PRESENT.

WHEREAS by treaty, grant, usage, sufferance or other lawful means, His Majesty the King has jurisdiction within the portions of China comprised within the Consular District of Kashgar:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of his Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as "The China (Kashgar) (Amendment) Order in Council, 1922," and shall be read as one with the China (Kashgar) Order in Council, 1920, hereinafter called "the Principal Order."

2. The following provisions are substituted for Articles 48 to 52 inclusive of the Principal Order:—

- (1) A register of British subjects shall be kept in the office of the Consul-General.
- (2) Every British subject resident within

the limits of this Order shall, in the month of January of each year, be registered at the office of the Consul-General. A British subject arriving within the limits of this Order must apply for registration within one month after his arrival provided that a person who fails to apply for or to obtain registration within the time limited by this Article may be registered at any time if he excuses his failure to the satisfaction of the Consul-General.

(3) Where a person is in possession of a valid British passport, the Consul-General shall, on the first registration of any such person, endorse without further fee than that provided for in sub-article (6) hereunder on the passport a certificate of registration in such form as may be prescribed by the Secretary of State. Where any such person applies for the renewal of the registration and produces his passport, the renewal shall without further fee than that provided for in sub-article (6) hereunder be endorsed thereon.

(4) Every person who has not previously been registered applying to be registered under this Order shall, unless excused by the Consul-General, attend personally for that purpose at the office of the Consul-General, but any person applying for the renewal of his registration need not attend personally unless directed by the Consul-General so to do, provided that the regis-

tration of the wife or wives of a man who is registered under this Order may, if living with him, be effected without their personal attendance being required, and provided also that the registration of minors, being his relatives in whatever degree, living with the head of a family who is registered under this Order, may be effected without their personal attendance being required.

(5) A person registered in any register of British subjects established under the provisions of any Order in Council which have been repealed shall be registered under the provisions of this Order, unless the Consul-General is satisfied after enquiry that the previous registration was erroneous or that such person is not entitled to registration under the provisions of this Order.

(6) Every person shall, on every registration of himself, and on every renewal of the registration, pay a fee of 1.5 Kashgar taels, or such other fee as the Secretary of State from time to time appoints. The amount of the fee may be uniform for all persons, or may vary according to the position and circumstances of different classes, if the Secretary of State from time to time so directs, but may not in any case exceed 3 Kashgar taels.

(7) Where any person applies to be registered, he shall be entitled without a fee to the assistance of the Consul-General in the preparation of any affidavit that may be required.

(8) The Consul-General may require the production of such evidence that an applicant for registration is entitled to the status of a British subject as he may see fit, but subject to such directions as may be issued by the Secretary of State.

(9) If any British subject neglects to obtain registration under the provisions of this Order, he shall not be entitled to be recognised or protected as a British subject within the limits of this Order, and shall be liable to a fine not exceeding 12.5 Kashgar taels for each instance of such failure, but he shall, although not registered, be subject to the jurisdiction of the Court.

3. From and after the commencement of this Order, Articles 48 to 52 inclusive of the Principal Order are hereby repealed but such repeal shall not prejudice any rights, obligations or liabilities accrued thereunder.

4.—(1) This Order shall take effect as soon as it is first exhibited in the public office of the Court, and that date is in this Order referred to as the commencement of the Order.

(2) For that purpose the Consul-General shall, on the receipt by him of a certified printed copy of the Order, cause the same to be affixed and exhibited conspicuously in that office. He shall also keep the same so affixed and exhibited during one month from that first exhibition.

(3) Proof shall not in any proceeding or matter be required that the provisions of this Article have been complied with, nor shall any act or proceeding be invalidated by any failure to comply with any such provisions.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 27th day of July, 1922, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for constituting a separate District for spiritual purposes to be taken partly out of the New Parish (sometime Consolidated Chapelry) of All Saints, Goodmayes, and partly out of the Parish of Dagenham, both in the County of Essex and in the Diocese of Chelmsford:

“Whereas we are satisfied that the said New Parish of All Saints, Goodmayes, and the said Parish of Dagenham are Cures wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said New Parish of All Saints, Goodmayes, and of the said Parish of Dagenham which are hereinafter mentioned and described should be constituted a separate District in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

“And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate District any consecrated Church or Chapel in use for the purposes of Divine Worship:

“And whereas we have agreed to make and pay out of the Common Fund created by the firstly herein mentioned Act a grant of £200 per annum to the Minister of the said proposed separate District so soon as a Minister shall have been duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein mentioned Act and to his successors:

“And whereas the said grant of the said yearly sum of £200 will after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme be made and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111:

“And whereas there has been contributed and paid to the credit of our account at the Bank of England a capital sum of £2,000

towards the cost of erecting a permanent Church within and for the said proposed separate District:

"And whereas the said capital sum of £2,000 has been contributed and paid as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District, and, when such District shall have become a New Parish, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof should be assigned in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas the contributors of the said capital sum of £2,000 towards the cost of erecting such permanent Church have nominated to us the Bishop for the time being of the said Diocese of Chelmsford as the person to whom they desire that the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District or New Parish should be assigned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend John Edwin, now Bishop of Chelmsford (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said New Parish of All Saints, Goodmayes, and of the said Parish of Dagenham which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the Map or Plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes, and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint Thomas, Becontree'.

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of Patronage of the said District so recommended to be constituted and, when such District shall have become a New Parish as aforesaid, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof shall without any assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid be assigned to and be absolutely vested in the said John Edwin, Bishop of the said Diocese of Chelmsford, and his successors, for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint Thomas, Becontree, comprising:—

"I. All that portion of the New Parish (sometimes Consolidated Chapelry) of All Saints, Goodmayes, in the County of Essex and in the Diocese of Chelmsford, which is bounded upon the south partly by the Parish of Barking and partly by the Parish of Dagenham, upon

the east by the said Parish of Dagenham, upon the north partly by the New Parish of Saint Chad, Chadwell Heath, and partly by the New Parish of Saint Paul, Goodmayes, all in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Goodmayes, from the said New Parish of All Saints, Goodmayes, at the centre of the bridge which carries the main line of the Great Eastern Railway across Mayes Brook, and extending thence first southward and then in various directions along the middle of Mayes Brook (thereby passing through the Goodmayes Recreation Ground) for a distance of 1 mile and 3 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge or culvert which carries Goodmayes Lane across the said brook, and extending thence southward along the middle of Goodmayes Lane for a distance of 14½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Longbridge Road upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of All Saints, Goodmayes, from the said Parish of Barking.

"II. And also all that contiguous portion of the said Parish of Dagenham which is bounded upon the north by the said New Parish of Saint Chad, Chadwell Heath, upon the west and upon the south by the above described portion of the said New Parish of All Saints, Goodmayes, and, upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of All Saints, Goodmayes, from the said Parish of Dagenham at a point in the middle of Green Lane distant 5 chains measured along the middle of such lane from its junction with Baron Road, and extending from the said point northward in a straight line (thereby following the proposed course of the new arterial road which will lead to Chadwell Heath Station) for a distance of 35 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries Chitty's Lane across the main line of the Great Eastern Railway upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Dagenham from the said New Parish of Saint Chad, Chadwell Heath."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures out of which it is intended that the District recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent to such Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Chelmsford.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS AND TREASURY BONDS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 1st September, 1922, at 1 o'clock, for

(b) £4 10s. per cent. Treasury Bonds, repayable at par on the 15th April, 1932.

2. The maximum amount of Treasury Bills and Treasury Bonds to be issued will be £50,000,000. The amount of Treasury Bonds issued will not exceed £5,000,000, but subject to that limit the total amount issued will be divided between Bills and Bonds in such proportions as Their Lordships may determine.

TREASURY BILLS.

3. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 4th September, 1922, to Saturday, the 9th September, 1922, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

5. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

£4 10s. PER CENT. TREASURY BONDS, 1932.

6. The Bonds will be in denominations of £50, £100, £200, £500, £1,000, and £5,000. They will be exempt from Corporation Profits Tax, and will in all respects rank *pari passu* with those issued under the Prospectus of the 21st April, 1922. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 4th September, 1922, to Saturday, the 9th September, 1922, inclusive; the first dividend, payable on the 15th October, 1922, will represent in the case of each Bond interest to that date from the date of the Bond.

7. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bonds required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one shilling) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bonds of different dates.

8. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

9. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on

the day on which the relative Bills or Bonds are to be dated.

10. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills and Bonds.

11. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

12. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

REGULATIONS MADE BY THE TREASURY, UNDER SECTION 3 OF THE PUBLIC OFFICES FEES ACT, 1879, WITH REGARD TO THE FEES PAYABLE UNDER SECTION 22 (1) OF THE RAILWAYS ACT, 1921, IN RESPECT OF PROCEEDINGS BEFORE THE RAILWAY RATES TRIBUNAL.

The fees payable under section 22 (1) of the Railways Act, 1921, in respect of proceedings before the Railway Rates Tribunal shall be received by an authorised officer of the Tribunal and transmitted from time to time to the Minister of Transport to be credited to the Appropriations in Aid subhead of the Vote for the Ministry of Transport.

The expenses of the Commissioners of Inland Revenue, which, under Section 6 of the Public Offices Fees Act, are a first charge on the fee receipts, shall then be paid as a debit to the subhead of the Vote entitled "Expenses of Railway Rates Tribunal."

All stamps used in respect of the fees in question shall be overprinted with the words "Railway Rates Tribunal."

The stamps shall be cancelled in black indelible ink by a hand stamp bearing the words "cancelled" and the date of cancelling or otherwise, as the Commissioners of Inland Revenue may direct.

ORDER UNDER SECTION 2 OF THE PUBLIC OFFICES FEES ACT, 1879.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on us by Section 2 of the Public Offices Fees Act, 1879, We, being Two of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, hereby give notice, order and direct as follows:—

VARIATION AND FIXING OF MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS FOR PERIODS DEPENDENT UPON THE COST OF LIVING INDEX FIGURE.

The Trade Board established in Great Britain under the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, for the branches of trade specified in the Trade Boards (Boot and Shoe Repair-

ing) Order, 1919, have given notice, as required by Section 4 (3) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, of the making of Orders by the Minister of Labour, dated 8th August, 1922, and of the contents of such Orders, confirming the variation and fixing by the Trade Board of General Minimum Time-Rates, Guaranteed Time-Rates, General Minimum Piece-Rates and Overtime Rates for Male and Female Workers, the rates as varied and fixed to be operative for periods dependent upon the Cost of Living Figure, and specifying the 28th August, 1922, as the date from which the said rates shall become effective.

CHAIN TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

PROPOSAL TO VARY MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES IN THE HAND HAMMERED CHAIN TRADE FOR PERIODS DEPENDENT UPON THE COST OF LIVING INDEX FIGURE.

In accordance with the Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour and dated 31st October, 1918, and 21st August, 1922, the Trade Board established under that Act for the Hand-Hammered and Dollied or Tommied Chain Making Trade in Great Britain hereby give notice that they Propose to Vary for periods dependent upon the Cost of Living Figure the General Minimum Time-Rates and General Minimum Piece-Rates for Hand Hammered Chain Making at present effective and set out in the Notice C (13) issued by the Trade Board and dated 10th January, 1922.

The Proposal provides that the minimum rates of wages to operate for the period during which the Cost of Living Index Figure (all items) as published in the "Ministry of Labour Gazette" is less than 90 but more than 72, shall be approximately 15 per cent. below the rates at present operating, and that such lower rates shall be subject to an addition or reduction of 5 per cent. for each completed rise or fall of 9 points in the Cost of Living Index Figure above or below 81.

Further information as to the proposed Variations in the Minimum Rates of Wages may be obtained on application to the Secretary of the Chain Trade Board (Great Britain) at the address set out below.

The Trade Board will consider any objections to the above Proposals to Vary which may be lodged with them within two months from the 25th August, 1922. Such objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary at the address given below.

It is desirable that the objections should state precisely, and so far as possible with reasons, what is objected to.
