ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 28TH APRIL 1922.)

WARWICKSHIRE (TANWORTH DISTRICT) (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1922 (No. 4).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows :—

Contraction of Scheduled District and Prohibited Area.

1. The Warwickshire (Tanworth District) (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1922 (No. 3) shall be read and have effect as if the Scheduled District and Prohibited Area described in the First and Second Schedules hereto were substituted respectively for the
