to be a place infected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease.

(b) Any licence granted by an Inspector under this article shall specify the route to be taken by the cattle during movement from the railway station of destination to the said premises, and the route to be so specified shall be such that at no point shall the cattle be moved within a radius of two miles of any place which is for the time being declared to be a place infected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease.

If no such route is available, a licence shall not be granted.

(c) Cattle moved with a licence under this Article shall not be moved from the place of destination specified in the licence until the expiration of a period of 28 days from the date of their arrival thereat, and then only if accompanied by such licence, if any, as may be required under the then existing Orders of the Minister relating to Foot-and-Mouth Disease. During the said period of detention the cattle shall be kept separate from all other animals and shall be under the supervision of an Inspector of the Local Authority.

4. No licence shall be granted under this Order for the movement of animals to premises other than a slaughterhouse from the Irish Animals Landing Places at Glasgow, Greenock or Manchester.

5. Where animals are moved with a licence

under this Order direct to a slaughterhouse, the animals on arrival at the slaughterhouse shall be detained therein until slaughtered, and shall be slaughtered within 48 hours of their arrival at the slaughterhouse.

6. A licence granted under this Order shall not be available for the movement of the animals from the Landing Place unless and until it is countersigned by an Inspector of the Ministry at the Landing Place.

7. A movement licence granted under this Order shall be available for seventy-two hours from the time it is countersigned by an Inspector of the Ministry at the Landing Place, and no longer.

8. In the case of every movement of animals authorised by a licence under this Order the licence shall accompany the animals throughout the movement, and shall be produced on demand to an Inspector of the Ministry, or of the Local Authority, or a Police Constable.

9. Animals while being moved with a licence under this Order shall, so far as is practicable, be moved by rail and be kept separate from all animals which are not being so moved. When being moved by road the animals shall be moved without unnecessary delay to the place of destination and by the route specified in the licence. In the case of animals moved by rail the animals shall not be untrucked for any purpose until they reach the destination station from which they are to be moved to the premises specified in the licence.

Provision as to Marking.

10. An animal shall not be moved from the Landing Place with a licence under this Order unless before the movement is commenced it is marked by and at the expense of the owner or his agent in manner following:—

Cattle.—By the clipping of a broad arrow, ↑ about six inches long, on the left hind-quarter of each of the cattle if the cattle are to be moved to premises other than a slaughterhouse, and on the right hind-quarter of each of the cattle if they are to be moved to a slaughterhouse.

Sheep.—By the clipping of a broad arrow ↑ on the forehead of each of the sheep; and also by the painting or stamping of the letter M, about six inches long, on both sides of each of the sheep with the following composition, namely: Rosin, five parts; oil of turpentine, two parts; and blue or red ochre, one part melted and used warm; or with some other adhesive composition of a blue or red colour.

Swine.—By the painting or stamping of the letter M, about six inches long, on both sides of each of the swine with the composition above mentioned.

Movement from Landing Place subject to other Regulations.

11. Nothing in this Order shall be deemed to authorise the movement of an animal in contravention of any Regulation of a Local Authority prohibiting or regulating the movement of animals into their District.

Disinfection of Railway Trucks and Railway Loading Banks.

12.—(1) A railway truck or other railway vehicle used for the conveyance of any animals

from an Irish Animals Landing Place shall, immediately before any such animal is placed in it, be thoroughly sprayed with liquid disinfectant, under the supervision and to the satisfaction of the Inspector of the Ministry at the Landing Place.

(2) A railway loading bank or loading dock used for the loading of Irish animals at an Irish Animals Landing Place for conveyance therefrom shall, when required by an Inspector of the Ministry at the Landing Place, be thoroughly sprayed with liquid disinfectant.

(3) The liquid disinfectant to be used for the purposes of this article shall be—

(a) A one per cent. (minimum) solution of chloride of lime containing not less than thirty per cent. of available chlorine; or

(b) a five per cent. (minimum) solution of carbolic acid (containing not less than ninety-five per cent. of actual carbolic acid); or

(c) a disinfectant equal in disinfective efficiency to the above-mentioned solution of carbolic acid.

(4) Nothing in this article shall interfere with the operation of the provisions of the Animals (Transit and General) Order of 1912 as to the cleansing and disinfection of railway trucks and other railway vehicles used for the conveyance of animals on a railway.

Offences.

13. If anything is done or omitted to be done in contravention of this Order, the owner and the person for the time being in charge of the animal, or, in respect of Article 12, the railway company loading the animals or owning the loading banks in respect of which, as the case may be, the same is done or omitted to be done, shall each according to and in respect of his or their own acts or omissions, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Revocation.

14. Article 8 of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Great Britain) Order of 1922 (No. 9) is hereby revoked from the commencement of this Order.

Commencement.

15. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-ninth day of March, nineteen hundred and twenty-two.

Short Title.

16. This Order may be cited as the ANIMALS (LANDING FROM IRELAND) ORDER OF 1922.
