1. This Order may be cited as the Importation of Plumage (No. 1) Order, 1922.

2. There shall be added to the Schedule to the said Act the name of the bird *Rhea Rothschildi* (Order *Rheiformes*).

PROPOSAL TO VARY MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, in Great Britain for the branches of Trade specified in the Trade Boards (Hair, Bass and Fibre) Order, 1919, HEREBY GIVE NOTICE, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they Propose to Vary the General Minimum Time-Rates, Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates and Overtime Rates at present fixed and set out in the Schedule to their Notice H.B. (6), dated 15th October, 1921, for Male and Female Workers, the proposed variations being as shown in the Schedule set out below.

The Minister of Labour has given his consent to the issue of this Notice.

## MINIMUM RATES AS VARIED FOR WORKERS EMPLOYED ON HAND-LOOM WEAVING (OTHER THAN DAMASK SEATING HAND-LOOM WEAVING).

EFFECTIVE AS FROM 28TH MARCH, 1922.

Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, the rates shall become effective as from the beginning of the next full pay period, but in no case later than 3rd April, 1922.

This Notice sets out all the minimum rates of wages which have been fixed by the Trade Board and are effective under the Trade Boards Acts for workers employed on Hand-Loom Weaving (other than Damask Seating Hand-Loom Weaving), and takes the place of Parts VI and VII of the Notice H.B. (6) issued by the Trade Board and dated 15th October, 1921.

## OVERTIME RATES FOR WORKERS EMPLOYED ON HAND-LOOM WEAVING (OTHER THAN DAMASK SEATING HAND-LOOM WEAVERS AND HOME-WORKERS).

SECTION I.—In accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board HAVE DECLARED THE NORMAL NUMBER OF HOURS OF WORK IN THE TRADE IN ANY WEEK TO BE 48.

Provided that all hours worked on Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays shall be regarded as Overtime to which the Overtime Rates shall apply.

SECTION II.—HAND-LOOM WEAVERS (OTHER THAN HOME-WORKERS) employed on Piece-work to which the General Minimum Piece-Rates set out in Part I of this Schedule are applicable shall receive, in respect of hours worked in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board, in Section I of this Part, to be the normal number

of hours of work in the trade, IN ADDITION TO payment at not less than the appropriate General Minimum Piece-Rates:—

- (i) As respects each of the first four hours of Overtime in any week, 2d. per hour;
- (ii) As respects each hour in excess of four hours of Overtime in any week, 4d. per hour;
- (iii) As respects each hour of employment on Sundays or on Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, 8d. per hour.

#### PART III.

For the purpose of this Notice the expression "Home-worker" means a worker who works in his or her own home, or in any other place not under the control or management of the employer.

#### PART IV.

SECTION I.—The Minimum Rates set out in this Schedule apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all workers employed in Great Britain in Hand-Loom Weaving (other than Damask Seating Hand-Loom Weavers) in respect of all time during which they are employed on piece-work to which the General Minimum Piece-Rates set out in Part I of this Schedule are applicable in any branch of the Trade specified in the Trade Boards (Hair, Bass and Fibre) Order, 1919; that is to say:—

The drafting, dressing or mixing of bass, whisk or similar fibres or horse hair or other hairs and the curling or weaving of hair or fibre, or of mixed hair and fibre, and all pre-

paratory, finishing, warehousing or packing operations incidental to or appertaining to all or any of the above processes, but excluding any of the above operations or processes where they are carried on in association with or in conjunction with the manufacture of brushes or brooms, and excluding also the dressing of animal skins.

SECTION II.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages must be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any Superannuation or other Provident Fund.

SECTION III.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages or to agreements made or that may be made between employers and workers for the payment of wages in excess of the Minimum Rates.

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#### PROPOSAL TO VARY MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR WORKERS OTHER THAN LEARNERS.

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In accordance with the Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, the Lace Finishing Trade Board established under that Act for certain branches of the Machine-Made Lace and Net Finishing Trade as defined in the Regulations made by the Board of Trade and dated 16th March, 1914, HEREBY GIVE NOTICE, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they PROPOSE TO VARY the General Minimum Piece-Rates and also the General Minimum Time-Rates for Workers other than Learners, at present effective and set out in the Schedule to their Notice L (8), dated 12th October, 1921, the proposed variations being as shown in the Schedule set out below.

The General Minimum Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for certain classes of Male Workers set out in the Notice O. (7) issued by the Trade Board and dated 9th September, 1921, which remain unaffected by this variation ; AND

- (c) For all hours worked in excess of 47 in any week, the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Quarter times the minimum rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME AND-A-QUARTER for the first ten hours, and One-and-a-Half times the minimum rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-HALF thereafter, except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of paragraphs (a) and (b) of this Sub-Section.

**B.—FEMALE WORKERS EMPLOYED ON PIECE-WORK :—**

A Female Worker employed on piece-work shall receive in respect of each hour of Overtime worked, in addition to piece-rates each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an ORDINARY worker, not less than the appropriate Piece-work Basis Time-Rate, as set out in Part III of this Schedule (or, where no Piece-work Basis Time-Rate is applicable, not less than the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate as set out in Section II of Part I of this Schedule), a sum equivalent to the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate, to One-Half of the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate, or to One Quarter of the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate, according as the Overtime Rate, which would be payable under the provisions of Part A of this Section, if the worker were employed on Time-work, were Double-Time or Time-and-a-Half, or Time-and-a-Quarter respectively.

**C.—MALE WORKERS EMPLOYED ON PIECE-WORK :—**

A Male Worker employed on Piece-work shall receive in respect of each hour of Overtime worked, in addition to piece-rates each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an ORDINARY worker, not less than the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate as set out in Section I of Part I of this Schedule, a sum equivalent to the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate, to One-Half of the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate, or to One-Quarter of the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate, according as the Overtime Rate payable under the provisions of Part A of this Section, if the worker were employed on Time-work, were Double-Time, or Time-and-a-Half, or Time-and-a-Quarter respectively.

*Note.*—The hours which Female Workers, Young Persons and Children are allowed to work are subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts, and of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920.

**PART V.**

The above minimum rates of wages apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all workers in Great Britain (except Female Workers employed in Carding Hooks and Eyes or Snap Fasteners), in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Pin, Hook and Eye and Snap Fastener) Order, 1919, that is to say :—

The manufacture of pins, hairpins, hooks and eyes, haircurlers, snap fasteners, or safety pins, from the following metals in wire or sheet form :—

Aluminium, copper, iron, lead, steel, tin, zinc or alloys of any two or more of the above metals.

**INCLUDING :—**

- (a) The capping of safety pins.
- (b) The operation of pin sticking.
- (c) Packeting, boxing or carding of any of the above articles wherever carried on.
- (d) Packing, despatching, warehousing or other operations incidental to or appertaining to the manufacture of any of the above articles.

**BUT EXCLUDING :—**

- (e) The manufacture of steel hatpins or shanks for steel toilet pins, wherever carried on.

**PART VI.**

**SECTION I.**

The above minimum rates of wages must be paid clear of all deductions, other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any Superannuation or other Provident Fund.

**SECTION II.**

The above Minimum rates of wages are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages, or to agreements made or that may be made between employers and workers for the payment of wages in excess of these minimum rates of wages.

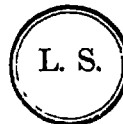

The restrictions on movement of swine imposed by the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, and the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Application Order of 1917 (No. 1), shall not apply to the movement of swine from the sale mentioned in the Schedule hereto to any premises in Great Britain not being a Swine-Fever Infected Place, and not being in any Scheduled District for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Control of Movement) Order of 1920, if the swine are accompanied by a licence in the Form F set forth in the First Schedule to the said Order of 1908, granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the city of Salisbury, and the following conditions, which shall be specified in the licence, are complied with:—

(i) The swine shall be moved to the place of destination specified in the licence and not elsewhere, and shall be there detained

and kept separate from all other swine for twenty-eight days unless they are slaughtered on such premises before the expiration of that period, or are moved under and in accordance with the conditions of a licence in the Form C set forth in the said First Schedule to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse in the same Scheduled Area.

(ii) The swine shall be moved by the nearest available route without unnecessary delay, and during the movement shall, so far as is practicable, be kept separate from all swine not being moved with a licence under this Order.

(iii) After completion of the movement the licence shall forthwith be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest police-station in the same district by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing such movement.

2.
